THE UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN SYSTEM

The University of Wisconsin System is marking its fourth anniversary in the fall of 1975. The UW System was created in October 1971 by a law placing all of the State's public university campuses under a single Board of Regents. The 13 Universities and 14 two-year UW Centers served 140,000 on-campus students in 1974-75 and UW-Extension provides outreach services from offices in every county. Although only four years old, the UW System was one of the first statewide higher educational systems in the nation and has pioneered in developing coordinated and high quality programs and services on a statewide basis. System administrative offices are in Madison.

Universities are at Eau Claire, Green Bay, La Crosse, Madison, Milwaukee, Oshkosh, Kenosha-Racine (Parkside), Platteville, River Falls, Stevens Point, Menomonie (Stout), Superior and Whitewater. Centers are at Baraboo, Fond du Lac, Janesville, Manitowoc, Marinette, Marshfield, Medford, Menasha, Rice Lake, Richland Center, Sheboygan, Waukesha, Wausau, and West Bend.

MAX R. SPARGER, COMMISSIONER OF ATHLETICS



Max R. Sparger was named athletic commissioner of the Wisconsin State University Conference in July of 1971, succeeding Fred Jacoby.

Sparger has experienced a varied and successful career in athletics as a participant, coach, administrator and official.

A native of Wichita Falls, Texas, Sparger was a member of the UW-Stout athletic staff from 1959 to 1971 and athletic director his last two years there.

The Commissioner grew up in St. Paul Park, Minnesota, graduating from high school there in 1952. He earned his bachelor's degree in 1956 from Dubuque (Iowa) University, where he played football four years and was named captain and most valuable player his senior year.

Following graduation from college, Sparger coached high school and junior college sports in Fort Dodge, Iowa, leaving to join the Stout staff as assistant football and basketball coach in 1959. He received his master's degree in education from Macalester College, St. Paul, Minnesota, in 1961 and since then has done advance work at the University of Minnesota.

He became head football coach in 1963 and was selected to receive an award for "Outstanding Teaching" during that year. He guided the Blue Devils of Stout to a Conference Championship in 1965 after which he was named "Coach of the Year" in N.A.I.A. District 14. He gave up his football coaching duties after becoming athletic director in 1969.

Although football dominated his attention as a coach and player, Sparger's administrative duties keep him in close contact with all sports and he remains an enthusiastic backer of the Conference's varied program.

He credits the success of the W.S.U.C. to the capable and dedicated personnel on the nine campuses, saying, "We have excellent leadership at our member schools. This is our greatest asset. The faculty representatives, athletic directors, and coaches are top flight people."

Max and his wife, Eloise, are the parents of five children -- Michael, Jane, Tracy, Susan, and David. The Sparger's live at 713 Thomas Drive in Sun Prairie.

TOM BUTLER, SPORTS INFORMATION DIRECTOR



Tom Butler joined the W.S.U.C. staff part-time May 1, 1967, to assist the Commissioner with the dissemination of sports information. The Madison native was born May 19, 1924, and graduated from East High School in 1942; and after a semester at the University of Wisconsin, entered the Navy on January 25, 1943, serving until February 18, 1946.

He re-enrolled at the University of Wisconsin and received a B.A. degree in journalism in January of 1950. After working as sports editor of the Stevens Point Daily Journal and the Daily Jefferson County Union (Fort Atkinson), Butler joined the Wisconsin State Journal as a sports writer on February 1, 1953. His duties there include covering University of Wisconsin football and basketball. Butler was named Sportswriter of the Year in Wisconsin in 1964 and 1965 and was nominated for the honor five straight years. He and his wife, Bonnie, have five children -- Terence, Kathleen, Jeffrey, Jayme, and Peggy. They live at 636 Sheldon Street in Madison.

GENE CALHOUN, SUPERVISOR OF OFFICIALS



Gene Calhoun, a veteran Wisconsin athletic official, became supervisor of Wisconsin State University Conference officials in 1966. He has more than 25 years experience in officiating.

Calhoun, a Madison native was born October 15, 1924, graduated from Madison East High School in 1941, served in the Army Air Corps during World War II, and is a retired Lieutenant Colonel in the Air Force Reserves. He earned his bachelor's degree from the University of Wisconsin in 1947 and his law degree in 1950. He is a practicing attorney in Madison.

Formerly freshman baseball coach at the University of Wisconsin, Calhoun also has represented many Badger athletes pursuing professional careers. He began officiating in 1947 and has worked in the Big 10 since 1963. He was the referee in the 1968 Rose Bowl game between Indiana and Southern California, the 1971 Cotton Bowl game between Notre Dame and Texas, and the 1974 (December 31, 1973) Sugar Bowl game between Alabama and Notre Dame. Gene and his wife, Louise, live at 4014 Zeno Street in Madison with their two children -- Gary and Kim.

CONFERENCE SCHOLAR-ATHLETE AWARD

In 1967, the Conference established the Scholar-Athlete Award, the highest honor achieved by a Conference athlete, to be given each year to the most outstanding junior or senior scholar-athlete from each member institution. PREVIEW 1975 FOOTBALL SEASON
WISCONSIN STATE UNIVERSITY CONFERENCE

Wisconsin State University Conference coaches traditionally stick with defending champions when assessing prospects for the next season.

Such is the case in 1975 with last Fall's tri-champions---Platteville, La Crosse, and Whitewater---receiving a major share of attention. Most coaches expect to see these three challenging again, although not necessarily in the above order.

For instance, Coach Russ Young at Oshkosh concedes the Conference power centers around the Pioneers, Indians, and Warhawks but sees more than a ray of hope for the Titans if the right combination of newcomers and veterans clicks.

A newcomer to the list of challengers, River Falls, appears more and more in pre-season prognostications as coaches reflect on the continuing improvement of the Falcons under Mike Farley in recent years.

Link Walker at Eau Claire calls Platteville "a solid favorite with La Crosse, Whitewater, and River Falls in the running". Herb Willis, administrative assistant and publicist at Oshkosh, lists "River Falls as a darkhorse, Eau Claire as a spoiler and Stevens Point to be much improved".

Coach Bob Seamans tabs Whitewater because of its many returnees at skilled positions, River Falls because of a strong running attack, and La Crosse with solid lettermen back.

Whitewater Coach Forrest Perkins apparently enjoyed an exceptional recruiting year, adding some outstanding prospects to such talented veterans as quarterback Rich Murphy, split end Roger Gename, and tight end Dan Brunner.

All-Conference end Steve Gerber heads the Warhawk defense, which finished second among the nine teams last season.

Running back Tom Jakubowski, the Conference's first 1,000-yard rusher in eight years, leads Platteville into its title defense. Jakubowski, a 5-11 205-pounder also had nine touchdowns to share the scoring championship.

Farley's offense at River Falls includes the entire starting backfield from last Fall, including fullback Dave Barlow, who gained 491 yards rushing in 1974, and fullback Bob Rogers, who added 485 yards.

Coach Roger Harring at La Crosse must rebuild the offense that broke 15 school records last Fall, but the defense is solid with eight lettermen starters returning from the 1974 unit that yielded only 42 points in eight Conference games, a modern WSUC record.

Most coaches cite overall strength of the Conference, which has been improving each year, as a reason for failing to pick an overwhelming favorite.

Farley figures Oshkosh might surprise the field, while Stevens Point Coach Monte Charles expects "greater balance than ever before".

Charles' own Pointers could spring some of the biggest surprises with his NAIA total offense leader and passing whiz quarterback Reed Giordana throwing to outstanding receivers Jeff Gosa and Doug Krueger.

The Conference's only coaching change this year involves hardly a newcomer. Veteran Mertz Mortorelli takes the Superior reins again after an absence of five years from the football field. He succeeds Ed Bender. The popular Mortorelli has coached 30 years, 20 at Superior.





PROSPECTS FOR 1975

The Blugolds would like to escape the middle of the pack and start challenging for the WSUC championship. Coach Link Walker has fielded some good teams in recent years but no football crown has graced the banks of the Chippewa River since 1964.

Walker has problems, but none seem insurmountable. The Blugolds possess an experienced defensive secondary headed by All-Conference Craig Hinke and Mark Hauser. Hinke, a speedster, provides Walker with a dangerous threat on kickoff and punt returns. Also available in the defense are linebacker Steve Martin and middle guard Phil Martinelli.

Among problems to be solved are filling the defensive line and improving the passing game. Replacing defensive tackles Paul Mundschau and All-Conference Len Luedtke presents a formidable task. Mark Sabin, who played five games last Fall as a freshman quarterback, could shore up the aerial attack with more experience.

Walker expects newcomers to bolster his lineup, including All-State tight end Rick Olson from New Auburn, Wisconsin. Other freshmen who could help are Curt Herrington of New London and Tom Burrows of Eau Claire, as well as transfers Noel Carlson from Dartmouth and Leon Peterson from Western Michigan.

A punter also must be found to replace Conference leader Greg Hoffman and there's a need for backup people at most positions. Still, the offensive line has considerable experience and Walker expects to mold a representative outfit by the first Conference game.

PROSPECTS FOR 1975

Coach Roger Harring loses 18 seniors through graduation and must rebuild an offense that broke 15 school records in 1974. Probably most difficult to replace will be quarterback Guy Arkin, wide receiver Dave Saeger, and defensive tackle Larry Wisniewski, each an All-Conference performer.

After winning the championship outright two years ago, the Indians shared the title last Fall with Platteville and Whitewater, all with 7-1 records. Although Harring has only four offensive starters returning among 37 lettermen, the defensive unit figures to be strong again.

Eight defensive regulars return, including All-Conference selections Dave Becherer at end, John Stanek at linebacker, and Shely Fifarek in the secondary. They formed the nucleus of last year's solid defense that yielded only 42 points in eight conference games, a modern record for the WSUC.

The Indians still appear capable of challenging for another championship and Harring states, "If our young offensive players progress as fast as they are capable, we could have a successful season.

"We feel the Conference is the strongest non-scholarship league in the country," he adds. "Competition for the top spot will be a dog fight between four or five schools. We hope our pride will get us up with these contenders."

PROSPECTS FOR 1975

There are high hopes on the banks of Lake Winnebago that the Titans will regain the magic that vaulted them into the WSUC throne room three years ago. They slumped to fourth place the following season and finished sixth last Fall. Coach Russ Young is confident, though, he can brake the skid and turn things around in '75.

Among reasons for this confidence are 35 returning lettermen, seven from the offense and nine off the defense, along with five transfer students with potential. Among the latter group are linebacker Len Kurzynski from Platteville, running back Steve Schmid of Eau Claire, middle guard George Bertone from Northern Michigan, and offensive tackles Ken Rodenkirk from UW-Madison and Bill Grundy of UW-Milwaukee.

Replacing quarterback John Koronkiewicz, linebacker Scott Kronenwetter, and All-Conference running back Dan Feldt presents the greatest challenge for Young. Feldt finished fourth among Conference rushers last Fall and averaged 4.8 yards a carry.

Despite Kronenwetter's departure, linebacking appears strong again and Young figures his defense will improve particularly because of the presence of a veteran secondary.

Some problems need solving in the offensive line but All-Conference center Lee Wyngaard represents a strong nucleus around whom to build. The coaching staff looks for the two transfer tackles to make a difference in the offense. These spots were considered the focal point of the team's troubles a year ago.

PROSPECTS FOR 1975

The Pioneers have figured in WSUC championships four of the last six years and got a piece of the crown last Fall in their first year under Coach Bob Seamans. They figure to challenge again in 1975 with a stable of gifted performers, particularly on offense.

Seamans has eight regulars returning to each of his offensive and defensive units among 32 lettermen. Heading the attacking unit is running back Tom Jakubowski, who last Fall became the Conference's first 1,000-yard rusher in eight years. He ran for 1,029 yards in eight games, including two 80-yard touchdown excursions. He averaged five yards a carry and shared the Conference scoring championship with nine touchdowns.

Seamans must replace All-Conference linebacker Jerry Ring and middle guard Ray Jackson as well as quarterback Gary Pedley, center Jon Cronin, and guard Dan Burchik in the offensive line, and Terry Loker in the defensive secondary.

The Pioneers are deep in running backs, particularly with All-Conference Jakobowski back for his senior season, but Seamans faces a major problem finding linebackers.

Other talented returnees are All-Conference defensive tackle Jim McCarthy and Mike Verbeten, who made the all-star squad as a freshman kicking specialist last Fall. His 20 extra points and eight field goals vaulted him to third place in Conference scoring and he could make his presence felt again this year.

PROSPECTS FOR 1975

The Falcons are aiming for the top with more confidence than at any time since Coach Mike Farley's first season in 1970. Last Fall they compiled a 7-3 record, 5-3 in the fourth place Conference finish, the school's best mark since 1958.

Farley's rebuilding program has produced improved records in each of the last five seasons and the Falcons finished just two games behind the 1974 tri-champions. This could be the culmination of that resurgence with 32 lettermen returning, including eight starters from each of the offensive and defensive units.

Although All-Conference offensive tackle Paul Cudd is gone, the entire backfield returns from Farley's Wishbone attack, which produced the best rushing statistics in the Conference last Fall. Those Falcons accounted for an average of 257 yards a game on the ground. They showed complete disdain for the forward pass, however, throwing only 55 times in eight games for just 305 yards.

Heading returnees on offense are running backs Dave Barlow and Bob Rogers, both of whom averaged 61 yards a game rushing last Fall. Farley's most pressing assignment from the outset of practice will be finding replacements for graduating seniors in the offensive and defensive lines as well as competent backup people for most positions.

PROSPECTS FOR 1975

Look for Coach Monte Charles' youthful Pointers of 1974 to develop into a formidable outfit this Fall behind the passing of quarterback Reed Giordana, who led the Conference last season, throwing for an average of 222 yards a game.

Among 30 lettermen returning only six are seniors. Nine are juniors and 15 are sophomores who performed so valiantly last Fall in their collegiate football baptism. One of the latter, of course, is the 6-1 190 Giordana, who compiled 1,955 yards in total offense during the 10 games.

Charles expects the Pointers to possess balance both on offense and defense, with particular strength at the "skilled" positions. Giordana led the NAIA in total offense last Fall, while Jeff Gosa and Doug Krueger finished first and fourth, respectively in Conference pass receiving. Gosa grabbed 54 aerials and Krueger 39.

Another sophomore, Rick Peot, averaged 38.1 yards on 37 punts a year ago and finished second in the Conference.

"Defensive tackle still seems to be our major problem," Charles admitted. "We had a great year for recruitment both in transfers and incoming freshmen," he added. The Pointers expect to improve their sixth-place finish (2-6) of a year ago.

PROSPECTS FOR 1975

The Blue Devils took their lumps last year with a young team, finishing with a 1-7 Conference record and a share of the cellar. They were 2-8 overall. Coach Sten Pierce figures they learned their lessons last Fall and now are ready to climb.

Pierce has 10 offensive regulars returning along with nine from the defense among 38 lettermen. Included in this group is quarterback John Elkin, who ranked third among Conference passers last season, throwing for an average of 119 yards a game.

Also returning is Elkin's favorite receiver, split end Bill Kyle, who caught 26 passes in 1974, averaging a 17-yard gain with each grab. Other key returnees are 285-pound offensive tackle Lang Ware and Jack Voigt, a fine defensive safety.

The Blue Devils must develop an adequate running attack to go with their passing if they expect to become a factor in the 1975 race. No Stout runner finished among the Conference's top 10 rushers and the Blue Devils wound up averaging only 103 yards a game on the ground, eighth in the nine-team league.

Stout's major strength lies in the defensive secondary and depth is good. Pierce expects improvement in all phases of play this Fall because of maturity. "We will be an upper division ball club," he promises.

PROSPECTS FOR 1975

A way out of Superior's football dilemma was complicated further this Spring by the announcement that Coach Ed Bender would not return in the Fall. The Yellowjackets managed to win only one of 10 games in 1974. Athletic Director Mertz Mortorelli will return to coaching after an absence of six years.

The past three years have not been easy for Bender, who came north with high expectations for better things. The Yellowjackets won only four of 24 Conference games during his tenure and were 4-26 overall. His replacement will find 18 lettermen returning, including 10 starters from the offensive unit but only three off the defense.

Gone are a couple of capable pass receivers, split end Gerry Uchytil and tight end Jim Peck. Uchytil topped the Conference with 43 receptions as a freshman and finished among the leaders two more years until injuries took their toll last Fall.

The Yellowjackets figure to be struggling again in the race for a WSUC championship, a goal Superior hasn't achieved in 29 years. Mertz must find a replacement for quarterback Frank Lee, who showed flashes of solid passing last Fall. Returning, though, are a couple of imposing offensive tackles, 6-4 260 Tim Walsh and 6-4 235 Steve Nass.

Finding defensive players and overall depth poses enormous problems, too.

PREVIEW OF 1975-76 BASKETBALL SEASON
WISCONSIN STATE UNIVERSITY CONFERENCE

Just because Eau Claire failed to figure in the Conference championship for the first time in six years does not mean the bottom has fallen out for Coach Ken Anderson. His Blugolds garnered just as much support in pre-season rankings as ever before.

Although Eau Claire lost some talented performers, a stable of equally proficient players remains and all indications point to another successful recruiting year for Anderson with Bill Nehls of Fond du Lac and Bob Wittke of Racine Horlick expected to make strong contributions.

Leading Blugold returnees are 7-foot Dennis Blunk and 6-7 Ken Kaiser, whose experience should pull Eau Claire back into contention after missing a sixth straight championship by only two games last season.

These are reasons why the Blugolds have lost no respect among opposing WSUC coaches. As Stout Coach Dwain Mintz points out in his early evaluation, "Oshkosh and La Crosse should be extremely strong, but will have to upset a super Eau Claire club.

Stout shared the championship with Platteville last season but graduation and apparent ineligibilities have stripped Mintz of some quality performers and he is searching for replacements. Center Steve Zmyewski leads returning lettermen.

Dick Wadewitz earned "Coach of the Year" citation for leading Platteville to last season's co-championship. The Pioneers still have such strong players as Steve Krebsbach, Jim Gardner and Elvin Jacobson to make a title defense.

Although Oshkosh lost Conference rebounding leader Greg Holmon, Coach Bob White's Titans get strong backing among rival coaches looking ahead to the coming season.

"Eau Claire will be strong," according to Wadewitz. "Oshkosh, La Crosse and Stout will all be in contention for the championship."

Benson notes, "If Platteville's winning tradition continues, they will be among the leaders. Eau Claire and Oshkosh look like contenders on paper," he adds.

Balance is the key word among coaches. Eau Claire "anticipates as good balance as there has been in the past three years". And, Superior's Coach Terry Krause sees the Conference as "very strong with Eau Claire the pre-season pick. Stout, La Crosse and Platteville, all could give a run for the top spot".

Oshkosh's White, who figures Stout, Whitewater, Eau Claire and Platteville are all tough again, stresses, "Overall the Conference is tougher and balanced better each year".

Stevens Point Coach Bob Krueger sees Eau Claire, Stout, La Crosse, Oshkosh and Platteville all challenging for the championship, while Mintz puts the Pointers among top contenders, too.

Despite losing Conference scoring champion Eric Haug, La Crosse Coach Burt McDonald still has the nucleus of a strong club with 6-7 Larry Halverson and 6-6 Ed Uhlenhake, the league's top marksman last season, returning.

Ralph Sims, the Conference's No. 2 scorer last season, along with Charlie White, Buzz Soderman, and Mike DeBakker lead Oshkosh's charge.

River Falls hopes are raised by the return of nine lettermen, including 6-7 Emile Etheridge and 6-5 Tom Hansen, while Krueger expects to be rebuilding around 6-6 center Chuck Ruyts at Stevens Point.

Superior has talented Ray Papach, a 6-7 center, back but Krause is searching for depth. Whitewater Coach Jim Miller has fine returnees but must replace All-Conference forwards Larry and Garry Grimes.

PROSPECTS FOR 1975-76

The Blugolds experienced an "off-year" last season, finishing third, two games behind co-champions Platteville and Stout. Those who might entertain ideas that Ken Anderson has lost his touch could be in for a surprise during the coming campaign. Look for his Blugolds to be among the top contenders again.

Despite the loss of two-year All-Conference performer Randy Wade and last year's team scoring leader Romie Thomas, and the squad's most valuable player, Rich Reitzner, the Blugolds figure to be in the thick of the 1975-76 race. Leading returnees, 7-foot Dennis Blunk and 6-7 Ken Kaiser, assure Anderson of strong play inside.

Anderson's principal projects at the outset this season will be to find more rebounding strength and team consistency. Two 6-6 freshmen forwards could make the job easier. They are Bill Nehls of Fond du Lac Goodrich High School and Bob Wittke from Racine Horlick. Nehls averaged 19 points a game and 14.5 rebounds in the Fox River Valley Conference last season, while Wittke averaged 15.1 points and the same number of rebounds for the Rebels.

The Blugolds are 97-15 in Conference play during seven years under Anderson. They failed to figure in the WSUC championship only his first year and last season. During those middle five title seasons his teams compiled a 75-5 Conference log.

PROSPECTS FOR 1975-76

The Indians head into their first season in five without Eric Haug, two-time Conference scoring champion who was named most valuable player in the WSUC for his play during 1974-75. Haug, a 6-6 guard, averaged 20.5 points a game last season and earned All-Conference recognition for the third straight year.

Coach Burt McDonald is not left high and dry, however. Among 10 returning lettermen are 6-7 Larry Halverson, who made All-Conference as a sophomore last season, and 6-6 Ed Uhlenhake, who led the league in shooting percentage with .599.

Halverson finished fourth in Conference scoring with 18.8 points a game and made better than 50 per cent of his field goal attempts which helped the Indians to a league-leading .501 shooting as a team. McDonald expects to assemble a lineup with similar talents for accuracy this season but must find someone exceptional to fill the void left by Haug.

McDonald is looking for some stability in the backcourt to offset the loss of Bob Mitchell, another .500 shooter, and John Arpin. Leading candidates are 6-2 Rob Appleby, Buck Burnstad, Dave Young, Tom Checkai, and Dave Saeger. The Indians need an average scorer but someone to run the offense. Halverson and Uhlenhake should handle a lion share of the rebounding.

PROSPECTS FOR 1975-76

The Titans haven't managed a Conference basketball championship since putting titles back to back in 1967 and '68. If Coach Bob White can find a replacement for graduated center Greg Holmon, this crew could make a strong run at the crown.

Heading the list of seven returning lettermen is 6-5 forward Ralph Sims, who finished second in Conference scoring last season, averaging 19.6 points a game and making almost 52 per cent of his field goal attempts. Other 1974-75 starters returning are guards Charlie White and Buzz Soderman and forward Mike DeBakker.

Coach White might have found a replacement for Holmon, the leading Conference rebounder last season with 13.7 caroms a game, in 6-8 Roger Jorgensen, a transfer student from Auburn. The Titans also could be bolstered by the return of 6-3 guard Larry Carpenter from Oshkosh West High School. Carpenter led the freshman team in scoring in 1973-74 then dropped out of school for a semester.

Sims led the Conference in field goals last season, making 137 of 264 shots, and overall this squad should shoot well. The presence of Carpenter along with lettermen Dorian Boyland, Ron Bridgewater, and Ted Harvey provide depth. Besides replacing Holmon, White must shore up the defense and stress the need for improved free throw shooting among his players.

PROSPECTS FOR 1975-76

The Pioneers were not supposed to win the championship last season. They figured to be dangerous, but after all, Coach Dick Wadewitz had lost Steve Kundert, the Conference's do-everything most valuable player the year before. However, Wadewitz molded a well-balanced group that shared the crown with Stout.

Six lettermen from the group that provided Platteville with its first basketball crown in 16 years return for another shot at the throne room. Heading the list are All-Conference performers Steve Krebsbach and Jim Gardner. The 6-7 Krebsbach finished seventh in WSUC scoring last season with a 15.8 average.

Also back is 6-6 Elvin Jacobson, who came on strong in the late stages of the 1974-75 campaign after overcoming the usual freshman jitters. He provides excellent rebounding, along with Gardner, who averaged almost 10 retrieves a game last season. Rebounding strength and tough defense are principal assets of this group.

The main problem facing Wadewitz, a 25-year coaching veteran starting his 13th season at Platteville, is finding competent guards to complement his promising front line. He must replace Rod Bush, who averaged 15.1 points a game last season, along with Bill Gardner and Tom Gilbank. The Pioneers expect to contend again, but much will depend on the development of the guards.

PROSPECTS FOR 1975-76

Following two straight cellar finishes, the Falcons appear ready to emerge from the doldrums and cause some trouble among WSUC contenders. Whether Coach Newman Benson's crew actually can challenge for the championship remains to be seen, but, he exudes confidence.

Principal reason for this optimistic attitude is that all five starters return from last season. They took a battering for the most part but learned through experience and now realize what it takes to be a winner in this league. Heading the list of nine returning lettermen are a pair of talented forwards, 6-7 Emile Etheridge and 6-5 Tom Hansen.

Hansen averaged 15.3 points a game last season and Etheridge 14.4. Operating in the front line with this pair was Ed Kaminske, who averaged 10.6. Experienced guards Larry Pittman and Mark Nelson provide stability to the backcourt but lack size. This adds to a deficiency that plagued the Falcons last season, when they finished dead last in team rebounding.

Help is expected to come from a couple 6-6 transfer students, sophomore Mark Christman from Wauwatosa East High School and Kiel Anderson from Rochester Junior College. Benson figures, "If recruiting can bring in one or two big men, we can be as good as any team in the Conference". Improved rebounding and more consistent defense are priority items from the outset.

PROSPECTS FOR 1975-76

Last season was not a pleasant one for the Pointers, who finished seventh in the Conference with a 3-13 record and wound up 6-20 overall. On paper they did not seem that inept, but seldom were capable of generating enough offensive punch to get them over the hump in a key game.

Nine lettermen return, including all five starters from last season. Heading the list are 6-6 center Chuck Ruy's with a 13.6 scoring average, 6-7 forward Mike McDaniel with 9.2 rebounds and 10.2 points, and 6-3 guard Paul Woita with 9.1 points. Another letterman, 6-1 guard Reed Giordana, could help, but the record-passing quarterback usually needs time to adjust after the football season.

Prior to last season Coach Bob Krueger said the Pointers needed a big strong rebounder and that deficiency continues to plague his club. Besides finishing last in team scoring with a 68-point average, the Pointers wound up eighth in rebounding, with 36.8 retrieves a game.

Krueger isn't blessed with a seven-foot center, but the front line boasts good overall size. The trick now is to use their height to advantage on the boards. Improvement in this department could change the outlook considerably because the Pointers possess experience, quickness, and reasonably good shooting.

PROSPECTS FOR 1975-76

The Blue Devil prospects are clouded by "ifs" at the outset this season, but Coach Dwain Mintz consistently turns out some of the more dangerous teams in the Conference. This year should be no exception even with the question marks confronting the veteran coach.

Gone are the team's leading scorer, Ken Obermueller, and three-year starter Bill Rozakis, who compiled 180 assists last season. There is uncertainty about the eligibility of forward Sam Sanders and guard James Rhett. All played key roles in last season's surge that earned the Blue Devils a share of the championship with Platteville.

Heading the list of six lettermen certain to return is 6-6 center Steve Zmyewski, who averaged 12.9 points and nine rebounds a game as Stout compiled a 13-3 Conference record to go with its 18-7 overall log. The Blue Devils shot a highly respectable .483 from the floor and .706 from the free throw line during their championship season.

Mintz stresses discipline on both offense and defense and these are principal attributes, along with Zmyewski's experience in the pivot. Rebounding and scoring punch could suffer without Sanders and Rhett. The eventual status of those latter two and development of younger players hold the key.

PROSPECTS FOR 1975-76

A "strong nucleus" is what Coach Terry Krause is banking on as the Yellowjackets begin preparations for the coming campaign. Four starters return among seven lettermen, including Ray Papach, 6-7 center back for his sophomore year.

Papach performed exceptionally well right from the start of his freshman season but tapered off at the end. He still wound up fifth in Conference scoring with a 17.6 average and second in rebounding with an 11.4 mark. Normal improvement from Papach could boost the Yellowjackets among first division teams.

Al Olson is the only starter from last season missing. Back with Papach are 6-5 Jim Happ, a 14.8 scorer who can play in the front line or backcourt, as well as 6-5 forward J. B. Keith. Improved rebounding from these returnees and a strong defense, something Krause stresses, should be evident from the start.

Finding competent guards and providing adequate depth are problems confronting Krause. He hopes some freshmen or transfer students might bolster the backcourt. Still, the coach insists, "We will be more competitive than in the past. A strong nucleus upon which to build is apparent for the first time in three years".

PROSPECTS FOR 1975-76

This should be a more relaxing season for Coach Jim Miller, who moved in to a hot seat following Eli Crogan's abrupt departure and guided the Warhawks to an 11-5 record and a share of third place. It wasn't an easy act to follow after Crogan had guided the Warhawks to a share of the championship in the two previous campaigns.

Miller calls this a rebuilding year with the loss of All-Conference forwards Larry and Garry Grimes, who performed so impressively for three seasons. Still, a strong returning nucleus includes 6-7 guard Gerald Coleman, 6-6 center Hank Anderson, 6-2 guard Ken Peyer, and 6-5 forward Tom Kalsow.

The Warhawks will miss the Grimes twins, who consistently averaged about 15 points and 10 rebounds a game. But, Coleman led the team in scoring last season with a 16.2 average, while Anderson, Peyer, and Kalsow can be expected to pick up some of the slack.

Miller coaches a controlled fastbreak and the guard position, headed by Coleman and Peyer, remain the strength of his attack. His major problem will be finding replacements for the Grimes twins. He might find them as some of his squad members gain additional experience, or from among in-coming freshmen and transfer students.
