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
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

- Friday Feb 2 -

It has not been at all
pleasant outside today
and so my little girl
could not go out very
much though you did
take a walk outside
this afternoon with Emma
and then after you
returned Mama had
cullen and you did your
part very nicely toward
interesting them their
this evening Papa stayed
at home and spent
the evening with us
and we had a happy
time altogether.

- Saturday Feb 8 -

This morn'g about ten o'clock my little girl cried so hard for your little friend Ethel to come down to spend the day that Mama let you telephone to her and she came and you had a good time as usual. You played from morn'g until night. You went with her to a surprise party on one of her little friends and Mama worried for you stayed out almost too late. You were a little surprised at Mama for worrying for you were having such a good time you did.

- Sunday Feb 4 -

This has been a day
that the kind of which
you very much enjoy.

This morning you went
to church with Mamma
and Papa and then this
noon we took our dinner
with Uncle Harry Cutler
and Aunt-Bessie, then
after that we had a
sleigh ride the first Mamma
has had and Russell
was out with us. We
did have a good time
and enjoyed it immensely.
Then this evening we
took our lunch with
Austin Hatch and we
always have a good time
there too.

Monday Feb. - 6 -

It has been another
beautiful milde day and
especially for babies! You
were all out for an airing
this afternoon. Mama put
you into your little sled
and let you hold little
brother and the we all
went down and spent the
afternoon with Aunt Anna.
You and little Helen did
have a big time together
and I think that little
Morris enjoyed it too more
than he could make me
understand. This evening
Papa came home early
and we all had a good
nightly rest.

Tuesday Feb. 6 -

This noon Papa gave a
sleigh ride that I think
you will remember for some
little time. You and he
had a big time together.
Then you came in and
took such a lovely sleep.
You did not awaken my
good natured horses but -
Uncle Harry V. was here
and ready to take us
for a ride. You went
rather reluctantly at first
but soon told us how
glad you were you had
been along. Then this
evening you and brother
went to your rooms rather
early and it did you good.

- Wednesday Feb 4 -

This morning you have
been a very busy girl
helping Mamma about the
house and about noon
you wanted your map
for you were going to meet
Papa you said and then
this afternoon you took a
nice walk with Emma
and when you came
home you found Uncle
Harmon here and you
did have such a good
time too over it all this
afternoon you were
very tired and Mamma
latched you into bed soon.
Papa could not be home
very early on account of business.

Thursday Feb - 8 -

This has been another ideal day for you and little brother my little girl for we all three spent the day at Grandpa's. Early this morning Aunt Ida came down and took us all over. We did have such a good time. You could not take the time to take your nap, nor could brother until after dinner and then he slept the most of the afternoon. It was very warm outside but very damp but you both came home without having taken any colds.

Friday Feb-9.

Today Mama was up town with you to do a little shopping and as we passed Aunt Sophie you wanted to go in and spend the day and so Mama did let you. You were so happy and did make them so happy too that it almost makes us glad to let you go. Aunt Sophie came home with you and spent the evening -

Saturday Feb 10

Ethel was down again today and spent the whole day with you or rather no, you were up at her house today and it is left little brother alone all day with us. He missed you more than I can say and always acts a little crosser when he is alone, but he was delighted when you came in tonight and made up for all lost time by showing it.

Sunday Feb 11.

Today you had a
good time again as
Aunt Bassia and Uncle
Harry took you over to
the farm to spend
the day with Grandpa
and Grandma. Your
little brother and Papa
and Mama could not
go as brother has been
sick all the week & he
feels very badly today.
He has cut his hair
by a starth and over
below this morn-

Monday - Feb 12 -

Today it has been rather cold but Mama took a little outing this afternoon and attended the St. Cecilia at the Hall and left you and Russell in Emma's charge. Papa took hosting with him after dinner and you came over after and took your airing this afternoon.

Mama loves to see you come in after you have been out for you look so well.

Tuesday Feb 13 -

This has been a bitter cold morning but you and I did venture out after our morning walk was done, and wandered on down town to do a little shopping. You enjoyed it all except the walk home when you became very tired and wanted your Popo to carry you, but you finally gave in and did the right thing -

Wednesday Feb 14

You did have such
a good time this
afternoon for Uncle
Hannan came and took
you for a sleigh ride
down our hill new
by. You did shout and
laugh to the top of
your voice, and you
could not have enjoyed
it more in any way
than you did that
ride with Uncle Hannan.

Then this evening you
did have such a
frolic with Papa -

Thursday Feb 13-

Today you were inside
quite closely for it has
not been very pleasant
outside and your little
brother has not been
well so Mamie could
not take you out any
either. But your Popa
phoned for you to meet
him with your little
sled both this morn
and this evening this
you did and what
great sport you did
have -

Friday Feb 16 -

This afternoon you were indeed very happy, for at dinner time Aunt-Carrie phoned over that Helen would be down to spend the day or at least the afternoon with you. This made you more than happy. You look you up very good naturally and then you did have a big time here with Emma while Mama went up to spend the afternoon with Aunt-Carrie. You were a very tired little one tonight.

Saturday Feb 17

Today your little friend
Othele came down to spend
the day with you again
and you as you always
do had a very good time
together. This afternoon
she took you in your
little sled up town to see
all there was there to see
and then you came
down and had a good
time here with your
dolls and things. This
evening you were so
tired that you were
very cross, so mamma
put you to bed early.

Sunday Feb 18 -

This morning you and
Papa and Mama start
out to church and we did
have a good time going
and after we once got to
church we enjoyed the
services very much. You
again stayed and attended
your S. S. class and had a
very good time with
the little ones. You seemed
very much interested with
them all. On our way
back we stopped in and
visited with Dr Allen a
few minutes. You were very
happy and it did you
and him lots of good for he
has been very sick.

Monday Feb. 19 -

This morning Aunt-Ida
came down to spend the
day with us and we
were delighted for it.
has been such a long
time since she has
been here. We all took
a long walk this
afternoon after you all
took your naps and
we did have such good
times too. It did Mann
good to see all you little
ones enjoy it so much.

It is the first time
little brother has been
out in quite a number
of days and it made
him quite happy.

Tuesday Feb 20 -

This morning as soon as you had eaten your breakfast you asked Mama to let you go over to Aunt Berwick to spend the day as I had promised you last night. You were there until about four o'clock and then you came home and Aunt Ida, Russell, you and Mama all took a good long airing of about an hour and a half. This did us all a great deal of good and you little dears had so much fun too.

Wednesday Feb 21 -

This has been a very
unpleasant day outside
and yet my little Sonja
had quite a little fun
anyway for she took
a long walk with Aunt
Ida this morning and then
had a good appetite for
your dinner. We could
not have our fun as we
had planned this afternoon
on account of the terrible
snow storm but Uncle
Hannan came in a
little while this evening
and that made you
very happy.

Thursday Feb 22-

This has been a perfect day for you my little son. The kind you like best of all. Papa took you out - courting most of the afternoon as he was born today. You did have such a good time.

Mama enjoyed seeing you both come down the hill together on your sleds. Then for a little friend Anna Guel came to spend the day with you and you were both out together soon after them. You were both very tired babies tonight.

Friday Feb 23 -

Today my little son
went over to spend
a part of the forenoon
with you and Bessie
and came home about
now. Then stir aft.
Mama took you and
little brother out-in
your sleds and gave
you an airing. You
did enjoy it very
much too and it did
Mama lots of good
to see you. Then some
of your little friends
came in and helped
make a nice time.

Saturday Feb. 24 -

You was rather a
very disappointed little
girl this morning when
your little friend Ethel
did not come to spend
the day with you as
she usually does. It
left you rather alone
you thought. This aft.
work it because so
dreadfully cold that
Mama could not let
you go outside any as
much as she would
have to have done. Then
this evening we had a
regular old round-

- Sunday Feb. 25 -

It is a very cold day but my Sore hands to go to church so I think we will go just the same. You became very much out of patience with the weather before you reached the church but had a good time in S. School. This afternoon Papa was here and we did much as each one pleased and had a very pleasant afternoon of it. and were very happy together.

We all went to our beds early and had a good nights rest. It did us all lots of good.

- Monday Feb 26 -

This has been rather a
pleasant day and Cousin
Helen and Aunt Carrie
and Ida came down a
little while this forenoon
and then we were
invited over to Aunt
Berries to dinner. We
had a good time there
and had a lot of fun
as my little Sonja would
say. Then after we came
home you took a ride
on your little sled with
a little friend and in
all your life you never
came home as cold
before. Mama was frightened.

Tuesday Feb 27 -

It was a lovely day
for little folks and as
Mama had quite a little
to do Emma took you
up town and gave both
you and little brother
a good airing. You both
came home much
refreshed. This forenoon
you went over to spend
a little time with
Aunt Bessie. You
were both very good
babies all of this day
and Mama was very
glad you were so happy
together.

- Wednesday Feb 28 -

Mama left you little
folks at home with
Emma a little time
this afternoon while I
did a little very
necessary shopping up
town. When Mama
returned she found you
had grown up over to
Aunt Besseir and
were visiting as hard
as you could.

Mama called your
home soon to visit
with little brother who
was missing you very
much.

-Thursday March 1 -

Today Manna has been
very busy and has taken
up some new work for
this week. It will leave
you and little brother
quite to look after your
self and Manna must
teach you to look after
yourselves. Emma took
you both out this afternoon
again and brought
little brother in fast-
asleep. You did not
come home as good
natured as Manna
hoped you would.

- Friday March - 2 -

Today Mama has
spent most of the
morning picking up and
you have been very
busy with your broom
and sweater too.

Grandpa and Aunt Ida
came down this morning
a little time too and
you did enjoy that
very much too. Then
this afternoon Emma
took both you and
Mother out for the afternoon
again. Maria was out
this evening for a short
time too.

- Saturday March 3 -

This has been to you
a very lonely day and
for Mamma rather a
hard day. We all took
a ride of about eighteen
miles south, making it
in all nearer thirty five
than thirty. You seemed
just-diligited with it.
all and came home
feeling just simply
good. Grandpa and Aunt-
Ida, Uncle Harry and
Aunt-Bessie were there
too. It all seemed very
nice and we were
glad when it was
all over with.

- Sunday March 4 -

This has been rather
a very stormy day,
but you begged your
Papa to take you to church
and Sunday School
which he did. He
says there were only
about six little ones
there but that they
were very happy little
ones and you seemed
glad you went and
looked much refreshed
when you came home.
Mama loves to have
you go and you seem
almost as glad to go to.

-Monday March 5--

This has been another
very slushy day and
you could not go
out any at all. Papa
came home to spend
the evening and you
had a big time
with him and
Mama was relieved
quite a little and
could get quite a
little sewing done
beside canning for
her little ones for
the joy of having
Papa a while away

-Tuesday March 8-

It has not been very
pleasant out-side
today so my little
girl could only ride
out-in her little
cab but I think it
did you lots of good.

Mama and Papa
went out to spend the
evening last-night
and left you and
brother with Emma
until quite late but
you were very good
and not an bit of
need for worry so
Emma said.

Wednesday March 7-

Today little Helen
came down to see
you a little while
this morning and you
little ones were just
having much fun.

Mama loves to have
you together and wishes
you could often be
together. It would do
you good.

You and Mama
took a little walk
together this afternoon
and I think it did us
both lots of good.

Thursday March 8-

Today my little
girl was kind of under
the weather. She did
not feel very good
and so wanted lots
of attention and
wanted Mama to
turn her lots, which
she used to do, al-
ways turn. You
are a great comfort
to your Mama whether
sick or well. Mama
hopes you may always
be such a comfort
to her as you are now
my own little girl.

Friday March 9-

Today was a very
warm day and very
good sleighing so your
Russell and Mamie
took a ride over to
Grandpas and I stuck
I never did enjoy a
ride any more than I
did that for we took
our time and the
trees covered with frost
did look most fine.

You did your Grandpa
lots of good too I can
tell you and they did
us lots of good too.

Saturday March 10 -

Today it has not been
very pleasant outside.
It has been so sultry
that I dreaded letting
you walk any but
this afternoon. Ellet
Fuller was down and
took you out for
a little ride in your
cub which you seemed
to enjoy more than
any thing during the
whole week. You
seem to enjoy climbing
company more than
walking. You
slept well this
evening but you were tired.

Sunday March 11-

It was a lonely day
alone today but not
below for it has simply
been terrible to walk.

You walked to church
and every step back but
it was hard for you
and you were very tired
too. Uncle Harry, Aunt
Bessie, and Grace Dibbley
and Miss Cavanaugh
were here to dinner today.
We all had a pleasant
time together and then
this afternoon we had
quite a number of
gentlemen callers too
which pleased you much.

Monday March 12 -

Today Mama was
very tired for yesterday
she was very busy
and today Mama had
just to rest. You were
quite happy because
Uncle Herman came
here to dinner and
you all did have
such a good time
together. Then this
afternoon you were out-
with Emma and little
brother with you always
seen to saying many
much, too. You talk
almost all the time
when you are out now.

Tuesday March 13 -

It was a very lovely day out today and if Mamie could have down so she would burn later a dinner this afternoon that was so kindly offered her but as she could not she let you take it over instead. You took a good dinner with Uncle Harry and Aunt Jessie over to the farm to see Grandmum and Grandpa.

You were very tired because of so much fresh air and fun.

Wednesday March 12

You had quite a big
time to day as your
little Cousin Helen came
down to spend part of
the afternoon with you.

You did have a good
time and lots of fun.

You always do have
when you are together.

This afternoon you were
out with Mama to
make a few calls
about here in the
neighborhood and you
had a good time
as usual.

Thursday March 13 -

Today we had a great surprise for our Uncle William V. came to us after absence. It was the first time we had ever seen him and the first time he had ever seen us. You little ones were more than delighted at having him here with us and the evening was one of great rejoicing among us all as our surprise we had had all around. It was lots of fun too.

Friday March 16.-

Today is was a
most-disagreeable day
very cold and damp.
Mama took you both
over to Grandpa's to
spend the day. We had
a lovely time and found
plenty to do and lots
more to do after we
were gone. We became
very cold and damp
before our arrival at
home. You were two
very tired little ones
and Mama was tired
too. She wanted to go
out-tis evening but felt
too much used up.

Saturday March 17

Today has been a
very gloomy day and
Mamma almost-dreaded
dressing you in white
to go out this afternoon.

You were invited out
to a birthday party at
Candy Bustle does this
afternoon. You seemed
very anxious to go and
Mamma was glad to
have you only for the
terrible risk she was
concerned with the
whole thing. You
came home very much
delighted and very tired.

Sunday March 18-

This has been another very beautiful Sunday only just a little cold for this time of the year. Today soon my little girl started out to church with her Uncle Willim. You were not quite satisfied however at - not being in your own church. You found Mrs and Mr Hatch and Miss Fisher at our house to stay to dinner. We all had a most lovely time and lots of fun too as we always do.

Monday March 19 -

It is rather stormy outside and we have feared that you and little brother looked very much as though you might be sick with measles as you have been exposed. We shall keep you in rather closely until we are more sure about it and then we will give you the proper care. You have not felt very well nor been very good natured either for some time.

Tuesday March 20

Maria has been
quite busy this morning
with her house work
and you know kept
yourself just as busy
helping here and there.
Little brother is beginning
to want to help and
so he gets in our way
all the time and does
not help much after
all. You have been
a dear good little girl
all day and Mama
will let you go out
in afternoon a little
time. It will do you
good.

Wednesday March 21-
This has been rather a
slushy day and
Uncle Frank and Millie
Voecher down from
from Woodland. They
were here for a few
days and now are
here to stay a few days.
This will please you
little over more than
almost anything else
possibly could. Mama
is glad too for Uncle
Millie loves to lather you
out and it does you
lots of good too.

Thursday March 22 -
It has been very
cold today but your
Uncle Willim took you
out this afternoon just
the sunn and you
seemed to have a
good time and Russell
came in fast asleep.

Mama has been
giving lots of her time
to embroidery of late.
Miss Fisher of Jackson
has been here visiting
Mrs. Halich and it has
made it very hardy
for Mama. I am
afraid my little ones
have been a little neglected.

Friday March 23

This was not a very
pleasant day at all but
you, Russell and Mama
spent the day at
Grandpa's again and
we found it very
bad about getting back
home. You my little
girl became so cold
that you fairly shivered
before Mama could
get you home again.

We have not felt
very good this evening
in consequence, but
perhaps time will
do lots for us.

Saturday March 24 -

It has been quite pleasant outside today again and your Uncle William took you both out this afternoon.

Then he went out to spend a little time.

You were very tired and very nearly sick today and it made you both weary, to-night.

Uncle William took you down this afternoon and had you weighed and found you weighed just thirty five pounds. You see you are not losing much flesh now, again.

You have been very well this winter.

Sunday March 25-

This day has been
very beautiful, and it
has been full of
surprises too. You and
I went to church and
S. School. We enjoyed
the walk together and
the school too. Then
when we had reached
home Auntie Hatch had
invited us to dinner
with her. Maria was
very proud of the way
you behaved but she
was terribly ashamed
of Russell. He would
not be good from the
moment we reached the

Monday March 26 -

It has not been
at all pleasant today
and my little folks
could not go outside
even for a mile.

Your Uncle Herman
came in to dinner
which you enjoyed
very much and
made the train pass
more swiftly by than
it otherwise would.

This is political week
and I do not think
that you will see
very much of Papa this
week for he will be
very busy every minute
of the whole time.

Tuesday March 27

Spring is surely coming
for it has been very
lovely all of this day.

You were outside
with Uncle William and
seemed to have a good
time. This evening
after you were both
asleep Aunt Ida came
down to stay all night.

You did have a good
time in the morning
when you found so many
lives. You and brother
always enjoy lots of
entertainment - of any kind.

Mama is glad you
are having so well.

Wednesday March 28

It looked like rain this morning and yet it turned out very lovely. This afternoon Uncle William Vorhees who has been here for some time, and Roy Miller started out for the nest in search of mink. We will no doubt not see them for some time to come. You and Russell have enjoyed Uncle William being here more than I can say. He took you both out for your last ride this afternoon. You will miss him.

Thursday March 29

This forenoon you took
your little doll cab and
rushed out - quite a
little. It seemed like
last summer to see you
out - with it - for the
first time this year.

Then this afternoon you
went down town with
Austin Hatch and
Marian and Russell
went down with
Emma. Marian put
you both to your beds
early and you slept
very well as you were
both so tired for sleep
and play.

Friday March 30

It was very pleasant today and we were very much delighted about it too for you, brother, and Mama and Emma all went over to the farm and spent the day. We were very glad to be with Grandpa and Grandma for a whole day. They did enjoy the babies very much. You did lots to make them very happy. During the afternoon I saw you and Grandpa roaming around on the farm having a good time.

Saturday March 31

It was simply lovely outside today for little ones like you and brother so after dinner you and Auntie Hatch and Mama started out to do some shopping and you did enjoy it very much and then afternoon you and brother went down again with Emma. You seemed to enjoy it very much. Uncle Harry came in to supper and it is very you were very tired and terribly sleepy too.

Sunday April 1 -

This has been a very lonely Sunday and you and Mama started out for church together. We had a most lonely time together. You asked Mama this morning while I was getting you ready for S. School to be sure and wash your face clean for Uncle Uncle the parlor might want to kiss her and then he would not like to see her face untidy. This has been camp day week and you have not seen Papa before today.

Monday April 2 -

It has been raining
drearly all day and
you have not been
outside very much
only a short time
in your cala with
Emma. You have
been nervous as Mama
has been anxious to
have Papa elected
Supervisor of the first
and second wards
and he has been
It has made us
all much easier this
evening.

Tuesday April 3 -

It has been raining
and snowing most
of the day and my
little ones could not
go out for any long
walks but you took
your cab out little
Pauline had a fall
on the pavement and
bruised her head. A
man passing along
picked up the pieces
for you and helped
you in this seemed to
be a great comfort for
you. You could not
remember his name.

Wednesday April 2.

This morning you made a call with Mama at Misses Bastedorff. You were in hopes that soon you would bring me your little friend Cosy but it seems she was not at home. You never much disappointed to find that you had missed seeing Grandpa for being out this day. But my little girl always has a very good time no matter where she is.

Thursday April 5-

I have not been
at all pleased - and
Mamm thought-
you best not go out-
any. You had a
good romping time
in the house. But
Mamm isn't always
let her little ones
do as they are
romping most
of the time now.
I will all soon
be gone now.

Friday April 6th
Today Mama
went up to Auntie
Sophia's to spend the
day and to sew for
Mama Carter. We
made her two sailor
and they look well
and we had a good
time too. You were
awfully cold and had a
big day, a good
time and so very
tired when I reached
home. It did you
good to go I know.

Saturday April 7.

This has been
another happy day
for you as little
Ethel Fuller came
down to spend the
day and that is
all that is needed to
make you very happy.
You and Ethel
took a long ride
and that refreshed
you very wonderfully.
Then this evening
you and Mum
met her very early
and it did us good.

Sunday April 8.

This has been a
very nice Sunday
for us we all at-
home today and
that-always makes
it-pleasant. Mother
was not-feeling
at all well and it -
annoys us lots.

But she is looking
forward to their coming
out from New York
and that-makes
her very happy and
makes the forget-
ting thing eas-

Monday April 9-

This is the day
that Emma always
finds very hard of
all the days of the
week. You little
ones always find
so much you want-
us to help do on
Monday. You have
been very good natured
however. You have
been giving Popo a
list of what you
want when Mama
gets down dinner
for yourself. Russell
just stands and listens.

Tuesday April 10

It was very
rainy and unpleasant
outside again today
and my little ones
could not go out.

Mama was very
busy sewing but you
did all you could
to help out. You
were better natured
than Russell for
you did not feel
very well and expected
you to do most of
the playing all the time.

Wednesday 11 -

Mama was very
busy today and she
could not give you
very much time.
But you and Russell
were very good babies.

Papa surprised you
yesterday by bringing
you a new doll-like
wagon. You put
little babies into
it. The very first
thing that you did,
you drew him
all around the house
and it was very
cute and sweet for
you to think of it.

Thursday April 12

Today you and
Maud went over home
early this morning and
spent the day with
Grandpa and Grandma
and helped anything
we could to make all
things come out-right.

It was not a very
pleasant day, rather
rainy and slushy.

We drove home early
in the afternoon and
had lots to do here
this had been very
much neglected by
our lots of fun we
had while at Grandmas.

Friday April 13 -

This has been rather a busy day for Mama for we have yet to go to the train this afternoon to meet Uncle George and Aunt Grace and little baby George. You took your lovely nap before Mama had to start to the train and then you spent the most of the afternoon at one of your little friends near by while Mama was away.

Grandpa called and took Mama out for a ride and down to Chestnut corner to see them all there together and to have a good time for a while.

Saturday April 14

You did not see
your Auntie and
Uncle yesterday for
they did not come
down here before going
home. Your Uncle
George came down
early this morning and
found you on the
floor eating a banana.
As soon as you were
spoken to you stood
on your feet ready
to give him your
hand and much more
as you should. He
seemed as much
pleased with you as your
mother was -

Sunday April 15-

This has been a very
sweet Sunday. We were
all at church and you
my little girl were
there and wore your
new Spring and Easter
bonnet, which was given
you by Miss Clitbeiger.

You looked very sweet-
er in it. To meet your
Auntie for the first-
time she came back
home this time.

Then after dinner Papa
took us all over to
Grandpas to spend the
afternoon and you babies
all were quite happy
yesterday.

Monday - 16

I have not been
very pleasant-but-
you must make the
best of those things
these days. Aunt-
Grace, George and
the baby came down
today to dinner and
we had a very pleasant.
Then they stayed to
supper too and Mary
feels she has had
a great day. The
baby, Russell, and
you all slept and
took your naps
together.

Tuesday Apr. 17.

It has been a very disagreeable day and we could hardly go out - any, so Sora was not out either.

Our New York friends came down today and spent the most of the day with Aunt Bassin. They could not even peek in at us for they were so busy that until the rain & snow

Their shiny had a cozy ride home in the buggy with the lovely night air.

Wednesday Apr. 18.

Today Sora did
not see anything
of her Auntie or
Uncle - for they
did not come up
town today. They
were so tired of
yesterday that they
feel they must
stay in town night-
and day.

We are in hopes
to see more of them
soon and later.
you have been very
good today. -

Thursday April 19.

This has been another
very different day from
those just gone by. Aunt-
Grace went to Aunt-
Carrier to dinner and
Supper and you spent
the forenoon at Aunt-
Bessie's. You came
home with words of
praise for your visit.

Then this afternoon
while you were taking
your nap Mama took
a ride with Aunt-B.
and took little brother
afoul. You were very
glad to have us get-
back I can tell you
