

### HOSPITALITY TEA 600 Washington Street


True to early settler hospitality, Mr. and Mrs. Peter Sinsel have graciously opened their home to interested visitors this afternoon from 3:00 to 5:00.

Though it has since been the home of many a happy family and been altered to meet the needs of the occupants, the architecture and "homeiness" have reamined.
