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

THE WISCONSIN SALON OF ART 1964

With the hope of increasing the cultivation of art and of public appreciation for art and the artist, the traditional objective of the Salon of Art has been to exhibit a cross-section of the best work currently being done by Wisconsin artists. To implement this objective, three recognized, competent non-Wisconsin men are selected to choose the highest quality works from the hundreds submitted, and to present to the most outstanding the various available awards.

When encountering the exhibition, it is of particular value to compare one's own tastes with those of the jury, individuals who are involved in the mainstream of American art, and who, in all probability, have tastes which reflect the direction of American art today. Such an experience can only result in a larger view of the field of art as a whole, and lead to a greater appreciation of each aspect.

The method of conducting the Salon is perhaps unparalleled anywhere in the field of large competitive art exhibitions. All arrangements for the Salon are planned and executed by University students, working voluntarily, as the Wisconsin Union Gallery Committee. The constant re-evaluation of objectives and procedures under an annually changing student sponsorship gives a vital Salon—never stagnant, but in continual evolution.

STATISTICS

362 artists submitted 669 works of art in oil, watercolor, graphics, and sculpture with a limit of two entries per person. 79 works by 66 artists were selected by the jury for exhibition in the Salon. In addition, 12 artists each submitted an "invited work" which was not juried.

The contributors who were eligible have had three years' residence in Wisconsin if now living outside the state, or are faculty or students now in Wisconsin art schools.

INVITATIONAL WORK

These well-established artists were invited on the basis of current residence in the state and their contributions to the Wisconsin art scene during the past several years.

JUDGING

The works were displayed according to category and the jury examined them. Each entry was brought before the judges, who selected a potential group of work for exhibition. These works were then, again, brought before the judges, who, working independently of each other, voted on each entry as being "in" or "out" or "meritorious". Then the three judges, working together, chose the award winners from the works which had received three "in" votes or a "meritorious".

COMMENTS OF THE JURY

The entries were of good quality; the graphics were especially strong and interesting . . . would like to have seen more watercolors and drawings entered . . . large number of sculpture was entered but tended to be impersonal and followed more trends than the other media . . . would like to see more variety in sculpture materials, i.e. direct carving in wood and stone.

. . . criteria for offering an "invitation" should be examined, perhaps the invitational category should be eliminated.

. . . in an effort to recognize the true merit of the work, the size of the individual awards should be increased . . . stipulations on the awards should be removed so that the jurors may more freely recognize the best work.

We compliment the committee on the organization and efficiency of the competition . . . we were pleased to be members of this jury and to work with the Union Gallery Committee . . . and thoroughly enjoyed our stay in Madison.


