HISTORY:

Originally named CITY OF HOLLAND, she was used for passenger and freight service and had gangways. She was sold to Point Lookout Navigation Co. of Saginaw about 1912 and renamed MELBOURNE. She was renamed CLARENCE E. LaBEAU about 1918-19 after being sold to LaBeau Wrecking Company of Toledo.

On July 11, 1922, she was burned in the Maumee River, Toledo, Ohio.
