PRESENT: Regents Grady, Callahan, Gelatt, Kleczka.

Upon motion of Regent Kleczka, seconded by Regent Callahan, it was VOTED, That an allotment of \$55,000 from the War Contracts Reserve Account No. 16D-990 be approved for the remodelling of the West Wing of the Machanical Engineering Building; that the following estimated schedule of costs for this project be approved:

that the contract for this work be awarded to Robert Morgan Company, Madison, Wisconsin, in the net amount of \$49,900, on the basis of their low bid of \$50,534, less deduction of \$634 for omitting asphalt tile floor, and that the Vice President of Business and Finance be authorized to sign the contract.

Upon motion of Regent Callahan, seconded by Regent Gelatt, it was VOTED, That the following revised estimated schedule of costs for the construction of a basement addition to Sterling Hall for housing University dial telephone exchange equipment be approved:

Upon motion of Regent Kleczka, seconded by Regent Callahan, it was VOTED That the Vice President of Business and Finance be authorized to sign a contract with the Department of the Army for research studies to be conducted under the direction of Dr. Green of the Enzyme Institute during the period September 1, 1948 to August 31, 1949. The total contract amount is \$20,000.

Upon motion of Regent Callahan, seconded by Regent Gelatt, it was yOTED, That the Vice President of Business and Finance be authorized to sign a contract with the Navy Department, Office of Naval Research (No. N8onr-60000) for a research project in the College of Agriculture during the period May 1, 1948 to April 30, 1951, in the sum of \$6,100.

Upon motion of Regent Kleczka, seconded by Regent Gelatt, it was VOTED, That the following budget for the Milwaukee Seminary Fund for the fiscal year 1948-49 be approved:

Upon motion of Regent Gelatt, seconded by Regent Callahan, it was VOTED, That the Vice President of Business and Finance be authorized to sign a cooperative agreement with the U.S. Geological Survey for a topographic survey of the State of Wisconsin during the period July 1, 1948 to June 30, 1949, each party to the agreement to appropriate \$15,000 for this work.

Upon motion of Regent Callahan, seconded by Regent Gelatt, it was VOTED, That, upon the recommendation of the College of Agriculture, the in-

ease in federal funds for agricultural research (Bankhead-Jones and Hope-Flannagan appropriations) be added to the 1948-49 University budget and distributed as follows:

Upon motion of Regent Kleczka, seconded by Regent Gelatt, it was VOTED, That the President and the Secretary of the Regents of the University of Wisconsin be and they hereby are authorized and empowered to sign a deed conveying the following described lands to the United States of America to provide a portion of a site for a veterans hospital in accordance with the terms and conditions approved by the Regents on May 28, 1948:

A tract of land situated in the County of Dane, State of Wisconsin, being part of  $S_2^1SE_4^1$  section 16, township 7 north, range 9 east of the 4th principal meridian, and being more particularly described as follows; all bearings being referred to true north: Beginning at the southeast corner of the  $SW_4^1SE_4^1$  of said section 16, said point of beginning being north  $89^{\circ}31$  west, 1339.5 feet from the southeast

corner of said section 16; thence north  $89^{\circ}$  31! west, 824.85 feet along the south line of said section 16 to a point, said point being south  $89^{\circ}$  31! east, 513.4 feet from the southwest corner of said  $SW_{+}^{1}SE_{+}^{1}$  section 16; thence north  $00^{\circ}$  17! east, 222.0 feet to a point; thence south  $89^{\circ}$  31! east, 825.8 feet to a point; thence south  $00^{\circ}$  32! west, 222.0 feet to the point of beginning, containing 4.21 acres, more or less.

Upon motion of Regent Callahan, seconded by Regent Gelatt, it was VOTED, That the resignation of Colonel Willis S. Matthews as Commandant and Professor of Military Science and Tactics be accepted as of July 1, 1948. (Colonel Matthews has been assigned to other duty by the Army.)

Upon motion of Regent Kleczka, seconded by Regent Callahan, it was VOTED, That upon the recommendation of the Department of the Army, Colonel Carl E. Lundquist be appointed Commandant and Professor of Military Science and Tactics effective on his assignment to duty at the University of Wisconsin by the Department of the Army.

Upon motion of Regent Kleczka, seconded by Regent Callahan, it was VOTED, That upon the recommendation of Dean Middleton, Clifton Nathan Woolsey be appointed Charles Summer Slichter Research Professor in Neuro-Physiology at a salary rate of \$9,000 on the twelve months' basis, effective August 1, 1948. Salary chargeable to the W.A.R.F. grant for the Charles Summer Slichter Professorship. (Confirming previous approval by mail vote of the Regents.)

Upon motion of Regent Gelatt, seconded by Regent Callahan, it was VOTED, That the following budgets for short courses in the College of Agriculture be approved:

Upon motion of Regent Kleczka, seconded by Regent Gelatt, it was VOTED, That the following report of actions taken by the Vice President of Business and Finance be approved:

- (a) In accordance with authority granted by the Regents for the Vice President of Business and Finance to sign contracts and agreements for educational services requested by the Government, the following contracts and amendments have been signed:
  - (i) Renewal agreement renewing Veterans Administration Contract No. VA-vr-170, covering veterans testing and counselling services at Madison, as of July 1, 1948, on the same basis as for the previous year, pending the renegotiation of the contract.

- (ii) Army Contract No. W-11-175-TNG-(AAV)-242, covering the enrollment of five Army Officers in a graduate course in Journalism during the 1948 and 1949 summer sessions and the 1948-49 and 1949-50 academic years, for which the Government will pay the equivalent of the nonresident tuition.
- (iii) Supplement No. 2 to Veterans Administration Contract No. VA 30r vr-193, covering the furnishing of a course of instruction by the University Extension Division for a veteran enrolled under the provisions of Public Law #16.
- (iv) Supplement No. 1 to Veterans Administration Contract No. VA 30r vr-307, covering additional short courses and summer session offered during the 1947-48 academic year and the 1948 summer period, for veterans enrolled under the provisions of Public Law #16.
- (b) In accordance with authority granted by the Regents on September 27, 1947, for the Vice President of Business and Finance to sign contracts and leases not in excess of \$2,500, the following contracts, leases and orders have been signed.
  - (i) Hubert Hundb, La Crosse, Wisconsin, additional rental for the period July 1, 1948 to June 30, 1949, at the rate of \$2 per acre for 15 acres, for providing help in planting, cultivating, and harvesting crops on the experimental area near the La Crosse Erosion Experiment Station which was leased by the University for a period of 10 years under lease approved by the Regents on May 11, 1940 \$30.00
  - (ii) Contract, Home Insulation of Madison, Inc., Madison, Wisconsin, for labor and materials for installation of acoustic material in Bascom Hall in Rooms 100, 101, 103, 105 and 107 (\$361.00) and in Rooms 169, 170, and 171 (\$503.00); total
  - (iii) City of Racine for use of Washington Park High School by University Extension Division on February 19, 1948, for practice basketball game 5.00
    - (iv) Use of facilities in the Milwaukee Y.M.C.A. Building by the University Extension Division for physical education and recreational purposes during the period October 1, 1948 to April 1, 1949; rental for the period 600.00
    - (v) Marathon County Board for light, heat and janitor service in Marathon County Normal School Building and Marathon County Youth Buildings for the month of June, 1948, occupied by the University Extension Center 250.00
    - (vi) Use of Racine Y.M.C.A. gymnasium for the Racine Extension Center physical education classes during the second semester of 1947-48; total cost

(vii) Milwaukee Recreation Company, for rental of Antlers Ballroom for Milwaukee Extension Center Welcome Dances on
October 1, 1948, and February 11, 1949, at \$225 per evening
