Sir: As has been our practice in recent years, most of this report is made by the Chief Clerk over his own signature.

The bettered condition of the banks and payment of taxes has enabled us during the latter part of this biennium to return to the policy of keeping our funds more fully invested.

The commission is still withholding its land from sale for various reasons which we deem in the interest of the state, except in the Indian Reservations, which latter we believe should be purchased by the government to solidify those reservations.

There have been a few cases where some scattered burned over forties were wanted for completing adjoining farms.

Several small areas of blown down timber were sold.

Trespass of timber has increased in number, adding greatly to field work, although smaller in volume.

This commission has been pleased with the completeness with which its employes in the land office have handled their work—thus relieving us of much work which otherwise would have fallen upon us under our constitutional duties.

REPORT OF CHIEF CLERK

December 1, 1934.

TO THE HONORABLE COMMISSIONERS:

In my last report I went so fully into the most important single item we have before us—disposal of the state's land and timber in the Indian Reservations—that I shall treat the subject briefly in this report.

Since that report the situation has materially cleared up. We now have in charge of the Indian Office at Washington and in the Reservations in Wisconsin, men of mental complex that fit in with the Wisconsin idea of how to advance the condition of the Indians. The result appears to be an agreement that Congress in its 1935 session should, by appropriation from the general fund, purchase from the state all its land and timber and reimburse for timber already cut, with a view of solidifying the Reservations. This is particularly true in the Menominee Reservation, where the large government saw-mill is in operation, and where the state's thousands of acres of timber adds materially to the cost of operation.

In the case of the Lac du Flambeau and Bad River Reservations, the timber was cut and sold by the government and the receipts placed in escrow awaiting determination of title.

I suggest that an active effort be made to consummate this matter now, while conditions are very favorable.

THE MISSISSIPPI ISLANDS

We have succeeded in the contest over the title to several Mississippi islands. These islands are about to be flooded by dams now being completed. The value to be paid has been fixed by stipulation at \$7,223.55.

MUNSEE-STOCKBRIDGE

The conflicts reported in my last reports regarding water fronts in the old Munsee-Stockbridge Reservation have been cleared, with title conceded to the state.

TRESPASS OF TIMBER

Since the depression started the trespass of timber has taken a change. There have been less large ones and materially more small ones. We have only one field man, making it extremely difficult to get many of them.

CLEARING TITLES

For more than three years the General Land Office has been sending to this office lists of land to some of which the state may be entitled to indemnity. To examine these lists will require much time which we cannot spare now with our present limited personnel. However, there is no limit during which this work can be done and our rights preserved.

In my last report I spoke of the erroneous 1926 Fox and Wisconsin Improvement patents, which we have been correcting as requests have come in. There are more than 2,000 remaining to be corrected.

The Attorney General has taken steps to obtain from the county courts earlier and more complete reports on escheats, so that we may better guard the interests of the state.

During the last year we have discovered at the mouth of the Peshtigo river, Marinette County, approximately 1,200 acres of unsurveyed land and about 100 acres at the city of Oconto. This land is of the nature granted by the swamp land act of 1850. We shall soon ask for a survey by the General Land office with a view of securing patent.

There are approximately 1,400 acres of swamp lands to which the state has patents in the Mississippi river where dams are to be built within a year and which will be flooded. We are now arranging for stipulated valuation as the best manner of sale.

We need some record books but will keep the cost down to the lowest possible point.
