## PRESENTATION

---

In presenting the Hand-Book for 1890, we wish to congratulate the citizens of Beloit upon the activity and growth of the city, which has made the new issue a business necessity. During the year Beloit has grown in every direction: new dwellings have been erected on every side—some modest, some reaching as high as \$15,000.00; many streets have been beautified and improved; new additions have been platted and built upon, new manufactories established. The new Boulevard drive, now in construction, and the many projects of large business importance, tell us that what we have seen is only an index to what is to follow. The growth of Beloit has indeed been remarkable, yet so gradual and steady has been the change, that the most observant would not realize its extent until brought face to face with the facts brought out by comparison. A directory is perhaps the best index to a city's growth. A comparison of our issues of 1889 and 1890 show 12.8 per cent. increase in the number of names, above all removals, and a change of 29.5 per cent. in residence, business, or place of employment, giving our new issue a total change of 42.3 per cent.

Very few except those intimately connected with the work can have any approximate conception of the labor and expense connected with an issue of this nature. There are portions of the book where the matter alone cost us at the rate of \$6.00 per inch before it had reached the printer's hands. Very small difficulties become great when multiplied by a thousand. It is a small matter for the lady of the house to ask us to call at a more convenient time to obtain the names of the household, and in itself it is a small addition to our work, but when we have three thousand names to collect, the extra call becomes an important factor in the problem of directory-making. Women have so much to annoy them in the way of peddlers, bill-boys, etc., that they may well be excused for any impatience they may show when our census-taker appears with a huge volume under his arm, wearing every appearance of the "book-fiend". When we call, perhaps there is a cake in the oven and we are invited to call again; of course the obligation is all on one side; the fact that we afterward present a complimentary copy of a valuable book, such as the residents of other cities must purchase at from \$2.00 to \$6.00 per volume, is a matter-of-course, and need not be considered. We do not speak of this in the way of complaint; in general our applications for information have met with a most hearty response, for which our

11-11 means more pressure. A second alarm indicates a dangerous fire. One tap is fire out. The hour of six o'clock is struck each evening.

The first stroke or strokes of the fire bell designate the ward from which the alarm was given, it also indicates the first figure of the box number. This is followed by a brief pause, and the remaining strokes indicate the second figure of the box number.



**WATER SUPPLY.**—The city of Beloit has one of the finest water supplies in the country, which is remarkable for its medicinal qualities and its purity. The source of supply is evidently the same as that of Waukesha, Palmyra and other notable Wisconsin waters in this part of the State. The water is supplied by innumerable springs bubbling up in the bottom of a huge well 30 feet in diameter and 40 feet deep. It is so clear and colorless that a cut glass when filled to the brim looks no different than an empty glass of the same style, and the great pureness of the water is demonstrated by heating the residue, which does not change its color.

We give below the chemical analysis of the water, made by Prof. E. G. Smith of Beloit College who is an acknowledged authority on these matters.



The grounds of the Water Works occupy about five acres on the East bluff of the city, almost in town. The water tower, nearly 100 feet high, is built of stone and is the finest and largest piece of stone masonry of the kind in the West. The tower sustains a large cypress tank, holding 100,000 gallons of water, which

is kept full at all times, day and night, and gives from its own head 60 pounds pressure to the business portion of the city. The pump gives a direct pressure of 125 pounds when required for fire purposes. The city has over eight miles of water mains and eighty fire hydrants, thus giving splendid fire protection as well as beautiful and healthful water for domestic purposes.

# STREET AND AVENUE GUIDE.

EXPLANATORY.—Beloit is numbered according to the Germantown plan, with 20 feet as the unit of measure.

All streets running north and south, count from the state line, with the even numbers on the west side of the street. The first block begins with 100, the second with 200, the third with 300, etc., increasing by 100 with each succeeding block; but Bushnell street and Bridge street form a correction line, which corrects to 600.

All streets running east and west, count eastward and westward from Fifth street, with the even numbers on the south side of the street. The correction lines in passing eastward are Pleasant street, correcting to 500, and Park Avenue, correcting to 900. In passing westward, Bluff street corrects to 300; Eighth street to 700, and Hackett street to 900.

On streets which cross Fifth street, "w" is annexed to the number of each house west of Fifth street, thus: St. Paul's Church, 102 w Bridge.




**TURING**—During the same months, Beloit's manufacturing output has footed \$2,008,364. The consumption of raw materials for the same period has been \$989,336, thus leaving \$1,019,028 as the actual wealth production of our manufactories.

**MANUFACTURING CAPACITY** has been greatly increased during the year. Among the more important additions that have been made are the following:

America Heating Co.'s plant.  
Artificial Stone Co.'s plant  
Beloit Swing Saw and Rosette Machine Co.'s plant.  
Cunningham Bros' sash factory 10,000 sq. ft. floor.  
Eclipse Wind Engine Co.'s additions 10,244 ft.  
E. Kinsley's carriage factory additions 2,880 ft.  
John Foster & Co.'s shoe factory additions 12,080 ft  
John Thompson & Sons Ltd, Plow Works additions 20,050 ft.

**BUILDING RECORD**—Since Sept. '89, one hundred and fifty-three new houses have been built. A close estimate gives an average of \$2,000 per house, making a total expenditure of \$306,000 for new houses. Besides the above there have been various additions and improvements made to old houses.

**POPULATION.**—The official census for 1890 gave Beloit 6,318; adding to this 200, the estimated population of the

Illinois portion of our city, gives Beloit a total of 6,518. The publishers, feeling confident that the official count was incomplete, determined to take a re-count at their own expense. This count included the Illinois portion, and gave Beloit a total population of **7,243**—not an estimate, but a careful house-to-house canvass. We give below a few of the statistics which led us to believe that the official returns for 1890 were incorrect:

When our census for '89 was taken there were numerous vacant houses. During the year 153 new houses have been built, and scarcely a vacant house can now be found.
