# New Gym Floor

On Monday, October 16, construction began for the installation of a new wooden floor for the gymnasium. The \$28,500 maple floor replaced the 21-year-old tile floor, laid in 1957, more commonly known throughout the Southern Lakes Conference as the "Kitchen floor." The construction was completed on November 7 in time for the basketball season.

Electors voted in favor of the wood floor at the annual meeting of the school district last July. Sports Surface Construction, Inc., Wauwatosa was chosen as the contractor.

The maple floor provides a better surface for physical education classes and athletic contests. The floor will be easier on a person's legs and feet and will not be as slippery as a tile floor.

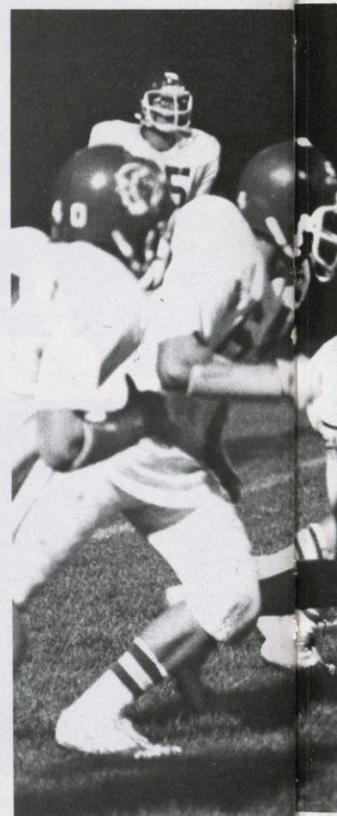

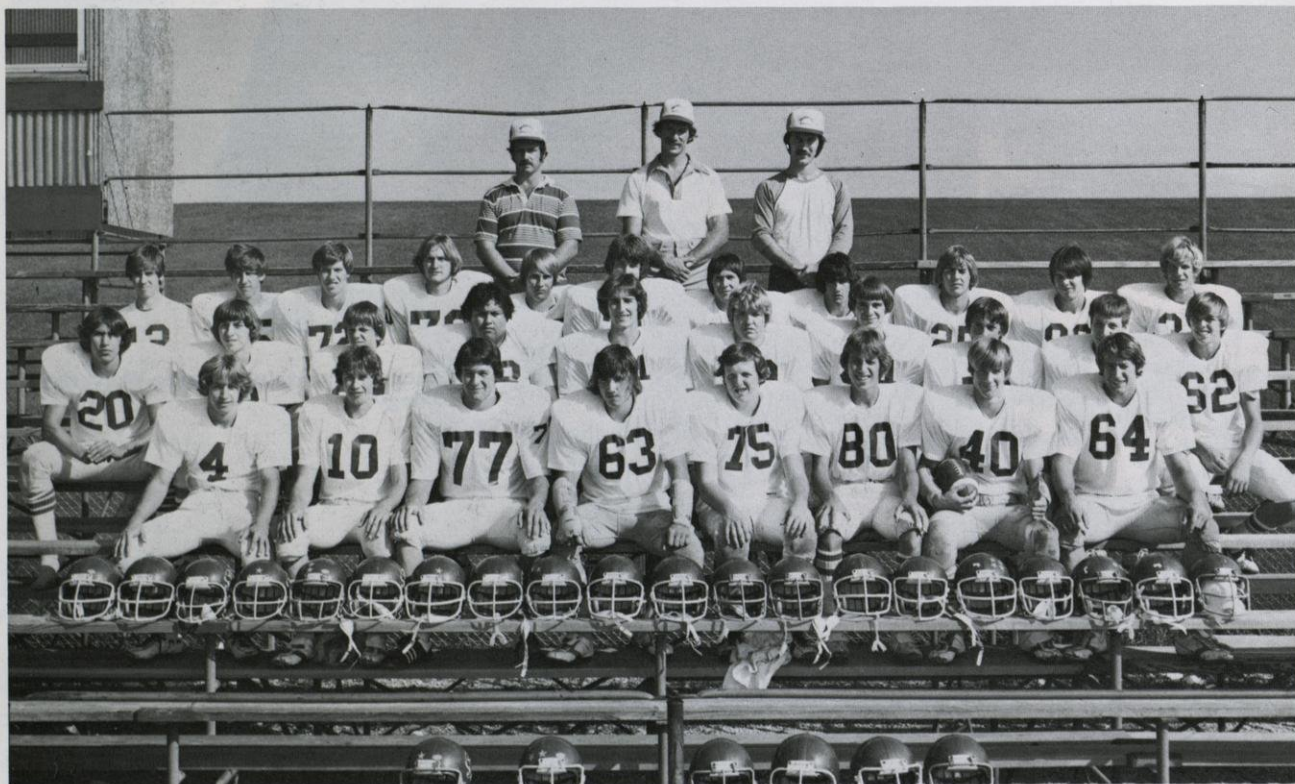
# New Coach Leads Wolverines

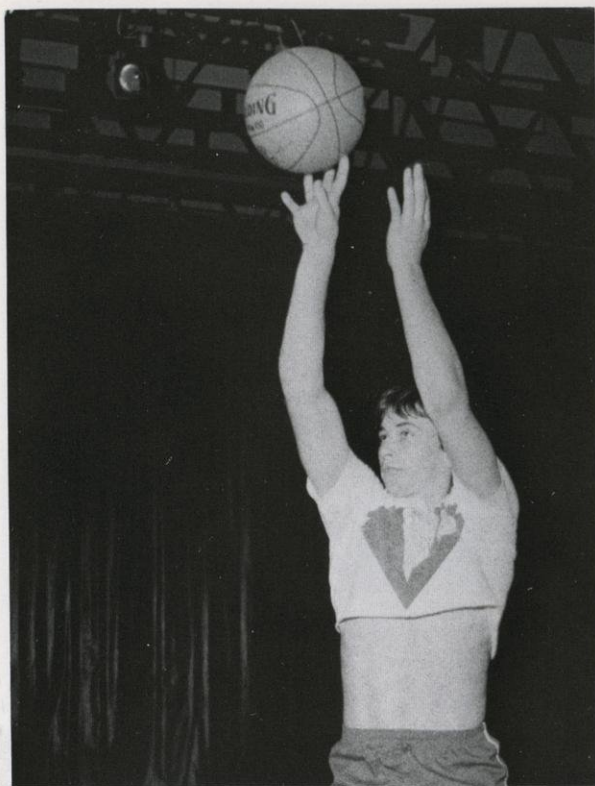

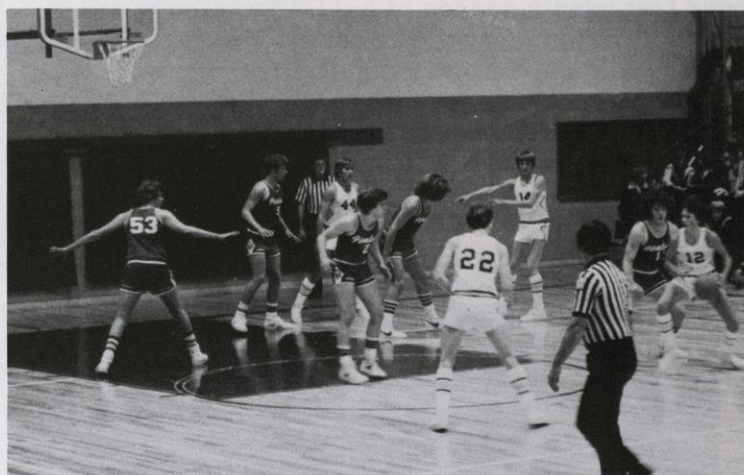

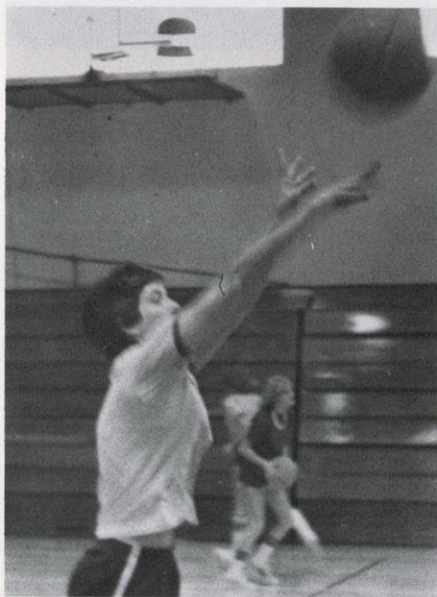

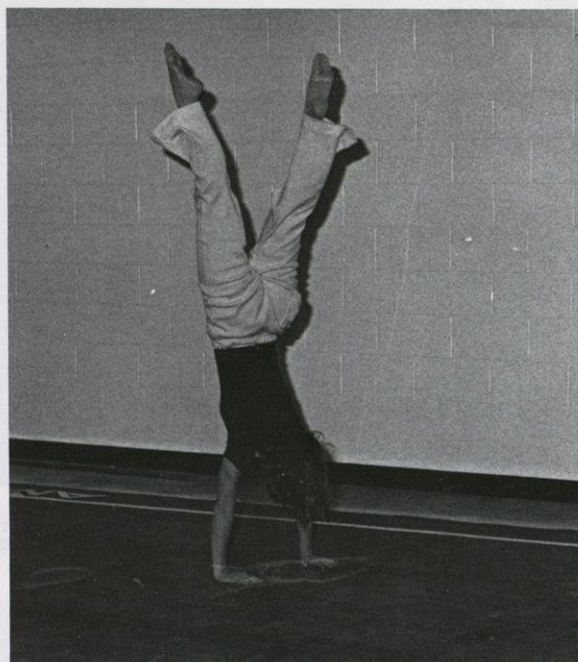
# Gymnastics

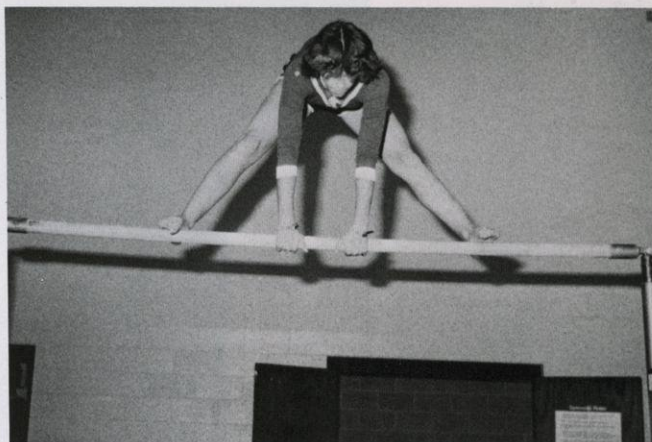

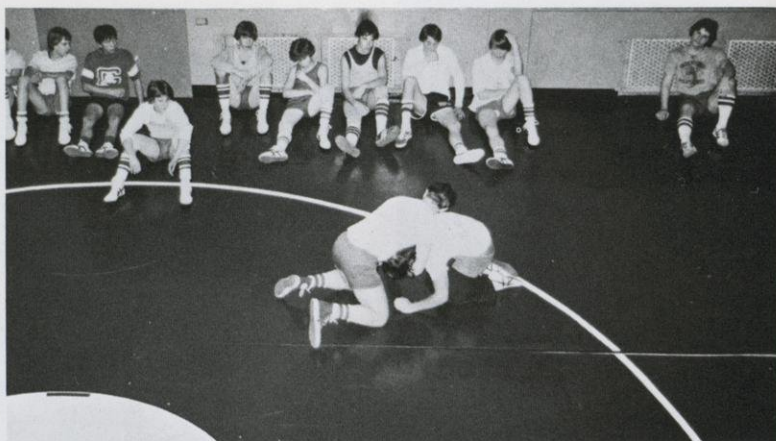

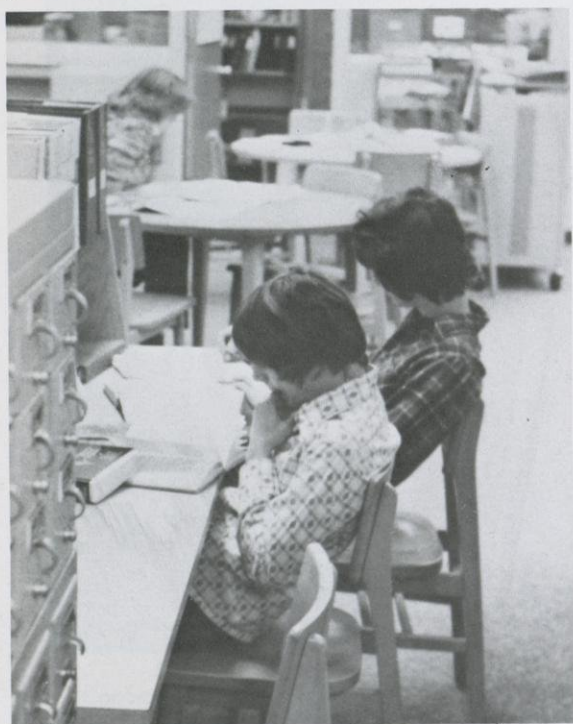

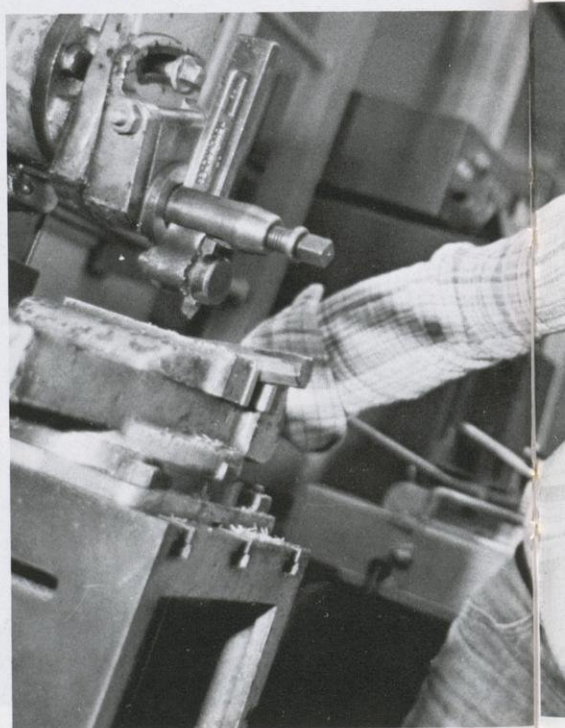

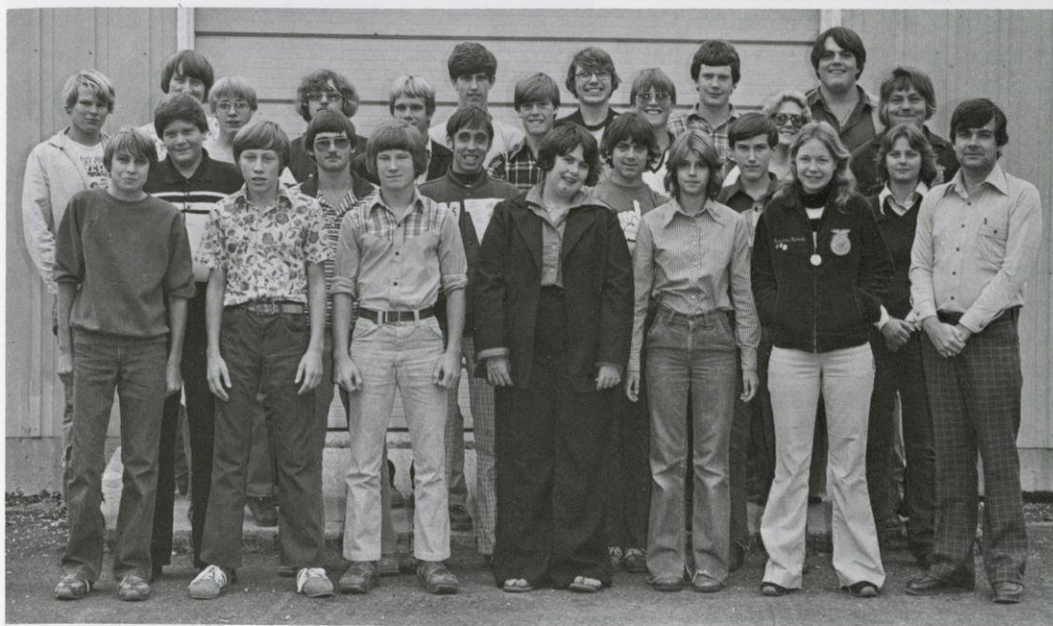

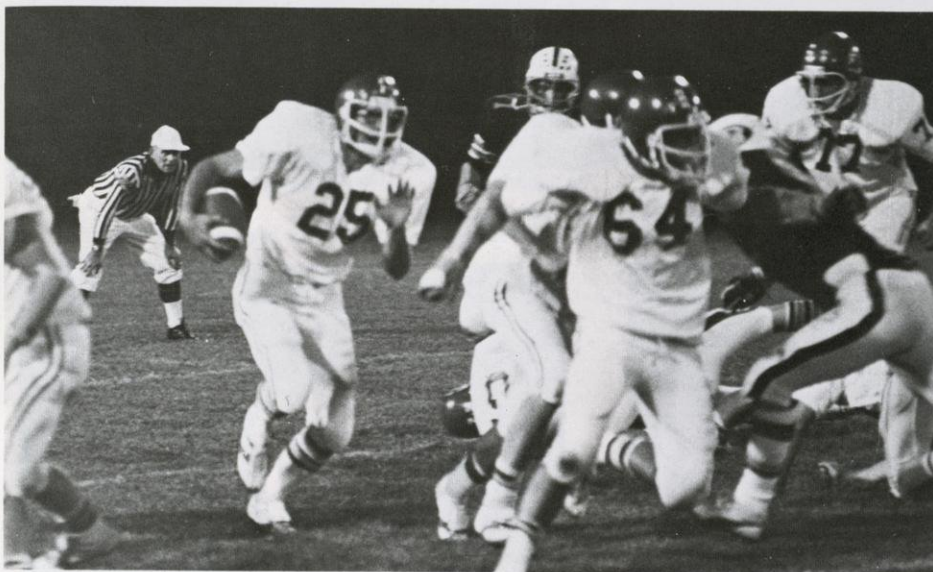

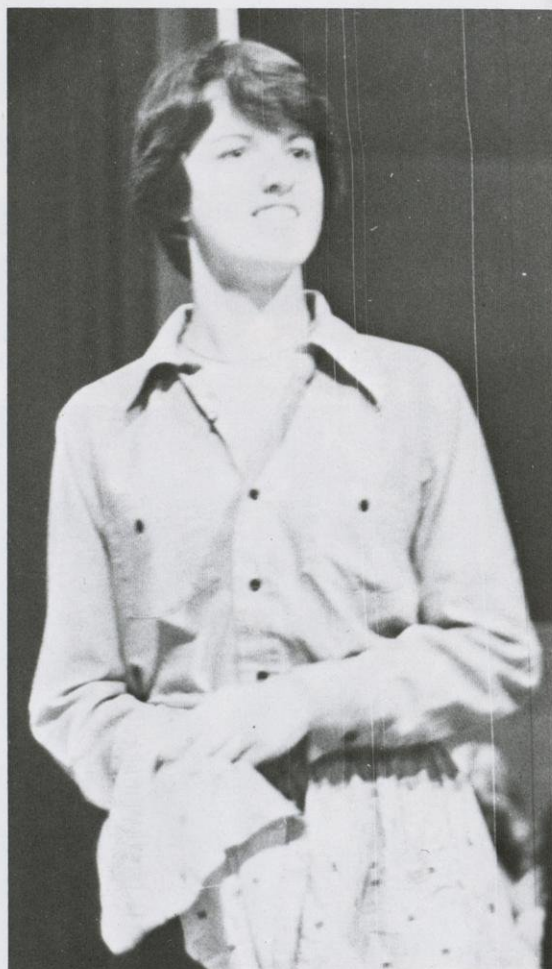

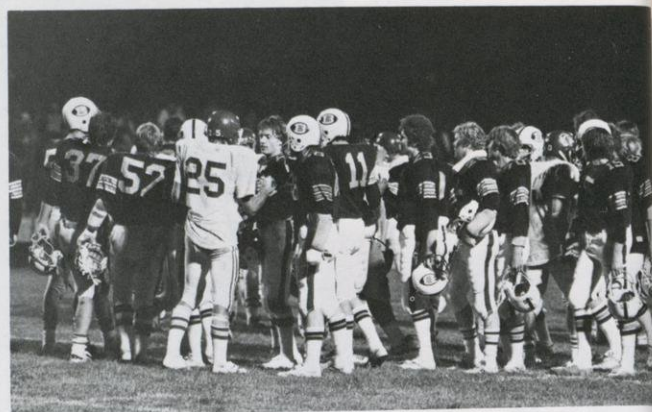
