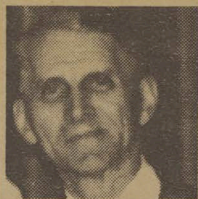

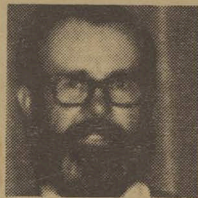

English and music from Augsburg College in Minneapolis.



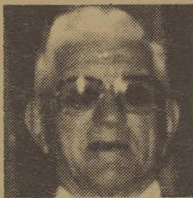
Grant Ellingson, 60, guitar. Grant is the manager of a farm supply store. He hails from Klamath Falls, Oregon. Grant started playing guitar at age 12. He put the instrument aside for many years, after enjoying limited time for playing during his years in the Army Air Force between 1942 and

1946. Grant's other hobbies include wood and metal working.



Kenneth Thompson, 65, Lead accordion. Kenneth is the composer of the "Goose River Waltz," which is included on this tape. He bought his first accordion in 1935, but put it in mothballs for several years while he raised his family and worked to support them. Kenneth says the accordion bug hit him

again in 1960, when he heard the excellent old time music being played at the Steamthreshers Reunion in Rollag, Minnesota.



Stanley Ellingson, 77, six-key harmonica. Stanley is the oldest member of the "Bonanza Steamers." He is a retired farmer from Wolverton, Minnesota. He started playing the harmonica when he was 15 years old. Even though he can't read music, Stanley is an accomplished musician.

After putting the harmonica aside for several years during his career as a farmer and machinery service man, Stanley picked up his favorite instrument again in his latter years, and joined the "Bonanza Steamers" in 1978.
