### DEAN GOODNIGHT APPROVES OF HELL

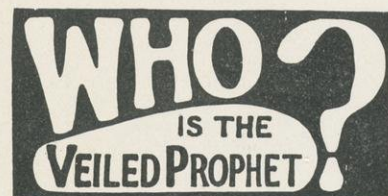
