

The DANE COUNTY MEMORIAL COLISEUM

Wisconsin plays its home games in the beautiful and spacious Dane County Memorial Coliseum. There are 8,000 theatre type seats and space for 662 additional seats and standing room making the capacity for hockey 8,662. It is the largest college hockey arena in the nation. The ice surface is regulation 85 x 200 feet.



RECORD ATTENDANCE

Wisconsin hockey has attracted record crowds to the Coliseum ever since the Badgers joined the Western Collegiate Hockey Ass'n in the 1969-70 season. Wisconsin fans have set college hockey attendance records for 9 consecutive seasons starting with 1970. The 1976-77 season total of 217,532 fans that saw 27 home games set an all-time collegiate record. The 1978-79 average attendance total of 8,654 is a school and collegiate record.

IMPORTANT DATES IN WISCONSIN HOCKEY

March, 1962—Wisconsin Athletic Director Ivan Williamson announced the return of hockey as an intercollegiate sport after a 28 year absence.

December 6, 1963—A rebound goal by Chan Young 5:10 into the sudden death period gives Wisconsin its first modern collegiate win, a 3-2 win over Macalester.

February 22, 1964—Wisconsin concluded its first season of hockey in the modern era with an 8-5-3 record

December 11, 1964—In an effort to upgrade their program, the Badgers scheduled eight dames against WCHA teams. In the first game, Michigan State scored a 9-2 win. The Badgers lost all eight of those games.

February 22, 1966—After 13 straight losses to WCHA teams, the Badders finally post a victory, a 5-4 overtime win over Minnesota. Jim Petruzates scored on a break just two

minutes into the overtime period.

April 1, 1966—Following the retirement of John Riley, Bob Johnson was named head coach

of the Badger hockey program.

- March, 1968-Wisconsin hockey hit the national spotlight as Bert DeHate, a sophomore center from St. Paul, MN, wins the national scoring title with 77 points on 47 goals and 30 assists. DeHate hits for seven hat-tricks, a Badger record, as the team goes 21-10.
- March 30, 1969—After another successful season, including an 11-9-2 mark against WCHA teams, the Badgers were admitted to the league.
- March, 1970—Wisconsin places fourth in the WCHA and qualifies for the national tournament, where they post a third place finish. Defenseman John Jagger of Sault Ste. Marie, Ontario becomes the first Badger player to win all-American honors.

March, 1972—The Badgers make their second NCAA appearance in three years, but again

they come away with a third place finish.

- March 16, 1973—Wisconsin stuns Cornell 6-5 in overtime to advance to the NCAA finals. A goal with five seconds left in regulation time by sophomore Dean Talafous ties the game. Talafous tallies the game-winner with 33 seconds left in overtime.
- March 17, 1973—With a 4-2 win over WCHA rival Denver, Wisconsin wins the NCAA championship for the first time in the school's history.

March 25, 1977—After missing the NCAA playoffs for three years, the Badgers make it to the final four again. Les Grauer scored the tying goal against New Hampshire and Mike

Eaves won it in overtime 4-3, as the Badgers advanced to the finals.

March 26, 1977—Senior Steve Alley culminated the Badgers' finest season with a goal 23 seconds into overtime to give Wisconsin a 6-5 win over Michigan for their second NCAA title. Wisconsin finished the season at 37-7-1 and was the first team to capture the Big Ten, WCHA and NCAA titles in the same season. Three players were named to the all-American squad, Johnson was named Coach of the Year and his son Mark was named Freshman of the Year.

March 25, 1978—Wisconsin fans took Providence by storm for the NCAA tournament and although the team finished fourth, Badger fans were proclaimed the "World's Greatest Hockey Fans". Mike Eaves finished his career as the school's all-time scoring leader,

while he and Mark Johnson were all-Americans.

March, 1979—Record crowds saw the Badgers (25-13-3) play as 21 of the 23 home games were sell-outs and the average crowd of 8,654 was just eight short of a sell-out. Mark Johnson closed out his Badger career as the top goal scorer in Wisconsin history. He was named to the all-American squad again and was the college "Player of the Year".

March 27. 1981 — Wisconsin returned to the NCAA final four after defeating the best team in the East, Clarkson, 9-8 in a total goal series at Potsdam, NY. After a 5-1 win over Northern

Michigan, the Badgers advanced to the finals again.

March 28, 1981—The Badgers regained the NCAA crown with a 6-3 win over Minnesota. The "back door" Badgers proved they were the champions after defeating the #1 teams in the ECAC (Clarkson), CCHA (Northern Michigan) and WCHA (Minnesota). The season also marked the end of the ten-team WCHA, as the four Michigan schools dropped out to join the CCHA.

Bob Johnson

BOB JOHNSON WISCONSIN HOCKEY COACH

Bob Johnson is entering his 15th season as Wisconsin's head hockey coach. His career record at Wisconsin shows 332 wins, 164 defeats and 22

ties since taking over as head coach in 1966.

During the 1970's, five Wisconsin hockey teams made it to the NCAA tournament with the 1973 and 1977 teams capturing national titles. The 1970 and 1972 Wisconsin teams placed third, and the 1978 team was fourth in national competition. His 1980-81 squad was the third to claim the NCAA Championship, beating Minnesota 6-3 in the finals.

Wisconsin won five Big Ten hockey titles in the 1970's.

Nine of Wisconsin's players under Johnson's coaching have been

honored by being named to the All-American team twelve times.

Johnson was honored by his peers in 1977 by being named WCHA "Coach-of-the-Year." He coached the 1976 US Olympic Hockey team that placed 4th at Innsbruck.

Bob came to Wisconsin in April, 1966 after a three year head coaching

stint at Colorado College.

The first three years at Wisconsin the Badgers operated as an independent before joining the tough Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) for the 1969-70 campaign.

That young band of upstarts surprised the hockey world by finishing fourth in the league—a feat never previously matched as new teams entering the WCHA had always placed last in their first year of competition.

From 1973 through 1976 Johnson coached the US National hockey teams and the 1976 US Olympic team. He received the 1976 Meritorious Service Award from the Amateur Hockey Association of the United States. He's currently serving as a consultant to the President's Commission on Olympic Sports.

The 49-year-old Johnson is a native of Minneapolis, MN.

He played hockey and baseball at North Dakota in 1950-51; then transferred back to the University of Minnesota for competition 1952-53 and 1953-54.

Bob received a Bachelor of Science degree from Minnesota and he obtained a Master's degree in Education from Minnesota as well. He's also a professor in the Wisconsin Physical Education and Dance department.

Bob started coaching in 1956 at Warroad, MN., High School. He began his collegiate career at Colorado College in 1963 and in three years compiled a 29-51-3 record. He also coached baseball and was named Rocky Mountain "Coach-of-the-Year" in 1964 and 1965 in NCAA College Division play.

He and his wife Martha are the parents of five children. Son Mark was a member of Wisconsin's varsity for three seasons during which the Badgers won the 1977 NCAA title, and he was a member of the 1980 US hockey team that took Olympic honors. He's currently a member of the Pittsburgh Penguins of the NHL. Son Peter is a senior at Wisconsin in 1981-82.



GRANT STANDBROOK Assistant Coach - 6th Season

Grant Standbrook has fast become an important part of Wisconsin's highly successful hockey program. Coach Johnson has given Grant the responsibility of the Badgers off-ice conditioning program and the seeking out of prospective hockey players who can fit the mold of past Badger stand-outs. Grant works closely with Coach Johnson in assessing Badger talent and performances. Coach Johnson has stated that he feels "there is no better assistant coach in the country than Grant Standbrook."

Prior to coming to Wisconsin Standbrook was Johnson's assistant coach for three years with the U.S. National and Olympic teams. A native of Winnipeg, Manitoba, Standbrook graduated from the University of Minnesota-Duluth in 1961. He lettered in hockey two years and was an

alternate captain in 1960-61.

Standbrook, 43, began his coaching career at Churchill High School in Winnipeg in 1961. In 1963, he took over the coaching position at Greenway High School in Coleraine, Minn., and in three years his teams posted a 56-21-2 record.

Grant entered the college coaching ranks in 1966 when he joined the Dartmouth College staff; he became that school's head coach in 1970—a position he held for five years. At Dartmouth Grant also coached soccer and lacrosse. Grant was a member of the Canadian championship soccer team in 1963.

Grant and his wife Judy have three children.



MIKE KEMP Administrative Assistant - 1st Season

Mike Kemp is a new member to the Badger coaching staff. His duties include serving as administrative assistant to head coach Bob Johnson, as well as being executive director of the Blue Line Club. He replaced Tom

Osenton, who resigned on June 1.

The 28-year-old Kemp is a native of Duluth, Minnesota and a 1975 graduate of Gustavus Adolphus, where he majored in Public Relations and Business. After a year of graduate work at Nebraska-Omaha, he returned to Gustavus Adolphus, where he was the assistant hockey coach as well as the women's golf coach.

Kemp is single.



DENNIS HELWIG

Dennis Helwig is a 30-year-old native of Columbus, Wisconsin and is in his fourth season as a member of Wisconsin's training staff. Besides being head hockey trainer, he assists in football.

He received his degree in Physical Education from Wisconsin in 1974 and worked with the Philadelphia Eagles of the National Football League before joining the Wisconsin staff.

Dennis and his wife Gail have no children.



ROB MALNORY

Rob Malnory is beginning his fifth year as a manager for the Wisconsin hockey team. The Waupun, Wisconsin native spent one year with the Varsity Reserve and this is his fourth year with the Varsity. Rob is a senior at Wisconsin majoring in Accounting. After graduating next spring, Rob hopes to get his CPA and join an accounting firm.

COACH BOB JOHNSON LOOKS AT THE BADGERS . . .

GOALTENDING: Goaltending is one of the strong spots. We have the MVP of the NCAA tournament, Marc Behrend returning, who was a key performer in the stretch drive for the Badgers. Terry Kleisinger was an outstanding performer most of the season and came back from an ankle injury. Between Behrend and Kleisinger the Badgers are well set in the net.

DEFENSE: Defense appears to be another strong suit. The Badgers lost Theran Welsh through graduation and one other starter to the pros. Steve McKenzie, Bruce Driver, Jeff Andringa and Pat Ethier give us good depth and experience. With the addition of Chris Chelios a second-round draft choice of Montreal, and Rick Heppner, a seventh-round draft pick of Calgary, we should be solid at the Blue Line.

A dozen years ago, Bob Johnson and the University of Wisconsin entered an age that changed college hockey—the Badgers became members of the Western


Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA).

In the first ten years, the Badgers won 171 WCHA games, lost 102 and tied 15 times for the best wining percentage in the league over the past decade (62%). In nine seasons, Johnson's teams had never had a losing record, finished in the top five in final league standings every year and captured two national championships.

In commemorating the Badgers' first ten years in the WCHA, fans voted for the all-time Wisconsin WCHA All-Star team. The list of 66 former Badger lettermen who participated in WCHA action included eighteen professional hockey players and five All-Americans.

Here then, is "the team"—the "class of classes" over that decade that molded Wisconsin hockey and its prominence in United States collegiate hockey.








