

By packing in bond, and through special concessions, we supply twice as much as you could buy and send yourself.

Facts and Details as to the Working of the Fund

THE DEMAND

There are nearly 200,000 Belgian Soldiers still holding on to the last few miles of Belgian Territory. Tobacco is an essential to these men with but few exceptions. They are an army without a country to supply their needs. Their compatriots are either destitute and sheltering in England and Holland, or under German domination in Belgium. The Belgian Soldiers have no money of their own and, asked recently whether they preferred to have improved food or tobacco, said: "Give us worse food if you like, but let us have Tobacco." That heroic Monarch, King Albert, and his Minister of War have requested the Over-Seas Club to undertake this work, because they know of the successful manner in which the Club because they know of the successful manner in which the Club has been caring for the smoking needs of the British forces.

THE SUPPLY

To fill the demand nearly 200,000 packages of Tobacco of a special kind are required each week. Each package costs 25 cents.

ALL THE MONEY FOR TOBACCO

Every cent contributed is expended in the actual purchase of Tobacco and Cigarettes to be sent to the Belgian soldiers.

NO EXPENSES

The whole of the organization expenses are borne by the Over-Seas Club.

The Tobacco is manufactured in bond and the British, French and Belgian Governments have agreed that no customs duties shall be charged.

NO FREIGHT CHARGES
The British and Belgian Authorities have undertaken to convey the Tobacco to the men on the firing line free of any charge.

MAXIMUM VALUE

These concessions, together with special terms arranged with the manufacturers, make it possible to supply for 25 cents more than twice as much Tobacco as a private individual could purchase at a retail store and send to the front for the same amount.

CONTENTS OF PACKAGE

Each contribution of 25 cents will supply a package containing 50 good quality Cigarettes, a large packet of good quality Tobacco, a box of matches and a reply post card. The Tobacco and Cigarettes will be of American manufacture, made specially to our order to suit the Belgian taste. Sample packages can be seen at the Office of the Fund.

REPLY POST CARD

The object of the post card is to enable the recipient to acknowledge the gift. The subscriber's name and address are written on the post card and the soldier at the front has merely to write his thanks on the back. These post cards will probably bring the sender into personal touch with the receiver and a collection of them will make most interesting War Souvenirs.

WHERE TO SEND THE MONEY

Money received should be forwarded at least twice a month, together with a list of contributors with names and addresses written legibly in order that the post cards may be correctly addressed, to the Depositaries, Messrs. J. P. Morgan & Co., New York. Drafts, checks and money orders should be made payable to the Belgian Soldiers' Tobacco Fund.
