Translation:

Ptolemae(u)s to Cassianus, his brother, very many greetings. Before anything else I pray for your health. I have received one ceramion --- and a letter in which you write that you had come ---. At the same time you could have come up-country to us so that we too --- because it is sweet to greet you in person. If he wants you to come in good health another time I implore you to come up-country to me. If I find someone who can bring you Proclus' money I will send it through him, if not, if Longinus has not departed, you will speak to him with my words and you will take it from him and write to me through him and I will give him here hundred and twenty-four drachmas. Greet Sarapias and her mother and Baukalas and all your people, each by name. I pray for your health, lord. Mecheir 17. Verso: To Karanis to Cassianus Gemellus veteran from his brother Ptolemaeus.
