

1983-84 Badger Preview

The University of Wisconsin women's basketball team will start the 1984-85 season with a lofty goal; trying to improve on last year's 13-5 Big Ten conference record and second place finish behind Ohio State. The Badgers handed the powerful Buckeyes their only league defeat last season with a stirring 79-70 victory at the UW Fieldhouse February 12. Ironically, it also marked Wisconsin's first win ever against Ohio State.

The 1983-84 Badger squad broke several records while compiling its finest conference mark since round-robin play began in the Big Ten two years ago. Both field goal percentage (.436) and free throw percentage (.661) records fell while the consecutive victory string was tied with seven. The Badgers couldn't maintain the torrid 7-0 pace that started their league play, but season-ending victories on the road against Illinois and Purdue assured the Badgers of a second place finish.

Wisconsin lost several key performers from last year's team including starters Janet Huff at guard, and Megan Scott at center. Huff, Co-MVP with Scott for the season, led the Badgers in scoring with 515 points for a single season record of 19.1 points per game. She established another single season high with her free throw percentage mark of .794 (81-102). The All-Big Ten performer also led the Badgers in steals and assists. Scott also an All-Big Ten performer, snared the top rebounding honors with a total of 179 for an 8.1 average. She led the Badgers in field goal per-

centage with a .547 mark (127-232) and received the Wisconsin Coaches' Award for her efforts.

Ten returning veterans will give the Badgers more depth than they have enjoyed in any past campaign. They will be joined by four freshmen and one transfer who could all see action for Wisconsin this year. Head coach Edwina Qualls starts her ninth season at Wisconsin with a career record of 116-100. She will be assisted by Terry Ellis, former coach at Grove City College (PA) and former Badger Linda Gough.

Newcomers include Delinda Hastie, a stand-out 5-11 forward from Washington D.C. who was named to *USA Today's* top 30 and garnered MVP honors from the Interscholastic Athletic Association Basketball Organization. Hastie will miss the early action because of knee problems but may still contribute this season. Marsha Millhouse, 6-3 center also from D.C., has been described by Qualls as the best offensive post player to ever attend Wisconsin. She finished third in scoring in the D.C. metro area averaging 12 rebounds and 18.2 points per game. She also earned *Street and Smith* honorable mention All-American honors.

Lisa Bonnell, 5-11 forward from Merrill, WI, is a strong inside player with a nice shooting touch who could see a lot of playing time this year. Vicki Prince is a 5-9 guard from Flint, MI, who has the quickness to play either point or off guard. Rounding out the group is senior transfer Carmella McMullen, 5-9 guard-forward from

Oklahoma State (Cleveland, OH) whose experience will add to an already strong guard corps.

Returning centers include Theresa Theder, 6-4 senior from Watertown, WI, Her competition includes 6-4 sophomore Camilla Hudson from Aurora, IL, who came on strong last year after a slow recovery from knee surgery, and 6-3 sophomore Inga Young from Alexandria, VA, a strong rebounder and defensive player.

Returning starting forwards Andrea Adams, 5-10 senior from Milwaukee, WI, and Chris Pruitt, 5-9 senior from Chicago, IL, will lead the Badgers in their quest for the Big Ten title. Pruitt averaged 15.0 points and 7.0 rebounds in '84 and won the Sparkplug award for her aggressive play. Cindy Slovak, 5-11 junior from Chicago, IL, and Michelle Fischer, 6-0 sophomore from Flint, MI, will provide frontline depth for the Badgers.

The Badgers look deep in the backcourt with former starting point guard Faith Johnson, 5-5 senior from Minneapolis, MI, returning to the squad after a year off from school. Sheila Driver, 5-8 junior from Racine, WI, is projected at off guard after a strong season in '84. Jane Skarr, 5-9 sophomore from Hales Corners, WI, and McMullen will provide able backup for the Badgers.

The season opens with a Saturday game at Illinois State on November 17. The next weekend the Badgers will compete in the Nebraska Invitational, facing Clemson, a team that was ranked in the Top 20 for much of last season. The Badgers strongest non-conference test will come December 7-8 when they travel to Ruston, LA, for the Lady Techster Dial Classic tournament. Louisiana Tech, a perennial final four contender, will be joined by Alabama-Birmingham, Memphis State and Wisconsin in the annual tournament.

In the Big Ten, Qualls is looking for a tighter race for the top spot, with no one matching Ohio State's 17-1 record of last year. "The Big Ten had a good recruiting year and there will be much more strength and balance at the top," according to Qualls. She is aiming for an upper division finish with an experienced corps of returnees providing leadership and depth that has been absent on previous squads.

Commenting on the outlook for this year's team Qualls said, "We want to spread out the point production more, get at least four people in double figures. We'll be more versatile and able use a lot of different combinations depending on the teams we face. We'll be able to match up in height and speed with any team we meet, and that is out great strength."





Big Ten Preview

The 1984-85 Big Ten women's basketball season is going to be more competitive than ever before. The teams are putting on a new look, with several new coaches and an influx of top-notch freshmen recruits with the size to match their long lists of high school basketball accomplishments.

Three new coaches join the Big Ten ranks this year; Laura Golden at Illinois, Michigan's interim coach Bud Van De Wege, Jr., and Northwestern's Don Perrelli.

In three years at Central Michigan, Golden led the Chippewas to two Mid-America championship titles, including an undefeated conference season last year. Van De Wege's background includes several years as an assistant in the Wolverine men's program. Perrelli comes to Northwestern from St. John's University where he led the Express to two straight Big East Tournament titles and two NCAA appearances. He was named the Big East Coach of the Year in 1983

To go along with the new faces in the coaching ranks, many outstanding recruits will join the conference teams. Of the 28 top recruits mentioned by the coaches this year, the average height is 5-11, and 12 of them stand 6-0 or over. At least 14 are all-state selections from their respective states, and six are All-America selections.


Of the regular 50 starters in Big Ten lineups last season, 35 (70 percent) have eligibility remaining entering the 1984-85 campaign. The breakdown of those 35 returning starters (class representing upcoming year in school) is 12 sophomores (24 percent), 15 juniors (30 percent), and eight seniors (16 percent).

Six of the returning 35 starters were All-Big Ten first or second team selections last year. Four of the six returnees are forwards; Minnesota's Carol Peterka, Ohio State's Francine Lewis, Northwestern's Anucha Browne, and Wisconsin's Chris Pruitt. Two other Buckeyes, center Carla Chapman and guard Yvette Angel were also honored with All-Big Ten status last year.

The 1984-85 season will also feature two former Conference MVP's: Minnesota's Laura Coenen and Northwestern's Anucha Browne will both be seniors this year. Coenen was voted the league's 1983 Most Valuable Player, and Browne was selected for the same honor in 1984. The frontcourt positions appear to be a Conference strength with 15 forwards and seven centers accounting for 22 of the total 35 returning starters.

Here is a look at each of the teams:

The Illini enter a new era under head coach Laura Golden this season. Two starters were lost to graduation, but the new Illinois mentor has nine experienced veterans returning, along with two players who were sidelined with injuries. The addition of three newcomers lend the Illini depth at every position. Gone from last year's starting lineup are center Diane Eickholt and guard Michele Vossen. Leading the list of returnees is Illinois' only senior cager Kendra Gantt. The 6-3 center has led the Illini in scoring, rebounding and blocked shots for the past two years. Also returning from last year's starting unit are Liz White



and Stephanie Romic, plus sophomore Jonelle Polk who saw action in all 28 Illini games last year. Freshmen newcomers include Jenny Johnson, a two-time Minnesota all-stater, Angie McClellan, a 5-10 forward from Chicago and also a two-time all-stater, and Lisa Bradley, a 5-9 guard from Lima, Oh.


Indiana lost four of its five starters including All-Big Ten selections Rachelle Bostic and Denise Jackson. Jackson was a Wade Trophy finalist for the past two years. Despite these losses, the Hoosiers do not lack experience as every member of the team last year contributed and started at least once. Leading the returnees are three experienced sophomores: Karna Abram, a 6-2 forward-center, and guards Laura Lounsbury, 5-6, and Tracy Krick, 5-9. Coach Maryalyce Jeremiah has five newcomers joining the ranks, all over six feet. The top recruits are Cindy Bumgarner, a 6-2 Converse All-American from Groveland, IL, and Noelle Young, 6-1, who was named to the Indiana all-star team last year.

Three of five starters return from last year's third place team, **lowa**, including Big Ten Freshman of the Year Lisa Becker. Newcomers include Michelle Edwards, a third team *Parade* All-American from Boston, Marva Fuller, a 6-5 *USA Today* All-American honorable mention, Jolynn Schneider, a 6-1 Converse All-American, and Pam Williams, a 5-9 guard from Chicago who was named both a *Parade* and *Street & Smith* All-American.

Michigan begins this season with a new coach Bud Van De Wege, Jr. Four starters return from last year's ninth place team including forwards Wendy Bradetich and Jerene Middleton, 6-1 center Sandy Svoboda and guard Orethia Lilly. In addition three of the top four reserves return.

Michigan State is one of two teams in the league to return all five starters. In addition to the starters, two experienced redshirts return in guard Brenda Jezowski and Sue Tucker, both sidelined with injuries last year. Balance appears to be the key for the fifth place Spartans as four of last year's starters averaged in double figures led by Mary Kay McNall (13.5 ppg). Also adding depth to the Spartan cagers this year will be newcomer Andrea Anthony, a 5-9 all-state guard from Mount Washington, KY.

Minnesota coach Ellen Mosher Hanson hopes a strong front line will improve her team's last season's seventh place finish. The Gophers return two All-Big Ten selections in forwards Carol Peterka and Laura Coenen. At center will be 6-2 Molly Tadich, who averaged 11 points and rebounds per game last year. Two newcomers will add depth to the forcourt in 6-4 Minnesota all-state center Diane Kinney, and 6-0 Minne-



sota all-state forward Susie Piram. Both guard positions are open with newcomers lowa all-stater Beth Hufford, Wisconsin honorable mention all-stater Mary Jo Nowak, and Minnesota all-stater Debbie Hilmerson expected to add expertise.

New Northwestern coach Don Perrelli has the Big Ten's Most Valuable Player, Anucha Browne, returning among four starters. The 6-1 forward paced the Conference in scoring and rebounding averaging 19.6 points and 11.2 rebounds. She is the lone woman ever to have topped both charts in a single season. Only four men have ever accomplished the feat. Also returning are juniors Laura Wiesen and Stacy Neal, and 6-0 forward Stephanie Chambers. New frontline help will include Laurie Arnold, a 6-0 forward who garnered Parade and USA Today Player-of-the-Year honors, and 6-3 Kelly Byrne of Wisconsin.

Defending champion Ohio State, returns four starters this year: forward Francine Lewis, center Carla Chapman, and two guards, Yvette Angel and Barb Smith. Lewis, Chapman and Angel were All-Big Ten picks last season. With several top reserves back, the two-time defending Conference champions appear to be in a strong position to defend their title. Two newcomers who will add height to the Buckeye lineup are Tracey Hall, a 6-0 forward-guard from Cleveland Heights and Rhonda Winter, 6-3 center from Orville, OH.

Other freshmen that will add depth are 5-11 forward Joni Mazzola, 5-8 guard Jill Williams and 5-4 guard Liana Coutts.

Purdue basketball takes on a new level of funding this year with full scholarships, full-time head coaching status, and the addition of a full-time assistant coach. Ruth Jones hopes the additional monies will turn her tenth place Boilermakers around, along with help from returnees Erin Doelling, Cathy Tyree, Sandy Alston and Janet Fruend. Newcomers include Sharon Versyp of Indiana, and Lisa Jahner of Wisconsin.

Wisconsin, the 1984 runnerup champion, would like to maintain its top division finish with the return of three starters including All-Big Ten selection Chris Pruitt. The loss of two other Big Ten honorees, Janet Huff and Megan Scott, will create some holes to be filled by newcomers Marsha Millhouse, a 6-3 center from Washington, D.C., and forwards 5-11 Lisa Bonnell of Merrill, WI, and 5-11 Delinda Hastie of D.C. Millhouse and Hastie were both selected Street and Smith honorable mention All-Americans, while Bonnell made the USA Today honorable mention list.

The Badgers maintained the strength of their backcourt with the return of 5-5 point guard Faith Johnson who sat out a year last season, and starter Sheila Driver. Adding depth will be newcomers Carmella McMullen, a 5-9 transfer from Oklahoma State, and 5-9 Vicki Prince of Flint, MI.

Administration and Supporting Services

Administration

Dr. Kit Saunders, the Director of Women's Athletics for nine years, assumed a new role in the Wisconsin Athletic Administration in 1983. As the Associate Director of Non-Revenue Sports, Kit oversees the policies and direction of the 22 men's and women's non-revenue sports at Wisconsin. Kit's long association with UW athletics also includes serving as the women's sports coordinator, lecturer in physical education, and the women's tennis coach prior to her appointment as Director of Women's Athletics in 1974.

She has held positions of leadership on the state, regional and national level. As one of the founders of the Wisconsin Women's Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, Kit served in numerous state offices including that of president. She has been a commissioner for the six-state Midwest Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (MAIAW), and was elected vice president for division I schools of the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW).

Paula Bonner became the Assistant Athletic Director in charge of the Wisconsin Women's Intercollegiate Athletics Program in 1983. Now in her seventh year of administrative association with the UW program, Paula oversees the complete operation of the 11-sport Badger women's program including budget preparation and expenditures, financial aid, specials events arrangements and recruiting.

She has served as the chairperson of the State and Midwest Regional AIAW ethics and eligibility committees, and heads the UW Athletic Board Women's Sports Committee. She is also a charter member of the Wisconsin Task Force on Women's Sports which is affiliated with the Wisconsin Women's Network, and serves on the steering committee for the Association of University Community Women.

Sports Information

The responsibility for disseminating all information and publicity materials for the 11-sport women's athletic program lies with Tamara J. Flarup, Director of Women's Sports Information.

Now in her eighth year, Tam has been able to observe Wisconsin women's sports gain stature and recognition both statewide and nationally. Under Tam's direction, the sports news staff coordinates sports results, plans brochures and other publicity materials, and writes weekly sports releases and additional features on the women athletes. Tam also assists the Women's Intercollegiate Sports Booster Club (WIS Club) in its promotions and publications.

Active in concerns of women's sports publicists nationally, Tam organized and chaired the College Sports Information Directors (CoSIDA) "Publicists for Women's Sports Committee" two years, served as a coordinator for the CoSIDA Publications Contest Committee three years, and was a member of the AIAW Publicity Committee.

In 1983, Tam was selected as one of 34 sports information directors to serve as a media liaison director for the National Sports Festival in Colorado Springs.

Sports Medicine

The care, prevention and treatment of injuries to all Wisconsin athletes is supervised by a four-person staff of NATA certified athletic trainers. Gordon Stoddard, Jan Tappon, Dennis Helwig and Jim Bosanny are supported by a staff of 25 student trainers and one certified graduate assistant as they care for the nearly 900 men and women athletes at Wisconsin.

The staff utilizes training rooms in the Stadium, Natatorium and UW Fieldhouse. All training areas are equipped with the finest therapeutic modalities and rehabilitative apparatus. An orthopedic surgeon assigned to intercollegiate athletics also assists in the diagnosis and treatment of the athletes.

Academic Counseling

Academic excellence is a phrase which is emphasized at Wisconsin. Much of the credit for the impressive academic record behind many Badger athletes is the counseling system available to the men and women student athletes.

Assistant to the Director of Athletics Diane Johnson and Counselors Alan Zussman and Mary Weaver are responsible for the Wisconsin athletics counseling program which is offered to the nearly 900 Badger athletes. As former members of the academic dean's office, Diane and Al have a comprehensive understanding of academics at Wisconsin, and a permanent line of communication with all university departments.

For those athletes that do request assistance, Diane, Mary and Alan offer counseling sessions on a one-to-one basis at a time appropriate for the athlete. Wisconsin athletes are encouraged to be degree-oriented while allowing for the flexibility to explore different areas. Johnson and Zussman take a personal approach to each athlete in determining his or her individual needs, whether the needs be personal or academic in nature.

Coaching

Head Coach Edwina Qualls

Head basketball Coach **Edwina Qualls** begins her ninth year of coaching women's basketball at Wisconsin. A native of Connecticut, Edwina coached basketball and taught physical education at R.C. Lee High School in New Haven, where she compiled an 82-15 high school coaching record over a seven-year period. Her teams consistently appeared in the Connecticut State basketball tournament claiming the Class L state title in 1975 and runners-up titles two other years.

Edwina's university coaching experience began at Southern Connecticut State College, where she received her Bachelor's and Master's degrees in physical education. She later teamed with basketball great Louise O'Neal, serving as her assistant basketball coach at Yale University prior to coming to Wisconsin.

Coach Qualls was honored by being named "Coach of the Year" in 1975 by the Connecticut High School Coaches Association. She served as the Midwest basketball coach at the National Sports Festival in Colorado Springs in 1979, and was a member of the AIAW Division I Basketball Committee 1979-80.

While at Wisconsin, Edwina's teams have an overall record of 116 wins, 100 losses and five winning seasons including a second place Big Ten Conference finish this past year. She guided the 1981-82 squad to a quarter-final finish in the AIAW National Basketball Championship.



Assistant Coaches



Terry Ellis is in her second year as assistant coach for the Badgers. She came to the UW from Grove City College (Pa) where her teams built impressive records as she doubled as head basketball coach for seven seasons and head volleyball coach for ten years. Named the conference basketball coach of the year four times, her basketball teams won five Women's Keystone Conference Championships and had an overall record of 102 wins and 25 losses. Grove City College finished among the top eight of the nation's 1983 NCAA Division III teams.

The Missouri native will coordinate about 80 percent of Wisconsin's basketball recruiting, as well as assisting with practices and games. Ellis received a B.S. in physical education from Southwest Missouri State in 1972 and her masters from Slippery Rock State College in 1974.



Linda "Bird" Gough, a former Wisconsin stand-out player, begins her fourth year assisting with the Wisconsin women's basketball program. The first 1000 point scorer for the Badgers, Linda played the forward spot for Wisconsin four years, graduating from the squad in 1981. She was a member of the Midwest Team attending the National Sports Festival in 1978.

Among her many career records is the enviable statistic of having played 103 consecutive games for Wisconsin in a 105 career total. Although she saw many of her records broken by scoring and rebounding aces Terri and Janet Huff, Linda still ranks fourth in scoring and third in rebounding and blocked shots. She also ranked among the top 10 in 11 other career categories.

Linda will assist in scouting and recruiting again this year in addition to her practice coaching duties. She received a B.S. in recreation and resource management in 1982.


Other facilities which are an integral part of the athletic program are the coeducational weight training and sports medicine rooms in Camp Randall Stadium


Madison: All American City

Nestled between a chain of four sparkling lakes, the dominant feature on the Madison skyline is the majestic capitol building, whose 200-foot illuminated white dome is visible for miles both day and night.

Madison is a clean, vibrant city whose chief businesses are education and government. Located just three driving hours from Chicago, one-and-one-half hours from Milwaukee, and five hours from Minneapolis, Madison is consistently rated as one of the most attractive places to live in the country. In 1978, Madison proudly accepted the designation of All-American City given by the national Municipal League.

The Wisconsin campus is located just one mile from the state capitol on a series of hills overlooking scenic Lake Mendota, the largest of the chain of lakes.

The campus covers over 900 acres—most within two blocks of Lake Mendota. Many of the residence halls have the lake in their backyard, and there are numerous bathing beaches along the Mendota shoreline. In addition, the UW Arboretum, a nature study and hiking area, offers another 1,224 acres to the campus community. Also located near the campus is Picnic Point, a 129-acre park-like peninsula which extends into Lake Mendota and is used for nature study and recreation. Jogging paths and bike trails extend along the entire campus shoreline of Lake Mendota.
