Tribute to Regent Ben R. Lawton and Installation of Portrait, pp 2-5

Introducing a videotaped interview with Regent Lawton, President Weinstein stated as follows:

"This morning, it is my honor to recognize the contributions of Dr. Ben Lawton for his leadership as president of this board. I visited with Ben and Ruth this week. They know this ceremony is taking place. I wish they were here with us, and I know you do, but I can assure you they are thinking of us now, as we are thinking of them. I thought it would be appropriate to share with you a recent interview with Ben which was part of the January 23rd edition of Wisconsin Magazine, co-produced by WHA-TV and the State Educational Communications Board. Some of you have certainly viewed the tape, as I have, but I believe it has special significance today. It is appropriate, I think, that we view it again. It was taped during the week of January 19 at Ben's home in Marshfield, and I think it stands for the kind of person that Ben is and his thoughts about education and a series of other subjects."

The text of the taped interview follows:

Interviewer: "Dr. Lawton is the former President of the University of Wisconsin Board of Regents and also a surgeon who has headed the Marshfield Clinic for many years. If you ask any number of former Wisconsin governors and senators and the like who they admired most in our state, Ben Lawton's name would eventually turn up. Ben Lawton is dying of cancer. His illness has tempered the intensity of his voice but not the intensity of his beliefs. Some last thoughts now from Ben Lawton.

Interviewer: "Dr. Ben Lawton is best known for presiding over University of Wisconsin Board of Regents' meetings, but this isn't a story about Ben Lawton's past. Even though he is dying, this is a story about the passionate views Ben Lawton holds for today and for the future. Lawton is nothing if not outspoken on the issues of the day. Here's a sampling. On the survivability of a nuclear war:

Regent Lawton: "There are still people at a very high level who think that nuclear war is survivable. And there are people who still seriously set up forums regarding the medical consequences of a nuclear war. Well, it's nonsense.

Interviewer: "On making too much money:

Regent Lawton: "The thing that makes me mad is the attitude of some in our society that money gives them some privilege.

Interviewer: "On doctors who make too much money: Are there some doctors who just make too much money? Are they too well off?

Regent Lawton: "Yes. I'm not making any friends preaching that, but there are some specialties where the monetary reward is vulgar, it is so great.

Interviewer: "This past president of the Board of Regents lives in a modest home in a modest neighborhood on the edge of Marshfield. When we drove up to your house, I thought 'this is interesting, that the renowned Ben Lawton, famous surgeon, president of the Board of Regents, lives in this quiet, rather modest neighborhood.'

Regent Lawton: "This reflects my philosophy of life. All I ever have demanded, moneynwise, is that I make enough money so that I don't have to worry about money. And that's always been true.

Interviewer: "Growing up, money was a worry for the Lawton family. He was a milkman and a carpenter, working his way through school. He owes everything, he says, to the university.

Regent Lawton: "My own career is an example of accessibility. Were it not for this University System, I might still be delivering milk, because I went to the university with absolutely no visible sign of support.

Interviewer: "I guess I'm interested in your views on education, why it is important for the future of this state to have the kind of system it does.

Regent Lawton: "Well, we're getting back to the same terminology--accessibility. I think it's crucial. At this time in our state's economic development, which has had so much hype that it's coming out of our ears, economic development is a buzz word. To ignore education, though, as a huge part of that would be shortsighted indeed.

Interviewer: "I want to ask you to imagine for a moment that the new governor was in the room here. What kind of passionate lecture would you give him about preserving the university?

Regent Lawton: "I would emphasize the points that I have just made regarding economic development. I guess I would also prevail upon his and my common background of small-town origin--the fact that I was born within ten miles of where he was born. I was born in Hillsboro. So I would appeal to that a little bit too.

Interviewer: "Ben Lawton wants to be remembered as a doctor who performed over 30,000 surgeries. But mostly, he wants to be remembered as a teacher. What are you proudest of, in your career?

Regent Lawton: "In my career--this is excluding my family. In my career, I guess my accomplishments as a teacher for the most part. I'm finding at this time the hundreds of students that have crossed my path are calling me, writing me, and this is very gratifying.

Interviewer: "It is not only former students who have come calling. Former governors, senators and congressmen have all stopped by for a last visit.

Regent Lawton: "I have learned that life has been very beautiful. I think the most fulfilling things in my life are the things that I have done for others, and they are coming home to roost now.

Interviewer: "As we concluded, Ben Lawton asked me when this interview would air. 'You know, I have a time limit,' he said. But there never was a time limit to the commitment Ben Lawton made to public life, and there never will be a time limit to Ben Lawton's dreams.

Regent Lawton: "I'm very proud of our state. Our tradition is such that I'm not only proud, I'm optimistic that it will continue long after my time.

Interviewer: "This will be Ben Lawton's last winter--a cause for sadness. But like the true Wisconsinite he is, Ben Lawton still finds beauty in a midwestern midwinter day, and he has one last winter wish.

Regent Lawton: "It is inherent in a true Wisconsinite. I have always liked the snow, and a real raging blizzard is a challenge as far as getting out of the driveway, but is a beautiful sight. I would like to see another one."

After the interview was shown, Regent Weinstein made the following statement: "There is certainly very little more one ought to say, except to remind us of the incredible experience of knowing this man.

"Ben was first appointed to the board in 1976 to fill an unexpired term. He was then reappointed for a full term in 1977 and again in 1984.

"He served as chair of the Education Committee. He is a member of the Council of Trustees and agreed to serve as chair of the council, which he does currently. He was elected to be vice president twice (in 1980 and 1981) and then president of the board twice (in 1984 and 1985).

"Because he is a man filled with so many dreams and hopes, all of us have a slightly different view of Ben Lawton. Among his countless achievements, I select the following three as particularly relevant to this occasion:

"1) He was, as you know, a tireless leader and worker for faculty and academic staff salary catch-up.

"2) He appointed the Regent Study Group on the Future of the UW System.

"3) He led the search and selection of Kenneth Shaw as president of the UW System.

"A portrait of Ben Lawton was commissioned by the Regent office, and it is on behalf of regents past and present, and a great honor to me personally, to ask the secretary to unveil the portrait at this time.

"This will be placed in this room along with the portraits of other past presidents at this place of honor. It is a lovely portrait."

The portrait was greeted with applause, after which regents and others were invited to add personal messages to a videotape of the ceremony.

UW Hospital - Council of Trustees - Report on financial condition of hospital, comparable worth impact agreement with Vernon Hospital in Viroqua and presentations on clinics & departments, pp 5-6

Report of the Vice Chairman, Council of Trustees, UW Hospital and Clinics

Summarizing the council's February 5 meeting, Regent Heckrodt reported that, due to increased patient volume and intensity of care, both revenue and expenses for the first half of the fiscal year had been higher than anticipated. As a result, the hospital's financial position continued to be more favorable than expected, with a deficit of \$700,000 instead of the \$4 million deficit projected in the budget process.

Superintendent Derzon reported to the council on several developments that would affect the hospital's budget in the near future, the first being comparable worth legislation, which would have significant fiscal implications for the hospital due to its reliance on women-dominated employee groups. Pay increases to nurses, clerical personnel and others were expected to total \$1.7 million in the next fiscal year, with more to come in the future. The hospital's competitive position would be affected because most other hospitals in the area were private institutions and were not required to implement comparable worth increases. Academic staff catch-up salary increases also would have a fiscal impact, though far less costly, and it was estimated that there would be a payroll increase of about \$200,000 to bring academic staff personnel up to norms. In addition, the hospital had increased its personnel and supply expenditures to accommodate the higher levels of care provided. In-patient stays had increased slightly, with a greater level of patient activity in intensive care and highly-specialized areas, which substantially increased the cost of care and supplies. It was considered probable that UW Hospital would need to request a rate increase in the near future.

Mr. Derzon reported that the hospital recently signed an affiliation agreement with Vernon Hospital in Viroqua. This brought to five the total number of affiliation agreements, which provided support to local hospitals while strengthening educational opportunities for the Medical School. He also announced the appointment of a new medical director for regional affairs who would be responsible for developing relationships with physicians throughout the area.

The council heard presentations from three clinical faculty members. Dr. Richard Hong, a renowned immunologist in the departments of Pediatrics and Medical Microbiology, reported on exciting developments in bone marrow transplantation. This potentially lifesaving procedure until recently was restricted to patients with identically matched siblings who could serve as donors. Based on research conducted at the hospital and Medical School, however, bone-marrow transplants could now be performed using only partially matched donors, thereby vastly expanding the donor pool.

Dr. Paul Sondel of the departments of Pediatrics, Human Oncology and Genetics, reported on dramatic progress in treating childhood cancers. Just 25 years ago, childhood leukemias were invariably fatal within two to three months. Now, thanks to advances in therapy, two-thirds of patients with certain leukemias could be cured of the disease, and researchers here at the university were exploring ways to further improve that outcome.

Dr. Sondel also described exciting developments in immune therapy for cancer, in which the university had played a major role. He and his colleagues were involved in clinical trials of interleukin-2, a substance that activated the body's immune system to destroy cancerous cells.

Providing an overview of heart transplantation, Dr. Herbert Berkoff, head of the Division of Cardiac Surgery, reported that improved drug therapies had greatly enhanced patient survival. In 1986, 15 transplants were performed at the hospital, with a 93 percent success rate--probably the highest in the country.

Senior Associate Superintendent Brower reported to the council that the hospital and Medical School had initiated a joint planning process which would result in development of comprehensive three-year plans for each clinical department.

Vice Chancellor Noren informed the council that the hospital's proposed additions and remodeling projects would be considered by a subcommittee of the Building Commission on February 17, as part of the university's capital budget for the next biennium.

Budget Update

President Weinstein reported that he had been working with President Shaw in preparation for the Governor's budget message on February 12.

The resulting report would be brought to the board's Education Committee. The kinds of changes he was contemplating, he added, were not radical, but rather were refinements designed to improve a process which already was working very well.

Dr. Trani reported that he had discussed the Regent Study Group report at twelve of the fifteen institutions and would visit the other three by February 12. His discussion focused particularly on the development of guidelines for mission review and the identification of centers of excellence.

It was announced that seven faculty from UW-Madison were among the 200 engineers and scientists in the nation to receive Presidential "Young Investigator" awards from the National Science Foundation, a program intended to help universities attract and retain outstanding young investigators. UW-Madison now had 23 recipients of this award on its faculty, one of the largest concentrations in the country.

Dr. Trani reported that in January the UW System Institute on Race and Ethnicity was formally established as an independent research unit at UW-Milwaukee. In doing so, the Institute was expected to attract accomplished scholars and to sustain a network among faculty and advanced graduate students throughout the system.

Update on Effects of Court Decision

The report of the Vice President concluded with an update on the effects of the Trojan case and the decisions to be made if the legislative Law Revision Committee decided to take no action on this matter. Dr. Trani was asked to continue to work as expeditiously as possible with faculty groups and faculty representatives, to see if unanimity could be achieved on the amendment. If that did not occur, the Board of Regents might consider whether or not to take an active role in having legislation introduced as an amendment. Professor Eugene Johnson, UW-Stevens Point faculty representative, explained the opposition of that faculty to legislative action concerning the Trojan case.

Regent Flores reported that Resolution 3716 was approved by the committee, with Regent Weinstein voting "No."

Resolution 3716: That, upon the recommendation of the Acting Chancellor of the University of Wisconsin-Madison and the President of the University of Wisconsin System, the request of the Acting Chancellor to recruit for an Associate Dean of Graduate School, be approved.

In response to a question by Regent Clusen regarding the reason for his negative vote in the committee, Regent Weinstein noted that the salary of the current associate dean was \$76,900, but that the request would authorize a substantial increase. His vote reflected concern about salary compression problems and did not indicate opposition to recruiting an associate dean of the Graduate School.

Vice President Trani explained that, if the range were limited to the salary of the incumbent, distinguished senior faculty members would be excluded from consideration. It was an internal search to fill a half-time position.

In reply to a question by Regent Flores, Dr. Trani said the only fiscal impact would involve annualization of the salary.

Regent Weinstein observed that when salaries of associate deans approached those of deans, pressure followed to raise the deans' salaries. While he felt this sort of action contributed to the salary compression problem, he had been assured by the acting chancellor that the issue was minor in this case.

In response to a question by Regent Clusen, Regent Grover explained that he had not requested regent participation in all recent dean of education selections, but that he felt board involvement from time to time had a salutary effect on the process without being overly intrusive. Noting that, in the next year and a half, there would be almost total replacement of the deans of education in the UW System, he observed that these deans were so critical to the linkage with elementary/secondary education and the quality of teacher performance, that their selection merited regent involvement.

Regent Fish asked if the regents were best suited to make such assessments.

In reply, Regent Grover indicated he sensed some tendency at the institutions to choose a person who would maintain the status quo, rather than someone who would provide innovative leadership. Regent participation had worked very well in the case of UW-Platteville, he added, where an outstanding person had been selected for the deanship.

Put to the vote, Resolution 3718 was then unanimously adopted.

The committee reviewed a listing of faculty being awarded faculty development/renewal grants for 1987-88 (copy on file with the papers of this meeting).

Financial Aid

Regent Flores reported that discussion of financial aid centered around merit-based scholarships, prepaid tuition plans, and a continuing appropriation for the Higher Educational Aids Board. The committee requested a report by April or May on what happened to the top five percent of last year's high school graduating classes in Wisconsin--where they went to school (in-state or out-of-state), whether they received scholarship aid elsewhere, etc. There were 510 high schools (both public and private) to be surveyed. It was anticipated that the committee might then make a recommendation to the board.

Further consideration of a prepaid tuition program was expected at the March meeting, including more information about how plans in other states actually were working, whether this type of program would be feasible, and what the tax consequences might be.

Reporting unanimous committee approval of the following resolution, Regent Flores moved its adoption by the board and the motion was seconded by Regent Finlayson:

That the Board of Regents supports the concept of a continuing appropriation for the Higher Educational Aids Board.

Regent Clusen inquired as to the reason for the resolution, to which Regent Flores replied that the benefit of a continuing appropriation was to eliminate the need to reduce a student's grant during the academic year as sometimes had occurred in the past, due to the nature of annual appropriations.

Vice President Trani added that United Council recommended regent support of the concept and that the director of the Higher Educational Aids Board planned to discuss the matter with his board. The concept related strictly to reduction of an award during the course of the year and was not concerned with multi-year grants.

To clarify the resolution's intent, Regent Weinstein suggested adding at the end the words "so that a student's award would be consistent for any one year."

Regent Nikolay moved that the resolution be so amended, and the motion was seconded by Regent Hassett.

President Shaw observed that a continuing appropriation meant that the budget estimate did not have to be exactly accurate for a single year and that funds from the following year could be used to prevent reduction in awards.

Put to the vote, the amendment was unanimously approved, after which the main motion as amended was adopted unanimously.

on research, scholarly efforts, public service or other professional responsibilities.

The committee heard a report on this program, in which 660 students were currently enrolled. Dean William Halloran, of the College of Letters and Science, and Professor Winston Van Horne expressed satisfaction with the program's development and answered questions by the committee.

UW-River Falls

Five-Year Review: BS in Metropolitan Regional Studies, UW River Falls P. 13

Regent Flores reported that the five-year review had recommended that this program be reevaluated and that upon reevaluation, UW-River Falls and System Administration decided to discontinue the program. No new students were to be accepted as majors in Metropolitan Regional Studies beginning with the fall of 1987.

Centers of Excellence - update, pp 13-14

Update on Centers of Excellence

In response to a request by Regent Lyon, Vice President Trani commented on reaction at the various institutions to the Centers of Excellence program. Thus far, he had visited 12 of the 15 institutions to talk about the concept and had received input from the chancellors, vice chancellors, and faculty. Concern had been expressed about the concept and about the possible implication that those selected as centers of excellence were the only excellent programs. Guidelines were to include different options, so that not only degree programs would be eligible for centers of excellence status. Some might be multi-disciplinary programs, and others could involve more than one institution. Funding for the program also was being

considered, including whether there should be an institutional match and, if so, for what period of time.

Regent Fish suggested that alternative titles be developed which would not carry the connotation that other programs might be less than excellent.

Dr. Trani responded that such alternatives would be brought along with the final guidelines to the March regent meetings.

Regent Hanson asked that suggestions as to other titles also be presented to the chancellors.

Regent Grover commented that the word "excellence" properly described the purpose of the program.

REPORT OF THE BUSINESS AND FINANCE COMMITTEE

Chairman Lyon presented the report of the committee.

Gifts, Grants, and U.S. Government Contracts

Assistant Vice President Ray Marnocha reported that gifts, grants and contracts through the seventh month of this fiscal year totaled \$217.8 million, or \$15.9 million more than the same period last year (a 7.9 percent increase). The non-federal share increased 17.9 percent, or \$8.4 million over a year ago, while the federal share increased 4.9 percent, or \$7.6 million over the same period. Changes in federal receipts included an increase of \$9 million in research, and a decrease of \$1.9 million in instruction.

Resolution 3723, which was unanimously approved by the committee, was moved by Regent Lyon, seconded by Regent Schenian and adopted unanimously by the board.

Resolution 3723: That, upon recommendation of the President of the University of Wisconsin System, the gifts, grants and contracts presented at this meeting (copy on file with the papers of this meeting) be accepted, approved, ratified and confirmed; and that, where signature authority has not been previously delegated, appropriate officers be authorized to sign agreements.

Compensation
Status Report on the Academic Staff Title Compensation Plan, pp 16-17

Introducing this item at the committee meeting, the chairman entered into the record the notation that Kathleen Moylan, Chair of the UW-Milwaukee Academic Staff Committee, who had requested an appearance before the Business and Finance Committee, had filed suit against the university with reference to the academic staff title and compensation plan. Regent Fish asked system legal counsel if hearing from a litigant would be a correct procedure, and Attorney Stathas replied that the litigant should restrict comments to general matters and not to the issues involved in the legal controversy.

Academic Staff - (same)
 Executive Vice President Katharine Lyall summarized the status report on the academic staff title and compensation plan. The final Hayes/Hill report was approved by the board in May 1986 and by the Joint Committee on Employment Relations (JCOER) in June 1986. Catch-up funds were distributed for academic staff in research, instruction and library on the same timetable as faculty: January 1986, July 1986, and January 1987. Funds for academic staff in other categories, known as the "withheld group" (about 3500 of the 7100 in academic staff), were placed in escrow, to be released in accordance with a new title structure approved by the board and JCOER as soon as individual titles could be assigned to academic staff by their institutions. Phase one payments to this "withheld group" were distributed effective January 1, 1986, based on tentative titles and salary levels at that time. New title assignments were completed by October 31, 1986, and submitted to system administration for review. After reviewing the assignments, President Shaw appointed the academic staff personnel liaison representatives as a review team to re-examine the new assignments, to ensure that consistent criteria had been applied across the system. Distribution of the remaining catch-up funds was not made pending this final review. On the basis of the findings of the review team, supplementary guidelines were issued to the institutions for the review and revision of title assignments as necessary. The assignments then were completed on this second review on January 23, 1987.

Final salary adjustments now would be implemented in two steps: first, adjustments to meet the required salary grade minima were to be paid on April 1, 1987; second, a distribution to establish competitive salary levels within the grade (the decompression component) was to be made on June 30, 1987. All distributions would be retroactive to the original schedule of July 1986 and January 1987. Adjustments resulting from appeals of title assignments also would be retroactive to the original distribution schedule. The payments would be funded by institutional reallocations from base budgets--\$2.3 million of GPR and \$1.8 million of program revenue funds.

It was pointed out by Dr. Lyall that the academic staff plan was regarded as a living system which would be adapted to changing functions over time.

Janet Newman, from UW-Stevens Point and representing TAUWF, introduced three academic staff who requested to speak before the committee.

Speaking as an individual, Dr. Richard Boyum, employed at the counseling center at UW-Eau Claire, commented that the most strenuous complaints seemed to focus on the model itself, which he characterized as a modified industrial-business model rather than an educational model for defining titling and compensation.

Dr. Dale Borer, a program administrator from the Office of Continuing Education, UW Center-Sheboygan County, reviewed concerns as related to the UW Centers, noting criteria applied to determine the title of "director" did not recognize supervisory responsibilities beyond the immediate supervision of full-time employees.

The third speaker, Joseph R. Sylvester, UW-Madison Physics Department, addressed the appeals process relative to title assignment, arguing that the process was structured in such a manner that appeals were not given adequate review.

Also commenting on the appeals process, Karen Carlson, of UW-Madison United Faculty and Academic Staff, made the point that individuals reviewing a title assignment appeal included persons who played a role in the original assignment decision. It was suggested that appeals should be handled by individuals who had not been involved in the initial decisions and this recommendation met with favor among regent committee members.

Kathleen Moylan noted that the Hayes/Hill plan was approved by three groups: the Joint Committee on Employment Relations (JCOER), the Department of Employment Relations (DER), and the Board of Regents. Subsequently, the plan had been modified administratively, she commented, without the changes being approved by any of the original concurring groups.

During discussion, the committee agreed the current plan should be implemented with provision to take corrective action as necessary and to achieve compliance with the legislative mandate. Executive Vice President Lyall agreed with Regent Fish that the appeals process should be addressed to make sure it was equitable. It was noted that title reassignments resulted in an additional \$4.1 million in academic staff salary adjustments above the legislative allocation.

In discussion at the board meeting, Regent Clusen asked if the lawsuit regarding academic staff compensation was a class-action suit.

Replying in the negative, General Counsel Stathas indicated that it was an action by two individual academic staff members.

President Weinstein noted that there would be a report on this pending litigation in the board's closed session.

In response to a question by Regent Clusen regarding recent comparable worth increases, Associate Vice President Lemon indicated that about half of the UW System's 11,000 classified employees would be eligible for some adjustment. There were two parts to the action that was taken by JCOER. One part, which accounted for about half of the adjustments, related to changes in salary ranges for classified employees, while the other part related to a phased program to provide adjustments to persons in female-dominated classes (at least 70 percent women). The first phase was being implemented, although there remained the possibility that a lawsuit might be filed against the increases.

Regent Clusen recalled that almost 50 percent of the academic staff were women, and Mr. Lemon added that unlike the classified staff, there were relatively few female-dominated classes in the academic staff. In the original test, approximately a dozen female-dominated job titles were identified, and analysis was in process regarding the effect of the last retitling exercise on that data. The understanding with state government was that academic staff could qualify for distribution of comparable worth funds.

Regent Lyon stated that this progress report was reviewed with the committee by Associate Vice President Cammack, who indicated that a Strategic Planning Group on Management Information Systems (MIS), chaired by Executive Vice President Lyall, was to provide a preliminary report by July 1, 1987, and a final report by October 1, 1987. The group would look at administrative computing, including major systems such as budgeting, accounting, payroll, facilities, student registration and records, and telecommunications.

Report of the Vice President for Business and Finance

In reviewing the *Fiscal Year 1986-87 Projection Summary Report*, Mr. Marnocha reported that the uncommitted balance for revenue shortfall and other contingencies as of June 30, 1987, was estimated at \$1,349,094.

REPORT OF THE PHYSICAL PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

The committee's report was presented by Chairman Nikolay.

UW-Platteville - Report
UW-Platteville: Approval of Major Project Concept and Budget Report

The committee unanimously approved the concept and budget report for the Student Center addition and remodeling at UW-Platteville and authority to plan, bid and construct the project. The \$609,000 budget for the addition and remodeling was to be funded with program revenues.

The project involved remodeling of 2,000 gross square feet and construction of 5,600 gross square feet to correct pedestrian entry and circulation problems, as well as to provide improved spaces for student activities and administrative functions. Also included was enclosure of an open courtyard to create a 3,800 gross-square-foot atrium which would serve as a focal point for the Student Center. Installation of an elevator, approved by the board in April, would provide vertical access within the building.

Resolution 3727 was moved by Regent Nikolay, seconded by Regent Knowles, and adopted unanimously by the board.

Resolution 3727: ~~That, upon the recommendation of the UW-Platteville Chancellor and the President of the University of Wisconsin System, the Concept and Budget Report for the Student Center Addition and Remodeling project be approved and authority granted to plan, bid and construct, at a total project cost of \$609,000 from Program Revenues.~~

Approval of Minor Projects

Regent Nikolay reported unanimous committee approval of seven minor projects--six for UW-Madison and one for UW-Superior.

The first request was for caulking and masonry repairs at Witte Hall, a 22-year-old residence hall at UW-Madison. The \$120,000 cost would be covered by housing program revenue funds.

The second request was for remodeling of twelve one-bedroom apartments in Eagle Heights Apartment Building No. 603 at a cost of \$166,000 from program revenue funds. This was to be a prototype project for this kind of renovation. One prototype remodeling of a two-bedroom unit was completed last fall. Another, involving minimal exterior renovation of a two-bedroom building, was approved in November. Still another prototype was planned involving conversion of selected one-bedroom apartment buildings into three-bedroom units. As prototypes were completed, residents would be surveyed regarding apartment function and satisfaction. The results of these surveys would be used in a long-range plan for remodeling and renovating all 1,084 apartment units over the next 15 to 20 years. The estimated total cost, which would be presented for regent approval, was \$15 million.

The third request was for a Molecular Biology and Biophysics plaza repair project, at UW-Madison, at a total estimated cost of \$163,000. The project was to be financed with 1985-87 general fund supported borrowing - minimum maintenance program funds.

The fourth request was for construction of a specialized geology laboratory in Weeks Hall at a cost of \$80,000 from gift funds. The National Science Foundation had provided half of the funding for the specialized piece of equipment to be placed in this laboratory, and a new faculty member would begin conducting research on the age of rocks as soon as the laboratory was completed.

The next minor project for UW-Madison was for construction of a central stair addition in the east corner of the Union South atrium, at an estimated total project cost of \$80,000 of gift funds. The purpose of the project was to improve circulation and aesthetics.

The last request for UW-Madison was for the first phase of an electrical improvements project at Elizabeth Waters Residence Hall, at a cost of \$248,000 from program revenues. A 1983 cost estimate from the Division of State Facilities Management of \$220,000 to update the entire building now was increased to approximately \$575,000. Because the whole project could not be completed during available summer schedules, it was to be divided into three separate phases to be undertaken each year during the summer when the facility was unoccupied. Phase II, involving the two wings to the east, would be requested in 1988 and Phase III, involving the two wings to the west, would be requested in 1989.

The last minor project was the Wessman Arena insulation project for UW-Superior, which was deferred from the December meeting at the request of Regent Fish. The estimated cost of \$129,600 would be funded by program revenues, with \$32,400 to be reimbursed by the City of Superior. A rigid foam-type insulation board was to be fastened to the concrete masonry walls on the interior side of the ice arena. This would form a durable insulated wall between the masonry walls and the shell of the existing metal envelope.

Regent Nikolay moved and Regent Clusen seconded Resolution 3728 which was unanimously adopted by the board.

Resolution 3728: That, upon the recommendation of the UW-Madison Acting Chancellor and the UW-Superior Chancellor and the President of the University of Wisconsin System, the following minor projects be approved and authority granted to plan, bid and construct, at the budgets and from the funding sources indicated:

The committee unanimously approved the West Madison Agricultural Research Station development plan and authority to bid and construct the project in phases as funds were received. This project was approved by the board for inclusion in the 1987-89 capital budget at a total cost of \$2,343,500, but the details on how the development was to occur were not available at the time. The need for the project was directly related to the decision to discontinue the former research station located at the Charmany and Rieder farms and convert them into the University Research Park. A detailed explanation regarding construction of a replacement agricultural research station was presented by Dean Leo Walsh of the College of Agricultural and Life Sciences. Funding was to come from sale of the Charmany and Rieder farms as interested tenants of the parcels were located. The land for the station had already been acquired under previous board approvals, and the university had developed an overall facility plan which permitted phasing of the various portions of the total development program as funds became available.

(Xref) Budget & Land - (same)

Grading, irrigation, and construction of access roads to the 186 acres which met research plot criteria would be the first work undertaken, and four storage buildings would be constructed. This phase was estimated to cost \$1,265,500. The remaining buildings, including the headquarters office, agronomy, sample drying, and the genetics/ag engineering structure would follow as funds became available, as would bituminous surfacing. Administration and maintenance of the facility were to be assigned to the Department of Agricultural Research Stations. Phase II costs were estimated at \$1,078,000. There was about \$1.4 million already in hand to apply toward the overall development cost of \$2.3 million.

Adoption by the board of the following resolution was moved by Regent Nikolay and seconded by Regent Heckrodt:

Resolution 3729: That, upon the recommendation of the UW-Madison Acting Chancellor and the President of the University of Wisconsin System, the development plan for the 1987-89 West Madison Agricultural Research Station is approved and authority granted to bid and construct this project in phases as funds from the sale of lands on the Charmany and Rieder Farms become available. The estimated cost for full implementation of the development plan is \$2,343,500 from Program Revenues.

In board discussion, Regent Fish asked if the \$2.3 million would consist exclusively of income from the sale of Charmany and Rieder farm land.

It was explained by Dean Walsh that, while sale of that land would comprise most of the program revenue, there remained five acres at the west side seeds facility which also might be sold. There was no program revenue besides that obtained from land sales.

In response to a further question by Regent Fish, Dean Walsh indicated that total disposition of Charmany and Rieder lands could accumulate more than the cost identified in this project, but sale of that land could take several years or more.

Put to the vote, Resolution 3729 was unanimously adopted.

Report of the Vice President

Bid Openings

Regent Nikolay reported the committee was advised that, since the December meeting, there had been bidding on nine major projects with pre-bid budgets totaling \$3,203,550. Two projects were bid at the approved budgets, three exceeded their approved budgets by a total of \$33,800 and four projects were under the approved budgets by a total of \$62,750. Thus, the results of bidding were a net of \$28,950 below the authorized budgets.

1987-89 Capital Budget

A preliminary report of recommendations by the Division of State Facilities Management staff on the UW System's 1987-89 capital budget request was presented by Vice President Brown, who noted that changes in these staff recommendations could be made by the Higher Education Subcommittee at its February 17 meeting and by the full Building Commission when it met on March 10.

In summary, the DSFM recommendations included approval of the first 16 of the 20 projects on the board's approved priority list, the estimated cost of those projects being about \$51 million. Physical education facilities for UW-Platteville and UW-Stevens Point were reduced significantly in scope and budget by not providing the fieldhouse portions.

The requested new construction for the UW-Madison Russell Labs (priority 15) was approved, as was phase 3 of the Dairy Center redevelopment project at UW-Platteville. The phase 2 Greenhouse expansion at UW-River Falls was not recommended.

The Division of State Facilities Management's rationale for not approving the three projects at UW-Madison to enhance business, engineering and dairying was stated as a limitation on funds for new construction plus the fact that these projects were low on the board's priority list. It was Vice President Brown's opinion that Governor Thompson's strong interest in economic development would give support to a system effort to secure

enumeration of these projects, with the contingency that private funding must be available before they could move forward.

The DSFM staff recommendation for \$6 million of general fund-supported borrowing for minor projects represented half of the system's \$12 million request. However, Mr. Brown noted that this figure compared favorably to the \$3.5 million approved in the current biennium.

DSFM staff recommended funding for the "all agency" accounts at a level substantially higher than the system's request. Therefore, it was felt the UW System should be able to secure most of the \$62 million requested.

Overall, the assessment was that the UW System did quite well based on the initial staff recommendations, with the potential for gaining back some of the initial cuts.

Clinical Science Center - (same), p. 23

Mr. Brown called attention to a problem with the DSFM staff recommendation relating to one of the program revenue-funded projects at the Clinical Science Center. At present, the recommendation was against remodeling for ambulatory surgery/critical care and construction of the new module for management services. The proposed packaging of this new construction and remodeling was recently approved by the previous commission on the recommendation of DSFM staff. System Administration and Clinical Science Center staff planned to continue their efforts to persuade members of the newly constituted Building Commission of the merits of this program revenue-funded project and hoped to have it restored to the list of recommended projects.

President Weinstein asked that the regents be kept informed of further capital budget developments as they occurred.

UW-Extension - Commemoration on 75th anniversary of Cooperative Extension, R 3730, pp 23-24

ADDITIONAL RESOLUTIONS

Cooperative Extension 75th Anniversary

Regent Lyon presented the following resolution and moved its adoption, adding that a special ceremony was planned for February 12 at Rhinelander to commemorate this 75th anniversary. The resolution was seconded by Regent Nikolay and carried unanimously.

Resolution 3730: Whereas, Ernest L. Luther was appointed the state's first county extension agent in Oneida County on February 12, 1912; and

Whereas, February 12, 1987 marks the 75th anniversary of this unique educational partnership between the counties of the state and the University of Wisconsin-Extension; and

Whereas, this partnership as pioneered in Wisconsin embodies the true meaning of the "Wisconsin Idea" - that the resources and knowledge of the University shall be extended to the people of the state wherever they live and work; and

Whereas, the 75th anniversary of Mr. Luther's appointment commemorates the contributions of all Cooperative Extension county agents to the growth and development of the entire state; and

Whereas, the vitality of today's county Cooperative Extension programs can be credited to the men and women of vision who accepted the challenge in 1912 to create the Wisconsin county extension system;

Therefore, be it resolved that the members of the Board of Regents of the University of Wisconsin System hereby commend the University of Wisconsin-Extension, its division of Cooperative Extension, and all Wisconsin counties for their cooperation and partnership which has enabled the people of the State of Wisconsin to apply the research and knowledge of the University in their homes, farms, families, businesses, and communities.

Sweet, William B. - Tribute from Regent Schenian, upon Mr. Sweet's death, p. 24

COMMUNICATIONS, PETITIONS AND MEMORIALS

Tribute to Mr. William B. Sweet

Regent Schenian made the following statement: "I would like to note the passing of a friend of mine who had worked with the university for approximately 15 years. His name was Bill Sweet. He was assistant director of student affairs on the UW-Madison campus. I came to know him through my work in student government. He passed away with cancer approximately two weeks ago. He worked both literally and figuratively in the bowels of the university--his office had no windows and was in the basement of one of the residence halls. As an academic staff person, he did not get the recognition that faculty and other higher administrators receive. But he certainly had an impact on many students on the campus, and that impact was recognized by many who knew him. There was a memorial service for him last week which I attended. He will be sorely missed by the people on the Madison campus, and as a member of the board, I wanted to acknowledge his passing with appreciation for his service to the university."



Dear President Shaw:

Last fall, Chancellor Shain discussed the proposed Convocation Center with the UW System Board of Regents. He promised them that there would be a more comprehensive report on our fund-raising prospects for this and other programs in early spring.

Athletics - (same)

For reasons beyond our control, the Capital Campaign feasibility study, which is being conducted by a private consultant for the University of Wisconsin Foundation, will not be completed until later in the semester — perhaps too late for a useful report to the Board this academic year. Therefore, I have obtained from the Foundation consultant a separate, preliminary judgment about the feasibility of our raising funds for the proposed Convocation Center, and I am able to report to you now about that.

Budget Capital - (same)

The Convocation Center originated out of concern for the inadequacy of the Field House for its present purposes, and for tentative plans by the Division of Intercollegiate Athletics for a new building addition near the Field House to house coaches offices, a new ticket office and student-athlete study space. Chancellor Shain judged that proposal not to be cost-effective or in the best long term interests of the Division's program. At the time that the Capital Campaign was first discussed publicly, the estimated cost of the Convocation Center was thought to be not more than \$20,000,000. Since then, there has been a revision in the proposed location of the Center and further study and refinement of the project itself. As a consequence, the cost of the project is now estimated to be in the range of at least \$28,000,000 to \$35,000,000.

Bldgs + Land - (same)

I have been informed by the Foundation's consultant that the legitimacy of the Convocation Center is not a matter of controversy among potential contributors to the Campaign; but neither is it something that has created a level of enthusiasm or commitment which promises success for this project in the near future. While the consultant has not yet identified any potential large donors for this project, they believe that we might eventually raise the necessary funds. However, they believe that this cannot be accomplished easily or in the relatively near future.

Fundraising - (same)

Originally, it was our hope that the private fund raising could provide most of the money necessary for the construction of the facility. However, with a total cost of at least \$28 to \$35 million, it has become apparent that an unexpectedly large portion of that funding would need to be financed through the Division of Intercollegiate Athletics operating budget, perhaps through self-supporting bonding. While the Division has been able, with considerable effort, to balance its books for the last several years, the cost of operating a major intercollegiate athletic program continues to increase. Television income continues to be an important factor in insuring a balanced budget. The television networks, however, are no longer content to sign long term contracts which guarantee a stable source of revenue to the Division. We are concerned about placing too great a long term financial burden on a program which depends upon continued fan interest and competitive ticket prices, and on donors who are also being asked to provide funds for the golf course and the McClain practice facility.


The consultant's conclusion, and the potential drain on the Intercollegiate budget, are portentous. If we are to have any chance of achieving the fund-raising goal for the Convocation Center, we would have to devote an inordinate amount of time and effort over the years of the Capital Campaign, at the expense of many other important needs and objectives of the University and the Division of Intercollegiate Athletics. This is not something that I think most of our faculty, our graduates or our friends want, nor is it the kind of obligation that we should be creating for a new Chancellor or a new Director of Intercollegiate Athletics. After discussions with the UW Foundation and with members of the faculty and the Capital Campaign Consultative Committee, I have concluded that we should remove the Convocation Center from our Capital Campaign, and not seek to develop it at this time.

I deeply regret this outcome; I believe, however, that it is a realistic assessment of the situation. If it should stimulate several angels to come forth, or down, and rescue the Center, I would be most happy to change my mind. The problems that Irv Shain identified, which led him to pursue the Center, are still with us, and will not go away. We have a terribly inadequate facility in the Field House, arguably the worst in the Big Ten, and we shall be the worse for having to live with it. But live with it we shall, until such time as there is sufficient interest among our private supporters for us to proceed. Because of the pressing need for such a facility it will remain a long range project for us, to be funded with major bequests and memorial gifts that are not likely to be obtained during the period of the Campaign.

The Mayor, and several members of the Common Council and the City staff worked closely with the University in establishing a process to evaluate the siting options. That process was especially helpful to the University, and we are very grateful to them. We are also appreciative of the support we have

received from the downtown business community. We have made promises to the City for joint planning for housing in the southeast part of the campus, and we will continue to work toward these goals.

Radio & TV

1. ~~Between the City of Madison and the University, providing for continued placement of the City of Madison Fire Department and radio transmitter atop Van Vleck Hall, Terms of the agreement began January 1, 1987 and continue for five years.~~ Nonpers. Item 1

Van Vleck Hall

2. Between the University and the UW Foundation, for lease of 1,430 square feet of office space from December 1, 1986 through November 30, 1989, at an initial rate of \$8.50 per square foot (\$1,013 per month), increasing to \$9.00 per square foot (\$1,073 per month) on December 1, 1987, and to \$9.50 per square foot (\$1,132 per month) on December 1, 1988. The space will be used by the Foundation for phonathon activities in its fund raising efforts.

3. Kammer, for continued use of 1,034 square feet of office and classroom space in a building at 2709 Marshall Court for the Ultrasound and Radiologic Technology Program instructional program. The lease covers the period from January 1, 1987 through November 30, 1989, at an annual rate of \$11,742 (\$11.36 per square foot) for the first year with a 3% annual rate increase in each subsequent year of the lease. The lessor is responsible for the cost of all services. Rental payments will be made from University Hospital and Clinics' operating funds.
