**The Sixty Books Project** is a collaborative book arts, writing and journaling project for the people of south central Wisconsin, hosted by the South Central Library System (SCLS), and produced by the Bone Folders' Guild (BFG), a book arts group based in Madison. This project is supported by a Madison CitiARTS grant.

The BFG book artists have created sixty hand made blank books. One of these books will be catalogued into each of the sixty libraries in the South Central Library System. Unlike other library books, patrons are invited to write, draw, paint or collage in the books. Subsequent patrons will add their own stories, drawings, and so forth, creating community-wide collaborative works of art. After the launch of the project these books will be available for checkout by library patrons until August 15, 2006.

At the close of the circulation period, the 60 books will be removed from the SCLS collections and brought together for a traveling exhibit. This exhibit will have its debut in Madison as part of the Fifth Annual Wisconsin Book Festival (October 18-22, 2006).

- Please, no perishables on the pages.
- Be advised that SCLS and BFG reserve the right to remove and/or delete any questionable material. Please be nice.

⑤ Why "must" I? I believe it isn't ~~as~~ <sup>as</sup> SIMPLISTIC as that.

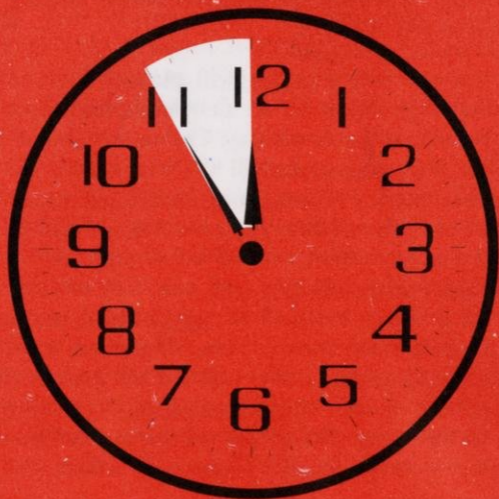
⑥ My approach is more meta <sup>physical</sup> physical not either or, not so literal.

Five Minutes

**Alive**

It has been estimated that three people around the world will die every second.\* This means that by the time you finish reading this tract, over nine hundred people will have died. For the next five minutes, I want you to imagine what it would be like if these were *your* last moments alive. After all, someone in your city will likely die in the next few minutes. It could be you. Why not?

When you die, someone will place a sheet or a blanket over your head. An ambulance may take you to the hospital for an autopsy. The undertaker will be called, and arrangements will be made to place you in a grave. People will come to the funeral and shed tears over your lifeless body. They will look at your cold, blank face and mourn, but you will be gone. They will slowly drive to a cemetery with your body in a casket. At the cemetery, they will carry your casket to a hole in the ground and lower it down. People will cry. The men will cover your casket with dirt and a tombstone. Your name, the date of your birth, and today's date will be on the stone. The people will leave, recover, and perhaps someday, forget that your body is there.

Your five minutes are almost gone, so I must get to the point. When your time is up and you have died, *where are you going?* We have already decided where your body is going, but what about your soul? Will you be in heaven or hell? Oh, yes, you will be in one place or the other. So in these remaining minutes, I will tell you what to do to get to the place of your choice.

If your choice is Hell, do nothing! You have already done enough! *"For the wages of sin is death;..."* (Romans 6:23a) *"The wicked shall be turned into hell..."* (Psalm 9:17)

Your time *is* short in this world. The decision is your own personal responsibility. *"And as it is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment:"* (Hebrews 9:27) I will tell you what you must do to go to heaven. You must acknowledge your sins, repent, and admit that you are a sinner in need of forgiveness. Confess to God that you know Jesus died for you on the cross, was buried and

resurrected, and now sits at the right hand of God the Father. Ask Him to help you turn from your unbelief and to come into your heart and save you for Jesus' sake. *"That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved."* (Romans 10:9)

Did you receive Him as your Saviour? If you did, and your life ended right now, you would be in heaven for the rest of eternity.
