GREAT HALL TO EXPAND

The gift of \$60,000 from the Class of 1924 on the occasion of the 50th anniversary of their graduation will make it possible to go ahead with plans for the next phase of the master plan for Union improvement -- a large reception-dining room opening into Great Hall and expanding its capacity.

At the same time it was learned that the Class of 1925 plans to provide funds for a new Union art gallery when it celebrates its golden anniversary next year.

The two class gifts launch a program of general fund raising among classes, alumni and students to improve and expand the 46-year-old Memorial Union, originally built when the University was one-fourth its present size. The first phase of the current master plan -- a new entry and lobby for the dining wing of the building -- was completed this spring with funds contributed by graduating students and former student chairmen of Union committees.

ON THE SUMMER SIDE

The Memorial Union Terrace will be the hub of summer programs again this year. The food staff is also planning to center activity out there with daily Brat 'n Beer (and other things) service from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. Monday through Saturday and from 1 to 3 p.m. on Sunday (weather permitting). Seven Sunday Night Dinners have been planned again, many of them for the terrace and weekly flickers and music programs will be held on Monday evenings starting at 9 p.m. Union South will also move food service outside. Their outdoor brat stand will be found on the corner of Johnson and Randall Monday through Friday from 11:30 a.m. to 1 p.m.

MINI-COURSE ANYONE?

A brochure listing mini-courses and other instructional programs offered by the Wisconsin Union will be available at both Memorial and South on June 10. UNION MEMBERSHIP RATES INCREASE

Because of rising costs, the Union, like so many other organizations, has found it necessary to raise the rate for annual memberships from \$23 to \$30 and for life memberships from \$130 to \$150 effective July 1, 1974. Although the membership rates have increased only twice in the last 55 years, many new facilities and programs have been made available to members. NEW! NEW! CHILDREN'S SUMMER CRAFTS PROGRAM

A crafts program to introduce children to materials and skills with hand tools in a fully equipped craftshop is planned for this summer. Materials will include clay, wood, fiber, film, food and paper. Each meeting will provide a different material and project and the last meeting of the six will be topped off with lunch in the Union. The stress will be on acquiring an acquaintance with craft materials and tools rather than on the finished product. The four sections of 12 children each will occur between June 17 and July 25. Children who will be going into first, second and third grades next year are eligible. Cost is \$15 to children to Union members (\$20 to non-members). HOOFERS GEARING UP FOR SUMMER

Sailing, Outing, Riding, Mountaineering and Ecology are the five Hooper clubs that are beginning their most active season -- summer. Memberships in Sailing Club are on a seasonal basis and the summer membership (which is good until August 26) is \$21 plus \$1.92 for the general Hooper membership. Membership entitles you to use of the club's boats for recreational sailing, instruction and eligibility to participate in racing and moonlight sailing. Outing Club's summer membership is \$6.24 plus the general Hooper fee and includes such activities as hiking, backpacking, canoeing, kayaking, biking and many trips. Riding Club has weekly trips and memberships are \$3.50 plus the Hooper fee. No membership is needed for Mountaineering Club which will continue its weekly outings to Devils Lake and plans some special trips. Ecology Club, which sponsored a very successful Earth Week this spring, will be involved, as usual, with environmental action at all levels of government.
