WISCONSIN HOCKEY COACH

BOB JOHNSON IS IN HIS NINTH YEAR AS BADGER MENTOR AND AS ALWAYS IS OPTIMISTIC ABOUT KEEPING THE CARDINAL AND WHITE AT THE FOREFRONT OF COLLEGE HOCKEY. DURING HIS TENURE AS THE WISCONSIN COACH, HOCKEY HAS MOVED FROM A NON-REVENUE SPORT, TO THE NUMBER TWO MONEY MAKING SPORT AT WISCONSIN. THE BADGER ICEMEN UNDER JOHNSON HAVE WON THREE CONSECUTIVE BIG TEN TITLES STARTING IN 1971-72, WON THE NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP IN 1973, AND HAVE LED THE NATION IN ATTENDANCE FOR THE PAST FIVE SEASONS.

JOHNSON TOOK OVER THE COACHING REIGNS AT WISCONSIN IN THE 1966-67 CAMPAIGN. OPERATING AS AN INDEPENDENT FOR THREE SEASONS, JOHNSON'S BADGERS JOINED THE TOUGH VESTERN COLLEGIATE HOCKEY ASSOCIATION FOR THE 1969-70 SEASON. IN THEIR FIRST YEAR IN THE LEAGUE WISCONSIN SURPRISED THE COLLEGE HOCKEY WORLD BY FINISHING FOURTH (ALL OTHER FIRST YEAR TEAMS HAD FINISHED LAST) AND THEN TOOK THIRD PLACE IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT AT LAKE PLACID, N.Y.

THE PAST FIVE YEARS JOHNSON HAS LED THE BADGERS TO THE NCAA TOURNAMENT THREE TIMES. AFTER THE THIRD PLACE FINISH IN 170, WISCONSIN THIRD IN 1972 AND WON THE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP IN 1973.

THE BADGER BOOSTERS HAVE RESPONDED TO THE JOHNSON STYLE OF WINNING HOCKEY IN RECORD NUMBERS. IN EACH OF THE PAST FIVE SEASONS THE BIG RED HAS LED THE NATION IN COLLEGIATE HOCKEY ATTENDENCE. IN THE 1973-74 SEASON 168,239 WITNESSED 20 HOME GAMES, AN AVERAGE OF 8,412, BOTH FIGURES ARE COLLEGE AND SCHOOL RECORDS.

DURING THE PAST YEAR JOHNSON RECEIVED ADDED RECOGNITION AS A HOCKEY COACH. THE U.S. OLYMPIC COMMITTEE NAMED HIM AS THE HEAD COACH FOR THE 1976 U.S. HOCKEY TEAM COMPETITING IN THE OLYMPICS. After a military obligation in Korea and a try at professional baseball, Johnson started coaching at Marroad, Minn. High School. A Year later he became head coach at Minneapolis Roosevelt High School where his teams won 51 of 60 conference games in six seasons.

IN 1963 JOHNSON ENTERED THE COLLEGE RANKS, STARTING A THREE YEAR STINT AT COLORADO COLLEGE AS HOCKEY AND BASEBALL COACH. HIS CC HOCKEY TEAMS HAD A RECORD OF 29-51-3. AS BASEBALL COACH HE WAS NAMED COACH OF THE YEAR FOR THE NCAA COLLEGE DIVISION ROCKY MOUNTAIN DISTRICT IN 1964 AND 1965.

JOHNSON RECEIVED A BACHELOR OF SCIENCE DEGREE FROM MINNESOTA IN 1954, A MASTERS DEGREE IN 1961 AND A PHD IN 1963 ALSO FROM MINNESOTA. ALONG WITH HIS COACHING RESPONSIBILITIES AT WISCONSIN HE IS A FULL PROFESSOR IN THE PHYSICAL EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

BOB AND HIS WIFE MARTHA ARE THE PARENTS OF FIVE CHILDERN.
