"BAXTER'S" PROGRAM TO AIR APRIL 13TH: A segment of the WITI TV 6 program "The Baxter's" dealing with the issue of gay and lesbian teachers, will air at 10:30pm on Sunday April 13. Members of Gay Peoples Union participated in the audience response portion of the program, countering comments made by religious fundamentalists who were also invited to participate in the program. Officials from TV 6 commented that this segment of "The Baxter's" was one of the best they had done, but would be the last show broadcast locally, due to poor ratings.

GPU MEDIA COMMITTEE: In addition to the Media Committee's work on the "Baxter's" (which was taped in December 1979), more recent accomplishments and projects include appearances on WTMJ radio program "Kathy Dunn's Newsmakers" and WYMS radio program "A Woman's Place". GPU will also have guests on the May 2nd (Friday) broadcast of "Tempo 24", a live two hour telephone call-in show on Milwaukee's new TV station (Channel 24). The show can be seen live from 1-3pm and taped (re-broadcast) the same evening from 7-9pm. The producers of the popular Phil Donahue Show have also been contacted by the committee regarding two recent shows that dealt with gay issues (one an appearance by Anita Bryant). The Media Committee also has the rather large task of monitoring all print and broadcast media to insure that gays and lesbians are portrayed fairly and accurately--giving praise and criticism when due. GAY AND PROUD, BUT STILL ILLEGAL! The Wisconsin State Assembly, on March 26, voted (54-45) to defeat S-552, which would have decriminalized private sexual activity between consenting adults, as well as cohabitation. Under provisions of the bill sanctions against prostitution and sexual assaults would remain unchanged. Since starting MILWAUKEE UPDATE we have urged you to contact your state legislators asking for their support of this sensible law reform; now we think you should contact your state Assemblyperson and ask how they voted on S-552! For those that voted for the bill, congratulations and thanks--for those that voted against, let it be known that you will do your best to see that he/she is defeated in any bid for re-election to public office. You can contact your state legislators via the toll-free legislative hotline (1-800-362-9696) in operation 8:30am - 5:00pm Monday through Friday. If you don't know the name of your representatives in Madison, the person on the end of the hotline can provide that info too.

GAY AND LESBIAN PRIDE WEEK PLANNING COMMITTEE: It's a fact! There will be a Gay and Lesbian Pride Week in Milwaukee June 21-29, 1980. A variety of events are being planned including: June 21 - "Sports Day" and picnic at Mitchell Park; June 22 - "Celebrate Life Day", Ecumenical service (lakefront) and Street Festival at Broadway and Menomonee St.; June 23 - opening of Gay and Lesbian Art Show at UWM Union Art Gallery (exhibit runs through July 11); June 24 - "Harvey Milk Memorial" Film and discussion of our role in the political process followed by candle light march and vigil to War Memorial Center to commemorate gay victims of the nazi (and continuing) holocaust; June 25 & 26 - "Film Festival", showing two gay-related films; June 27 - "Talent Day" Gay and Lesbian performing artists at UWM Union Wisconsin Room; June 28 - (open); June 29 - Charter buses leave Milwaukee for Chicago Gay and Lesbian Pride Parade. The next meeting of the Planning Committee will be on Monday April 21 at 7:30pm at the Farwell Center, 1568 N. Farwell. RUMMAGE AND GARAGE SALE: As a fundraiser for the G.P.U. Building Fund and the Gay and Lesbian Pride Week Planning Committee, the Board of Directors of Gay Peoples Union has announced plans for a rummange and garage sale the weekend of May 17-18. GAY LEADER WARNS OF THREAT FROM "NEW RIGHT": In a special appearance before a capacity audience at the Farwell Center, Steve Endean, Executive Director of the Washington based Gay Rights National Lobby, warned the group of a serious threat to gay and lesbians from what he termed the "new right", headed by fundamentalist religious leaders. A heavily financed march on Washington for "righteousness and morality" has been set for Apr 29, 1980. Known as both "Washington for Jesus" and "One Nation Under God", the march may have very serious implications for the lesbian/gay movement, as well as for a number of other human rights concerns. Under the guise of a religious event, rally organizers will attempt to impose their own brand of political "morality" on elected officials and try to influence Congress on a wide variety of issues, including civil rights for gays, prayer in schools, abortion, etc. Endean urged both groups and individuals to use this occasion to raise a number of issues with their Representatives and Senators: HR 6303/S2210 - the immigration legislation that would drop exclusion of gay aliens; HR2074/S2081 - the lesbian and gay civil rights bills; urge their opposition to anti-gay amendments that might come up on otherwise unrelated legislation.
