



Head Coach Mary Murphy

Chicago native Mary Murphy was named head women's basketball coach at the University of Wisconsin–Madison on July 7, 1986. Murphy's proven experience in recruiting, her enthusiasm for re-vitalizing the Wisconsin basketball program, and her emphasis on the importance of having *scholar*-athletes in the program, are all assets that she has brought to her position at Wisconsin.

Beginning her fourth season at Wisconsin, Murphy's presence in the Badger program has been judged a success by the public and UW administration alike. In February of 1988, she became the first coach of a non-revenue sport to receive a multi-year contract at Wisconsin.

Murphy's rebuilding of the Badger program has included an infusion of youth, most of whom come from the state of Wisconsin. Her 1988–89 team, comprised of six freshmen, four sophomores, and two juniors, posted the best season record in six years at 13–14.

The squad set or tied 31 team or individual records, and two players received All—Big Ten Honorable Mention honors by a vote of the conference coaches. The 1988 Badger team was recognized for its individual talents when Lisa Bonnell (Merrill, WI), was named second team All—Big Ten, and Kay Fredrickson (Durand, WI), was picked as the 1988 Big Ten Freshman of the Year.

While building a basketball program from the ground up, Murphy has not neglected the academic responsibilities of



her student-athletes. Three members of the 1988–89 team earned Big Ten Academic Team honors, and Kay Fredrickson became Wisconsin's first women's basketball CoSIDA/GTE Academic All-America District team member.


Murphy's emphasis on the court and in the classroom is, "To be the best that you can be." The results of that philosophy are evident on the court as well as in the classroom.

Murphy is a 1980 graduate of Northwestern University in Public Administration/Public Policy. She was a four-year starting guard for Northwestern and a cocaptain her final two seasons. She guided the Wildcats to consecutive Big Ten and Midwest Association of Intercollegiate Ath-

letics for Women (MAIAW) Championships in 1979 and 1980. The Wildcats went to the quarter-finals of the 1980 AIAW National Basketball Tournament. She was also selected a Wade Trophy finalist in 1980, an annual award given to the nation's outstanding female college basketball player.

After completing her playing career at Northwestern, Murphy accepted a graduate assistant coaching position at Notre Dame. She earned a Master's of Business Administration (MBA) degree from Notre Dame in 1982. Murphy served as a head assistant and recruiting coordinator at Notre Dame for six years prior to being named to her first head coaching appointment at Wisconsin.

Assistant Coaches



Mike Peckham, a former assistant coach at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, begins his fourth year with Wisconsin women's basketball as chief recruiting and academic coordinator. An assistant at North Carolina from 1980–86, Mike aided the Tar Heels to four NCAA tournament appearances.

Mike serves as the head recruiter, travel and schedule coordinator, in addition to his on-court coaching duties. He has worked at many summer basketball camps, and is the Co-Director of the Mary Murphy Basketball Camps.

A 1982 graduate of North Carolina in recreation administration, Mike and his wife, Bobbi, reside in Madison with their two-year old, Samantha.



Donna Freitag, a native of Oregon, Wisconsin, returned to Wisconsin in 1986 as second assistant. Freitag earned most valuable player honors at the University of Wisconsin–Platteville for two years before transferring to the University of Iowa. At Iowa, she was named team MVP and captain during the 1982–83 season. Freitag also won the All-Around Athlete award in 1983 and was named to the all-tournament team at the Sun Dial Classic.

Freitag, a 1983 graduate of lowa in physical education and health, has also worked at numerous basketball camps and has coached at the high school level. She played in Ireland with the women's semi-professional basketball league for two years prior to her appointment at Wisconsin.



Part-time assistant **Yulonda Wimbish** adds an elite dimension to the Badger program as she re-joins the Wisconsin coaching staff for the second year. The University of Texas at Austin graduate was a two-year starter for the top-ranked Long Horns.

As a senior, Wimbish had her best season for Texas, averaging 15.7 points per game and becoming the Southwest Conference Player of the Year for 1988. She started for the 1986 U.S. National Team which competed in the Pre-Olympic Invitational Tournament in Seoul, South Korea. Wimbish, a 1988 organizational communications graduate of the University of Texas, ranks eighth in scoring at Texas with 1485 career points.

Youth, enthusiasm, talent . . . those are the attributes that have distinguished Wisconsin Women's Basketball under fourth year coach Mary Murphy. These characteristics have provided a formula for success as proven by the 1988–89 UW team.

Murphy's squad, comprised of six freshmen, four sophomores, and two juniors, posted the best record in six years with a 13–14 mark, and tied for eighth in the Big Ten.

The team set or tied 31 team and individual records including a six-year-old record for most consecutive wins (seven) tied during the non-conference season. The Badgers more than tripled their win record of a year ago (4–24), and improved from a 10th place conference finish to just one game shy of a tie for sixth place with a 5–13 record.

The keys to maintaining that success lie in having healthy players, and in reducing the number of turnovers and fouls accumulated last year, numbers directly related to the youthfulness of the team.

"Last year our guards were hurt so much it reminded me of the three guys in the parade who were returning from the Revolutionary War," Murphy reminisced. "One played the fife, one the drums, and the third carried the flag. All three were so banged up they were about to fall out.

"That was Amy Bauer, Shelly Rucinski and Gina Edmonds last season. After three surgeries last summer, and a lot of rehabilitation, I think these three will be ready for a great year."


Murphy added, "In addition, a healthy Robin Threatt and the return of Mynette Clark will add to our speed, quickness, shooting ability, and depth. The turnover problems can be solved as we mature and continue to improve our decision-making, both offensively and defensively."

The experienced gained by last year's newcomers will be a factor in continued success as freshmen individual performances highlighted last season. Point guard Amy Bauer (Durand, Wis.) was responsible for setting 15 individual records. The freshman stepped into the command role setting single game and single season assist records of 21 in a game, and 141 for the year (average of 5.2 per game). She tied the UW school record for best free throw percentage hitting 79 of 101 attempts (.782), and bested nine other single game and single season frosh

Bauer, a 5–9 guard, started 26 games and missed one game with a sprained ankle. She averaged 10.5 points, hitting double figures in 15 games including a career best 19 points vs. Illinois-Chicago.

"Last year's success proved that we have taken great strides in turning the Wisconsin program around. The team's improvement highlights the type of people we have here at Wisconsin—hardworking individuals who have accepted an enormous challenge, and have come out on top."

She was second on the team in steals with 37.

Freshman walk-on **Michele Kozelka** (**Prairie du Chien, Wis.**) earned a scholar-ship by the conference season where she

became the team's leading scorer and rebounder averaging 13 points and nine rebounds while starting all 18 conference games. She led the team in steals with 45 on the season, and ranks second behind Bauer in freshmen free throw attempts and best percentage hitting 74–100 (.740)

The 6–1 forward was named Big Ten Player of the Week for leading the Badgers in an upset of 11th-ranked Purdue (19 points and 10 rebounds), and added 16 points and 11 rebounds against Illinois the same weekend. Kozelka earned 1989 All—Big Ten Honorable Mention honors as she averaged 17 points and 10 rebounds the last seven conference games of the season.

Robin Threatt (Cedar Rapids, Iowa) led the team in scoring averaging 11 points through five games before a back injury forced her temporary retirement. The 5–7 speedster returns healthy this season, and will add great versatility to the Badger attack. Threatt hit over 50 percent from the field in four of five games and totaled a career high 21 points against Western Illinois on eight of 16 from the floor including three of four three-point shots.


Guard Mynette Clark (Racine, Wis.) gained experience in her first semester of college ball playing in 13 games and averaging 3.8 points. Although ineligible the second half of the season, Clark made her mark from three point range hitting six of 19 (.316) including a freshmen record three of four against Indiana (tying Threatt).

Heather Bostrom, a 6–1 forward from Rochester, Mich., battled nagging injuries all season, but played in 26 games. Although a hand injury hampered her scoring abilities, it helped established her as a defensive specialist. Returning healed this fall, Bostrom should prove to be a scoring force as well this year.

Jennifer Scotten played in 10 games and was the recipient of Wisconsin's "teammate award" last season. The 6–2 center from Victoria, British Columbia, played a reserve role but had a great game against Valparaiso scoring eight points on three of six from the floor and two free throws.

With such a large freshmen class and no seniors, Murphy counted on the "veteran" experience of her sophomore and junior players. **Kay Fredrickson**, the 1988 Big Ten Freshman of the Year, played in all 27 games last season starting 17. The 5–10 forward averaged 8.1 points and 4.4 rebounds, and has the best UW career three-point goal percentage hitting 14–41 for .341 percent

Kay, one of three Badgers from **Durand**, **Wis.**, also distinguished herself off the

court as Wisconsin's first GTE/CoSIDA District V Academic All-American for basketball. She and fellow teammates Lisa Lawrence and twin sister Kim, were All-Big Ten Academic team members. Kay was also the 1989 UW Athletic Board Scholar for basketball.

Kim Fredrickson played in 21 games last season as a reserve forward averaging two points and rebounds. Surgery has corrected a condition that affected her hand after an industrial accident the summer of 1988, and she will be counted on for improved play this season.

Lisa Lawrence (Milwaukee, Wis.) was third on the team in rebounding last season leading in three games including a career high 11 against Detroit. She played in 27 games starting 19, and averaged 5.7 points and 4.6 rebounds. She had a career high 16 points hitting seven of 11 field goals against Ohio State in the next to the last game of the season.

Another sophomore returned for the last 13 games of the year. **Gina Edmonds**, a 5–5 guard from **West Nyack**, **N.Y.**, regained her eligibility second semester, and averaged 2.6 points while spelling Bauer at guard.

Last season's junior class numbered just two including junior college transfer Janetta Johnson (Ann Arbor, Mich.) and senior/junior Shelly Rucinski of Dousman, Wis. Rucinski was the Badger captain two years and started 23 of 27 games last season. She averaged 10.8 points and three assists, and was the primary three-point shooter hitting 18 of 60 attempts including four of five against lowa (.800).

Rucinski hit over 50 percent in 11 of 27 games finishing year with a .457 field goal percentage. She was second on the team in total assists (85), and was the assists leader in nine games. Progressing from walk-on to scholarship athlete in 1986, she has played in all 82 games the past three

years, and has single game career highs of 19 points and eight assists.

Murphy's program was dealt a blow in the fall when it was learned that 6–3 center Janetta Johnson will not return for her senior season due to academic difficulties. Johnson was Wisconsin's leading scorer and rebounder and most valuable player last season averaging 12.6 points 8.5 rebounds. Known as the "Blockmaster," she led the team, the conference, and was second in the nation in blocks with a 4.8 average (130 in 27 games). Johnson received All–Big Ten Honorable Mention Honors, and was selected the Big Ten Player of the Week for Dec. 19.

Despite Johnson's absence, the center spot will be capably filled by one of four

incoming freshmen, three of which are 6–0 and over. **Amber Landrigan**, a 6–5 center from **Bridgeport**, **Neb.**, is the tallest player ever to play at Wisconsin. She is the holder of nine Bridgeport High School records including all-time leading scorer with 1067 points. She also holds single season records for most points (448) rebounds (284) and blocks (111).

She averaged 20.4 points, 12.4 rebounds and five blocks per game her senior year while hitting 57 percent from the floor. Her team attended the state semi-finals twice and accumulated a 40–2 two-year record.

The Badgers will have additional height in the front line with **Michele Bourne**, a 6–1 forward from **Hillside**, **N.J.** A creative

and explosive player, Bourne will lend quickness to the Badger line-up. As a four-year prep starter, she is the all-time Hill-side High School scorer for both girls and boys accumulating 1566 career points. She averaged 22 points, 16 rebounds and three blocks per game as a senior, and was the team MVP three years.

Another player will be the sixth player reaching six feet this season. Jen Waterman, a 6–0 forward from Wisconsin Dells, became the school's all-time leading scorer while averaging 23 points and 10 rebounds her senior year.

Joining the Badger back court is 5–8 guard **Peggy Shreve** of nearby **Monroe**, **Wis**. Well known to area fans for her state tournament play, Shreve led her Monroe High School team to the 1989 Class A state championship, and was a member of the 1988 runner-up championship team. She averaged 12 points, four rebounds, five assists and three steals per game her senior year.

Murphy's evaluation of the Badger newcomers is one of excitment and anticipation. "Amber has a great deal to learn about being a center in the Big Ten, but she understands her importance to our program, and has the ability and strong desire to learn and improve."


Murphy continued, "Jen and Michele have the tools to be fine Big Ten players, but how soon they will step in and contribute is hard to say. Peggy turned down scholarships to be at Wisconsin. Her presence gives us much-need depth at guard, and her work ethic will push our other guards to improve."

The projections for success this season depend on a number of factors Murphy added. "The return of starters Bauer, Rucinski, Lawrence and Kozelka gives us experience in the line-up. Our versatility will come from a mix of the old with the new players.

"We can go with a big line-up with Amber at center, or we can run a three guard offense with Gina, Mynette and Robin returning. I would like to evolve into more of a running team, and a team which can play some pressure defenses.

This year the competition for positions is there, and hopefully it will push each of our players to the next level of performance."

Youth, enthusiasm, talent . . . it looks like more of the same formula for 1989–90. The chemistry of the team members and the attitude of the coaching staff has proven a winning combination, and a recipe for success.




Michele Kozelka became Wisconsin's leading scorer and rebounder in Big Ten Conference games last season.

Player Interviews: Media representatives may interview Badger players 20 minutes after each game (coaches appear first in the media room). Arrangements should be made at game site with Tamara J. Flarup. Players are also available for interviews outside of game appearances. Requests should be made through the Sports Information Office (608–263–5502).

Coach Game Interviews: The opposing coach and Mary Murphy will meet with media representatives 10 minutes after each game. Meeting room will be the Reinke Room, located at the north end of the Fieldhouse. The opposing coach will usually appear first.

Madism: All Americans City





Nestled among a chain of five sparkling lakes, the dominant feature on the Madison skyline is the majestic capitol building, whose 200-foot illuminated white dome is visible for miles both day and night.


Madison is a clean, vibrant city whose chief businesses are education and government. Located in southern Wisconsin just three driving hours from Chicago, one-and-one-half hours from Milwaukee, and five hours from Minneapolis, Madison is consistently rated as one of the most

attractive places to live in the country. In 1978, Madison proudly accepted the designation of All-American City given by the National Municipal League.

The Wisconsin campus is located just one mile from the state capitol on a series of hills overlooking scenic Lake Mendota, the largest of the chain of lakes. The State Street Mall, a lively pedestrian thoroughfare containing unique shops and restaurants, separates the Capitol Square from stately Bascom Hill, the administrative center of the University.

The campus encompasses more than 300 buildings and covers over 900 acres—most within two blocks of Lake Mendota. Many of the residence halls have the lake in their backyard, and there are numerous beaches along the Mendota shoreline. In addition, the UW Arboretum, a nature study and hiking area, offers another 1,224 acres to the campus community. Also located near the campus is Picnic Point, a 129-acre peninsula that extends into Lake Mendota and is used for nature study and recreation. Jogging paths and bike trails extend along the entire campus shoreline of Lake Mendota.

The University of Wisconsin–Madison is one of the world's leading institutions of higher education. Wisconsin has ranked among the top 10 universities in every scholarly reputational study since 1910. Today, the UW–Madison includes 13



schools and colleges, 133 academic departments, over 43,000 students and 14,000 employees, and nearly four million volumes in 22 libraries.

The University's intercollegiate athletic program includes division I competition in 25 men's and women's sports including baseball, basketball, cross country, fencing, football, golf, gymnastics, ice hockey, soccer, swimming and diving, rowing, tennis, track and field, wrestling, and volleyball.
