



FRED JACOBY, COMMISSIONER OF ATHLETICS



Fred Jacoby was appointed Commissioner of Athletics for the Wisconsin State University Conference in July, 1966, following a highly successful coaching career that included eight years as assistant football coach at the University of Wisconsin.

Jacoby, a 42-year old native of Logan, Ohio, had his plans for a football career at Ohio State University shattered during his freshman year, when an injury ended his playing days. He earned a bachelor's degree in physical education from Ohio State in 1948 and a master's from Wisconsin in 1953.

His nine-year record of high school coaching at Bremen and Washington Court House, Ohio, and Madison West shows 63

victories and 13 defeats with five championships and three runner-up finishes. During his tenure at Wisconsin, the Badgers won two Big Ten championships and were runner-up once.

As WSUC commissioner, Jacoby coordinates the athletic program at nine schools which sponsor a program of ten sports that include approximately 100 coaches and in excess of 3,000 participants. Fred and his wife, Marcia, live at 301 Glacier Drive in Madison with their three sons -- Tom, Robert, and Steve.

TOM BUTLER, SPORTS INFORMATION DIRECTOR



Tom Butler joined the WSUC staff part time May 1, 1967 to assist the commissioner with the dissemination of sports information. The 45-year old native of Madison graduated from East High School in 1942; and after a semester at the University of Wisconsin, entered the Navy on January 25, 1943, serving until February 18, 1946.

He re-enrolled at the University of Wisconsin and received a B.A. degree in journalism in January of 1950. After working as sports editor of the Stevens Point Daily Journal and the Daily Jefferson County Union (Fort Atkinson), Butler joined the Wisconsin State Journal as a sports writer on February 1, 1953. His duties there include covering University of Wisconsin football and basketball.

Butler was named Sportswriter of the Year in Wisconsin in 1964 and 1965 and was nominated for the honor five straight years. He and his wife, Bonnie, have five children -- Terence, 17; Kathleen, 16; Jeffrey, 11; Jayme, 9; and Peggy, 8. They live at 636 Sheldon Street in Madison.

GENE CALHOUN, SUPERVISOR OF OFFICIALS



Gene Calhoun, a veteran Wisconsin athletic official, became supervisor of Wisconsin State University Conference officials in 1966. He has more than 20 years experience in officiating, including the last five in the Big Ten Conference, where he is now a football referee.

Calhoun, 44, graduated from Madison East High School in 1941, served in the Army Corps during World War II and currently is a Major in the Air Force Reserve. He earned his bachelor's degree from the University of Wisconsin in 1947 and his law degree in 1950. He is a practicing attorney in Madison.


Formerly freshman baseball coach at the University of Wisconsin, Calhoun also has represented many Badger athletes



PREVIEW 1969 FOOTBALL SEASON WISCONSIN STATE UNIVERSITY CONFERENCE

Defending co-champion Oshkosh appears strong again on paper, but Wisconsin State University Conference opponents remain wary of Whitewater in the 1969 football race.

The Warhawks boast a winning tradition — five championships in the last 10 years — and an impressive contingent of returning lettermen.

Oshkosh, which shared the title with Platteville last fall, builds its 1969 hopes around four returning all-conference performers — center Pete Gabrielson, halfback Ron Cardo, fullback Brian Burbey, and defensive guard Clair Rasmussen.

Cardo, who returned from service a year ago and led conference rushers with 772 yards and a 4.5 average, will be abetted in the offensive backfield by Burbey, halfback Carl Alberti with a 4.9 rushing average, and quarterback Jim Goeckerman, the league's third ranked passer in 1968.

Halfback Greg Jones heads Whitewater's returnees. He was the conference's No. 6 rusher last fall with a 4.3 average and No. 4 pass receiver with 31 catches.

Among other Warhawks back are halfback Bruce Rasmussen, the league's second ranked rusher with 587 yards and a 5.6 average, quarterback Dennis Zander, fullback Leif Fredricksen, and end Mike Fox.

Three new coaches will make their debuts in the Conference — Gil Krueger at Platteville, Pat O'Halloran at Stevens Point, and Roger Harring at La Crosse.

Krueger formerly coached at Macalester College in St. Paul, Minnesota. O'Halloran was a defensive coach at Oshkosh State and Harring head coach at Wisconsin Rapids-Lincoln High School.

Platteville will try to retain its championship standing with a team headed by all-conference quarterback Chris Charnish and linebacker Tom Barth. Charnish led all backs in total offense and passing. Also on hand will be end Rich Smigielski, his principal target and the league's top receiver with 41 receptions.

La Crosse, which shared third place with Whitewater last fall, will build around all-conference end Dewey Stendahl and defensive back Gary Gardiner, plus halfback Gary Klug, a 5.2 rusher, and John DeMerit, who led the league as a freshman in both punt and kickoff returns.

Eau Claire starts defensively with two all-conference performers, 225-pound end Tom Clark and 220-pound tackle Terry Strand. Its chief offensive weapons is halfback Terry Weinberger, a 200-pounder who ranked third in rushing with 578 yards and a 4.1 average.

River Falls' ace returnee is all-conference defensive back Brian Kreibich, who set a record last fall with 14 pass interceptions (11 in WSUC games) and had a string of 11 straight games over two years with one or more steals.

Also prominent in Falcon plans are No. 3 receiver Tim DeLawyer (33 catches) and second ranked quarterback Jerry Trooien.

Stevens Point, Stout, and Superior face enormous rebuilding jobs. O'Halloran must start almost from scratch at Point, although Stout still has quarterback Rocky Maxson and halfback Nick Misch, while returnees at Superior include all-conference defensive back Rick Jurcsak and a 240-pound tackle, Doug Sutherland.

Veteran coaches back at their old stands include Eau Claire's Link Walker, Oshkosh's Russ Young, River Fall's Gwynn Christensen, Stout's Max Sparger, Superior's Mertz Mortorelli, and Whitewater's Forrest Perkins.

PROSPECTS FOR 1969

Eau Claire will try to improve on its 3-4-2 record of last fall with some strong running and a defensive forward wall and linebackers, who should be a hard-hitting group.

Link Walker, starting his second year as head coach, has 28 lettermen back, seven on defense and seven to run his winged-T and pro-T formations.

Terry Weinberger, who ranked third in conference rushing last fall with 578 yards and a 4.1 average, bolsters the ground attack. End Tom Clark and tackle Terry Strand, both all-conference last fall, are key men on the defensive unit.

Ends Dave Cizek and Dave Bong, guard Greg Kinart, and halfback Al LaMovec must be replaced. Bong caught 22 passes in 1968 and ranked seventh in the WSUC.

Lack of overall speed and depth is a worry to Walker as he ponders the Blugolds' rise from a fifth place finish last fall. Finding a consistent quarterback and establishing a stronger passing attack remain big tasks.

"Our team should be improved, but so will the other teams in the league,"
Walker commented. "We're rated somewhere near the middle of the conference."

Young has nine regulars back from the offensive platoon and five from the defense, where linebacker Frank Orzel and halfback Dan Buhr must be replaced. All-conference offensive tackle John Saletri also has graduated.

The Titans run their offense out of a winged-T with variations, and Young's squad is blessed with experience, good speed, and fair size. The problem area is defense, where lack of depth is a drawback.

Jim Goeckerman, the conference's third ranking passer last fall, should provide the Titans with experienced leadership in his senior year at quarterback.

PROSPECTS FOR 1969

Quarterback is a major problem area as Warhawk Coach Forrest Perkins begins his 14th season as head football coach at Whitewater, which shared third place last fall after winning consecutive championships in 1966 and '67.

Among the missing are NAIA All-American linebacker Al Equi, quarterback Bob Dorn, end Neil Hansen, guard Jim Perkins, and all-conference defensive end Jerry Mahoney.

Some 25 lettermen are back, including all-conference halfback Greg Jones, who with fullback Leif Fredricksen will begin their fourth year as starters. Offense is a major strength and includes halfback Bruce Rasmussen, who was second in conference rushing yards last fall with 587 and led in average gain per carry with 5.6 yards.

Most of the defensive line is back, but the offensive forward wall must be rebuilt almost from scratch. Perkins will rely on newcomers to a great extent in the line as the Warhawks try to rebound after being ousted from the throne room last fall.

PREVIEW 1969-70 BASKETBALL SEASON WISCONSIN STATE UNIVERSITY CONFERENCE

Eau Claire, the surprise team of 1969, could be even more shocking in the 1970 Wisconsin State University Conference basketball race.

Blugold Coach Ken Anderson probably sounded a warning a few days after the 1968-69 season ended when he remarked, "We're looking forward already to next year."

Stevens Point, which shared the 1969 crown with Stout, also appears strong on paper. Platteville, too, figures to find a spot among the contenders.

Eau Claire (11-5) shared third with Platteville and the Blugolds jolted the more highly regarded quintets with a predominantly freshman squad.

Four top Eau Claire returnees are sophomores, including guard Jim Lindsey, who led the Blugolds in scoring with a conference average of 14.2 points per game.

Steve Johnson and Mike Ratliff each averaged 11.6 and Tom Jackson 10.1. Ratliff also averaged 11.5 rebounds a game and Johnson 10.3 retrieves.

Included among Anderson's veterans are senior Larry Sturz and junior Jerry Hughes, both of whom averaged 10 points a game.

Stevens Point will miss 6-9 rebounding star Mike Hughes, but Coach Bob Krueger still has juniors Tom Ritzenthaler and Quinn Vanden Heuvel, 16.5 and 13.8, respectively, as well as senior sharpshooter Ken Ritzenthaler (10.6), who compiled the best field goal shooting average in the conference the past two years.

Senior Dan Tinnon (10.9) as well as juniors Jim Lawinger (13.7) and Rich Ludka (13.3) head Platteville returnees. A replacement must be found for all-conference Doug Knutson (15.1) who is now in the service.

La Crosse boasts a promising group of veterans, including sophomore Len Sullivan, who came on strong for the Indians in the latter half of the 1968-69 season. He wound up averaging 14.9 points and 10.6 rebounds per game.

Also back for the Indians are seniors Mike Heideman (15.0), LeRoy Young (10.4), and Dave Aller (9.4), along with junior John Selbo.

Superior will build around sophomore Win McGriff, a 16.1 scorer and 11.8 rebounder, and Hank Solomon, who scored 11.1 points a game and grabbed 10 rebounds. Also back are juniors Bob Boettcher and Jim Brandt.

Junior Jeff Stang, the sixth ranking conference scorer with 16.4 last season, is the chief hope as Oshkosh hopes to recapture its championship groove of a couple years ago. He will be abetted by senior Rick Rehm, the team's leading rebounder, and junior Ken VerGowe.

Two of Stout's big three are missing as Coach Dwain Mintz searches for another winning combination. All-everything Mel Coleman, who scored more points (338) and accounted for more rebounds (242) than anyone else in the conference, is gone along with Bill Heidemann, ninth ranked scorer in 1969 and co-scoring champ in '68.

Junior Cal Glover, fourth ranked conference scorer (18.3) is the lone returnee from the Bluedevil triumvirate. Also back is senior guard Greg Ebsen.

Whitewater is confident of escaping the conference cellar by building around seniors Jerry Stelse and Don Paulsen, and River Falls must start almost from scratch except for sophomore Bob Parker and junior Joe Acotto.

Returning all-conference performers include Glover, Lindsey, Paulsen, Tom Ritzenthaler, and Vanden Heuvel.
