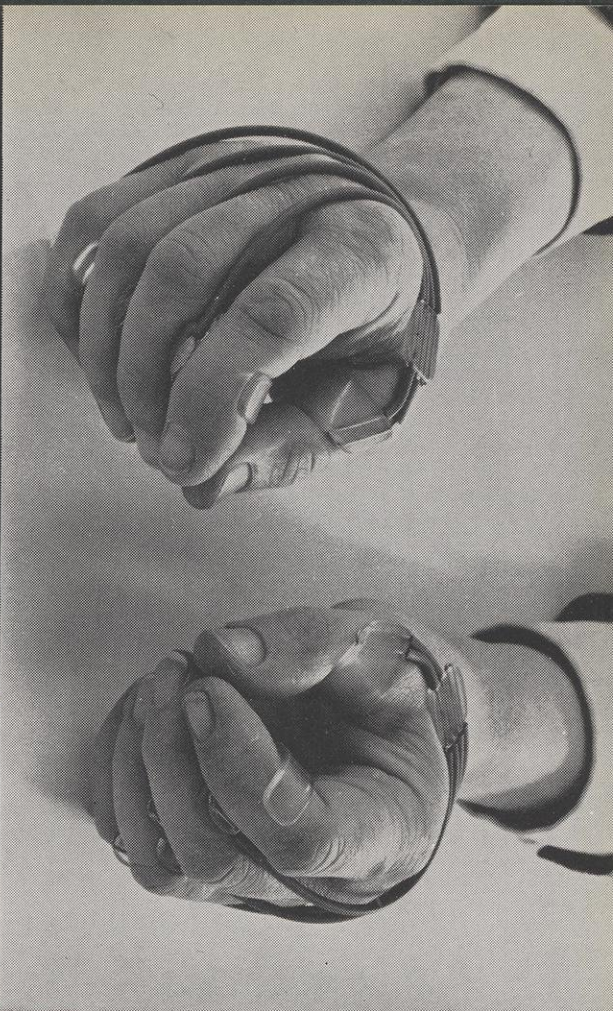
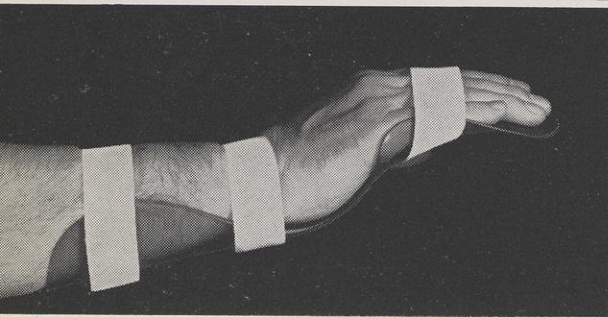

LIVELY HAND SPLINTS FOR DIGITAL EXTENSOR WEAKNESS. These splints consist of carefully positioned thermoplastic finger troughs, attached to rubber covered wire "assists", which provide the force required to hold the fingers in extension against the opposing flexor muscles. Light, cosmetically acceptable; eliminate need for unsightly straps and buckles. Five finger model illustrated. Also available as: a radial palsy splint for maintaining digital extension of the hand; thumb, index and middle finger splint for 3 point prehension; and, thumb and index splint for median nerve paralysis.
