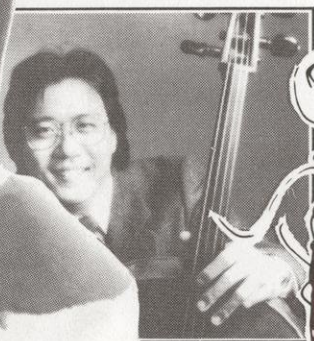

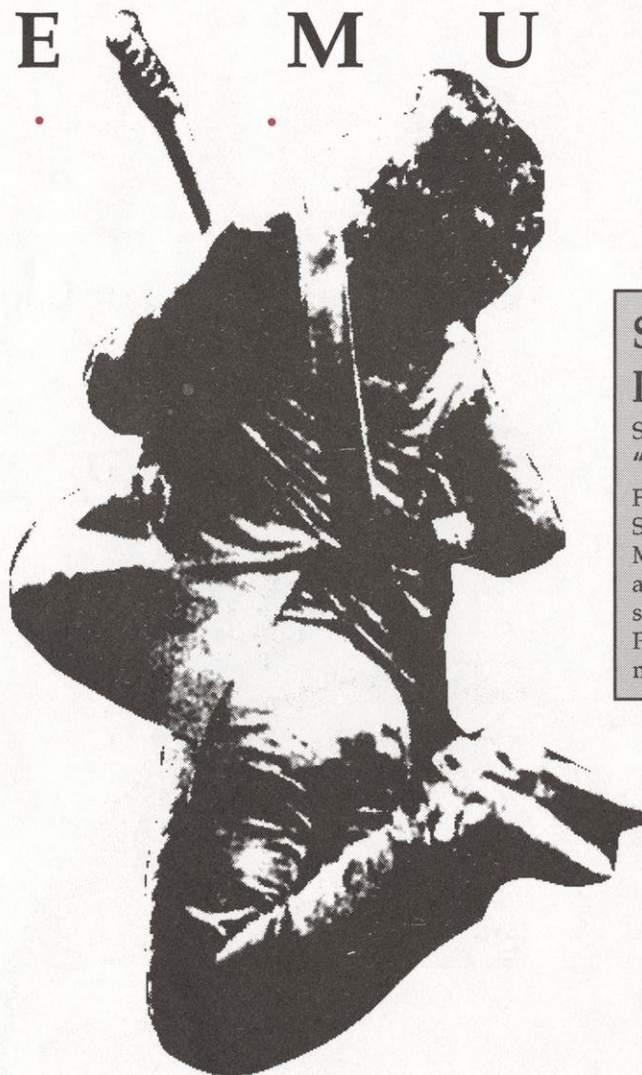

RENOVATION UPDATE

Construction on Memorial Union's expanded Deli Sweet Shop is complete and the Deli is fully operating, filling the Union with the aroma of freshly baked cookies, muffins and streusel. In addition to the usual menu of ice cream, coffee and popcorn, the new Deli also offers a wider variety of sandwiches, snacks, and desserts, including soft serve yogurt.

The second phase of first floor remodeling in Memorial Union began in August and includes constructing a new store, "Essentials". This store will combine the services of the Service Center and Commons

Desk, as well as sell UW memorabilia. The store will be located in the area previously occupied by the Deli Sweet Shop (directly inside the southeast entrance.)

To guide you through this final phase of construction, staff from the Commons Desk will be able to answer your questions from a temporary location in the remodeled part of the first floor lobby. Service will not otherwise be interrupted.

If all goes according to plans, the new and improved first floor lobby should be finished by November 1992.
