# JANESVILLE.

---

It is only in these days of railroad construction and land speculation, that it has become a matter of common occurrence to lay out and build cities in pursuance of a preconceived plan, and at such places as common consent or individual shrewdness determines to be an eligible situation for a prospective commercial center. Although analogous instances of cities laid out on paper and transferred to a real existence on solid ground, natural or artificial, occur in the history of almost all nations. The one powerful inducement for the congregation of people in closely built communities was, in former times, the necessity for protection, either by uniting their individual strength, or by the grace of a powerful Lord. Thus it is, that, in the old world, almost every city of importance can point to the original lordly mansions, or to the exact spot where the feudal castle once raised its mighty bastions and turrets toward the sky, far above the thatched cottages that crowded about its walls in the closest possible proximity to the arm that was to guard them against the raids of neighboring robber barons. The same thing has been repeated on a similar scale in this country, where the rude block-house or palisaded wooden fort, built as an advance in the domain of native Indians, to serve as a protection against expected attacks, often formed the nucleus of a settlement which gradually extended in ever widening circles, while, at the same time, it condensed in its center to a village that ultimately gained the dignity of a city.

There are those cities, however, which count their origin not from the more or less elaborate abode of grim war, but from the rude chapel and roughly hewn cross of the early missionary who risked his life for the spiritual welfare of his savage brother of the forest. A still larger portion of our western cities have no other beginning than the humble dwelling around which a solitary backwoodsman cleared a small space to plant his scanty stores of seed and grain, or where an adventurous trader of the early days spread out wares, to barter with his dusky neighbors for the gain of their hunting expeditions.

Janesville had a very peaceful beginning which is an epitome of its whole subsequent history. It can point to no ruin of castle or fort; there is no field or hill, copse or creek of which it can be said that there raged once a battle, whether between civilized or savage foes; and an ordinary city business block covers the spot where the first white settler built his house. The history of the city, therefore, can but be a record of the peaceful conquest of a virgin soil, only occasionally disturbed by little dissensions of financial convulsions; a record, indeed, that is a blessing to the inhabitants of such a place, but not of a character to excite the lively interest and sympathy of an outside world.

\* \* \* \* \*

Janesville, as a home, is one of the most delightful cities in the Northwest. It possesses advantages that cannot be overlooked by those desirous of establishing themselves in a healthy locality for purposes of trade, commerce or business of any description. An equable climate, almost entirely free from the dense fogs which are the horrors of cities adjacent to the seaboard, gives it that healthy mien which is seldom present along any of the water courses of this country or Europe.

There is a subtle something, hard to describe, a bonhomie, good fellowship, good breeding, refinement, perhaps a combination of many excellent qualities which seem to pervade the very atmosphere of the city, and to penetrate all the avenues of life. Society in Janesville is delightful, and this remark is intended to apply to all grades and classes. The lines of demarkation between the different strata are finely drawn. The most severe and exclusive circles, refined, intelligent and educated, exist side by side with less ostentatious, but not less cultivated, coteries, and in the humblest ranks of the community there is an independence of thought and action which begets manhood in the highest sense of the term. That our citizens fully appreciate this is tested by the fact that a citizen of Janesville, in whatever section of the globe he may be, like the Swiss of their native Alps, longs for the city that gave him birth and never loses pride in its beauty and delight.

A stranger from any of the larger cities, upon his entrance to Janesville, is struck by the absence of tenement houses—those fearful scourges, the hotbeds of crime and pestilence in so many of the larger communities throughout the civilized world. Janesville does not need them, her unlimited capacity for exten-

sion in every direction is a practical barrier to the fabulous prices obtained for land in other cities; and rents are so reasonable and the rates for living are so much less expensive than elsewhere, that the humblest mechanic or laborer can ensconce his family in a modest dwelling and surround them with the pleasures and comforts of home. Instead of the indiscriminate herding of the industrious and the slothful, the sober and the drunken, the upright and the criminal, the healthy and diseased and the promiscuous mingling of the sexes, so detractive both to morality and to life itself, the struggling man with small means can gather his household about him in a commodious dwelling, absolutely removed from impure contagion and amendable only to those influences which emanate from himself or his associations. He and his family acquire an individuality and manliness which are apt to display themselves for their right in their career through life. Home influence, the strongest, the purest, the most precious that can surround man, either in his relations to society or in family circle, is offered here in all its freshness and luxuriance, and other cities should not be surprised when we claim superiority in this regard.

The moral and religious tone of our community is excellent. Though the city is not exempt from the nameless evils incident to all localities where human beings dwell together in masses, immorality does not rear its brazen front with impunity; nor does the law of its enactment encourage vice or embolden its votaries. Our people are eminently a church-going people. There are eleven churches within the limits of the city, as shown by our church directory, divided among the different denominations. Sunday is emphatically a day of rest in our city. Business of every description is suspended, and the citizens willingly co-operate with the authorities in the enforcement of the Sunday law. A stillness, unbroken save by the tinkle of the car bell, or the voices of the people as they move to and from the houses of worship, reigns throughout the city during the morning hours, and upon pleasant afternoons, the promenades and thoroughfares are fairly alive with happy faces, eager to bathe in the soft Sabbath sunlight and breathe the invigorating air which comes from the Rock river.

In conclusion, we tender our thanks to those business men who have encouraged this publication by their patronage, and hope for a continuation of their support in the future.
