REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN

Madison, Wisconsin

Held in the President's Office

Saturday, November 11, 1950, 10 A.M.

PRESENT: Regents Arveson, Campbell, Gelatt, Grady, Hodgkins, Jones, Kleczka, Sensenbrenner, Watson, Werner.

Regent Jones left the meeting to participate in a memorial service on the College of Agriculture campus.

Upon motion of Regent Gelatt, seconded by Regent Watson, it was VOTED, That the minutes of the regular meeting of the Board held on October 14, 1950, be approved as sent out to the Regents, and that the minutes of the Executive Committee held on October 27, 1950, be approved, ratified and confirmed.

Vice President Peterson read a letter addressed to all State Departments by Governor Rennebohm requesting that no publicity be given to the biennial budget requests submitted by the various state departments for the next biennium until authorized to do so by the Governor-Elect.

Upon motion of Regent Hodgkins, seconded by Regent Kleczka, it was VOTED, That salary and service adjustments numbered 1 to 5, inclusive, listed under Actions by the President, be approved.

Upon motion of Regent Campbell, seconded by Regent Grady, it was VOTED, That the four leaves of absence listed under Actions by the President be approved.

That upon recommendation of the Carl Schurz Memorial Professorship Committee Constantin Von Dietze be appointed Carl Schurz Memorial Professor of agricultural economics for the second semester of the 1950-51 academic year at a salary of \$5000 for the semester with advances for traveling and living expenses to be paid from his salary; charge to the Carl Schurz Memorial Trust.

Upon motion of Regent Kleczka, seconded by Regent Gelatt, recommendation No. 1 listed under Appointment was adopted.

1. That George W. Hill, professor of rural sociology, be granted leave of absence, without pay, from November 27, 1950, to the close of the academic year 1950-51, in order that he may serve as adviser to the Venezuelan government on immigration and colonization programs.

REPORT OF THE VICE PRESIDENT OF BUSINESS AND FINANCE

I. Report of Actions Taken

- 1. Contracts and leases signed with the United States Government for research work, educational programs, and for services requested by the Government for military personnel and veterans, and for other educational services of the University:
 - Supplement No. 2 to Fifth Army Contract No. W-11-175-TNG-(AAV)-354, providing for additional training for an Army Officer in a graduate course in pharmacy to August 17, 1951, for which the Government pays the equivalent of the nonresident tuition.

- b. Supplement No. 2 to Fifth Army Contract No. W-11-175-TNG-(AAV)-414, terminating training as of August 18, 1950, of an Army officer in a course in chemistry.
- c. Navy Contract No. N600s-p-8830, covering enrollment of NROTC students for the period September 1, 1950 to June 30, 1951, under which the Government pays the equivalent of the nonresident tuition. (Estimated number of students per semester 140; estimated total revenue for the year \$58,800.)
- d. Army Chemical Corps Contract No. DA-18-064-CML-452, covering research in the Institute for Enzyme Research, during the period October 20, 1950 through October 19, 1951, under which the Government will contribute not to exceed \$20,000.
- e. Amendment No. 5, Task Order I, Office of Naval Research Contract No. N7onr-285, providing for continuation of research in the Department of Physics, through September 30, 1952, for which the Government will contribute an additional \$30,000.
- f. Amendment No. 1 to Office of Naval Research Contract No. N7onr-28506, providing for a fixed overhead rate of 25.8% in lieu of a provisional overhead rate at no change in the total estimated cost (\$6970) to the Government during the period June 15, 1950 through June 14, 1951, for graduate research in the Department of Zoology.
- 2. In accordance with the authority granted by the Regents on September 27, 1947, for the Vice President of Business and Finance to sign contracts and leases not in excess of \$2500, the following contracts and orders have been signed:
 - a. Lease from Robert Rabach, Sturgeon Bay, of 7 acres of land located in the S.E. quarter of the S.E. quarter of section 11, range 26E, township 27N, in the town of Sturgeon Bay, Door County, Wisconsin, to be used by the College of Agriculture for experimental work during the three-year period commencing January 1, 1951, at an annual rental of \$35.

Total cost \$105.00

b. Rental from Racine Woman's Club, Racine, of the Racine Woman's Club Building for two free public lectures on November 6 and December 11, 1950, sponsored by the Racine Extension Center.

Total cost 50

Upon motion of Regent Kleczka, seconded by Regent Grady, actions 1 and 2 listed under the report of the Vice President of Business and Finance (I. Report of Actions Taken) were approved.

Regent Gelatt presented the report of the Educational Committee. Upon motion of Regent Gelatt, seconded by Regent Kleczka, it was

VOTED, That sections 2, 3 and 4 of the action of the Regents on June 21,
1941, relating to the enrollment of male freshmen in the military training program,
be amended to read as follows:

- 2. That for the purpose of class instruction this total registration be reduced to the current Department of the Army quota by the:
 - a. Exemption of students who are qualified for and are accepted for membership in the Regimental Band.
 - b. Exemption of students who receive from the Health Department a physical rating below "A".
 - c. Exemption of students who are physically fit, but for bona fide reasons satisfactory to the Department request release from the military training.
 - d. Elimination by unit instructors of such registrants as are obviously not fitted for military training.
- 3. If the registrations and exemptions provided for above make a registration in excess of the current Department of the Army quota, the Department will exempt additional registrants to reduce the enrollment to the authorized quota.
- 4. If the registrations and exemptions provided for above reduce the total below the current Department of the Army quota, the department may cancel enough exemptions to bring the enrollment up to the current quota.

Upon motion of Regent Gelatt, seconded by Regent Campbell, it was VOTED, That Edwin Young be appointed Director of the School for Workers, Extension Division, and assistant professor of economics, College of Letters and Science, beginning February 1, 1951; salary \$475 per month, \$237.50 to be paid by the Extension Division, and \$237.50 by the College of Letters and Science; charge \$1187.50 to 2A and 2AB, School for Workers and \$1187.50 to Letters and Science. (Mr. Young's appointment in the College of Letters and Science for the academic year 1950-51 is reduced from full time to half time for the second semester.)

Upon motion of Regent Gelatt, seconded by Regent Kleczka, it was VOTED, That Vidkunn E. Ulriksson, Assistant Director of the School for Workers, be promoted to Associate Director of the School for Workers, beginning November 1, 1950, without change in salary. (Mr. Ulriksson will continue to hold the rank of assistant professor of economics.)

Upon motion of Regent Gelatt, seconded by Regent Hodgkins, it was VOTED, That the following recommendation of the University faculty on the Report of the Committee on University Functions and Policies relating to departmental recommendations regarding the annual budget and matters ordinarily associated therewith be approved:

The Faculty recommend to the Regents that the section of the University Laws which reads: "Departmental recommendations regarding the annual budget and matters ordinarily associated therewith, such as appointments, dismissals, promotions, and salaries, shall be made by the full and associate professors, and shall be transmitted through the chairman to the appropriate dean" be amplified to authorize specifically the delegation of departmental budget recommendations, as follows:

Departmental recommendations regarding the annual budget and matters ordinarily associated therewith, such as appointments, dismissals, promotions, and salaries, shall be made by the full and associate professors, and shall be transmitted through the chairman to the appropriate deam. The committee of full and associate professors may delegate by annual action to a smaller committee or committees or to the departmental chairmen any part or all of the following (a) recommendations regarding salaries, equipment and supplies (b) recommendations for appointment or promotion of classified personnel and appointment of assistants, and may delegate by annual action to the full professors recommendations for promotions to that rank. (See Chapter VIII, 26 - Second Report, Internal Survey, of the Committee on University Functions and Policies)

Upon motion of Regent Gelatt, seconded by Regent Kleczka, it was VOTED, That upon recommendation of the University Faculty, with reference to the Report of the Committee on University Functions and Policies relating to the duties of the University Committee, and with the substitution of the words "as may be deemed important" for the words "as it wishes" in the recommendation as submitted by the Faculty, Item 2 of the Rules Relating to the Duties of the University Committee, which now reads:

"A specific examination of all actions taken from time to time respecting the University and its policies by the State Board of Education, the Board of Regents, the Board of Visitors, the various Faculties or Faculty Committees, or by other bodies of individuals related in any way to the University";

be amended to read as follows:

"A specific examination, as may be deemed important, of any actions taken from time to time respecting the University and its policies by the Board of Regents, the Board of Visitors, the various Faculties or Faculty Committees, or by other bodies of individuals related in any way to the University".

Professor Edwin Young appeared before the Board and was presented to the members of the press.

Regent Werner presented the report of the Business and Finance Committee and announced that Regent Jones was necessarily absent because of participation in another activity on the campus.

Upon motion of Regent Werner, seconded by Regent Hodgkins, it was VOTED, That the 16-B Agricultural Research Salaries and Wages budget for 1950-51 be increased \$7000 on account of additional federal appropriations for agricultural research work.

Upon motion of Regent Werner, seconded by Regent Hodgkins, it was VOTED, That paragraph 3 of the action of the Executive Committee of the Regents on June 2, 1926, establishing the Cora Rodermund Evans Loan Fund for Medical Students be revised to read as follows:

3. That interest be charged at the rate of 3 per cent per annum after the student has received his Medical Degree, and that no interest be charged while the student is in school prior to receiving his Medical Degree.

Upon motion of Regent Werner, seconded by Regent Kleczka, it was VOTED, That the Attorney General be requested to take appropriate action to obtain compliance with the provisions of Section 174.13, Wisconsin Statutes, relating to the procurement of dogs for the laboratories of the University of Wisconsin Medical School. (Regent Campbell voted "No".)

Upon motion of Regent Werner, seconded by Regent Hodgkins, it was VOTED, That upon the recommendation of the committees appointed, in conformity with Regent authorization of May 13, 1950, to negotiate with qualified engineering consultants for a survey of campus utility services, the Vice President of Business and Finance be authorized to sign an agreement with Sargent and Lundy, Chicago, Illinois, for a survey and recommendations regarding the University's problems related to steam and electrical utility services and needs, at a cost not to exceed \$5,000 chargeable to the post-war construction funds allotted for Utility Services.

Upon motion of Regent Werner, seconded by Regent Kleczka, it was VOTED (a) That \$225,000 be transferred from unbudgeted 1-E receipts to the 1950-51 budget item - Reserve for Capital Purchases, Remodelling and Contingencies.

(b) That the following allotment for remodelling and improvements be made from the Reserve for Capital Purchases, Remodelling and Contingencies:

I. \$529,000 for:

- (i) Remodelling, repairs, improvements and equipment in the first and second floors of the Education-Engineering Building to provide useable facilities for the School of Education, the College of Letters and Science and for general classrooms, laboratories and offices in the said Education-Engineering Building.
- (ii) Remodelling space in the old Electrical Engineering Art Education Building, which has been vacated by the
 College of Engineering, and for repairs, improvements
 and equipment to provide useable facilities for the
 College of Letters and Science and for general classrooms, laboratories and offices in the said old
 Electrical Engineering Art Education Building.
- (iii) Remodelling Hiram Smith Hall and the Dairy Annex and for repairs, improvements and equipment to provide useable facilities in those buildings for the College of Agriculture.

ii. \$ 65,000 for:

Remodelling, repairs, improvements and equipment to provide useable facilities for University departments in the following buildings and areas:

Horticulture Building, Mechanical Engineering Building, Law Building, Bascom Hall, Sterling Hall, Chemistry Building (Pharmacy), Primate Laboratory for Psychology, Naval Armory, T-17, T-18, T-25, Arboretum buildings, and for improving parking lots, crossover water connections, heat controls, compressed air lines, and to provide a well at Picnic Point.

- (c) That subject to the approval of the State Bureau of Engineering, the Vice President of Business and Finance be authorized to sign contracts with private architects for the preparation of plans and specifications for the remodelling, repair and improvement of the Education-Engineering Building, the old Electrical Engineering Art Education Building, Hiram Smith Hall, and the Dairy Annex, and for the supervision of the contract work. The architects' fees not to exceed the standard A.I.A. rates for architectural work of this type.
- (d) That the Vice President of Business and Finance be authorized to negotiate contracts with private contractors for the remodelling, repair and improvement of the Education-Engineering Building, the old Electrical Engineering Art Education Building, Hiram Smith Hall and the Dairy Annex on either a fixed price or cost plus fixed fee basis, and to present for the approval of the Board or the Executive Committee specific proposals for these remodelling, repair and improvement projects.

Upon motion of Regent Werner, seconded by Regent Hodgkins, it was VOTED, That \$100,000 be allotted from the 1-E Peserve for Capital Purchases, Remodelling and Contingencies in the 1950-51 budget for the purchase of capital equipment, subject to release by the President of the University.

Upon motion of Regent Werner, seconded by Regent Campbell, it was VOTED, That authority be granted to advertise for bids for the construction of the west wing of the Home Economics Building.

President Fred reported that Governor Rennebohm was releasing funds for the construction of the West Wing of the Home Economics Building from savings on the Memorial Library Building project and stated that the West Wing of the Home Economics Building would be comparable in size to the East Wing of the building and would provide much needed space to relieve the crowded condition of the present Home Economics Department facilities and would permit the department to carry out additional desired work.

Regent Grady presented the following resolution:

"The Regents commend the spirit which prompted the students and faculty in recommending the protection and preservation of human rights in the University of Wisconsin.

"The Regents are unanimous in their belief that the faculty and officers of the University of Wisconsin, throughout the long years of its history, have made an outstanding record in the safeguarding of human rights. Our University has historically served, regardless of race or creed, all who have sought its instruction. Its students now include members of all groups and segments of society, accepting each other and learning together. The Regents are proud of the ability of any student on our campus to gain recognition upon his or her individual merits, and are pleased with the growth in understanding upon our campus — an understanding so sorely needed in America and in the world.

"THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the University of Wisconsin shall in all its branches and activities maintain the fullest respect and protection of the Constitutional rights of all citizens and students regardless of race, color, sect, or creed; and any violation thereof shall immediately be reported to the administration and the Regents for appropriate action to the end that any such violation of Constitutional rights shall be promptly and fully corrected, and future violations prevented."

Regent Grady moved the adoption of the resolution, which was seconded by Regent Kleczka.

Regent Gelatt then moved to amend the resolution by adding the words "and they hereby approve Document 933, as revised" to the end of the sentence in the first paragraph. The motion to amend was seconded by Regent Watson.

Regent Grady was of the opinion that the recital of the resolution fully covered each and every question involved.

Regent Watson, in order that the record and the motion might be understood, believed it was necessary for the Board of Regents in some way to recognize receipt of Document 933 and in some way dispose of it. He thought that Document

933 had been well done and that the committee responsible for its preparation had cooperated to the utmost with the Board of Regents in making language changes that were desired. Regent Watson stated that the Regents ought to dispose of Document 933 and that he was in accord with Mr. Gelatt in approving it as an amendment to Mr. Grady's fine resolution.

A roll call on the amendment was then taken - Regents Arveson, Gelatt, Watson voting "Aye"; Regents Campbell, Grady, Hodgkins, Kleczka, Sensenbrenner, Werner voting "No". The amendment was declared lost.

Regent Watson then moved that the resolution be amended in the same way by approving Document 933 in principle. The motion to amend was seconded by Regent Gelatt.

Regent Grady indicated that there were certain recitals in Document 933 to which he had objection because he did not believe that it accurately stated the facts as they had been brought to the Regents and that there were certain actions included in the document for which there was no proof. For those reasons Regent Grady opposed the amendment.

Regent Kleczka opposed the amendment for the same reasons as stated by Regent Grady.

Regent Gelatt reported that at the meeting of the Regents in May a majority of the Regents felt that Document 933 as it then existed was in many respects a good report but that there were some things that they felt needed to be changed. He was of the opinion that most all of the things that were specified to be changed at that time had been revised in the present document and that although there might still be a few points of language in which some of the Regents might differ, in principle they were in agreement. Regent Gelatt was of the opinion that a few members of the Regents were letting disagreement with a few points cloud their full agreement with the principle. He expressed his belief that most of the members of the Board, if they would examine their positions carefully, would approve the document.

Regent Watson inquired as to whether Regent Grady's resolution pertained to Document 933.

Regent Grady asked whether his motion conflicted with Document 933. He acknowledged that the resolution did not mention 933 but that it was all inclusive, except with respect to the recitals he had noted, and that it so far as possible protected the constitutional rights of all citizens and students.

Regent Campbell reported that the revised Document 933, when it was brought to the Regents, did not carry out the promise that was made by the committee (University Committee) to eliminate two things, one of which was the reference to "inter-racial living" which he stated was taken out of the report, and the other one was the statement that the University had discriminated against negroes, which he stated had not been taken out of the report. Regent Campbell was of the opinion that the Regents could not take the report as written because it did not carry out what the committee agreed to do. He indicated that he was opposed to the amendment. He objected to the report demanding that private housing be not recognized

unless private owners agreed to take student roomers regardless of race, color, or creed, because he believed that the Regents shouldn't try to take fundamental rights away from individual property owners.

A roll call on Regent Watson's amendment to the resolution was then taken - Regents Arveson, Gelatt, Watson voting "Aye"; Regents Campbell, Grady, Hodgkins, Kleczka, Sensenbrenner, Werner voting "No". The amendment was declared lost.

A roll call was then taken on the original motion, all Regents voting "Aye", with Regents Gelatt and Watson qualifying their votes as follows:

Regent Gelatt voted "Aye" with the reservation that he believed that the amendments as previously offered should be passed.

Regent Watson voted "Aye" but requested that the record show that he believed the Regents should have acted upon Document 933.

The Secretary reported that Regent Jones had requested that he be recorded as voting in favor of Regent Grady's resolution.

Regent Watson presented the following resolution:

"The Regents record with satisfaction the desire of the student board to be of aid and assistance to the Regents as expressed to the Regents by their recent communication and by the student board president, Karl Steighorst, personally on October 13, 1950.

"The Regents of the University derive their responsibilities from the statutes which state in part: 'The government of the University shall be vested in a board of regents of nine members' and '....shall possess all the powers necessary or convenient to accomplish the objects and perform the duties prescribed by law' The statutes also declare - 'The board of regents shall enact laws for the government of the University in all its branches.'

"It is obvious that the Regents cannot delegate nor can they share their responsibility for the operation and control of the University. The Regents do recognize, however, that in many of their considerations it is extremely helpful to have student opinion. Such student opinion has been sought in the past and the Regents are now advised that the student board offers its personnel in any informal advisory manner desired by and agreeable to the Regents.

"The Regents, therefore, accept the offer of the student board and direct their secretary to advise the student board that the Regents

from time to time will call upon representatives of the student body and other campus groups for such counsel and information as the Board of Regents may deem desirable."

Upon motion of Regent Watson, seconded by Regent Hodgkins, the resolution was adopted.

President Fred displayed and presented to the Regents a United Nations flag which had been presented to the University as a part of the United Nations Day program by the University of Wisconsin 4-H Club and recommended acceptance of the flag by the Regents. Upon motion of Regent Werner, seconded by Regent Watson, it was

VOTED, That the United Nations flag presented to the University by the University of Wisconsin 4-H Club as a part of the United Nations Day program be accepted by the Regents and that the Secretary be directed to thank the University of Wisconsin 4-H Club for the flag.

Regent Werner presented the following resolution:

"President Fred and the University of Wisconsin have been honored by the appointment, by the President of the United States, of President Fred as a member of the National Science Board of the newly created National Science Foundation. This represents not only an honor but also an opportunity for service to the state and nation.

"The National Science Foundation was created by the last session of the United States Congress for the purpose of strengthening the scientific research and educational activities of the entire nation. This increased support to scientific research and education will strengthen all of the technical aspects of the nation including the military, industrial and public health potentials.

"The National Science Board will be responsible for the establishment of policies within the provisions of the legislation creating the National Science Foundation. The twenty members of the National Science Board are all recognized leaders in the fields of industry, research and education. The administration of the activities of the National Science Foundation will be performed by a full time staff.

"THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Board of Regents express their appreciation of this tangible expression of the nationwide reputation of President E. B. Fred as an excellent scientist and administrator."

The certificate of appointment, signed by President Harry S. Truman and Secretary of State Dean Acheson, was shown to the Regents.

Upon motion of Regent Werner, seconded by Regent Kleczka, the resolution was adopted unanimously.

The Secretary reported that the next meeting of the Regents would be held on December 9, 1950.

President Sensenbrenner announced that apparently the meeting would adjourn prior to the time for the official observance of Armistice Day. In accordance with a motion made by Regent Watson, the Regents rose and faced the East in observance of Armistice Day.

Upon motion of Regent Werner, seconded by Regent Hodgkins, the meeting adjourned at 10:50 A.M.

RECOMMENDATION OF THE ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE CONCERNING CREDIT FOR ADVANCED WORK IN MILITARY SCIENCE AND AIR SCIENCE

Recommended Substitute:

"3. That the two-year period of the Advanced Course be regarded as a unit and that credits be granted only upon the completion of the unit; that credits each semester be entered on the Registrar's books as provisional until the course has been completed; provided, however, that any student satisfactorily completing a curtailed Advanced Course prescribed by the Department of the Army or Air Force, or discharged for physical disability prior to completing the prescribed course, shall be allowed two credits for each semester completed, upon recommendation of the appropriate ROTC department."

Present Regulation:

"3. That each two-year period be regarded as a unit and that credits be granted only upon the completion of each one of these units; that credits each semester be entered on the Registrar's books as provisional until the course, basic or advanced as the case may be, has been completed." (University faculty minutes of May 1, 1933)

Present statement: (bulletin of the School of Education, page 16, paragraph No. 2, lines 14-19) "Students in the School of Education who are candidates for the University Teachers Certificate shall present evidence of their speech proficiency by meeting the requirements of either Option A or Option B as given below. It is recommended that students registered in other colleges of the University, and who plan to enter the School of Education as candidates for the University Teachers Certificate, meet one of the options before applying for admission."

Recommended statement: "All students who are candidates for the University Teachers Certificate shall present evidence of their speech proficiency by meeting the requirements of either Option A or Option B as given below. It is required that students registered in other colleges of the University, and who plan to prepare for the University Teachers Certificate, meet one of the options before registering for the professional courses in education."

Present statement: (bulletin of the School of Education, page 17, paragraph 3) "Students in special courses having a complete four-year curriculum, such as the Courses in Chemistry, the Course in Humanities, and the Schools of Commerce, Journalism, and Music, will retain their classifications in their respective colleges, but must also register in the School of Education in order to receive the University Teachers Certificate."

Recommended statement: "Students in special courses having a complete four-year curriculum, such as the Course in Chemistry, the course in Humanities, and the Schools of Commerce, Journalism and Music, will retain their classifications in their respective colleges, but must also register in the School of Education and give evidence of proficiency in speech (See Option A or Option B, page 16) in order to receive the University Teachers Certificate."
