The State Historical Society of Wisconsin was first organized on January 30th, 1849, nineteen days after the opening of the first session of the state legislature in Madison. Its members were chiefly state officers and legislators, and Gov. Nelson Dewey was the first president. Increase A. Lapham, a distinguished scientist and antiquarian, was secretary, but he was able to give no time to the work. Public addresses were given before the society in 1849, 1850, and 1851, by prominent citizens of the state; but beyond these, nothing of importance was done during this period. A library of fifty volumes was slowly accumulated, the meagre collection being contained in a small glass-faced case, kept on a table in a corner of the governor's office, and this case is now exhibited as a curiosity in the society's museum.

It was evident that at this rate of progress, the society would never amount to anything. Somebody must devote his entire time to the work, becoming personally responsible for the conduct of the society's affairs, and giving to it life and character. The man for the place was imported to Madison in October, 1852. He was Lyman C. Draper, a young Philadelphia antiquarian, who had already achieved much success in the accumulation of materials for the history of the Middle West and the South.

For various reasons, it was January 18, 1854, before the society was thoroughly reorganized for work on the new plan. Draper was at that time chosen secretary, and at once entered with joyous enthusiasm upon the undertaking of accumulating books for the library, relics and curiosities for the museum, portraits for the gallery, and documents for publication. In the course of a few weeks, the little library case was too small. By the close of the year, the secretary was able to report to the society the acquisition of two thousand volumes and pamphlets. For want of space, the greater part of the acquisitions were stored in Draper's residence until August, 1855, when a small room in the basement of the local Baptist church was secured for the society's use.

The society soon securing legislative aid, the collections grew rapidly, until nearly the entire basement of the church was occupied. place was, however, dark, damp, and dingy, and in no way suited to library purposes. In January, 1866, the library, portrait gallery, and museum of the society were, by authority of the legislature, removed to quarters especially prepared for them in the then new south wing of the capitol. It was thought that there was now ample room for the accessions of at least a quarter of a century. But such was the rate of increase, that by the year 1881, cords of volumes, pamphlets, and relics

were piled in out-of-the-way corners and rooms throughout the capitol, there being no space to shelve or display them.

In 1881-84, two new transverse wings were added to the capitol. To the use of society, there were assigned the three upper floors of one of these wings, and into it the society's possessions were transferred in

December, 1884. But the new quarters soon proved to be inadequate in extent, faulty in construction, and not fire-proof; moreover, the state government in time came to demand for the use of legislative clerks and committees the space occupied by the society. The great need of the latter was seen to be a commodious fire-proof building, designed and equipped upon the most approved models, for the accommodation of its



library and museum, and its several offices. After many years of agitation, the legislatures of 1895, 1897, and 1899 came liberally to the rescue, with tax levies which in due time will aggregate \$620,000. The desired building is at last nearing completion, upon an ample plot of ground given for the purpose by the board of regents of the state university, in the proximity of that institution. It is anticipated that the

removal into this building—to occur, probably, during the early summer of 1900—will be accompanied by considerable private gifts to the library and museum, and a general broadening of the society's influence and usefulness.

The society is actively engaged in several departments of historical and economic research and collection; has a fairly-equipped historical and ethnographical museum; and a considerable portrait gallery of Wisconsin worthies. About 50,000 persons visit the gallery and museum annually.

Yet whatever reputation the society may have won among scholars, has chiefly been the outgrowth of its library, and its numerous historical and bibliographical publications; in these it takes great interest, and Miscel, Org.

is doing its best educational work. In 1875, the miscellaneous books in the state library, at the north end of the capitol, were transferred, by order of the legislature, to the Historical Society's library, leaving the former purely a state law library, under the control of the justices of the supreme court; while the latter became, to all intents and purposes, the miscellaneous state library, in charge of the Historical Society.

The State Historical Library now numbers about 205,000 titles. The average annual increase is 6,500 titles. It is a general reference collection, with the departments of American and English history, economics, politics, sociology, travel, and geography developed with especial care.

There are a few special collections, which largely contribute to the reputation of the institution. One of these is the so-called Tank Library, consisting of 5,000 old and rare volumes, mostly in the Dutch language-probably the largest collection of Dutch books in the United States. Nearly half of them are richly bound in vellum, and many are profusely illustrated with seventeenth-century copperplate engravings; in the collection are numerous Bibles, atlases and charts, old editions of the classics, early lexicons, and historical works.

Of the principal daily and weekly newspapers of the state, the society's files generally reach back to the first issues of the journals represented. The collection of bound newspaper files published outside the state, amounts to nearly 9,000 volumes. From the date 1656, there are few years not represented by some prominent English or American journal; from 1750 forward, the collection is unusually strong, especially in the American department.

The Draper collection of about 400 bound volumes of manuscripts. covering the history of the West and South from 1734 to 1816, is a famous possession of the society. So also, are the Wisconsin MSS., and the great mass of printed material for the original study of Western history. The collections of genealogy, Shakesperiana, early English dramas, English local histories, reports of public institutions, and bound magazines are all of them notable among scholars.

On account of the proximity of the state university, about ninety per cent. of the readers in the Historical Library are members of that institution, and in purveying for the library their wants are taken into consideration. The university history seminars, and some special classses in that line of work, are given the use of rooms adjoining the library; and in the new building will have still more ample conveniences. The students and professors are, in fact, encouraged to use the library as freely as they would that of the university itself; and indeed, they chiefly rely upon it in the domain of history, economics, and kindred subjects. In addition to university students, specialists from all parts of the country may be found in the Historical Library, especially in the summer months.


