in time, the sun is gone.



Gradual afternoon sun.

comes to us.


Dusk. We find it hard to



## Precious And Few








For the seniors the tennis season came and went like hitting a ball over the net -- here one moment and gone the next! The underclassmen are anxiously waiting for next year's matches.



The varsity did fairly well this year in sub-sectionals and sectionals, with all the players getting into the second round play-offs and one doubles team getting into sectionals.












# "Senioritis" Affects Seniors
