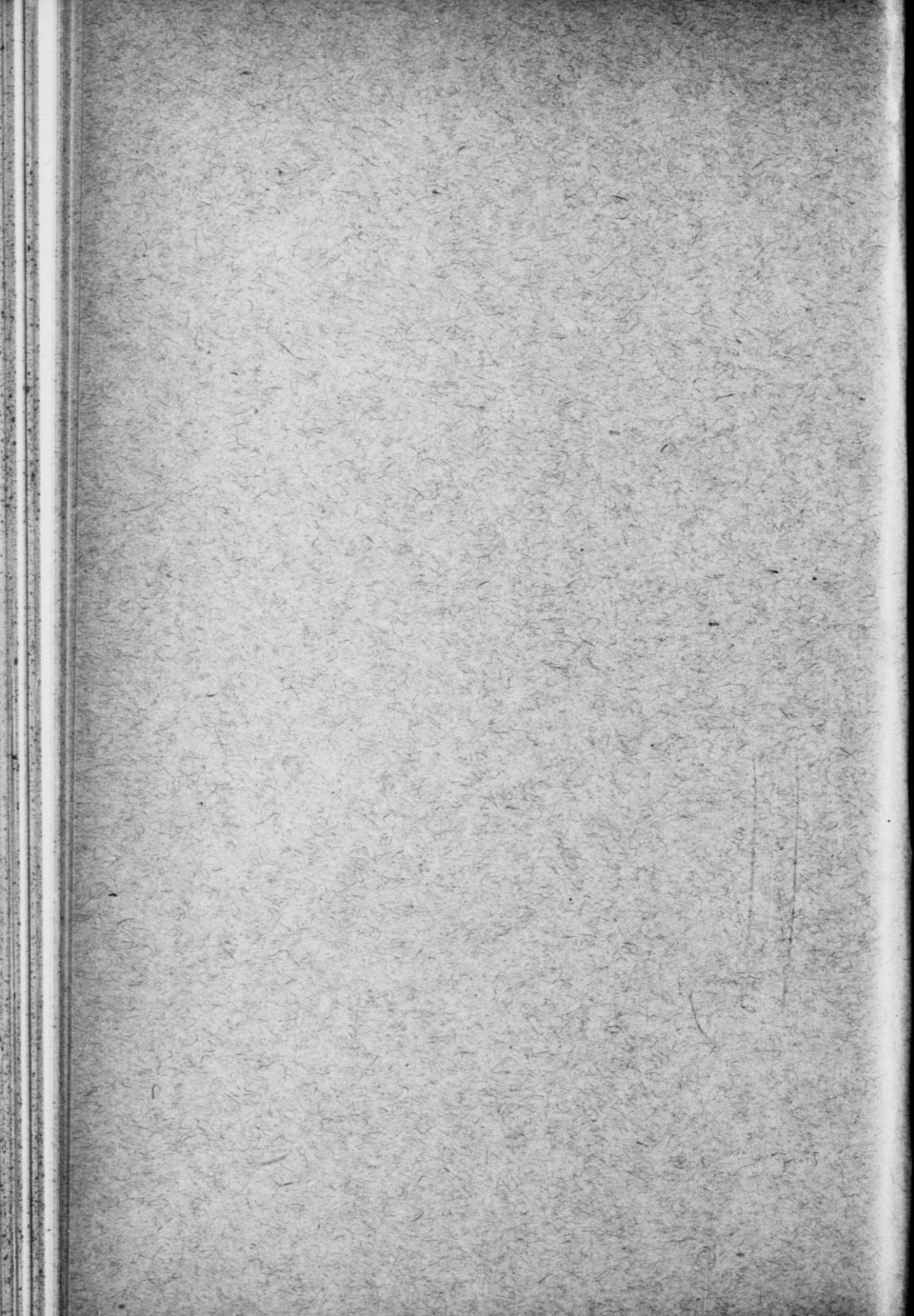

Governor of Wisconsin.

In compliance with law, we place before you our report of the transactions of the Land Department for the biennial fiscal term ending June 30, 1922.

Exhibit "D" shows that there are carried on the books of this department individual loans aggregating \$799.24 on which no interest has been paid for forty years and which are unsecured and worthless. Some action to discontinue the carrying of these accounts from year to year should be taken.

The field notes of government survey that are filed in this department, in the course of time and handling have become almost illegible and more or less mutilated. Provisions should be made for transcribing the same.

Tabulated statements, marked Exhibits A to I inclusive, show in detail the transactions of the Department and status of lands and trust funds for the term covered by this report.

Section 24.39, Wisconsin Statutes, created by Chapter 454, Laws of Wisconsin 1917, empowers the Commissioners to lease parcels of the public lands. Under that section there have been quite a number of leases executed for pastures and hay meadows and small lots on shores of northern lakes for summer homes and hunting and fishing lodges.

Under operation of Chapter 477, Laws of 1915, \$592,891.77 of the certificates of indebtedness have been retired and that amount added to the state trust funds. Practically all of this has been reinvested in

loans to school districts and municipalities of the state as authorized by law. Pursuant to the act cited there will be \$100,000 of the old certificates of indebtedness retired annually until all are paid. Old certificates of the University Fund as well as that of the Agricultural College Fund have been retired leaving a balance on certificates of indebtedness in the School Fund \$1,163,700.00 and that of the Normal School Fund \$1,000,000.00

The aggregate for the past two years is \$3,540,288.76 as against \$1,683,222.70 for the biennial term ending June 30, 1920, an increase of \$1,857,066.06 during the said term.

All preliminary work and the recording of such loans is performed in the Land Office.

Calls for certified copies of field notes of surveys, plats, patents and transcripts from the records increase in number as the state continues to develop.

We recommend that the coming Legislature should authorize the Commissioners of Public Lands to place the public lands on the market again.
