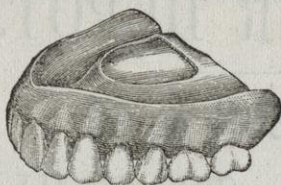

The endeavor to get all the names spelled correctly in a city like ours, where so many of the inhabitants have names of a foreign origin, is a hopeless task; but in canvassing we took great care to get every name spelled correctly where it was possible.

HISTORICAL SKETCH OF FOND DU LAC.

THE origin of the name of Fond du Lac is obscure and uncertain. The fact that the name is French, leads to the supposition that it originated from some Frenchman. It is known that the name of Fond du Lac was applied to its locality as early as 1787. Hon. James Duane Doty says: "The name was known to all the old settlers whom I met at Green Bay in 1820. I think it was given by Mr. Franks, a trader of Green Bay, who established a trading post at the forks of the Fond du Lac River, in 1787."

The literal signification of the words Fond du Lac is "Bottom of the Lake." Applied to a place, it was intended to designate the farthest "Extremity of the Lake." This view is confirmed by the fact that the same name is applied to the location at the western extremity of Lake Superior: these localities being so designated by the inhabitants of the opposite ends of the respective lakes. The Indian name of this locality was Win-ne-co-me-yah.

The City of Fond du Lac is situated upon a prairie about six miles in diameter, at the southern extremity of Lake Winnebago. A ledge of limestone rock, rising up some two hundred feet above the level of the prairie, and, in many places, presenting perpendicular precipices 75 to 100 feet high, borders the eastern and southern part of this basin. From the base of this ledge hundreds of springs of cool, rippling water gush out, and meander down over the prairie in narrow channels to the lake. This ledge recedes in a south-westerly direction, and eastward of Horicon Lake, forming the division line between the heavy timbered lands and the undulating prairies far down the Rock River Valley. Westward from the city the surface of the country gradually rises, alternating with prairie, timber, and springs, for some twenty-five miles, where it attains about the same altitude as the ledge

eastward. Through the middle of the Fond du Lac Prairie a stream of water, with two branches meeting in the city, flows northward to the lake. Along either branch of the river is a thrifty growth of forest trees, consisting of the usual variety of hardwood, such as hickory, maple, oak, elm, &c.

The earliest occupation of this prairie by white persons was in 1787, by Mr. Franks and Jacques Fortier. Their building was below the railroad bridge. They were succeeded by John Lowe in 1791. In the summer of 1818, Augustus Grignon established a trading post on the west branch, on Mr. McKibbon's lands. In 1828 this house was standing.

In the year 1835, that part of the city comprised within the fourth and fifth wards was laid out by "The Fond du Lac Company," of which J. Duane Doty, George McWilliams, J. P. Arndt, H. S. Baird, and others, were members. A block-house was erected in 1836, below the north end of the railroad bridge. A few rods above, another house was erected, into which the "first settlers," Colwert Pier and his wife, moved, June 6th, 1836. On the 11th March, 1837, Edward Pier and family settled in this vicinity. In June following, Norman Pier and Albert Kendall joined the pioneer settlers. Others were soon attracted to the place; among them we may mention Calvin Pier, Oliver W. Pier, A. Raymond, William Stewart, Gustave DeNeven, Patrick Kelly, William Hays, J. D. Doty, Colonel H. Conkling, Governor G. D. Ruggles, A. Laborde, and M. C. Darling. On our arrival, in the spring of 1842, there were within the limits of the county only thirty families.

From the time of the laying out and plotting the Fond du Lac Company's grounds, in 1835, to the fall of 1842, no progress was made in building up a village. This company was wanting in enterprise and foresight. Under its peculiar policy, the village of Taycheedah was laid out and built upon, with a fair prospect of obtaining the location of the county seat, and becoming the centre of business for the county. Under these circumstances, Dr. M. C. Darling, in 1844, laid out and brought into market that part of the city known as Darling's Addition to Fond du Lac. At the same time he obtained an injunction against the Fond du Lac Company,

which had the effect to prevent it from bringing lots into the market upon the old plot, thus tying the hands of his most dangerous rival for the location of the county buildings. By a decree of the court, the Company's property was ordered to be sold at auction. But before this sale was effected, Darling's addition had advantages that placed it out of the way of the competition of the "original plot," and the court house was located upon its present site by act of the Legislature, of which Mr. Darling was then a member. Under the decree of the court, all the lands, and the lots and blocks north of the line of Forest street, belonging to this company, were sold at auction. This sale attracted many strangers to the place, who purchased, and became interested in the growth of the place. From this time forward improvements were made rapidly.

In 1850 the population of the city was 1,940; in 1855 it was 4,000; in 1860, a little short of 6,000; in June, 1865, it had increased to 11,042; at the present time, October, 1865, it is estimated at 12,000. The rapidity of increase has this season been checked materially by the scarcity of buildings—the mechanics and builders not being able to supply the demand.

The increase of business has kept pace with the increase of population, but is also held in check by the scarcity of business houses, although a very large number have been erected during the past summer. Rapid as has been the growth of the population and business of the city, during the past five years, the future still promises greater results. The evidences of this are everywhere to be seen—in the preparations for business and building—in the confidence all have in the capacity of the city and surrounding country to maintain a healthy increase, and in the pressure to secure eligible sites for future business or residence.

Among the causes that have contributed to this unrivalled prosperity the lumber interest is the most prominent. In fact there is no point in Northern Wisconsin which can compare with this in the quantity of lumber, shingles, lath, &c., manufactured. The location of the railroad machine and car shops at this place has also had a beneficial influence. The sur-

rounding country is fertile and thickly settled, inducing a very large trade in the sale and exchange of commodities. The health of the city is good, and the water unrivalled—there being some 300 artesian wells or fountains, out of which the purest water constantly flows from a depth of 60 to 100 feet. The Chicago and Northwestern Railroad gives communication with Chicago and Lake Superior, while the Fox and Wolf Rivers open to us water communication with the great lakes, the pineries, and a vast extent of fertile agricultural country.

There are enterprises in prospect which will exert an important influence in the growth of the city: the completion of the Sheboygan Railroad, the building of an air-line Railroad to Milwaukee, and the building of the land-grant Railroad from this point north-west, *via* Stevens' Point, to Lake Superior. That these great works will be accomplished in a very short time no one can doubt, and which will make this the greatest Railroad centre in the State.

Fond du Lac now is the second city in the State. May we not, with all these advantages, hope to become the first?

APPENDIX.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE CITY COUNCIL.

RULE 1st. At the hour of meeting or adjournment of the Council, the Mayor, or in his absence the President, shall call the Council to order, and preside over the same.

RULE 2d. The following standing committees shall be appointed by the Mayor, viz.: A Committee on Finance, to whom shall be referred all claims and accounts for their investigation and report, except Firemen's accounts, which shall be referred to the Chief Engineer; an Improvement Committee, to whom shall be referred the improvement of streets, sidewalks, and sewers, and all other improvements, and a Committee on Miscellaneous Business.

RULE 3rd. All questions to be decided by vote, shall be put in the usual parliamentary form, unless a division be called for.

RULE 4th. When a motion is made and seconded it shall be stated previous to debate.

RULE 5th. When any person is about to speak in debate, or present a subject to the Council, he shall address himself to the chair, and shall confine himself to the question under debate, and avoid all personalities.

RULE 6th. No member of the Council shall interrupt another in his remarks, unless to call him to order for a violation of a rule of order.

RULE 7th. All motions—except a motion to adjourn, and to lay on the table—and all resolutions, shall be reduced to writing, if required.

RULE 8th. Any motion may be withdrawn, by consent of the Council, before any decision or amendment to the same.

RULE 9th. Every member present, when a question is put, shall vote, unless the Council for a special cause excuse him.

RULE 10th. Any member of the Council who voted with the majority, may move a reconsideration of the vote at that or the next succeeding meeting.

RULE 11th. A motion to adjourn, to lay on the table, to postpone indefinitely, or to a certain period, to refer or to amend, shall always be in order, and be decided without debate.

RULE 12. Any three or more Aldermen may demand the ayes and noes on any question, and, when so demanded, the same shall be entered upon the records.

RULE 13th. Every resolution, order or other action of the City Council, by which an appropriation is made, or debt, or liability against the city will be incurred, exceeding \$100, shall be passed by a majority of the members elect; unless there be two or more members absent, in which case such acts shall be passed by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

RULE 14th. Except as above provided, the common parliamentary rules shall be applicable to the City Council in its deliberations.

RULE 15th. Any of the foregoing rules may be suspended for the time being, by a vote of two-thirds of the Aldermen present.

RULE 16th. These rules may be altered and amended at any meeting of the Council: provided, however, that a notice of such alteration or amendment shall have been given at a previous meeting.

RULE 17th. No account or claim shall be allowed at a meeting of the Council when the same is presented, but shall be referred to the appropriate Committee, and lie over till the next meeting.

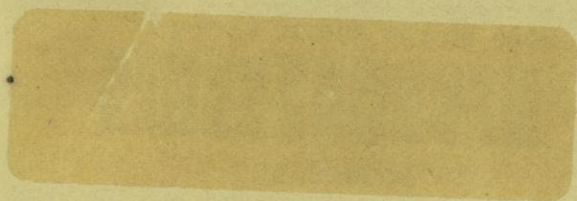

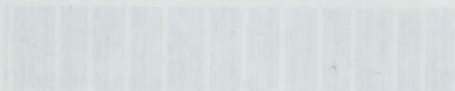
Incorporated in August, 1853.
