Upon motion of Regent Watson, seconded by Regent Renk, it was VOTED, That the minutes of the special meeting of the Board held on July 11, 1953, be approved as sent out to the Regents.

ACTIONS BY THE PRESIDENT

Upon motion of Regent Renk, seconded by Regent Rennebohm, it was VOTED, That the Actions by the President of the University, since the July 11, 1953, meeting of the Board of Regents, covering appointments, resignations, and changes in status or salary of personnel (Exhibit D attached), be approved, ratified, and confirmed.

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Upon request of President Fred, Vice President Little appeared before the Regents and reported on enrollment prospects for the fall semester, indicating that the enrollment would be approximately the same as last fall or slightly higher, with a freshman enrollment higher than any year since 1946. Vice President Little also explained the purpose of the Freshman Orientation Week.

Regent Renk inquired as to the status of new dormitory construction plans and was informed that the matter had been presented to the State Building Commission for consideration; and that there apparently was nothing more that the Regents or the University administration could do in this matter until after further consideration by the State Building Commission which probably would be deferred until after the October session of the Legislature.

Regent Wanvig inquired as to the adequacies of facilities for the large freshman class in Engineering this fall and was informed that the instructional facilities were entirely adequate.

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REPORT OF THE VICE PRESIDENT OF BUSINESS AND FINANCE

I. Recommendation

Upon motion of Regent Watson, seconded by Regent Renk, it was VOTED, That upon the recommendation of the College of Agriculture, the agreement with Merck & Co., Inc., Rahway, New Jersey, in support of research on the nutritional requirements of microorganisms, be cancelled immediately, and that a balance of \$3,518.62 be refunded to the donor. (\$9,400 has been given to the University in the period 1945 through 1950. This action is recommended due to the resignation of the faculty member responsible for the supervision of the research project. Fund 15-192)

Upon motion of Regent Renk, seconded by Regent Wanvig, Action No. 3 listed under the report of the Vice President of Business and Finance, was approved, ratified and confirmed (II. Report of Actions Taken).

### III. Confirming Actions

Upon motion of Regent Rennebohm, seconded by Regent Renk, it was VOTED, That the following actions be approved, ratified and confirmed:

1. That, upon recommendation of the Directors of the Extension Division and Milwaukee Extension Center, the Vice President of Business and Finance be authorized to sign Articles of Agreement with Ace Foods Inc., Milwaukee, for operation at the Milwaukee Extension Center of catering service on a concession basis during the initial period September 15, 1953, to June 15, 1954, and continuing automatically from year to year for each school year, subject to termination by either party upon 60 days' advance notice. (Confirming written approval by the Executive Committee)

2. That, upon recommendation of the Directors of the Extension Division and Milwaukee Extension Center, and subject to the approval of the Governor, the Vice President of Business and Finance be authorized to sign a renewal lease with the

City of Milwaukee covering use of space by the Milwaukee Extension Center in the Boys' Trade and Technical High School, Milwaukee, during the 1953-54 school year for engineering courses at a total annual rental of approximately \$2,500. (Confirming written approval by the Executive Committee)

3. That the Vice President of Business and Finance be authorized to sign service agreements for hospital equipment as follows:

a. Otis Elevator Company - Initial two-year agreements  
 9 Units located in the Wisconsin General Hospital,  
 Orthopedic Hospital, Bradley, and Intern-Residents  
 Dormitory - Monthly service charge \$ 536.16

4. That the action voted by the Regents on July 11, 1953, for an exclusive right of way and easement to the Wisconsin Telephone Company be amended to read as follows:

That the President and Secretary be authorized to execute on behalf of The Regents of The University of Wisconsin an exclusive right of way and easement to the Wisconsin Telephone Company to place and maintain buried cable and other appliances beneath the surface of land within the south 30 feet of the southeast quarter of the northeast quarter of Section 25, Township 7 North, Range 8 East; within the south 30 feet of the northwest quarter of Section 30, Township 7 North, Range 9 East; within the south 15 feet of the west half of the southeast quarter of the northeast quarter of Section 30, Township 7 North, Range 9 East; within the south 15 feet of the east 1,170 feet and within the south 40 feet of the west 150 feet of the southwest quarter of the northeast quarter of Section 30, Township 7 North, Range 9 East; all in Dane County, Wisconsin.

(Confirming written approval of the Executive Committee)

5. That the action of the Vice President of Business and Finance, in signing, upon recommendation of the State Architect, subject to the approval of the Governor and pursuant to Regent authorization of July 21, 1951 (Minutes, p. 26), an agreement with Walter Kelsey, Architect, Tarrytown, New York, for completion of the glass portion of plans and specifications for University Greenhouses, exclusive of head house, at a fee for such services of \$9,000, plus reimbursement at the rate of \$50 per day plus costs of transportation and living incurred by the architect or his assistants for attendance at conferences in Madison in excess of five at the request of the University, be confirmed.

The Vice President of Business and Finance presented for consideration a lease covering the University Extension facilities at Green Bay for an additional period of three years, ending July 31, 1956. There was discussion of making a

commitment for this length of time, even though it was subject to the availability of appropriations by the Legislature. It was suggested that it would be preferable to have the lease on a one-year basis, with an option for renewal.

Upon motion of Regent Watson, seconded by Regent Steiger, it was  
VOTED, That the renewal of the lease for the University Extension facilities  
at Green Bay be referred to the Executive Committee with power to act.

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President Werner made the following statement for the record:

"At the July meeting of the Board the President of this Board was directed to meet with the heads of other boards of public institutions of higher education in the state for the purpose of devising a means of meeting the requests of the 1953 Legislature as expressed in Joint Resolutions 31,S, 49,S, and 78,A. That meeting was held on July 15, 1953.

At that meeting it was the unanimous opinion that a committee should be formed, representative of all of the governing boards of public institutions of higher learning in the state. It was agreed that the University Regents should appoint three of its members to that committee. The Board has since then authorized me to appoint the committee of three to help organize and form that committee to study higher education.

I appoint the following committee: Regents Gelatt, Rennebohm, and Steiger."

(Secretary's Note: The presidents of the governing boards, on July 15, 1953, agreed to recommend to their respective boards the appointment of the following committee:

3 representatives from the Board of Regents of the University of Wisconsin;  
3 representatives from the Board of Regents of the Wisconsin State Colleges;  
1 representative from the Board of Trustees of Stout Institute;  
1 representative from the Board of Regents of the Institute of Technology at Platteville;  
Superintendent of Public Instruction.)

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The Secretary reported that the Wisconsin Alumni Association had appointed Mr. Fred W. Genrich, Jr., of Wausau, as a member of the Board of Visitors for the term ending July 1, 1957; and that the Governor had appointed Mr. Harold Komak, of Racine, as a member of the Board of Visitors for the term ending July 1, 1957.

The Secretary reported that the dates of the October and November Regent meetings did not coincide with dates of Wisconsin home football games, and suggested that, if the Regents intended to change the dates of the October and November Regent meetings, it would be desirable to do so as early as possible. Upon motion of Regent Watson, seconded by Regent Steiger, it was

VOTED, That the By-Laws be suspended; and that the October meeting of the Board be postponed from October 10 to October 24, 1953.

Upon motion of Regent Renk, seconded by Regent Wanvig, it was  
VOTED, That the By-Laws be suspended; and that the November meeting of the Board be postponed from November 7 to November 14, 1953.

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Regent Renk presented the report of the Educational Committee.

Upon motion of Regent Renk, seconded by Regent Arveson, it was  
VOTED, That the Rules and Regulations For the Management, Administration, and Regulation Of Land and Property Owned Or Controlled By The University of Wisconsin, as adopted on November 11, 1949, and amended on October 25, 1952, be repealed and recreated to read as set forth in Exhibit E, attached.

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Upon motion of Regent Renk, seconded by Regent Steiger, it was  
VOTED, That Oliver S. Rundell be appointed Jackson Professor of Law for the academic year 1953-54; salary to be paid as follows: \$8,934.43 charged to 1-E Instruction, \$725.57 charged to the Jackson Trust Fund; total, \$9,660. (No change in salary shown in the 1953-54 budget.)

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(President Werner left the meeting, and Vice President Rennebohm took the chair.)

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Upon motion of Regent Renk, seconded by Regent Steiger, it was  
VOTED:

1. That the appointment of Carlisle P. Runge, Assistant Professor of Law, be changed to Assistant Dean and Assistant Professor of Law for the academic year 1953-54 without change in salary.

2. That Agnes M. Hansen, associate professor, county extension service, be granted leave of absence, without pay, from September 20, 1953, to June 30, 1954.

3. That Graham B. Hovey, associate professor of journalism, be granted leave of absence without pay for the academic year 1953-54.
4. That the leave of absence granted to Samuel M. McElvain, professor of chemistry, be changed from the first semester to the second semester of 1953-54; salary for the first semester, \$5,525; second semester, leave without pay, no change in total salary.
5. That the resignation of Mrs. Grace R. Duffee, associate professor, county extension service, College of Agriculture, be accepted; to take effect August 31, 1953.
6. That the resignation of Margaret Emanuel, professor of nursing, be accepted; to take effect September 1, 1953.
7. That the resignation of Milton Davis, Jr., associate professor of anesthesia, be accepted; to take effect April 30, 1953.

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Regent Renk moved, and Regent Wanvig seconded, the adoption of the following recommendation of the Educational Committee:

That the Wisconsin Center Building be placed at the northwest corner of Lake Street and Langdon Street.

Upon motion of Regent Arveson, seconded by Regent Steiger, it was VOTED, That the roll be called on the preceding motion.

A called vote was taken, with Regents Laird, Rennebohm, Wanvig and Watson voting "Aye", and Regents Arveson, Renk, and Steiger voting "No". The motion was declared carried.

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Upon motion of Regent Renk, seconded by Regent Arveson, it was VOTED, That the Regents report to the Governor and the State Building Commission that they are not in favor of the use of the Wisconsin High School building for Medical School purposes at this time.

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Upon motion of Regent Renk, seconded by Regent Wanvig, it was VOTED:

1. That the resignation of Annette C. Washburne, professor of neuropsychiatry and preventive medicine, be accepted; to take effect October 1, 1953.
2. That the resignation of Edward R. Hodgson, associate professor of preventive medicine and neuropsychiatry, be accepted; to take effect October 1, 1953.

Regent Arveson voted "No".

Upon motion of Regent Renk, seconded by Regent Watson, it was  
VOTED, That the following resolution be adopted:

WHEREAS the State Radio Council was authorized by the 1953 Legislature to establish a transmitting station for the conduct of research and experimentation in educational television, and

"WHEREAS the Legislature created a new section of the statutes to read:

"36.063 Experimental Television Transmission. The Board of Regents is authorized to grant the radio council the part-time use of equipment and space for the conduct of research and experimentation in educational television ." ...and,

WHEREAS it has been determined that the studios, equipment, and other facilities of the University Television Laboratory can be used to provide a broadcasting service as well as performing closed-circuit research and training functions for the University, therefore be it

RESOLVED that the Board of Regents of the University of Wisconsin herewith authorize and approve such joint use by the University and the State Radio Council of the physical plant, equipment, and facilities of the University Television Laboratory.

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Regent Steiger presented the report of the Business and Finance Committee.

Upon motion of Regent Steiger, seconded by Regent Wanvig, it was

VOTED, That the Vice President of Business and Finance be authorized and directed to confer with the Governor and with officials in other State departments regarding (a) the procurement of a legal "commercial opinion" on the marketability of securities issued by the Wisconsin University Building Corporation, (b) the advisability of requesting the Legislature to revise the statutes to permit 99-year instead of 50-year leases of University lands to the Wisconsin University Building Corporation, and (c) such other related matters as may be necessary to arrange for financing the construction of dormitories and athletic facilities by the Wisconsin University Building Corporation.

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Upon motion of Regent Steiger, seconded by Regent Renk, it was

VOTED, That, upon the recommendation of the Dean of the College of Agriculture and the Directors of Starks Farms, Inc., the Vice President of Business and Finance be authorized to sign a 10-year lease with Starks Farms, Inc., for the use of the so-called Willis Juday Farm at Starks, Wisconsin, for potato breeding research and related functions without rental cost to the University; and that authority be granted to reconstruct the barn on the said farm to provide a warehouse for potato storage at an estimated cost of \$7500 chargeable to the Lelah Starks gift account, number 15-887; and that the Executive Committee be authorized to act for the Board in the award of contracts for the reconstruction work.

Upon motion of Regent Steiger, seconded by Regent Wanvig, it was  
VOTED, That authority be granted to advertise for bids for remodelling,  
new construction, and equipment of Unit No. 1 of the Extension Division Building  
in Milwaukee, in accordance with plans and specifications prepared by Gerrit J.  
de Gelleke, architect.

Upon motion of Regent Steiger, seconded by Regent Renk, it was  
VOTED, That authority be granted to raze the buildings on the former  
McGill property which is now a part of the University Arboretum.

Upon motion of Regent Steiger, seconded by Regent Wanvig, it was  
VOTED, That the Vice President of Business and Finance be authorized to  
sign contracts with the Coleman Floor Company, Chicago, Illinois, on the basis of  
their low bid of \$8,181.36, for furnishing and installing rubber-tile floors in the  
Wisconsin General Hospital, Bradley Memorial Hospital and the Infirmary.

Upon motion of Regent Steiger, seconded by Regent Renk, it was  
VOTED, That authority be granted to advertise for bids for alterations to  
the McArdle Memorial Laboratory and equipment in accordance with plans and specific-  
ations prepared by the State Architect.

Upon motion of Regent Steiger, seconded by Regent Laird, it was  
VOTED, That this Board go on record reaffirming its position regarding the  
removal of the quonset buildings on the lower campus.

Vice President Rennebohm asked the assemblage to rise, and Regent Laird  
presented the following resolution in memory of Miss Gretchen Schoenleber:

IN MEMORIAM

Miss Gretchen Schoenleber

We, the members of the Board of Regents of the University of Wisconsin,  
record with deep regret the death of Miss Gretchen Schoenleber, for eight  
years an outstanding member of the University Board of Visitors and for three  
years chairman of the Board.

A member of the University Class of 1911, Miss Schoenleber has since her  
graduation devoted herself to the educational and business life of the state  
with marked success. She was this year given the Wisconsin Alumni Association

Distinguished Service Award for her noteworthy contributions to her alma mater. She has been an active and productive member of the Milwaukee Alumni Club and the Alumni Association, with a particular and absorbing interest in the scholarship work of these organizations.

As a citizen of Milwaukee she served on the Community Welfare Council and as trustee of the Citizens' Governmental Research Bureau. As a business woman she took over the reins of the Ambrosia Chocolate Co. when her father died, to build it into one of the most modern mechanized plants of its kind in the Nation. She was the only woman on a commodity exchange in this country and one of the few to serve on the Cocoa and Chocolate Manufacturers' Industry Advisory Committee.

Women of her caliber, with intelligence, ability, and character, who have the will to devote their lives to the general welfare, are indispensable to our public life. We deeply regret her passing.

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Upon motion of Regent Watson, seconded by Regent Renk, it was  
VOTED, That the Special Regent Committee on Agricultural Lands be  
directed to include in their study the location of the University poultry yards,  
with the view to removal of said poultry yards from their present location at the  
earliest possible time; and that the committee be requested to report its findings  
and recommendations to this Board of Regents.

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Upon motion of Regent Renk, seconded by Regent Steiger, it was  
VOTED, That the meeting adjourn.

The meeting adjourned at 11:15 A.M.

7.30 RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT, ADMINISTRATION  
AND REGULATION OF LAND AND PROPERTY OWNED OR CONTROLLED  
BY THE UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN

Prescribed by  
THE REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN  
1953

WHEREAS, 36.06 (8) of the 1941 Wisconsin Statutes provides that all special powers conferred on the Conservation Commission by 27.01 (2) and (3) are conferred on The Regents of the University of Wisconsin (hereinafter referred to as the "Regents") insofar as they are applicable to lands owned by or under the control of the Regents, and that all penalties set forth in said subsections shall apply in the exercise of such powers by the Regents. and,

WHEREAS, The Regents deem it necessary and advisable to adopt and enforce certain rules and regulations for the management, administration, and regulation of lands and property owned by or under the control of the Regents;

NOW, THEREFORE, by virtue of the authority conferred on the Regents by 36.06 (8) of the 1941 Statutes, the Regents hereby prescribe and adopt the following rules and regulations which shall apply to all lands and property owned by or under the control of the Board of Regents:

7.31 POLICE OFFICERS.

Such persons as shall be authorized by the Regents shall be constituted police officers and shall have the power to enforce these rules and regulations, and for the purposes thereof shall police all property under the control of the said Regents. Such officers shall have all the powers provided in 27.01 (3) of the 1941 Statutes, except where such powers are specifically limited or modified by the Regents. Said police officers shall be identified by an appropriate shield or badge conspicuously worn, bearing the words, "Police, University of Wisconsin", and bearing a number.

7.32 DESIGNATION OF UNIVERSITY LAND

All lands and real property owned by or subject to the control of the Regents are hereby designated as University Parks, and as such shall come within the scope of these and all subsequent rules and regulations relating to University lands.

7.33 CHAPTER 85, STATUTES, APPLICABLE

All provisions of Chapter 85 of the Wisconsin Statutes entitled "Law of the Road" including subsequent amendments and revisions thereto which are pertinent to the regulation of the use of roads under the control of the Regents, not including highways, streets, or roads under the jurisdiction of the State or any of its political subdivisions, are hereby adopted and made applicable to all roads and ways which traverse University parks, except where such provisions are specifically limited or modified by the Regents.

7.340 PARKING RESTRICTIONS IN UNIVERSITY PARKS

7.341 Parking is prohibited at all times on roads, drives, and fire lanes travers-

ing University Parks and on all University lands, except that, the Dean of the College of Agriculture or his designated representative is authorized to establish necessary parking areas at Upham Woods and on University farms not on the main Madison campus, and the directors of the Extension Centers are authorized to establish necessary parking areas at the Centers, and the Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds may designate areas as appropriate and safe for parking for specific groups at specific times, providing such areas are properly posted and patrolled as parking areas, and except at places hereinafter specified:

- a. The west side of the driveway between Radio Hall and Science Hall, limited by proper signs to 45 minutes.
- b. The west side of Babcock Drive near Slichter Hall between designating signs, limited to the hours 6 p.m. to 1:00 a.m. during the time women students are quartered in Slichter Hall.
- c. The east side of Babcock Drive in front of Slichter Hall, limited by proper signs to 30 minutes.
- d. The north side of Linden Drive west of Babcock Drive as relocated and between terminal signs, limited to 30 minutes for patrons of the Nursery School so long as that function is carried on in building T-17.
- e. The south side of Linden Drive in front of Babcock Hall between terminal signs, limited to 30 minutes for visitors to Babcock Hall.
- f. The area between the steps leading to Gate 22 and the entrance to Gate 21 at the southeast corner of the Stadium limited by proper signs to 30 minutes.
- g. Parking area No. 20, north of the Nurses Dormitory, reserved for visitors to the University Hospitals.
- h. Parking areas, designated hereinafter in Section 7.342, limited to persons specifically assigned to such areas by permits.
- i. Designated parking areas at the Arboretum and Picnic Point, limited to the hours specified hereinafter in Section 7.3713, and at the area west of the Tent Colony, the Daisy Field, and Willows Beach, limited to the hours specified hereinafter in Section 7.3714.
- j. Designated parking areas in the University Houses project at Eagle Heights.

7.342 Except as provided in Section 7.3421, parking in the following University parking areas is prohibited to others than persons specifically assigned to such areas. Motor vehicles so assigned to any of these parking areas shall be identified by an appropriate parking permit affixed to the vehicle as designated by the Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds.

7.3421	In order to provide off-street parking in University parking areas for pub-

lic patrons of University events, such as, for example, athletic contests, motor vehicles may be permitted to park in areas designated for such purpose by the Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds for a limited time not exceeding twelve hours continuously and on payment of a parking fee not exceeding one dollar for each event.

7.343 Parking is prohibited at all times in areas which must be kept clear for the passage of fire apparatus. Said areas shall be designated by standard signs reading, "Fire Zone, No Parking at Any Time."

7.344 Parking is prohibited at all times in areas which must be kept clear for vehicles to load and unload. Such areas shall be designated by standard signs reading, "Loading Zone, No Parking at Any Time."

7.345 Motor vehicles parked in a restricted parking area without a permit, or motor vehicles parked in a fire zone, loading zone, or no parking zone, and unlicensed or partially dismantled motor vehicles, may be towed off the university premises and stored at the owner's expense.

#### 7.350 GENERAL TRAFFIC REGULATIONS

7.351 As a safety measure, there is hereby established a maximum speed limit of 15 miles per hour for motor vehicle traffic on all roads and drives on that part of the University campus within the area bordered by Lake Street on the east, Regent Street on the south, and Breese Terrace and Walnut Street on the west; and a maximum speed limit of 25 miles per hour is established on all other University roads and drives, except as otherwise specified.

7.352 No motor vehicle shall be driven on any road within the Eagle Heights University Housing Project at a speed in excess of 10 miles per hour, except that the speed limit on the road leading to the Eagle Heights Housing Project, between Oxford Road and the stop sign at the entrance to the project, shall be 25 miles per hour.

7.353 No motor vehicle shall be driven on any road traversing Camp Randall Memorial Park at a speed in excess of 10 miles per hour.

7.354

- a. Southbound traffic on University campus shall come to a full stop at the intersection of all campus roads and University Avenue.
- b. All vehicles entering Park Street from campus roads or parking areas shall come to a full stop at the intersection of such roads and Park Street, with the exception of eastbound traffic on Observatory Drive from Bascom Hall entering Park Street at the Memorial Union.
- c. All vehicles entering Langdon Street from campus roads or parking areas shall come to a full stop at the intersection of such roads and Langdon Street.
- d. Eastbound traffic leading from the Eagle Heights University Housing Project to University Bay Drive shall come to a full stop at the intersection of University Bay Drive and Oxford Road.
- e. Westbound traffic on Linden Drive and southbound traffic on Elm Drive shall come to a full stop at the intersection of said Linden Drive with said Elm Drive.
- f. Northbound traffic on the road east of the Electrical Engineering and Mechanics Building shall come to a full stop at the intersection with Johnson Drive and westbound traffic on Johnson Drive shall come to a full stop at the intersection with the first road mentioned.

- g. All southbound traffic on Lake Mendota Drive shall come to a full stop at the intersection of Lake Mendota Drive with University Bay Drive.
- h. All eastbound and westbound traffic shall come to a full stop before entering Charter Street.
- i. All northbound traffic on Walnut Street shall come to a full stop at the intersection with Willow Drive.
- j. All northbound and southbound traffic on Babcock Drive shall come to a full stop at the intersection with Linden Drive.
- k. All eastbound and westbound traffic on Linden Drive shall come to a full stop at the intersection with the road leading to the Wisconsin General Hospital and at the intersection with Henry Mall.
- l. All westbound traffic from the Arboretum shall come to a full stop at the intersection with Seminole Highway.
- m. All westbound traffic on Observatory Drive shall come to a full stop at the intersection with Babcock Drive.
- n. All traffic from parking areas and service drives shall come to a full stop before entering streets and campus roads.
- o. All traffic entering or leaving the enclosed parking area at the rear of Wisconsin General Hospital shall come to a full stop before entering the passageway at the south end of Bradley Memorial Hospital.
- p. All traffic entering or leaving the Eagle Heights University Housing Project shall come to a full stop as indicated by stop signs at the main entrance between Buildings No. 1 and No. 41.
- q. All westbound traffic from the Van Hise Dormitories area shall come to a full stop before entering Babcock Drive.

7.355 U and Y turns are prohibited on Observatory Drive from Charter Street to Babcock Drive.

7.356 All trucking on all University parks roads is prohibited, except for purposes of delivery to University Buildings, campus construction projects, and residences within University Parks.

7.357 Private motor vehicles owned by students, in the possession of students, or used for the transportation of students are not to be driven on that part of the campus east of Babcock Drive and east of Breese Terrace during the hours 7:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. on weekdays, and from 7:00 A.M. to 12:00 Noon on Saturdays. All privately owned motor vehicles operated in Madison by students shall be registered by such students with the Department of Protection and Security.

#### 7.360 CONSERVATION OF UNIVERSITY PARKS, DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY

- 7.361 a. The dumping of any waste, trash, debris or other rubbish on any University Property is prohibited, except only as may be specifically authorized by the Regents.
- b. Except as authorized by the Regents, the removal of any shrubs, vegetation, wood, timber, rocks, stone, earth, or other products from the University parks is prohibited.
- c. The removal, destruction or molestation of any bird, animal and fish life within the boundaries of University Parks is prohibited, except in cases wherein this provision conflicts with any order of the Wisconsin Conservation Commission, when such Commission is empowered to act; and in such cases of conflict said Commission order shall govern.

- d. The presence of dogs is prohibited in the Arboretum and Picnic Point at all times. The presence of dogs is prohibited in other areas of the University parks unless they are on leash.
- e. Carrying or using firearms on University property except as required for (1) educational programs, (2) use in established rifle and pistol ranges, and (3) for police and military purposes is prohibited unless otherwise authorized by the Regents.

7.362 It shall be unlawful to break, tear up, mar, destroy or deface any notice, tree, vine, shrub, flower or other vegetation, or dislocate any stones or disfigure natural conditions or destroy or damage in any way any other property, real or personal, within the boundaries of any University park. The penalty provided in section 26.19 of the 1941 Statutes shall apply to violations of this subsection.

#### 7.370 CONDUCT WITHIN UNIVERSITY PARKS

7.3701 Picnicking is prohibited in University Parks except in the Arboretum, Picnic Point, the area west of the Tent Colony and the Daisy Field in such specific areas as are designated by the Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds to be picnic grounds. All rules and regulations for picnics which are posted by order of the Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds must be strictly complied with. The Dean of the College of Agriculture or his designated representative is authorized to establish picnic areas on University Farms.

7.3702 The lighting and use of fires is prohibited except in such places as are set aside for this purpose and appropriately designated by standard signs. It shall be unlawful to throw away any cigarette, cigar, pipe ashes, or other burning material without first extinguishing them.

7.3703 All canvassing, peddling, or soliciting shall be prohibited on the grounds or in the buildings of the University except that the Vice President of Business and Finance with the consent of the President of the University may authorize subscription, membership, and ticket sales solicitation by University and student organizations and campaigns for charitable purposes at such times and in such manner as not to interfere with regular University business and functions. Food or beverage concessions operated either by students or private parties are prohibited unless prior approval is granted by the Vice President of Business and Finance.

7.3704 The use of the Wisconsin Union and its facilities is restricted to members, faculty, staff, and invited guests except on occasions when the Union Council may invite the general public to an open house. No person shall enter or remain in any of the Wisconsin Union's facilities except as herein provided.

7.3705 As an anti-littering measure, the distribution of handbills, pamphlets, and other similar materials on the grounds or in the buildings of the University is prohibited, except that student and University organizations may be granted permission for such distribution by the office of Student Personnel Services provided that the organization agrees in writing to collect all discarded materials from its distribution on the campus and to distribute no unlawful material.

7.3706 The erection, posting or attaching of signs in or on any building or University grounds is prohibited except on regular bulletin boards. The Director of Residence Halls is authorized to allow exceptions to this rule, for temporary periods for the University Residence Halls and immediately adjacent grounds. The

Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds is authorized to allow exceptions for temporary periods for the remainder of the University campus. The Dean of the College of Agriculture or his designated representative is authorized to allow similar exceptions for temporary periods for the University Farms.

7.3707 Smoking is prohibited in the classrooms, laboratories, rest rooms, store rooms, and corridors of University buildings except for such areas as are designated for that purpose by the Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds.

7.3708 Walking upon the roof of University buildings is prohibited at all times except where emergency egress to a fire escape is necessary, unless such roof has been specifically constructed to be walked upon.

7.3709 The use of mobile public address systems for advertising or other purposes upon the University property is prohibited at all times. The use of stationary public address systems outside of the buildings on the Madison campus is prohibited at all times except that the Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds is authorized to permit the use of such equipment for special events.

7.3710 Swimming, fishing, and boating in ponds, lagoons, streams and all waters within the boundaries of the Arboretum is prohibited. The storing of boats, boating gear, and other equipment within the boundaries of University parks except under conditions specified by the Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds, and except as otherwise authorized by the Regents, is prohibited. There shall be no swimming, fishing, docking or mooring of boats from University piers, except as follows; and, unless otherwise indicated, the facilities are available only to University personnel:

- a. Crew pier - Reserved for crew purposes only. No trespassing.
- b. Life Saving pier - Reserved for Life Saving purposes only. Boat docking permitted. No trespassing.
- c. University pier (East of Memorial Union) - Swimming and docking of boats permitted. Open to public.
- d. Hoofers pier - Reserved for members and guests of the Hoofers Club. Docking and mooring of boats permitted.
- e. Lake Laboratory piers (2) - Reserved for Lake Laboratory purposes. No trespassing.
- f. Piers at Van Hise and Kronshage dormitories - Reserved for University Halls residents. Boat docking and swimming permitted.
- g. Pier at Elizabeth Waters Hall - Reserved for University Halls residents and University Medical School and University Hospitals personnel. Boat docking and swimming permitted.
- h. Picnic Point pier - To be used as a boat dock only. Open to public.
- i. Tent Colony pier - Reserved for Tent Colony residents. Boat docking and swimming permitted. Fishing permitted only as the Director of the Colony may direct.

7.3711 Drunkenness or disorderly conduct of any kind is prohibited. The use or possession of intoxicating liquors or beer with an alcoholic content of more than 3.2% by weight is prohibited on all University property.

7.3712 No fermented malt beverages containing  $\frac{1}{2}$  of 1% or more by volume shall be sold, dispensed, given away, or furnished to, or purchased by or for any persons under the age of 18 years, on University of Wisconsin property, unless accompanied by parent or guardian.
