THE UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN SYSTEM

The University of Wisconsin System is marking its fourteenth anniversary in the fall of 1985. The UW System was created in October 1971 by a law placing all of the state's public university campuses under a single Board of Regents. The UW System is composed of 13 universities and 13 two-year UW Centers, and UW-Extension which provides outreach services from offices in every county. Although only thirteen years old, the UW System was one of the first statewide higher educational systems in the nation and has pioneered in developing coordinated and high quality programs and services on a statewide basis. System administrative offices are in Madison.

Universities are at Eau Claire, Green Bay, La Crosse, Madison, Milwaukee, Oshkosh, Kenosha-Racine (Parkside), Platteville, River Falls, Stevens Point, Menomonee (Stout), Superior and Whitewater. Centers are at Baraboo, Fond du Lac, Janesville, Manitowoc, Marinette, Marshfield, Menasha, Rice Lake, Richland Center, Sheboygan, Waukesha, Wausau, and West Bend.

MAX R. SPARGER, COMMISSIONER OF ATHLETICS

Max R. Sparger was named athletic commissioner of the Wisconsin State University Conference in July of 1971, succeeding Fred Jacoby.

Sparger has experienced a varied and successful career in athletics as a participant, coach, administrator and official.

A native of Wichita Falls, Texas, Sparger was a member of the UW-Stout athletic staff from 1959 to 1971, and athletic director his last two years there.

The Commissioner grew up in St. Paul Park, Minnesota, graduating from high school there in 1952. He earned his bachelor's degree in 1956 from Dubuque (Iowa) University, where he played football and wrestled during his college career.

Following graduation from college, Sparger coached high school and junior college sports in Ford Dodge, Iowa, leaving to join the Stout staff as assistant football and basketball coach in 1959. He received his master's degree in education from Macalester College, St. Paul, Minnesota, in 1961, and since then has done advance work at the University of Minnesota.

He became head football coach in 1963, and was selected to receive an award for "Outstanding Teaching" during that year. He guided Stout to a Conference championship in 1965, after which he was named "Coach of the Year" in N.A.I.A. District 14. He gave up his football coaching duties after becoming athletic director in 1969.

TOM BUTLER, SPORTS INFORMATION DIRECTOR

Tom Butler joined the WSUC staff part-time May 1, 1967, to assist the Commissioner with the dissemination of sports information. The Madison native graduated from East High School in 1942.

Following three years in the Navy during World War II, he received a B.A. degree in journalism from the UW-Madison in January of 1950. After working as sports editor of the Stevens Point Daily Journal and the Daily Jefferson County Union (Fort Atkinson), Butler joined the Wisconsin State Journal as a sports writer February 1, 1953. He has been there since.

GENE CALHOUN, SUPERVISOR OF FOOTBALL OFFICIALS

Gene Calhoun, a veteran Wisconsin athletic official, became supervisor of Wisconsin State University Conference officials in 1966. He has more than 30 years experience in officiating.

Calhoun graduated from Madison East High School in 1941, served in the Army Air Corps during World War II and is a retired lieutenant colonel in the Air Force Reserves. He earned his bachelor's degree from the UW-Madison in 1947, and his law degree in 1950. He is a practicing attorney in Madison.

An official since 1947, he worked in the Big 10 for 20 years, and was referee in the 1968 and 1976 Rose Bowl games, the 1971 Cotton Bowl game, the 1974 Sugar Bowl and the 1981 Orange Bowl game.

He retired from active officiating after the Orange Bowl and assumed the duties of Supervisor of Football Officials for the Big 10 in 1982.

OTTO PULS, SUPERVISOR OF BASKETBALL OFFICIALS

Otto R. Puls is supervisor of Wisconsin State University Conference basketball officials. Gene Calhoun will continue as supervisor of football officials.

Puls, a veteran high school and college official, graduated from Madison East High School and the University of Wisconsin, where he earned a B.S. degree in Pharmacy. He currently is chief pharmacist at the Central Wisconsin Center for Developmentally Disabled in Madison.

Otto played baseball at East and at UW-Madison. Following college he played professional baseball in the Baltimore Orioles farm system.

He started officiating in 1955 and has worked Big Ten football for the past 12 years. During that span he officiated six Michigan-Ohio State football games, the 1978 Tangerine Bowl, 1981 Orange Bowl and Rose Bowl games in 1977 and '82.

The UW-Oshkosh baseball team made history in 1985 by capturing the NCAA Division III championship in Marietta, Ohio, in its eighth trip to national tournaments. Coach Russ Tiedemann's Titans rolled to the title with an awesome display of offense in victories over Ithaca, 11-4, and Marietta, 11-6, in their last two games. The '85 Titans set a school record with 37 victories. They lost only three games.

JORGENSEN TOURNAMENT MVP

Terry Jorgensen, UW-Oshkosh's freshman outfielder from Luxemburg, was named the NCAA Division III Baseball Tournament's most valuable player after the Titans won their first national title in history. MILLER NAMED MOST VALUABLE GRIDDER

Mike Miller, senior tailback for UW-Whitewater's co-championship football team, was named the WSUC's most valuable player for 1984. The 5-11, 210-pounder set seven school records during his career, including 2,693 yards rushing. He gained 1,076 yards in 1984 and scored 16 touchdowns.

BOLDT EARNS ALL-AMERICAN RECOGNITION

UW-Whitewater offensive tackle Steve Boldt was named to the 1984 NCAA Division III All-American first team by Football News. Boldt, a 6-3, 260-pound senior from Black Earth started every game since the middle of his sophomore year. He was the only Wisconsin player named to the first team on either offense or defense.

WEIGEL EARNS NAIA ALL-AMERICAN NOD

UW-Eau Claire running back Lee Weigel became only the fifth player in Blugold history to earn a first team berth on the NAIA Division II All-American football squad. The 6-0, 211-pound tailback from Marshfield gained over 1,000 yards for the second consecutive season despite missing more than nine quarters because of injuries.

KREPFLER SETS PASSING RECORD

UW-La Crosse quarterback Bob Krepfle set a pass completion record in 1984 when he connected on 11 of 11 attempts in a 55-3 victory over Superior. The previous record for 10 or more attempts was .850 on 17 of 20 passes by Whitewater's Bob Berezowitz against Superior in 1966.

PREVIEW OF 1985 FOOTBALL SEASON
WISCONSIN STATE UNIVERSITY CONFERENCE

River Falls is the heavy favorite to win the 1985 Wisconsin State University Conference football championship, at least in the eyes of league coaches other than Mike Farley of the Falcons. But, don't bet the rent money on that prediction. The WSUC has a history of defying the odds. Usually the title isn't decided until the final Saturday of the season. Seldom does any team ride through its schedule unscathed.

Farley's Falcons do have some impressive credentials in their favor. They shared the title last year with Whitewater with a young team. Most of those stalwarts return, including fullback Greg Corning, halfback Dan Kahlow and quarterback Clark Luessman, who played major roles in the success of Farley's potent wishbone offense last season.

The Warhawks are not so fortunate. They lost more than a legendary coach when Forrest Perkins announced his retirement. The entire starting backfield is gone, including hard-running Mike Miller and quarterback Jim Stoppenbach. End Randy Kress, tackle Bill Lobenstein and linebacker Brian Frantl also are missing from the defense.

Maybe it's fitting that Bob Berezowitz starts with essentially a new cast of performers in his rookie year as head coach. The more new faces that appear, the sooner the Warhawks will be known as "his" team.

The Warhawks probably won't change drastically from Perkins at the outset. After all, Berezowitz was offensive coordinator under Perkins the past three years. The new mentor probably will throw the ball a little more often. He was a passing whiz himself as a Warhawk player and is known to favor that mode of travel on the football field.

La Crosse lost only to the co-champions last year, so Coach Roger Harring knows what it's going to take for his Indians to rebound in '85. That could be a problem without quarterback Bob Krepfle, who knew how to produce big numbers--statistically and on the scoreboard.

La Crosse still boasts quality personnel, including talented offensive guard Tom Newberry, but replacing Krepfle will cause some problems. The Indians still expect to challenge River Falls down to the wire.

A new program pops up more and more as coaches speculate about the coming season--Stevens Point. The Pointers haven't won a championship since 1977 but Coach D. J. LeRoy's first recruits become seniors this fall, headed by quarterback Dave Geissler, the conference's premier passer. LeRoy also has strong running from Mike Christman and Mike Reuteman and a big veteran offensive line. This might be the year of the Pointers.

Eau Claire lost a strong contingent, including quarterback Jess Cole, but Coach Link Walker has built a winning tradition, including a four-year record of 26-6, and his current crop of Blugolds knows how to win. He will depend heavily on Lee Weigel, probably the most explosive running back in the conference.

Ron Cardo struggled through his first year as Oshkosh head coach, but the former Titan star figures the transition phase is over and things will look up this fall. The program has some talent but mostly Cardo hopes to instill a winning attitude that seems to have been missing in recent years.

The same holds true for Coach George Chryst at Platteville. The Pioneers must rev up their program and the loss of ace running back Marty Sturzl makes that a difficult proposition. One of the worries facing Chryst is uncertainty, not knowing for sure who will be available when the bell rings. That plagues most coaches at non-scholarship schools.

Twenty years have passed since Stout won a WSUC football title and Coach Bob Kamish would like to end that slump with a flourish this season. Inconsistency stalked the Blue Devils during two straight 2-9 seasons and Kamish wants to correct that problem first and move on from there.

Superior needs a victory early to erase the stigma of last year's winless season. The Yellowjackets are in the throes of a 16-game conference losing streak and Coach Gil Krueger wants to guide them out of the doldrums this season.

PROSPECTS FOR 1985

The Blugolds have some enormous voids to fill from their 8-3 team of a year ago, but Coach Link Walker has developed the most successful program in the WSUC over the past four seasons and Eau Claire partisans expect another winner. A winning tradition has been instilled in the current crop of athletes by that 26-6 four-year record.

Among the missing are quarterback Jess Cole, second in total offense and third in conference passing last season, as well as his favorite target, tight end Tom Saskowski, who led the league with 46 pass receptions. Also gone from the offense are center Pete Derleth, tackle Mike Molnar and fullback Ken Heffel.

The defensive secondary presents a problem because Heffel, Bart Mattson, Mark Barstad and Jeff Kitzman also are gone. Mattson excelled as a kickoff return man. Another void was created by the departure of kicker Brad Pierce, who booted 29 of 33 conversion attempts last season along with eight field goals.

Still, the offense is not wasted. Best of the returnees is Lee Weigel, who made the NAIA first all-American team last season. An outstanding breakaway runner, the Marshfield senior needs less than 200 yards to become the school's all-time leading rusher. The veteran tailback put together a pair of back-to-back 1,000 yard seasons.

The 23 returning lettermen have adequate experience and Walker doesn't expect any kind of collapse. Inside linebacker John Kuhn and free safety Luke Coenen head returning defenders. Kuhn was credited with 99 tackles last season and Coenen 73. Guards Tom Barber and Joel Betsinger and tackle Bubba Beech anchor the offensive line. The No. 1 priority, though, will be finding a replacement for Cole at quarterback.

PROSPECTS FOR 1985

The Indians lost much of their offensive punch from last year, including quarterback Bob Krepfle, the WSUC's total offense leader and second-ranked passer. Also gone are wide receivers Stan Johnson and Kevin Hanegraaf and tight end Don Kindt. Another serious void developed with the loss of linebackers Joe Weber and Steve Graf.

These are problem areas Coach Roger Harring must confront when the Indians begin pre-season practice. The veteran coach can be consoled by the return of 6-3, 270-pound Tom Newberry, an all-conference and all-NAIA Division II all-American guard, as well as standout defensive backs Kevin Yeske and Jerry Sydorowicz.

The offense could be bolstered by the presence of River Falls transfer Doug Derginer. The senior from Ashwaubenon finished third in WSUC scoring in 1983 while a quarterback for the Falcons. Harring probably will try the 5-10, 180-pounder at wide receiver first.

Pre-season competition for the quarterback spot is expected among junior Mark Capstran and sophomores Todd Oberg and Joe Rihn. The running back positions are in good hands with Dave Behm, who averaged 5.1 yards a carry, and Dan Lowney with a 4.9 mark last fall. The kicking game is solid with Marshall Wolowicz, who booted 22 conversions in 24 attempts last fall and five field goals.

Even without Weber and Graf the defense should not be a problem because the linebacking corps still has Dale Gottschalk. Also back is defensive end Jay Wolowicz, a starter last year, and a veteran secondary that includes Yeske, Sydorowicz and Pat Bushman.

La Crosse led the WSUC in passing and total offense last year but could be hard-pressed to repeat without the talented Krepfle, who is trying to make the Dallas Cowboys squad this fall. The Indians of 1984 were third in rushing defense, and second in passing defense and total defense.

PROSPECTS FOR 1985

Ron Cardo starts his second year as Titan head coach with hopes of finding some offensive punch and improving last season's 2-6 conference record and 3-7 mark overall. The Titans were sixth in conference rushing, last in passing and eighth in total offense last season.

There are no all-conference players returning and Cardo again will field an extremely young team trying to find its way against some more experienced and talented programs. Chief losses were guard Tim Dahlke and running back Gary Gauger on offense and end Tom Schuessler and cornerback Mike Hughes on defense.

Junior Kevin Reichardt returns at quarterback, but he is expected to be challenged by Jeff Peterson, Bryan Yager, Jim Linnabary and Ken Maly. The one who can generate some offensive punch will win the job. Reichardt completed only 36 percent of his passes in the conference last fall as Oshkosh was shut out in three of its eight WSUC games and managed only one touchdown in each of three others.

Cardo is encouraged by a defensive line that includes Rob Belland, Scott Rucynski, Bob Ritchie, and Jeff Lanich inside with Andy Yates, Don Skibba and Scott Davis on the ends. The linebacking crew features Greg Gruett, John Palazzo, Scott Gudowicz, Scott Huebner and Chris Mellberg. Joe Syring, David Queen, Jeff Borchardt, Steve Finco, Mark Karamitis and John Nueser will be vying for positions in the secondary.

Veterans in the offensive line are Tony Tewelis, Todd Voss, Pete Dodge, Jim Dolan, Jim Masticola and Marsh Murray. BenJE Veit, Brad Veldboom and Tim Danielson will compete for the tight end spot. Jim Braun, Rob Frahm, Ed Fryman and Tony Gonzales are letterman running backs.

Lack of overall team speed was a problem last season and unless some newcomers show early that inadequacy could hamper development this fall. This remains one of Cardo's priority items going into pre-season practice.

PROSPECTS FOR 1985

The Pioneers this fall will learn what life in the fast lane is all about without old reliable running back Marty Sturzl, upon whom they depended so strongly in the past. Sturzl led the conference in rushing last season, averaging 115 yards a game and 5.3 yards a carry.

Finding a quarterback to direct the intricacies of the Wing-T offense will occupy Coach George Chryst's attention early. H. T. Kenney and Dale Jacobs took most of the snaps last season, but Bill Rogan, a transfer from Waldorf Junior College, should provide depth to that position. Mark Rae also remains in the quarterback picture and doubles as a punter.

Probably the most talented of the returnees is junior wide receiver Jamie Scherkenbach, who made all-conference last fall after catching 23 passes for four touchdowns and an average of 17.6 yards a reception. He also averaged 8.5 yards each punt return. If Chryst can find a quarterback to get Scherkenbach the ball, the Pioneers will add an explosive dimension to their offense.

The veteran offensive line, which should give the Pioneer attack more consistency than last year, includes tackles Paul Gruner, Steve Nohns and Paul Peetz; guards Marc Bodeau and Pat Miller, and centers Greg Fictum, John Mamerow and John March.

The defense is anchored end Tom Hunsader and 6-5, 250-pound tackle Dave Viaene. A key man in the secondary is junior Mike Hintz, who made the all-conference second team last fall. The rap against the defense is that it is slow and inexperienced. Chryst hopes to do something about that by the time his Pioneers get into the conference season.

Both offense and defense must jell early because the Pioneers face conference powers Whitewater and La Crosse back-to-back in the third and fourth games of the season.

PROSPECTS FOR 1985

A young Falcon team shared the WSUC championship with Whitewater last fall and fashioned an overall 8-2 record. Most of those people are back as experienced veterans to make a run at the title again this year. Coach Mike Farley has 46 returning lettermen, including nine starters on each of the offensive and defensive units.

Farley is not without some voids to fill, however. Missing will be quarterback Mike Farley, fullback Tony Kulinski and center Matt Renn from the offense as well as tackle Chip Kintopf and free safety Dennis Herum from the defense.

The loss of young Mike is especially crucial. He provided a triple threat as a quarterback, punter and placekicker. He ranked third in conference scoring with 61 points on 25 of 27 conversion attempts and four field goals. Coach Farley believes the kicking game decides 70 percent of all football games, so a solid replacement is needed. Jon Ackerman, also a quarterback-kicker, could be heir apparent.

Farley's wishbone attack averaged 256 yards a game rushing last fall, best in the WSUC, and the veteran coach will emphasize his offensive philosophy again this fall. Fullback Greg Corning, who gained 518 yards rushing last fall and averaged almost seven yards a crack, returns to make the ground game go with halfback Dan Kahlow, who rushed for 377 yards in 1984. They will operate behind a veteran offensive line.

Clark Luessman, who handled the limited passing chores last year, returns at quarterback for spot assignments. He attempted only 29 passes but five of his 14 completions went for touchdowns. Farley uses the pass as an element of surprise and senior wide receiver Tom Smith was the principal shocker. He caught 16 passes for six touchdowns and an average of 24.1 yards per reception.

The Falcons ranked third in total defense last fall and the heart of that unit returns, including nose guard Kent Gray and linebacker Steve Frantl, both all-conference.

PROSPECTS FOR 1985

Coach D. J. Leroy's first recruits are heading into their senior season and this group should give the fourth-year head coach his first title contender. The Pointers are headed by veteran quarterback Dave Geissler, who has led the WSUC in passing three straight years but has yet to be named all-conference.

Geissler will be triggering LeRoy's multiple pro offense but he won't be a one-man gang. He also will have Mike Christman and Mike Reuteman running behind a big veteran offensive line. Reuteman gained 506 yards rushing in the conference last fall, while Christman is a fine pass receiver with breakaway speed. He caught 26 passes in eight league games last season.

Wide receiver Jim Lindholm also returns to bolster the offense. He caught 24 passes in 1984. Anchoring the offensive line is all-conference guard Mark Rietveld, a 6-3, 270-pound senior. Other guard veterans are senior Ron Hintz and junior Mark Tate. Lettermen offensive tackles are Eric Jones and Fred Meinen. The center spot is well fortified with Dan Umnus and Andy Weyker returning.

Major losses were linebackers Mike Van Asten and John Stanko and defensive back Rick Weitersen. These will be priority projects when the Pointers gather for pre-season drills. John Bechard and Rick Paulus are returning linebackers, while sophomore John Lund, a transfer from Eau Claire, could help at one of the vacant spots. Bill Flynn, a 6-6, 245-pound junior, gives LeRoy a solid defensive end.

Geissler remains the key offensively. He started as a freshman and performed well three straight years. Last fall he completed 55 percent of his passes and threw for 1,667 yards in eight games. He has excellent targets in Christman, Lindholm and running back Kevin Knuese, as well as 6-5, 230-pound tight end Guy Otte. This is the year Geissler's arm could whip the Pointers into contention.

This will be Stout's third year running the veer offense and Coach Bob Kamish figures the learning process is over. The Blue Devils should become proficient enough now to execute, forget the past two seasons and battle their way back into the win column.

Three years ago the Blue Devils enjoyed an exciting 8-3 season, but two straight 2-9 records shook the foundations at Menomonie and Kamish now is determined to guide his charges back to respectability. He expects two standout seniors, quarterback Glen Majszak and linebacker Brian Kellett, to lead the charge.

Kamish believes Majszak could become the conference's premier quarterback, if he can avoid injuries. He will direct the veer and has quality receivers in split end Ron Wise and tight end Scott Stauffacher. Kamish, though, is looking for a solid running back to replace graduated Jesse Hughes. Freshman Brian Tetzlaff might be the answer but it's too early to tell.

The offensive line is thin and that area will take a great deal of work during preseason. Veterans who must come through are Doug Pahlow, Rich Rupp and Rob Tadych. Among the offensive pluses is Todd Miles, a placekicker who booted nine field goals last fall in the conference.

Defensively Kellett is the key. Keith Jurek and Brandt Olsen must anchor the interior line but an intensive search is underway to find adequate defensive ends, where no veterans return. Senior Dan Weber is the best of the defensive backs.

Inconsistency again dogged the Devils last fall. They dropped a heartbreaker, 17-16, to eventual co-champion River Falls early in the season, but midway through the campaign lost to La Crosse, 37-0. Kamish wants them to forget the last two seasons and return to the form they showed in 1982. Majszak held the key then, so the coach hopes he rediscovers that magic this fall.

Veteran Coach Gil Krueger continues his rehabilitation project on the shores of Lake Superior as he tries to make the Yellowjacket football program competitive with the rest of the WSUC. Most importantly he must change the attitude. First he will try to wipe out the losing image and make his Yellowjackets think positive.

There's no question he faces a major project. Superior is mired in a 20-game losing streak. The Yellowjackets last hit the win column in the second game of 1983, when they defeated Bemidji State, 3-0, in a non-conference game. They also have lost 16 consecutive conference games since knocking off Oshkosh, 23-16, in the second last game of the 1982 season.

They open the season in a non-conference game with arch rival UM-Duluth and that's a rugged assignment any year. The Bulldogs are riding a 22-game winning streak against the Yellowjackets, who haven't won in this series since squeaking out a 7-6 decision back in 1962. PROSPECTS FOR 1985

A new era begins in Warhawk Stadium, where Bob Berezowitz takes the reins that were handled so expertly by Forrest Perkins for the past 29 years. The venerable coach bowed out last fall with a co-championship, but most of the key performers from that team have graduated. Berezowitz, a standout quarterback for Perkins in the 1960's, must rebuild practically from scratch.

"No one will ever replace Forrest Perkins and I won't try," Berezowitz said, when elevated to the head job after serving three years as Warhawk offensive coordinator. "He gave me a foundation to work from and I'll try to maintain it."

Success won't come easy. Gone from the offense are such all-conference performers as tackle Steve Boldt and running back Mike Miller, as well as quarterback Jim Stoppenbach and wide receiver Kelly Silha, second team all-WSUC. Defensively, key losses included end Randy Kress, tackle Bill Lobenstein and linebacker Brian Frantl.

Finding Stoppenbach's replacement will be one of the priority items for Berezowitz who still holds many school passing records. Competition begins with two lettermen, senior Lance Leipold and junior Tom Bishop. The Warhawks will run from an "I" formation with multiple sets, but it won't be new and the transition to a new coach should be no problem.

The entire offensive backfield will be new. Halfback George Rainey and fullback Phil Fader are lettermen expected to get starting shots at the outset. Rainey also is an excellent return specialist. He led the conference last fall with an average of 28.5 yards per kickoff return. Rebuilding the line will be a project.

Tackles Jim Asturius, Brian Zander and John Plewa give the defense a good starting point and three veterans return to the secondary, including all-conference cornerback Tim McNeill. Another plus is punter-placekicker Joel Gmack, who booted 31 conversions and six field goals last season.

POINTERS FIRST DEFENSIVELY AGAIN

UW-Stevens Point was first in the nation in basketball defense among NAIA teams for the fifth straight year. The Pointers allowed just 47.9 points per game compared with 51.5 for runnerup Missouri-Kansas City. The Pointers also led the nation in team scoring margin, winning by an average spread of 16.8 points per game and in team free throw percentage at .798.

PREVIEW OF THE 1985-86 BASKETBALL SEASON
WISCONSIN STATE UNIVERSITY CONFERENCE

The 1985-86 Wisconsin State University Conference basketball race figures to be the most unpredictable in recent memory. None of the top 11 scorers in the conference returns, so an entire new cast of performers is waiting in the wings to capture the spotlight.

Also, Dick Bennett, who coached Stevens Point to four straight championships and the runnerup spot in the 1984 NAIA Tournament in Kansas City, has moved on to UW-Green Bay and been succeeded at the helm of the Pointers by former University of Pittsburgh assistant Jay Eck. Bennett turned Stevens Point into a national power and revolutionized the WSUC game with his tenacious defense.

What's on the horizon for the conference? Well, a solid nucleus remains at Stevens Point and Eck has a reputation for proficiency himself, so the Pointers rank among the top contenders. Coach Ken Anderson still wields his magic at Eau Claire. Although he no longer has Chester Smith, the WSUC scoring champion last year and two-time all-conference forward, the veteran coach seldom is caught short of talent.

Coach Dave Vander Meulen, who built a winning tradition at Whitewater, including an NCAA Division III championship in 1984, added 6-6 Dwayne Johnson, former Marquette ace, for the second semester. His presence could vault the Warhawks into a contending role immediately.

Stout lost some key people but opponents always cast a wary eye toward the Blue Devils with crafty Coach Dwain Mintz plotting strategy, particularly against contenders. The same holds true for Coach Stan Jack, who needs just a key performer or two and the Falcons could raise havoc.

La Crosse lost all-conference Linus Vander Wyst but Coach Burt McDonald can put the biggest front line in the conference on the floor and, if he finds a quality guard, the Indians figure to battle the best for the big prize that has eluded them since 1965.

Oshkosh and Platteville went through a feeling-out process under new coaches last season. That period has ended and the Titans and Pioneers expect to become factors in the 1985-86 race.

Coach Jim McGrath lost three starters at Oshkosh but welcomes back a good nucleus of veterans and his explosive offense from a year ago should improve. His Titans have quickness and like to run. They scored more than 100 points in five games last season. Conversely, so did their opponents. So, McGrath must shore up that phase of his game in the defense-minded WSUC.

Coach Bo Ryan welcomes all his starters back to Platteville. The former UW-Madison assistant admits he learned a lot in his first year in the WSUC. These lessons should help pave the way for his "sophomore" year in the league. His young proteges also gained valuable experience and should possess some savvy to go with the intensity they displayed last season.

Superior failed to win a game in the conference last season but Coach Chris Ritchey returns undaunted with a rejuvenated lineup. He has only one letterman returning but an impressive list of recruits could turn things around for the beleaguered Yellowjackets.

Terry Porter, the WSUC's most valuable player, is gone from Stevens Point, but the presence of Kirby Kulas, Tim Naegeli, Dimitric Roseboro and Jeff Olson, among others, makes the Pointers the team to beat. They've been through the wars with Bennett and know what it takes to win in the WSUC. Kulas and Naegeli are the only all-conference players returning.

Look for Oshkosh's Lester Luehring, Platteville's Rock Ripley, La Crosse's Paul Kuske and Whitewater's Boyce Hodge to blossom this season. And, of course, newcomers could make more of an impact than ever before in the conference.

Defending champion Stevens Point, Eau Claire and Whitewater are the choices of coaches to fight for the championship. Mintz believes it will take a major overhaul for any of the other teams to challenge them. The general consensus is the team with the best inside game and the ability to win on the road will take home the big trophy. That's right out of the coach's manual.

PROSPECTS FOR 1985-86

Eau Claire has gone three years without winning or sharing a WSUC basketball championship, an unprecedented stretch for veteran Coach Ken Anderson. This appears to be a rebuilding year for the Blugolds following last season's 24-5 record and runnerup finish to Stevens Point in the conference race.

All-conference forward Chester Smith, the WSUC scoring champion who was a two-year Blugold most valuable player and twice NAIA first team All-American is gone. Also missing is four-year starter Rick Dahl, a two-time all-conference performer who was the glue in the backcourt.

The backcourt has been depleted and Anderson will depend on a small nucleus around which to build. Brian Krueger, a 6-8 forward, should be one of the conference's premier players. He gained invaluable experience touring this summer with an NAIA all-star team for the second year in a row.

Junior guard Mike Blair could be one of the Blugolds to blossom this year, and Anderson hopes to find some incoming freshmen who can fill the holes. But, he concedes the transition to college is a difficult one, especially in the WSUC. Some of the more promising newcomers are expected to be Scott Anderson of Auburndale, Eric Davis of Hamtramck, Mich., Tim Blumentritt of St. Paul, Minn., and Craig Campbell of Kenosha St. Joseph.

PROSPECTS FOR 1985-86

Coach Burt McDonald is looking for consistency in the front line and two starting guards as he prepares the Indians for another WSUC campaign. They shared fifth place with Oshkosh last season and compiled a 17-10 overall record. Mostly they were inconsistent, winning games they probably should have lost and losing when favored.

La Crosse has a big void to fill after the departure of all-conference forward Linus Vander Wyst, who led the Indians in practically every statistical category, including scoring with a 14.3 average. Also gone is backcourt ace Mike Reinhart, who averaged 10.4 points a game and made almost 60 percent of his field goal attempts.

McDonald could put one of the tallest front lines in the conference on the floor with 6-8 Paul Kuske at center and 6-8 Lee Stahl and 6-7 Shane Graham at the forwards. Graham did not play enough to win a letter last season but Kuske averaged 10.5 points a game in the conference and Stahl 8.8. All are capable of scoring and rebounding, if they get their act together.

The Indians set a Wisconsin collegiate record January 25, 1985, when they made 79 percent of their field goal attempts in a 109-68 victory over Oshkosh. They lost a return engagement to the Titans, 89-78. That's the kind of inconsistency McDonald hopes to eliminate in a race that appears wide open in 1985-86.

PROSPECTS FOR 1985-86

Jim McGrath starts his second year as Oshkosh head coach after providing the conference with one of its major surprises last season. He brought the Titans from a last place finish in 1984 to a share of fifth place with a 9-7 record. His Titans also were 15-11 overall compared with 8-18 the year before.

McGrath lost three key performers, including all-conference forward Todd Potokar, who led the Titans in scoring with 17.3 points a game last season. Also missing are 6-8 center Chad Schultz and 6-2 guard Tom Dorlack. Dorlack averaged 14.3 points and Schultz 13.4 with almost seven rebounds a game.

The Titans must replace a lot of points with these three missing. The most prolific scoring returnee is 6-5 forward Lester Luehring, who contributed 12.9 points a game last season. Also back is 6-5 forward Randy Wellhoefer and 6-8 center Dave Krause, who is big enough to patrol the inside effectively.

Tony Banks, a 6-3 senior, and 5-11 Dave Vosicky figure to get the first crack at starting in the backcourt. McGrath will be looking for a supporting cast that can contribute to his up-tempo offensive scheme. Team strengths are a strong bench, overall quickness and an extremely explosive attack.

PROSPECTS FOR 1985-86

Coach Bo Ryan and his Pioneers come into the 1985-86 season a year older and 26 games wiser as they prepare for their second campaign together at Platteville. The Pioneers finished seventh last season with a 4-12 record and were 9-17 overall. But, they established an identity and proved they could play with the best.

Having lost only Ray Wagner, a key swingman reserve, Ryan has 13 lettermen back, including all five starters. Only two are seniors. So, they still are young and lack the savvy of their more experienced opponents. How fast they absorbed last season's lessons will determine their fate during the coming campaign.

Leading the charge are expected to be 6-6 sophomore Rock Ripley, a tough competitor who led the team in scoring with an 11.3 average last year, and senior guard Tim Hill, with a 10.4 average and almost four assists a game. Randy Kazin, a 6-3 guard, is one of those expected to blossom in his sophomore season.

Competitiveness and defensive intensity are Pioneer assets but Ryan's squad needs more strength to compete effectively inside against WSUC opponents. Platteville was the worst rebounding team in the conference last season and that relates to their physical weakness. They also must learn to win on the road.

PROSPECTS FOR 1985-86

Coach Stan Jack looks at his depleted ranks and it comes as no surprise that the Falcons need a great deal of help if they are to finish in the WSUC's upper division. Last season they slumped to eighth place at 3-13 and wound up with a 9-17 overall mark.

Four starters are gone, including Brian Jass, an all-conference center who averaged 15.6 points and 7.8 rebounds a game. Also missing are guards Jeff Bloomer, with his 13.6 scoring average, and Steve Combs, along with forward Dan Strom.

Lack of returning players with WSUC experience will cause problems at the outset. Jack is looking for newcomers to fill some of the gaps but even they will take time to meld into his system. Starting guards figure to be 6-1 junior Steve Justice and 6-0 sophomore Scott Benoy. Both appear adequate, but the inexperience factor again presents a problem.

The Falcons will fast break when they can and otherwise operate with a disciplined attack. Jack will be looking to build his inside game from among 6-7 Brian Buchholtz, 6-5 Bob Kotecki, 6-6 Kevin Lee, 6-9 Tom Rowe, 6-5 Tim Schneider and 6-6 Neil Yost. If the Falcons can hang together during the early going, they could develop into a factor after the first of the year.

PROSPECTS FOR 1985-86

A new era begins at Stevens Point as Jay Eck replaces Dick Bennett as head coach of the Pointers. Eck has a tough act to follow. Bennett guided Point teams to a 174-79 record in nine years, four straight WSUC championships and a runnerup finish in the NAIA Tournament at Kansas City in 1984. Eck, a native of Madison, coached three years at La Crosse Aquinas and was an assistant at Bradley University four years and the University of Pittsburgh two seasons.

Missing besides Bennett, who took the head coaching job at UW-Green Bay, will be All-American Terry Porter, the WSUC's most valuable player last season. He finished second in conference scoring with an 18-point average. He also averaged 5.3 rebounds and 4.4 assists a game.

Despite the loss of Porter, a strong contingent returns, including all-conference performers Kirby Kulas and Tim Naegeli. Kulas averaged 11.4 points and 6.0 rebounds a game, while Naegeli added 10.7 points and 4.8 rebounds. Dimitric Roseboro, who started 16 games, and Jeff Olson, who started 23, also return.

Other key returnees are 6-1 Todd Christianson, 6-4 Darien Brown, 6-2 Scott Koepnick, 6-6 Keith Kulas and 5-11 Bill Nelson. They form a strong nucleus as the Pointers bid for a fifth straight title. Eck also expects help from transfer Walter Grain and freshmen Troy Engstrom and Manny Johnson.

PROSPECTS FOR 1985-86

The Blue Devils figure to struggle this season after losing two of their three top scorers from 1984-85. That was the case in pre-season a year ago, but they defied the odds and shared third place with Whitewater on the strength of a 10-6 record. Much of that was credited to the coaching savvy of veteran Dwain Mintz, who has almost 35 years in the business.

Chief loss is forward Kurt Stellpflug, an all-conference selection as well as Stout's leading scorer and most valuable player. The loss is critical because Stellpflug was the heart of the team. Besides his 16.1 scoring average, he provided the Blue Devils with 6.4 rebounds and 3.2 assists a game.

Mintz figures to have a difficult time filling that void. The top returning scorer is 6-foot guard Ron Hunter, who contributed nine points a game in the conference last season. Mintz does look for a quicker team that should give the Blue Devils more movement than in recent years. They also should be stronger inside if 6-8 Tom Gomolak improves as expected.

Mintz says leadership is a problem with this group and competitive intensity is lacking. They also must correct a turnover problem that plagued them last season. The Blue Devils will get their baptism early, opening the season against Nebraska and Northern Illinois, two NCAA Division I opponents with post-season tournament potential.

Coach Chris Ritchey is turning over a new leaf on the shores of Lake Superior. The Yellowjackets failed to win a conference game last season and wound up 4-22 on the season. The only returning starter from that group is 6-3 guard Tony Bourget, a sophomore from Eau Claire Regis.

Gone are starters Clendon Gustafson, Ken Frierson, Joe Cannamore and David Crisp. Gustafson led the team with a 13.4 scoring average last season. Frierson contributed 10.8 points a game, Cannamore 9.9 and Crisp 8.9. Also missing is Kevin Franzen, who led the conference with 4.8 assists a game.

Ritchey is counting on seven transfer students and several incoming freshmen to help lift the Yellowjackets out of the doldrums. Heading this list of prospects is 7-foot Kevin Alexander from Highland Junior College in Kansas. The list of newcomers also includes three 6-6 inside players.

Ritchey says his program is fighting a negative tradition but he hopes to change that with a new cast and a fresh outlook this season. "We're starting fresh and should be bigger and stronger than last year," he emphasizes. The old saw about having no place to go but up aptly describes the Yellowjackets, and the coach predicts flatly his team will win more games than last season.

PROSPECTS FOR 1985-86

The Warhawks will be operating this season without all-conference center Mark Linde, a mainstay on three Whitewater powerhouses that included the 1984 NCAA Division III championship team. Linde averaged 17.4 points a game last season and led the WSUC with 8.6 rebounds a game, while earning all-conference recognition for the third straight year.

Coach Dave Vander Meulen hopes to fill some of the void with 6-6 Dwayne Johnson, a transfer from Marquette. Johnson led the Warriors in scoring during the 1983-84 season but sat out last year and won't be eligible to play for Whitewater until the second semester.

The Warhawks still have a strong nucleus of returnees, headed by 6-2 Duane Byrd and 6-4 Gary Ruch, both of whom averaged more than 11 points a game last season. Also back is 6-2 Boyce Hodge, one of the best leapers in the WSUC. He made 55 percent of his field goal attempts in 1984-85, while averaging 8.1 points and 5.6 rebounds a game.

Vander Meulen expects a winning tradition, which produced 72 victories over the past three years, and the experience of four returning starters to vault the Warhawks back into a contending position this season. They shared third place at 10-6 in '85 and were 20-8 overall. The big problem and major concern is the lost scoring potential from the center position.
