Upon motion of Regent Watson, seconded by Regent Kleczka, it was VOTED, That the minutes of the postponed regular meeting of the Board held on October 25, 1952, be approved as sent out to the Regents.

RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE PRESIDENT

1. That the following gifts and grants be accepted; and that the Vice President of Business and Finance be authorized to sign the agreements:

GIFTS

- (a) \$ 3,000.00 - The John Morse Memorial Foundation, Chicago, Illinois, to be added to the John Morse Memorial Foundation Scholarship Fund in Engineering. Scholarships of \$500 each are to be awarded to three Junior and three Senior Engineering students for the 1952-53 academic year.

- (c) 100.00 - The Milwaukee Bar Association Foundation, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, the second annual contribution to the Milwaukee Bar Association Foundation Prize Fund in the School of Law. This gift is to be awarded as a prize or prizes to participants of the annual Moot Court competition in the Law School. The number of prizes, the conditions of the competition, and the award of prizes are to be determined by the Law School. The award must be given during the same academic year that this gift is accepted. (Fund 15-60)
- (d) Harnischfeger Corporation, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, a donation of technical equipment to the College of Engineering, consisting of a 500 lb. capacity mono-rail hoist and a Model TH-200 ampere welding transformer.
- (e) 25.00 - Mr. James R. Stott, Evansville, Wisconsin, in memory of his wife, Mrs. Gertrude Stott, to be used by the University Medical School for Cancer Research. (Fund 15-327)
- (f) Friends of Dr. J. A. E. Eyster, a gift of a plaque commemorating the services of Dr. Eyster as a physiologist in the University of Wisconsin Medical School. It is proposed to hang the plaque in the Medical School Auditorium so that all who may congregate there may be reminded of Dr. Eyster's contribution to science.
- (g) 300.00 - Oscar Mayer and Company, Madison, Wisconsin, for the continuation of the Oscar Mayer and Company Short Course Scholarships in the College of Agriculture, during the period November 17, 1952 to March 14, 1953. Four scholarships of \$75 each are to be awarded to four farm boys from Southern Wisconsin enrolled in the Short Course upon their selection by the Dean of the College of Agriculture and the Director of the Farm Short Course. (h) \$ 1,000.00 - The First National Bank, Janesville, Wisconsin, Trustee for the George Kemp Tallman Trust, for the establishment of the George Kemp Tallman Scholarships at the University of Wisconsin. The recipients, amount and number of the scholarships are to be determined by the University, as well as the availability of scholarships to graduate and undergraduate students. The donor requests that the following items be taken into consideration:

- (1) That it be made known that such scholarships as may be awarded are made possible by a gift from the Trust Estate of George Kemp Tallman, University of Wisconsin Class of 1897, a life-long and leading citizen of Janesville, who died July 8, 1950.
- (2) Selection of recipients and amount of the scholarships be made on the basis of definite need, scholarship, character and future promise.
- (3) Preference is to be given in the following order, as far as is practical, to applicants residing:

- (p) 150.00 - The Memorial Union Building Association to establish the "Edward H. Gardner Creative Writing Awards Fund" in recognition of Professor Gardner's achievements in writing and his services to students as director of the campaign to establish the Memorial Union Building. Annual contributions will be made to provide awards to students who do especially meritorious work in the field of creative writing. The number of awards and recipients thereof are to be decided by the Union Library Committee. (Fund 15-437)

- (2) Installation of ventilating hoods over the laboratory tables in the art metal laboratory at an estimated cost of \$1280.

Upon motion of Regent Renk, seconded by Regent Jones, actions 1, 2 (a) and (b) and 3 (a) to (c), inclusive, listed under the report of the Vice President of Business and Finance (II. Report of Actions Taken) and action No. 1 listed under the report of the Vice President of Business and Finance (III. Miscellaneous) were approved, ratified and confirmed.

The Secretary reported that the Regents in informal conference had discussed postponing the December Regent meeting. Upon motion of Regent Kleczka, seconded by Regent Jones, it was

VOTED, That the By-Laws be suspended and that the next regular meeting of the Board be postponed to January 10, 1953, the date of the regular meeting for the month of January, and that the Executive Committee be authorized to act for the Board in the interim, subject to the call of a special Regent meeting, if necessary.

Regent Renk presented the report of the Educational Committee.

Upon motion of Regent Renk, seconded by Regent Arveson, the following recommendations of the Educational Committee were adopted:

1. That John H. Franklin be appointed visiting professor of history for the second semester of 1952-53; salary \$3750 for the semester; charge \$2590 to L & S history, Easum leave, p. 61, \$500 to history, lecturer, p. 62, \$250 to history, instructor, p. 62, and \$410 to L & S Undistributed.
2. That LeRoy Alonzo Wilson be appointed emeritus professor of mechanical engineering, effective July 1, 1952.
3. That Wakelin McNeel, emeritus professor of agricultural extension, be employed on a special service contract, from December 1, 1952 to June 30, 1953, as Superintendent of Upham Woods, salary \$345 a month, total for the period \$2415; charge to Fund 1-E Unbudgeted Receipts.
4. That the resignation of W. Windsor Cravens, professor of poultry husbandry, be accepted; to take effect December 31, 1952.
5. That Chester V. Easum, professor of history, be granted leave of absence for the second semester of 1952-53 on the summer session basis; \$1935 charged to L & S history, fund 1A-1E, and \$2590 to Summer Session Trust Funds.
6. That Van R. Potter, professor of oncology, be granted leave of absence from December 1, 1952 to March 1, 1953, without pay.
7. That John W. M. Rothney, professor of education, be granted leave of absence from February 4 to June 18, 1953, on the summer session basis; \$2901.75 to be charged to School of Education, fund 1A-1E, and \$1323.25 to the Summer Session Trust Funds.

Upon motion of Regent Renk, seconded by Regent Arveson, it was VOTED, That, upon recommendation of the Administrative Committee, the regulation relating to the retirement of faculty members, approved by the Regents May 18, 1942, be amended to read as follows:

4.53 RETIREMENT OF FACULTY MEMBERS.

The date of retirement for a faculty member serving on an indefinite appointment ~~on the twelve-month basis~~ shall be the end of the fiscal year during which he reaches his seventieth birthday; ~~the date of retirement for a faculty member serving on an indefinite appointment on the ten-month basis shall be the end of the fiscal year during which or within two months of which (August 31) he reaches his seventieth birthday.~~ His retirement shall be automatic. The Regents, however, reserve the right to terminate or modify the appointment of any individual between the ages of sixty-five and seventy when such action seems to them desirable. Anyone retired as aforesaid may be employed after such retirement for special service on special contract at the discretion of the Regents, but not as a member of the regular staff.

Upon motion of Regent Renk, seconded by Regent Rennebohm, it was VOTED, That \$2018.75 be appropriated from 1-E Unbudgeted Receipts to provide funds for the purchase of 1953 Badger Yearbooks for distribution to the high schools in the State.

Upon motion of Regent Renk, seconded by Regent Kleczka, it was VOTED, That the inscription in section 1. of the Report of Special Regent Committee for Lincoln Statue Inscriptions, approved by the Regents May 10, 1952, be revised by deleting the word "created" and substituting the word "provided" in the first line thereof.

Regent Jones presented the report of the Business and Finance Committee.

Upon motion of Regent Jones, seconded by Regent Kleczka, it was VOTED, That the Vice President of Business and Finance be authorized to sign an agreement with the Town of Madison providing for an easement to The Regents of the University of Wisconsin to permit the construction and maintenance of an outfall sewer along Rosa Road from the Mineral Point Road to the existing

sewer in Glen Oak Hills (a distance of approximately 3000 feet); and that the Vice President of Business and Finance be authorized to sign agreements with the Madison Metropolitan Sewage Commission and the appropriate Sanitary Districts of the Town of Madison, as may be necessary, to comply with the regulations of the Commission and the Districts to operate and maintain an outfall sewer to serve the Brucellosis Laboratory on the Charmany Farm. (Cost of sewer and incidental expenses chargeable to the special legislative appropriation for a laboratory for bovine brucellosis research - 20.41 3h)

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Upon motion of Regent Jones, seconded by Regent Kleczka, it was VOTED, That the Governor be requested to release \$17,500 from the allotment for remodelling in the appropriation made by Section 20.419(3) Wisconsin Statutes to provide funds for remodelling and new construction work and for equipment in various University buildings.

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Upon motion of Regent Jones, seconded by Regent Arveson, it was VOTED, That upon the recommendation of the Director of Residence Halls, the charges for housing accommodations in the Wisconsin University Building Corporation properties occupied by graduate women be increased as follows, effective January 1, 1953, for the apartments, and at the beginning of the second semester of 1952-53 for the single and double rooms:

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Upon motion of Regent Jones, seconded by Regent Kleczka, it was VOTED, That the Vice President of Business and Finance be authorized to sign a contract with the Downey Heating Company, Milwaukee, low bidders, in the sum of \$13,877 for furnishing and installing five hot water boilers at University Houses.

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Upon motion of Regent Jones, seconded by Regent Kleczka, it was VOTED, That the Vice President of Business and Finance be authorized to sign a lease agreement with the University of Wisconsin Y.M.C.A. for the rental by the University of approximately 7,130 square feet of space on the first floor and in the basement of the University Y.M.C.A. building located at 740 Langdon Street, Madison, for the period September 1, 1952 to August 31, 1954, subject to termination upon 30 days advance written notice, at an annual rental of \$5880.

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Regent Jones moved and Regent Rennebohm seconded the adoption of the following recommendation of the Business and Finance Committee:

That the administrative officers of the University be authorized to complete negotiations with the Wisconsin Alumni Research Foundation for the remodelling and rental by the University of the property on Coyne Court formerly owned by the Madison Milk Producers Cooperative Dairy, and that the Executive Committee be authorized to approve the final arrangements for the use of this property by the University for research laboratories.

Regent Rennebohm reported that it was the understanding of the Business and Finance Committee that the structural remodelling of the Coyne Court property would be taken care of by the Wisconsin Alumni Research Foundation and suggested that it would be desirable to so specify in the action. Regent Jones moved that the motion be amended by adding the clause "it being understood that all costs of remodelling this building will be taken care of by the Foundation". The amendment was concurred in by the second of the motion and the motion, as amended, was voted.

Upon motion of Regent Renk, seconded by Regent Kleczka, it was VOTED, That the meeting adjourn.
