

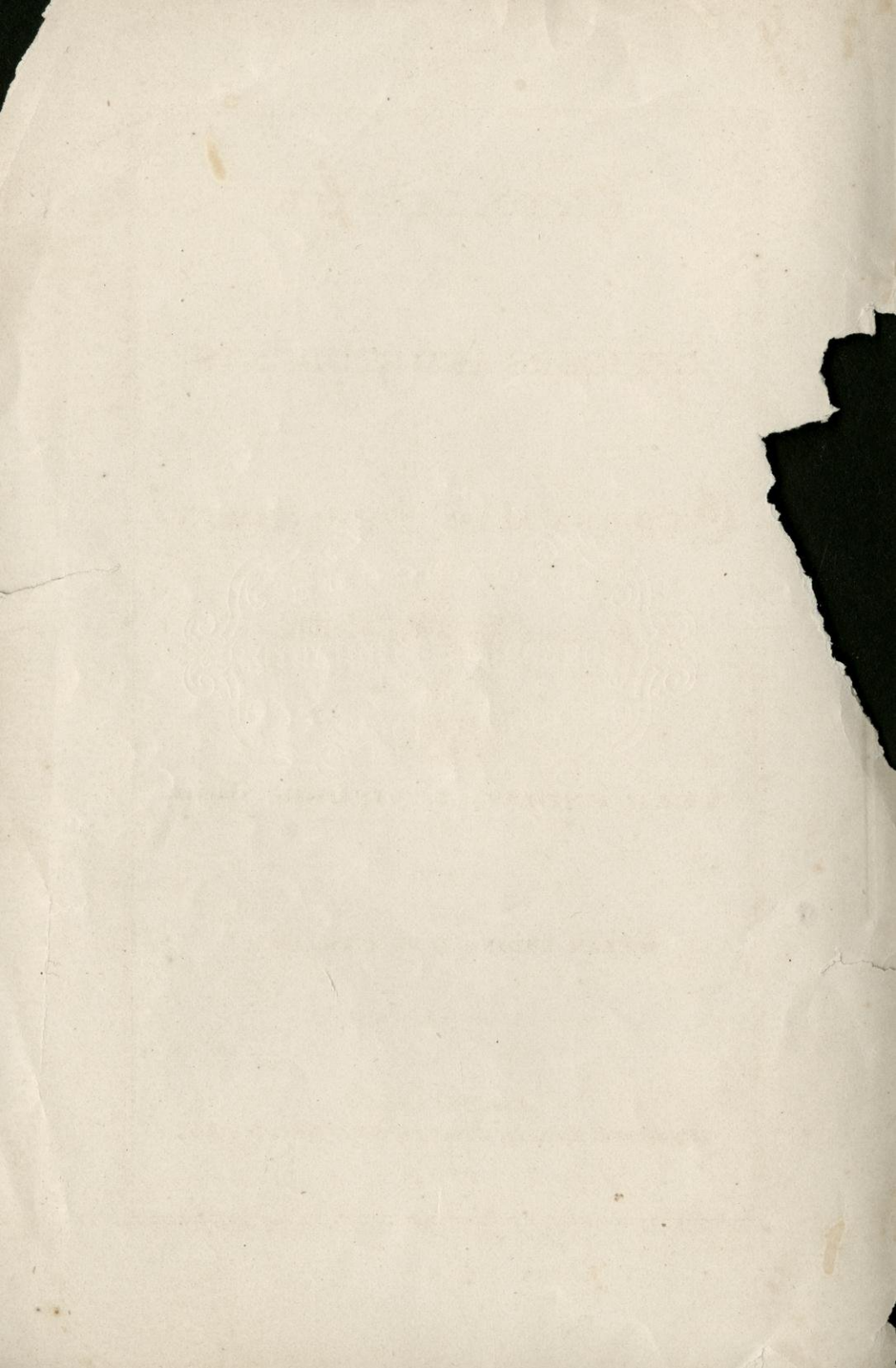

DIPLOMAS.

Students completing either of the above courses of study will receive the Diploma of the Seminary, on paper or parchment, as they may elect.

ELECTIVE.

All of the common branches are taught each term. There are constantly five classes in Written Arithmetic and three in English Grammar. There is a beginning class in Latin each term. Any of the above studies may be pursued at any time, but students are earnestly advised to follow the course.

COMMERCIAL.

Those wishing to fit themselves for business, will find the classes in Bookkeeping and Commercial Arithmetic an excellent preparation. They are taught by a practical book keeper.

NORMAL CLASS.

A Normal Class is formed in the Fall Term, and during the other terms when desired. In this all the modern improvements in teaching are discussed.

COLLEGE--PREPARATORY STUDIES.

Especial efforts are made to accommodate those who desire to fit themselves for any college.

RHETORICAL.

Weekly Rhetorical Exercises are required of all. A class in Elocution will also be formed.

MUSIC.

Under the supervision of Prof. Jacobs, the music department is still popular. Instruction is given on Piano or Melodeon and in Vocal Music.

GERMAN.

Unsurpassed facilities are afforded for the study of German. A class is begun at the first term each year.

LECTURES.

Frequent lectures, with experiments, are delivered to the students, making a pleasing and profitable diversion from the regular routine of study.

APPARATUS AND LIBRARY.

The Seminary possesses a fine apparatus for illustrating the Tides, the movements of the Planets and the positions of the Stars. Also a Microscope and a good Chemical and Philosophical apparatus, Maps and Charts, &c.

A small Library and good Reading Room are open to the students, free from charge.

PRIZES.

The Lewis Prize, founded by ex-Gov. J. T. Lewis, LL. D., is awarded to the student, who, during the year preceding, has made the "Best Intellectual and Moral Improvement."

There will also be awarded the Principal's Prize, to the student that shall have made the greatest proficiency in English Composition.

SOCIETIES.

Two permanent and flourishing societies are connected with the seminary,—the Ingelownian and Philalathean. Both have made good beginnings in securing libraries.

MERIT AND DEMERIT.

An accurate account of the standing of each pupil, on a scale of 10, is kept, and no student not reaching 5 will be admitted to examinations. Any student receiving 25 demerits will be expelled, or suspended for the remainder of the term.

MORAL AND RELIGIOUS.

The Faculty strive to pay special attention to the manners and morals of the students.

During the past winter Evansville was chartered, and the village Board of Trustees have permanently closed all Billiard Saloons, and no Drinking Saloons have ever been allowed. With four good churches and no saloons, it is thought that no place offers greater incitements to virtue and less temptations to vice.

LOCATION.

Evansville, Wisconsin, is a beautiful village on the Beloit & Madison Rail Road, twenty-one miles from Madison and twenty from Janesville, via Janesville Junction.

Regulations.

I. The following things are required of students, unless special permission for their non-performance be obtained from the Faculty :

1. Three studies for each student, and no change after first selection.

2. Punctuality in attendance upon, and promptness in preparation for all school duties, especially all general rhetorical exercises designated by the Faculty.

3. Attendance at Church upon the Sabbath and morning prayers in the Chapel.

4. The obtaining permission, if practicable, for neglect of any of the above requirements beforehand, otherwise rendering the excuse as soon after as possible.

5. Strict obedience to all temporary prudential regulations that may be made by the Faculty.

II. The following things are prohibited unless by special permission from the Faculty :

1. All communication between students in Recitation.

2. Absence from private study room, during study hours, except for school duties.

3. Absence from town or sleeping out of one's room.

4. Leaving school before the end of the term of entrance.

5. Receiving or making calls, riding or walking with one of the opposite sex.

6. Attending all parties, gatherings or public assemblies other than religious.

7. The holding any public meetings or forming any societies.

III. The following things are unconditionally prohibited :

1. Clamorous noise, seuffing, running, jumping, or the use of tobacco in the Seminary buildings.

2. The use of gunpowder on the Seminary premises.

3. The use of obscene or profane language, books or communications, or intoxicating drinks, the frequenting of bar-rooms or saloons, or engaging in any games of chance, or attending any dances.

4. A disregard of the sanctity of the Sabbath.

No one need apply for admission who cannot or will not keep the above regulations.
