


## MATH AND YOU




## Science In The Schoolroom!

A sense of accomplishment that accompanied the design and completion of independent projects in these classes cannot be rivaled by any other task.


Some of the woods classes again built the modular office components. Watching these structures take shape in the middle of the shop was ... very satisfying.




# Tough As The Pigskin!




## Girls' Tennis Has Year Of Rebuilding





The gymnastics team had an increase in membership this year, partly because they lost no seniors from last year. Their routines in all areas were more difficult than in past years.




## Gettrust & Jozwowski: Co-MVP's




## Track Teams Gain Prestige!



# WHS HISTORY





## WHS History

**1904** Waterford got its first High School. It was on the upper floor of the then new Graded School.

**1916** The High School obtained its own building because of a donation made by Mrs. J. B. M. Kuhler, a relative of Mr. Levi Barnes. The three story building with its seven classrooms was named in honor of Mr. Barnes, one of the city fathers.

**1941** The first addition, consisting of the first Gym (now the apparatus room and Boys' Locker room) four additional classrooms, and a library were added. A Solarium was paid for by a donation of A. Cooper.



**1957** The second addition added a larger library, the present Gym, and several more classrooms.

**1964** This addition consisted of our present library, shop classes, the offices, and the first cafeteria. Also, the 1916 Levi Barnes building (the **real** tower) was torn down at this time, because it was ruled to be unsafe.

**1975** The most recent addition, what we call the "New" building, consists of Business Education, Art, and a new gymnasium. It was constructed in 1975.






# Editor's Page

If the recording and documenting of history is considered a difficult task, then recording High School history, with pen and camera, while one is in High School must be considered a task **twice** as difficult. Yet this is what the yearbook editor and his staff must attempt, and accomplish, year after year, book after book, and then receive little, if any gratitude for their long labors.

Perhaps a short explanation of how a yearbook is created is in order. Each page consists of three integrated parts: the layout & artwork, requiring artistic ability; the copy, requiring writing **and** editing talents; and the pictures, requiring both a working knowledge of cameras and knowledge of developing and processing techniques.

To write the copy, the person must gather all accessible information, and then sit down and write some creative, interesting copy. It must be typed, edited for grammar, spelling, and size considerations, and then retyped on a triplicate form.

The photographer must take his pictures, keeping himself hidden so that all of the photos do not appear the same, develop the negatives, and make prints from the good shots. All of which takes several hours of work to complete.

Once the photos and copy are done, the layout artist must try to integrate them so that the page is easy to read, and does not appear cluttered. He makes a few preliminary sketches, does a practice layout form, and then transfers it to a triplicate form. He

must be careful to label every photo, art, or section of type, as well as if there will be a background screen or color and other minor, yet necessary information for the plant.

The Editor-then gives the page a final checkover, and Voila-you have now completed ONE yearbook page. Things are looking up, you only have 155 more to go!

Remember, this yearbook has been produced by your friends, your classmates. If your abilities to do the same job are better, and you are able to justly criticize their work, then perhaps **you** are the person the staff needs to correct those errors next year. If you can do no better, and take **all** things into consideration when you guess, then perhaps you have no right to criticize.
