Upon motion by Regent Gundersen, seconded by Regent DeLong, the minutes of the February 2, 1990, meeting of the Board of Regents were approved as distributed.

REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT OF THE BOARD

Report of the President of the State Board Vocational, Technical and Adult Education, p. 1

A written report was presented by Regent DeLong, President of the State Board of Vocational, Technical and Adult Education.

Legislative Update *on*

Agriculture-Related Legislation *and*

Summarizing action on legislation to prohibit sale and use of BST, Vice President Bornstein reported that SB 454, which passed the Senate on a vote of 20 to 11, would ban the sale of BST until July 1, 1991, or one year after FDA approval. Assembly Bill 200 would ban the sale of BST until July 1, 1991, or six months after FDA approval.

Assembly action removed all funding for UW System research from AB 200 and placed it in Senate Bill 344, which would establish the Family Farm Institute within the UW-Madison College of Agriculture and Life Sciences and provide for reports on the effects of biotechnology and other research on family farms. There was \$1 million included for those activities and for research, field testing and extension education related to BST.

A conference committee would be formed to address differences between the Senate and Assembly versions.

Solid Waste Disposal and Recycling Legislation, P. 2

Vice President Bornstein then reported that Senate Bill 300, which dealt with solid waste disposal and recycling legislation, passed the Senate unanimously. Included in the measure was \$290,700 for extension recycling education, \$557,500 that would fund 18 research projects approved by the Board of Regents at institutions with faculty having expertise in the area, and \$85,000 for the administration and development of extramural research grants.

In closing, Vice President Bornstein expressed appreciation to VTAE colleagues for participating with the UW System in successful efforts to defeat an amendment to Assembly Bill 218 and thus protect the state and its employees from added exposure to litigation.

He also thanked Assistant Vice President David Martin, Michael Williamson of UW-Madison, and Mark Lederer of UW-Extension, who worked diligently on the BST and recycling bills and expressed appreciation to Regent Vice President Lyon for his expert advice and counsel.

In reply to a question by Regent Flores, Vice President Bornstein said funding had been removed from the BST bill so that it would not be subject to line veto.

Regent Dreyfus asked if there is sentiment for a legislative ban on any sort of research, to which Assistant Vice President Martin replied in the negative.

Regent Lyon added that the bill differed from other legislation providing for research in that it included specific requirements in such areas as the size of herds to be studied and set a reporting timetable which was not realistic in terms of the characteristics of the animals being studied.

Regent President Schilling reminded the Board of the annual conference of the national Association of Governing Boards, being held from March 18-20, 1990, in San Diego. Regent Vos planned to attend the conference.

X Regent - Committees - *Authorization to Board President to form a Special Committee to hear UW-Sau Claire Student Governance Appeal, pp 3-6*

Regent Committee on Student Discipline and Student Governance Appeals

Regent President Schilling presented a draft amendment which would create a standing Regent Committee on Student Discipline and Student Governance Appeals.

The Committee would consider appeals submitted pursuant to student governance guidelines for Regent review of decisions related to student participation in governance matters, and would make recommendations to the Board of Regents as to appropriate disposition of appeals. There currently was no established process for handling such appeals. The guidelines on student governance provide for mandatory review of disputes over use of segregated fees and discretionary review of other appeals pertaining to whether the letter and spirit of s. 36.09(5) of the statutes is being followed.

X Regent Committee - Committee on UW-Sau Claire Student Governance Appeal - *(same)*

The Committee on Student Discipline and Student Governance Appeals also would handle student discipline appeals submitted under Chapters UWS 14 and 17, *Wisconsin Administrative Code*, (academic and nonacademic misconduct.) Chapter UWS 17 provides for mandatory review of suspension or expulsion appeals and discretionary review of other appeals. Under Chapter UWS 14, all reviews by the Board are discretionary.

For the past year, the Personnel Matters Review Committee also had functioned as the Committee on Student Discipline for cases brought under Chapter UWS 17. Consequently, the Committee's workload in recent months had been heavy.

The revised committee structure would consolidate student appeals for both discipline and governance cases within one committee. The Personnel Matters Review Committee would continue to handle faculty and staff appeals, as provided in the bylaws.

Also included in the draft amendment were criteria to be used in determining whether or not a review should be granted in those instances when Regent review is discretionary. This language paralleled existing bylaw language, which sets forth criteria used by the Personnel Matters Review Committee in deciding whether or not to recommend that the Board grant requests for review of personnel decisions.

The proposed bylaw amendment was presented at this meeting for preliminary review and the intent was to bring the proposed amendment, with any suggested modifications, to the Board for action at the April meeting.

Regent Nikolay considered it an excellent idea to have a committee designated to handle student appeals, in that it would clearly signify to students that they have a right to be heard by the Board under appropriate circumstances.

Regent Vos felt that the new committee would strengthen the role of student governance by providing a better opportunity for such cases to receive in-depth consideration.

In response to a question by Regent Dreyfus, Regent President Schilling noted that both the administrative rules on student discipline and the student governance guidelines provide for certain appeals to the Board. He cited the following proposed criteria for deciding whether or not to review a student discipline case: (1) The case involves substantial constitutional claims; (2) there is a serious concern that the chancellor has abused his/her discretion or exceeded his/her authority; (3) the decision made at the institutional level could have systemwide implications; or (4) the final institutional decision is based upon facts not supported by the record, resulting in material prejudice to the individual seeking review.

Replying to a question by Regent Weinstein, President Schilling noted that the bylaw amendments would make it clear that faculty or staff appeals would go to the Personnel Matters Review Committee and student appeals would go to the new committee.

Regent Clusen commented that creation of such a committee might serve to encourage submission of more student appeals than otherwise would come forward.

Regent President Schilling noted that there had been segregated fee appeals in recent years and that one governance appeal currently was pending. In each case it had been necessary for the Board President to determine on an ad hoc basis how they should be handled.

In response to a question by Regent Davis, President Schilling confirmed that the proposed bylaw revision would not extend any new rights of appeal but only would provide a mechanism for channeling the rights that exist.

Regent Davis asked if the reason for creating a new committee had to do with the workload of the Personnel Matters Review Committee or if there was a request by students for a committee of their own.

While committee workload was a factor, Regent Schilling replied, his primary motivation was to establish a procedure that would handle all student cases in a known and consistent manner. The initial request of the UW-Eau Claire students had been that their appeal go to the Education Committee. Given the time it takes to hear appeals, however, he thought it would not be feasible to assign governance appeals to a standing committee which has a broad array of other responsibilities.

In response to a question by Regent Weinstein, President Schilling said the Personnel Matters Review Committee had handled four cases so far this year, including three student discipline appeals.

Regent Weinstein was not convinced that two committees would be needed for that number of cases.

President Schilling explained that it was the considered view of United Council and individual student governments that appeal rights under the 1986 student governance guidelines would be exercised. Indicating that he already was aware of several governance appeals that are likely to come forward, he cautioned that the interpretation of governance rights under s. 36.05(9) will be a difficult task because of the way the statute is written.

Regent Flores commented that, while four cases may not seem like many, each one can be very time-consuming due to its complexity and the extensiveness of the record that must be reviewed. He thought it would be appropriate and helpful to involve more Regents in such reviews.

Regent Dreyfus agreed with Regent Clusen's view that providing a separate committee might not only meet the need, but also could be expected to encourage the filing of more appeals.

Regent Hanson recalled that, before the Personnel Matters Review Committee was created, appeals had been reviewed by individual Regents or ad hoc committees. She thought that approach might be preferable to creating an avenue which would serve to encourage filing of more appeals.

Regent Schilling felt it always had been a problem for ad hoc committees to have to first ponder how to proceed and what criteria to apply. Cases reviewed in this way had been handled differently from one another. The intent in establishing a standing committee was to have cases handled in a consistent manner.

Regent Weinstein requested that the proposal be redrafted exactly as it would appear as part of the Bylaws, including language to distinguish the duties of the two committees.

Turning to the pending governance appeal, Regent President Schilling explained that the appeal had been forwarded for Regent consideration as to whether or not a review should be granted. It was an appeal by the UW-Eau Claire student body president concerning the student role in a decision to remove cigarette vending machines from certain university buildings.

The proposed Committee on Student Discipline and Student Governance Appeals could not be appointed until action on the bylaw amendment at the April meeting. If the UW-Eau Claire appeal were referred to that Committee, no action on the appeal could occur before the May meeting.

The student body president had expressed concern about the delay which would be caused by waiting for amendment of Regent bylaws before processing their appeal, on the basis that the time involved would bring consideration of the appeal close to final exams. Because it would be difficult for students to devote attention to the appeal at that time, she requested more expeditious consideration.

A means of accommodating this concern would be to create a Special Regent Committee to consider the UW-Eau Claire appeal. The committee first would recommend to the Board whether or not to grant the request for Regent review. If the Board determines that the review should be granted, the committee could then proceed to conduct the review and to make its recommendation to the Board as soon as possible on the merits of the case. The bylaws provide for creation of special regent committees by an affirmative majority vote of the Board.

President Shaw agreed that action should be taken on the pending appeal without waiting for amendment of the bylaws. With respect to creation of a new standing committee, he observed that three principles were involved: First, the need for an opportunity to be heard by an impartial body; second, the concern that assigning appeals to one of the regular standing committees would detract from its ability to consider policy matters; and third, the importance of dealing with appeals in a consistent manner rather than on an ad hoc basis.

Regent Lyon moved that the President of the Board be authorized to form a special committee to consider the UW-Eau Claire student governance appeal. The motion was seconded and adopted unanimously.

Presentation on UW-Whitewater/Grambling State University/Pan-American University Faculty Exchange, pp 6-10

President Shaw asked UW-Whitewater Chancellor Connor to introduce four colleagues involved in the Consortial Program for Educational Cooperation and Scholarly Exchange: Dr. Richard Lee, Associate Dean of Continuing Education and Extension Services at UW-Whitewater; Dr. Hilda Madrano, Associate Professor and Chair of the Department of Curriculum and Instruction at the University of Texas at Pan-American; Dr. Martha Tevis, Professor of Education at the University of Texas at Pan-American; and, Dr. Marilyn Irving, Assistant Professor of Education at UW-Whitewater.

Chancellor Connor noted that, following a merger process, Pan-American University was now known as the University of Texas at Pan-American.

Dr. Lee explained that the exchange program began with the assistance of minority faculty exchange funds from UW System as well as with the help of Dr. James Sulton, Special Assistant to the President for Minority Affairs.

The program involves UW-Whitewater, Grambling State University from Louisiana, and the University of Texas at Pan-American. These three institutions share several characteristics:

- 1) Each is a regional comprehensive institution;
- 2) Each has an established tradition of excellence in higher education, particularly teacher education;
- 3) Each is committed to promoting cultural diversity; and
- 4) Each serves a predominantly homogeneous population. UW-Whitewater, despite dramatic gains in the last two years, still serves primarily white middle-class students; Grambling State University still serves a predominantly black student population; and the University of Texas at Pan-American serves mostly Hispanic students.

Dr. Lee acknowledged that it was in the best interest of all three institutions to promote exchanges among both faculty and students to enhance the cultural diversity of these institutions.

Describing the activities involved in the scholarly exchanges among the participating schools, Dr. Lee included collaborative research across academic disciplines, teaching and instructional exchanges, learning experiences that promote multicultural understanding among undergraduate students, opportunities for research and study of an intercultural nature among graduate students, opportunities for professional growth and development among faculty and academic staff, and jointly-sponsored symposia, workshops and conferences to promote multicultural learning.

Dr. Lee outlined the program's major accomplishments to date, including:

- a five-day retreat, held on the Grambling campus in June 1989, involving 35 faculty and administrators from the three participating institutions to discuss future plans for the program;
- a five-week exchange of 15 students from Pan-American who enrolled in teacher education courses at UW-Whitewater as well as speaking to community groups;
- the "Ventures in Better Schooling" conference, attended by a team of teacher-educators from the University of Texas-Pan American in August 1989. An intensive week-long program, the conference was designed for high school educators wishing to discuss issues relevant to improving high school education;

- a four-day visit from Professors Theodore Jennings and Allen Williams, both of Grambling State University, to discuss exchanges in the arts scheduled for Summer 1990;
- a speech by Dr. Joseph Johnson, President of Grambling State University, at the African-American Awards Banquet at UW-Whitewater in February 1990;
- the collaborative writing of a textbook on multicultural education by Dr. Martha Tevis, a professor at Pan-American, and Dr. Roberta Sexson, an assistant professor at UW-Whitewater;
- Dr. Marilyn Irving's study of methods used to teach science to under-represented minority students by public school teachers in northern Louisiana; and,
- a presentation of the exchange program to several national conferences.

Next, Dr. Martha Tevis briefly described the University of Texas at Pan-American. Located in a predominantly rural area, for a number of years Pan-American has had the largest percentage of Hispanic students of any university in the United States (currently 82 percent Mexican-American) as well as graduating the largest number of Hispanic students. Dr. Tevis pointed out that most of the students are not only the first college graduates in their families, but are the first high school graduates in their families as well. She described the Pan-American graduations as "quite something. Everyone comes--the grandmother, the two-year old--everybody comes because this is the biggest thing that has ever happened in their family."

Dr. Tevis expressed great enthusiasm for the scholarly exchange program, describing it as a wonderful experience for the students, adding that most of the participating Pan-American students had not traveled far from their homes before. She reported that, upon their return to Texas, the excited students described Wisconsin as very hospitable and said they wanted to come back.

Dr. Tevis communicated the thanks and enthusiastic support of Dr. Miguel Nevarez, President of the University of Texas at Pan-American, and expressed the hope that the Regents would someday have the opportunity to meet some of the exchange students.

The Regents next heard Dr. Hilda Madrano of Pan-American describe a four-week exchange she led last summer, bringing 14 Pan-American students to UW-Whitewater. As a result of that short stay, three of those students are currently graduate students at UW-Whitewater pursuing a masters degree in education--a very positive result of this faculty and student exchange. This summer, Dr. Madrano plans to return to UW-Whitewater with at least ten undergraduate students. Also, during spring break, Pan-American will host two UW-Whitewater students in south Texas where they will have an opportunity to tour the campus as well as enjoy the spring weather.

Dr. Madrano pointed out that another group of teacher-educators from Pan-American is planning to attend the "Ventures to Better Schooling" conference again this summer.

Dr. Lee then presented Dr. Marilyn Irving, an alum of Grambling State University who came to UW-Whitewater 18 years ago as an exchange student. After finishing her doctorate, she accepted a position at UW-Whitewater, where she has provided leadership to the multicultural efforts on the UW-Whitewater campus.

Dr. Irving shared with the Regents the background of her research project at Grambling State University regarding issues associated with teaching science to traditionally under-represented populations. She had interviewed science professors to find out if they perceive a difference between the methods of instruction for motivating minority students to learn science. Concurrently, she was surveying teachers in three school districts in northern Louisiana to determine if a different method of instruction should be utilized to motivate minority students in science classes. The data she had collected from the three school districts thus far will enable her to lead summer teacher workshops on hands-on science activities.

Last summer, Pan-American and UW-Whitewater faculty attended a five-day conference held at Grambling State, which resulted in new ideas for the program as well as collaborative research plans. From that conference, two professors from Grambling State visited UW-Whitewater in December. Ideas were shared as to how theatre and music department exchanges could be implemented.

Future program plans include participation by teachers and professors from Grambling State in the "Ventures in Better Schooling" workshop that will be held at UW-Whitewater this summer. Fall semester seminars and workshops at Grambling State will be presented by UW-Whitewater faculty members from the Department of Curriculum and Instruction.

Reflecting on her personal commitment to the exchange program, Dr. Irving said, "I would just like to add that 18 years ago I was an exchange student from Grambling State University. As a result of that, I know that is why I am now employed in the UW System. I think the exchange program is quite beneficial and very advantageous toward the *Design for Diversity*. I do believe it can help increase minority enrollment and I think it does aid in increasing opportunities for minorities and the economically disadvantaged students. Mostly, it helps educate all students for this increasingly multicultural society."

Dr. Lee summarized that the exchange program established very positive personal relationships with the people from Pan-American and Grambling State. These people have helped UW-Whitewater design its own plan for diversity as well as recruit faculty members from traditionally under-represented minorities.

Regent Flores noted that, as a native of the Rio Grande Valley, he could attest to the importance of this exchange program. Because there is no professional school in Texas south of San Antonio, he said, whenever

students in south Texas want to go to a professional school, they must leave their home area. He added that these exchanges with universities help the UW System recruit some of those graduate students into the professional schools. He expressed hope that other UW System campuses would attempt to forge similar linkages.

Regent Davis concurred with Regent Flores' statement and commended the presenters and the program.

Concluding the presentation, President Shaw noted that programs like the Consortial Program for Educational Cooperation and Scholarly Exchange reinforce the commitment UW campuses are making to the letter and, more importantly, to the spirit of *Design for Diversity*.

Regent Study Group on the Future of the UW System

Report on Implementation of *Planning the Future*, pp 10-11

Presenting the fifth progress report on implementing the resolutions adopted in *Planning the Future*, President Shaw recommended that this be the final such report. With the exception of a few items that had not been accomplished due to the need for action by forces external to the university, the tasks outlined by the Board had either been implemented or require continuing activity by the institutions. Many of these continuing efforts are regularly reported to standing committees of the Board through such means as the *Design for Diversity* report made each November; the enrollment report given to the Board each fall; and the annual report to the Education Committee on program planning, as well as annual reports on remedial education, exceptional admissions, add-drop policies and credit transfers.

Items of interest in the current report included a transfer information system, which will make the System institutions more accessible to transfer students. Phase I, the equivalency matrix, is currently being piloted at UW-Eau Claire, UW-Whitewater, and UW Center-Washington County. Pilot institutions for Phase II, institutional and program information, include UW-Green Bay, UW-Stout, and UW Center-Fox Valley. Implementation of this phase is scheduled for the fall of 1990. Funding for the project had been approved through the biennium. The project would be fully implemented in 1994.

With regard to progress in implementing the policy on transfer of credits from VTAE institutions into the UW System, President Shaw reported that Milwaukee Area Technical College was selected as the first VTAE pilot district and was to join the Phase I pilot of the transfer information system this spring.

In conclusion, President Shaw thanked the Board for its guidance, and the faculty, staff and administrations of the institutions for their tireless efforts to bring about important and lasting changes in the University of Wisconsin System. With the actions resulting from *Planning the Future* as a foundation, he was confident that the UW System will continue to make significant advances in educational, equal opportunity, and management policies and practices.

Asking if there were plans to update *Planning the Future*, Regent Davis commented that it is an excellent planning document, the relevance of which should not be allowed to diminish.

President Shaw explained that it was his expectation that the "Issues of the 90s" papers will culminate with a set of planning initiatives that will supplement *Planning the Future*, which he considered timeless in the sense that the concepts in that document are being internalized as a part of UW System culture.

Regent Weinstein asked for assurance that all items in *Planning the Future* had been assigned to a committee, in order to ensure that implementation continues to be monitored. President Shaw confirmed that assignment of accountability would be ensured.

REPORT OF THE PHYSICAL PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

Regent Gundersen, Chair, presented the Committee's report.

Consent Agenda Items

Regent Gundersen reported on Committee consideration of an allocation formula for program revenue funding of utility system capital costs. This subject had been discussed at several recent meetings in an effort to address a directive from the State Building Commission that the System

contribute a specified amount of program revenue funds annually. These funds are to be the System's contribution toward funding the program-revenue facilities portion of utility system repair and capital costs. The Committee's discussion centered on the new phrase added to the resolution since it was first introduced in December, which reflected the Building Commission's action at its January 24 meeting that the institutions shall not impose any new segregated fees in order to generate these funds.

There was brief discussion of this action at the February Board meeting, and it was agreed that the resolution would not be presented for action until this month to allow additional student input. That opportunity was provided during a meeting with student government presidents which was held on February 2 following the Board meeting. During that meeting, the students asked that the phrase be added to the resolution when it was forwarded to the Board.

At the Committee meeting, Regent Vos and several student organization leaders were present and participated in the discussion. The speakers included John Strasburg, President of the UW-Whitewater Student Association; Chad Ritchie, UW-Whitewater, representing the Wisconsin Association of Residence Halls; Rob McGinnis, representing United Council; Sandra Eschman, a senior at UW-Platteville and a four-year dormitory resident; Ann Welch, UW-Eau Claire Student Body President; and Jordan Marsh, UW-Madison, University Affairs Director of the Wisconsin Student Association.

The discussion centered on three issues: (1) that the Building Commission's directive which limits the options available to the Chancellors to collect fees intrudes on the statutory authority of the Board; (2) that there is desire on the part of some to have the program revenue contribution come from any source except segregated fees; and (3) that there is desire on the part of others to use only segregated fees to generate the contribution.

Following extensive discussion of the various viewpoints, the Committee voted unanimously to adopt Resolution 5430. Regent Dreyfus stated that, while he would vote in favor of the resolution, he thought that President Shaw should send a request for the Governor's help in curbing the tendency of the Building Commission to intervene in Board and University matters.

It was moved by Regent Gundersen and seconded by Regent Dreyfus that the following resolution be adopted by the Board of Regents:

Resolution 5430: That, in response to a directive from the Wisconsin State Building Commission that the Board of Regents of the University of Wisconsin System adopt a policy to provide for Program Revenue contributions to the cost of funding capital projects relating to central utility systems, the President and Chancellors of the University of Wisconsin System recommend and the Board of Regents adopts the following schedule of payments by each of the several campuses:

These assessments would occur on an annual basis, beginning July 1, 1990, and remain at the level shown through the 1994-95 fiscal year when they will be re-evaluated.

In generating the funds to pay these assessments, the Chancellors are not to impose any new segregated fees.

*Amount based on UW-Platteville's cost per student to more equitably equalize the cost impact.

Regent Vos explained why he felt the prohibition against imposing any new segregated fees should be removed from the resolution. First, he thought that a precedent was being set for further intrusion into the Board's authority, and he did not consider a letter to the Building Commission a strong enough response. Second, he viewed the prohibition as undermining campus autonomy. Third, he did not believe that residence hall students want their rates raised, possibly by large amounts, as a result of prohibiting segregated fee use. While he did not necessarily favor an across-the-board segregated fee, he thought the option should be left open so that each campus could decide what best suits its own circumstances.

Regent Davis agreed with the need to send a strong signal to the Building Commission concerning the Board's statutory authority. With regard to student opinion, he noted that student government organizations at all institutions except UW-Whitewater supported the prohibition as stated in the resolution.

Regent President Schilling asked if there were any consensus among institutions as to how fees will be collected if segregated fees are not used.

President Shaw replied that the options would be to increase housing fees and other user charges paid by students.

In response to a question by Regent Dreyfus, Associate Vice President Marnocha stated that the Building Commission directive meant that existing segregated fees may be used but may not be increased to pay for the program.

Regent Weinstein said he had been told by student government representatives that they favored user fees--and not segregated fees in any form--to pay utility costs. His preference would be to adopt the approach favored by students.

Regent President Schilling called on Ann Welch, President of the UW-Eau Claire student body, who stated that their request for purposes of this resolution was that no new segregated fees should be imposed. It was their view that the segregated fee funding had become the "dumping ground" for a variety of charges, and students were in concert in wanting the practice stopped.

In response to a question by Regent President Schilling, Associate Vice President Marnocha confirmed that no segregated fees currently are used for utility maintenance.

Regent President Schilling called on Lance Walter, legislative affairs director of United Council, who explained that it was their position that institutions should not be limited in their ability to implement the policy except to prohibit use of new segregated fees. If individual campuses wished to use existing segregated fees in combination with user fees, United Council felt that should be permitted.

President Shaw agreed that institutions should have the flexibility to reallocate existing segregated fees to fund utility costs.

Regent Nicholas asked if reliance on user fees alone would not be the fairest solution. Mr. Walter replied that many institutions probably would choose that approach.

Regent Gundersen commented that, in the future, funding sources should be clearly delineated at the time of construction so that this type of situation would not recur.

Regent President Schilling suggested that Regents and President Shaw arrange to discuss with the Building Commission the concern that directives were being issued in areas that are the responsibility of the Board.

Regent Vos commented that individual campuses should have the authority to decide which funding sources to use, including segregated fees, and that no options should be precluded by a central directive.

Regent Hanson encouraged the Board to hear the views of chancellors as well as students, since the chancellors would be responsible for implementing the decision.

President Schilling indicated that the chancellors' views were taken into account in President Shaw's recommendation.

Regent Vos moved to strike from the resolution the words "In generating the funds to pay these assessments, the Chancellors are not to impose any new segregated fees." The motion was seconded by Regent Weinstein.

The question was put on the amendment, and it failed on a voice vote.

Put to the vote, Resolution 5430 was adopted, with Regent Vos voting

In response to a request by Regent Davis, Chancellor Shalala explained that this was the first request to use the Graner funds for a professorship. The original authorization had not provided for a high enough salary level to attract the caliber of candidates the university was seeking, because salaries in the field of finance were rising so rapidly. In addition, some candidates were lost because they demanded very low teaching loads. The intent was to go back into the market with the advantage of the endowed Chair in order to attract a first-rate candidate.

Regent Nicholas asked if the proposed range included some of the endowment income, and the Chancellor replied in the affirmative.

Put to the vote, Resolution 5438 was adopted unanimously.

Dr. Jacqueline Ross, Director of the Post-Secondary Re-Entry Education Program, UW Centers, described a series of multidisciplinary courses designed for students in the Wisconsin prison system.


