# Media Information

## Media Credentials

UW Women's Basketball credential requests should be made in writing and in advance through Tam Flarup at the Wisconsin Athletic Communications Office, (608) 263-5502. Game-day credentials for the Kohl Center will be left with the parking attendant at Lot 91 east of the Kohl Center or at the table at the media entrance off Frances Street.

## Parking

Parking for media during Wisconsin basketball games is reserved on a limited basis near the Kohl Center. Special arrangements must be made in advance. Please contact the Athletic Communications Office for parking credentials at least one week in advance of the event.

## Media Services

Working facilities for all media are located courtside at the Kohl Center. Electrical outlets are available at every seat. Telephone lines must be installed in advance of the game by calling Jamie Buchanan at the Kohl Center, (608) 265-8546. Event programs, media guides, event notes and computerized statistics will be available in the interview/work room adjacent to the main floor at the Kohl Center. The credentialed media entrance is on the Frances Street side (east) of the Kohl Center adjacent to the media parking area and near Gate A. The media entrance is open two hours before tip-off.

## Photographers

Photographers may work from either end of the Kohl Center court in the designated section. Photographers may not work from in front of team and scoring benches, or in front of media row. Contact Jason Davenport at the Kohl Center, (608) 265-4705, to arrange for the rental of strobe lights.

## Post-event Interviews

All post-event interviews will be conducted in the media interview room located adjacent to the Kohl Center main court. The large interview area contains recording couplers for hookup to the house sound system for TV and reporters. The visiting coach and players will be interviewed approximately 10 minutes follow-

All requests for interviews should be directed to Athletic Communications personnel prior to the completion of the event. 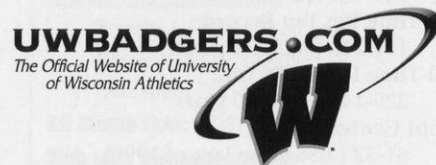
## Practice and Interviews

UPN14 have not announced their plans for local and statewide coverage.



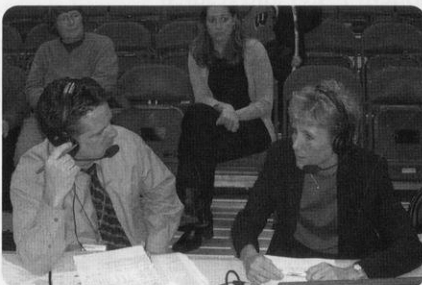
Wisconsin Public Television is entering its 13th year of broadcasting Badger Women's Basketball on its statewide network. The WPT announce team features veteran



announcer Ken Syke, and former UW assistant coach, Dawn Crim. Syke has been calling play-by-play on televi-

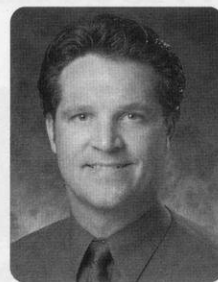
sion for more than two decades at the high school and collegiate level.

A PGA of America member, Mike has worked in the golf business since 1995, and began AGES Golf, his own company two years ago. He has worked as a golf professional in Madison and was the head golf professional at "The Springs" in Spring Green, Wisconsin.

Mike has also been a regular on Madison talk-radio since 1996. He joined ESPN Radio in June of 2003, and is the nightly host of "The Bullpen Show" on WTSO Radio 1070.

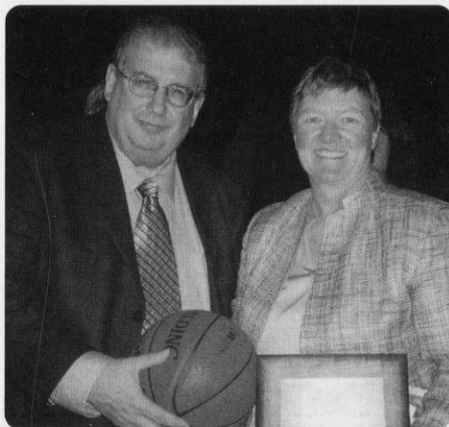
Mike and his wife Kristen have four daughters.

A member of the NCAA Communications Committee, Flarup has worked every NCAA Women's Basketball Final Four since 1995. She has served on numerous committees for CoSIDA, the national organization for sports information, including as a member of the national board from 1998-2001.

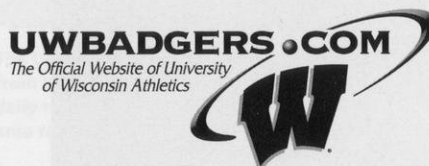

# 2003-04 Badger Season in Review

The Badgers (10-17 overall, 4-12 Big Ten) closed the first season under Coach Lisa Stone with three more wins than the previous season, and finished in a three-way tie for eighth place with a 4-12 Big Ten regular season mark. The Badgers tied for eighth in the Big Ten in 2003 with a 5-11 mark.

A depleted Wisconsin team bowed out in the first round of the Big Ten Tournament losing to Indiana, 57-39, in a battle of the 8 versus 9 seeds. UW was without two starters after point guard Stephanie Rich fractured her right hand in the previous game. Also out was forward Kjersten Bakke, who tore her ACL that same week.

Wisconsin will return six letterwinners this season including four starters. The Badgers will lose height in departing senior starting post player 6-5 Emily Ashbaugh of Woodinville, Wash., (10.2 pts, 5.8 rebs.) and 6-7 Lello Gebisa of West Lafayette, Ind. (8.9 pts., 6.0 rebs.). Reserve Abby Simmons (Verona, Wis.) also graduated. Guards Erin Olson, Kandace Evans, and Moo Gilmartin did not return.

## 2004 Team Notes

- The Badgers have had 5,000 or more fans at 108 consecutive regular season games dating back to December 12, 1995. UW ranked 13th in attendance nationally with 6,313 per game.
- UW had three people average double figures last year as compared with just two in the previous season. Five people scored in double figures in the win over Illinois on 1/13/04 and in the win over Iowa State on 12/7/03.
- The Badgers averaged 22 turnovers a game in 2003, and reduced that to 17.93 per game in 2003-04 with a season low nine vs. Northwestern on 1/25/04, which tied the school record for second fewest turnovers in a game.
- UW outrebounded 18 and tied two of the teams it played in 2003-04 and averaged 37.9 caroms to 34.3 by its opponents for a +3.6 rebound margin which ranked fourth in the conference. The Badgers twice outrebounded Illinois, the top rebounding team in the league. In Big Ten only games, UW tied for first in the conference with 37.9 rebounds per game.

- UW finished the non-conference season with a 6-4 mark. The Badgers were 2-9 in non-conference action in 2002-03. UW was 6-7 at home last year after a 3-11 mark in 2003.

- UW claimed its 10th tournament title in its 30-year school history when it won the Sonesto Coconut Grove Thanksgiving Classic title in Miami.

- Badger Coach Lisa Stone's first recruiting class signed in November, 2003, was ranked 21st nationally by *All-Star Girls Report*.

## 2004 Individual Notes

- Sophomore 6-1 forward **Jordan Wilson (Naperville, Ill.)** was named the MVP of the Miami tournament, her first all-tournament honors.

- **Stephanie Rich (Crawfordsville, Iowa)** was named All-Big Ten Honorable Mention by the media for the second-straight year. The junior converted-point-guard led the Big Ten all in assists all season with 5.81 per game.

- Sophomore **Ashley Josephson (Onalaska, Wis.)** tripled the number of three-pointers she had as a freshman. She is No. 1 in UW career three-point shooting, hitting 66-156 for 42.3 percent. She earned her first all-tourney honors at the Miami Tournament.

- Senior **Emily Ashbaugh (Woodinville, Wash.)** concluded her UW career ranked eighth in field goal percentage hitting 347-687 for 50.5 percent. Ashbaugh also ranks third in blocks with 113. She is 20th all-time in scoring with 825 points, and ranks 15th in career rebounding with 545. Her 113 career games rank 15th all-time in games played by a Badger.

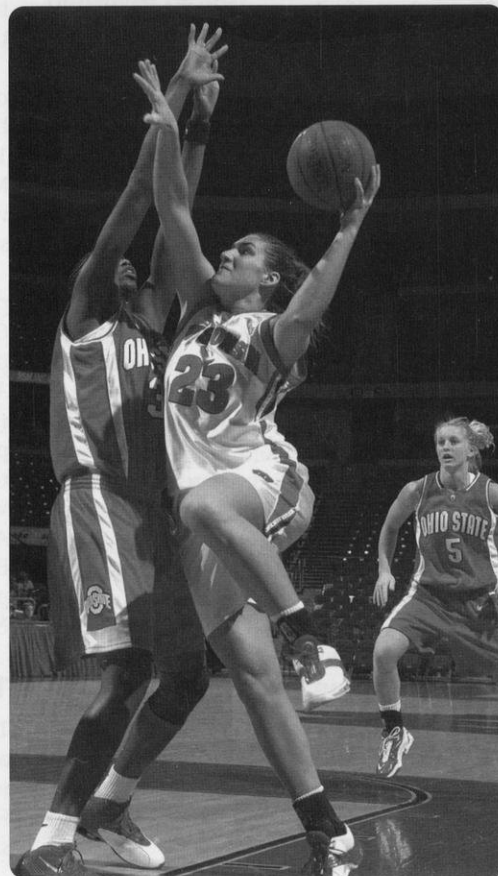
- Senior **Lello Gebisa (West Lafayette, Ind.)** finished her career ranked fourth all-time in blocks with 110, right behind Emily Ashbaugh. She is 11th in double-doubles with 10 in her career.

Sophomore Jordan Wilson had a breakout season becoming a starter in 12 games. An Academic All-Big Ten honoree, she earned MVP honors at the Sonesto Miami Thanksgiving Tournament.

Wisconsin had a team cumulative grade point average of 3.142 and had seven student-athletes named to the Academic All-Big Ten team last year. With 71 citations, Wisconsin has had more conference academic honorees than any other Big Ten school since the award was first granted in 1986.

# 2004-05 Badger Season Preview

The first season under coach Lisa Stone gave fans an idea of the enthusiasm with which she is leading the Badger resurgence. Wisconsin improved to 10-17 in 2003-04, but fans should expect continued improvement in this second year of the 'New Stone Age'.

The team won the Miami Thanksgiving Tournament, and mustered several great performances, but season-ending injuries in February to starters Stephanie Rich and Kjersten Bakke forced the Badgers to limp into the Big Ten Tournament and lose the first game.

With six excellent recruits joining a veteran group of six returnees, Wisconsin's potential for its first winning season under Coach Stone appears excellent.

## Returning Players

Four starters return led by the last year's top scorer, 5-8 junior guard **Ashley Josephson (Onalaska, Wis.)**. Josephson returned from a back injury for her sophomore season to average 12.3 points and 3.6 rebounds per game.

A 2004 Big Ten tour team member, she led the UW team in three-point and free throw shooting hitting 84.8 percent (39-46) from the line, and 41.0 percent (50-122) from beyond the arc.

Senior point guard **Stephanie Rich (Washington, Iowa)**, an All-Big Ten Honorable Mention player two years, averaged 10.3 points, 4.9 rebounds, and led the Big Ten in assists with 5.81 per game.

UW's other senior and returning starter is **Ebba Gebisa**, a 6-3 post player from West Lafayette, Ind., She averaged 5.0 points and 3.7 rebounds per game, and is a two-time Athletic Board Scholar for women's basketball with a 3.8 grade point average in business. She led seven players who were named Academic All-Big Ten in 2004.

The other returning starter is **Jordan Wilson (Naperville, Ill.)**, who started the last 12 games of the season. The 6-1 junior averaged career-bests with 6.8 points and 5.4 rebounds per game.

Also returning are juniors **Kjersten Bakke (DeForest, Wis.)** and **Annie Nelson (Hudson, Wis.)**. Bakke earned a starting role in six games before a torn ACL ended her season in late-February. The former walk-on averaged 2.3 points and 3.6 rebounds. Nelson averaged 1.0 points and 1.3 rebounds in 11 appearances last season.

## The Newcomers

Recruits are always an unknown variable, but UW's six newcomers sport impressive prep resumes. The Badgers were dealt a blow in the first week of school, however, when the medical staff determined Lesha Jones will have to sit out the season to rehabilitate her surgically repaired knee.

Wisconsin's all-time prep scorer joins the Badgers this season all the way from Port Wing in the northern most part of the state. The AP player of the Year, **Jolene Anderson** set the state scoring record with 2,881 points and averaged 37.1 points and 15.1 rebounds her senior season. She also holds the scoring records for most points in a game (58) and in a season (956).

Another state player, 6-4 **Daniel Ward of Milwaukee, Wis.**, was the State of Wisconsin Gatorade Player of the Year. She averaged 13.4 points and 9.0 rebounds in leading her team to its first state championship appearance.

Another Gatorade Player of the Year from the State of Indiana joins the Badgers in **Janese Banks (Indianapolis, Ind.)**. The athletic 5-10 guard averaged 25.3 points and 9.2 rebounds before her team made a premature departure from the state tournament.

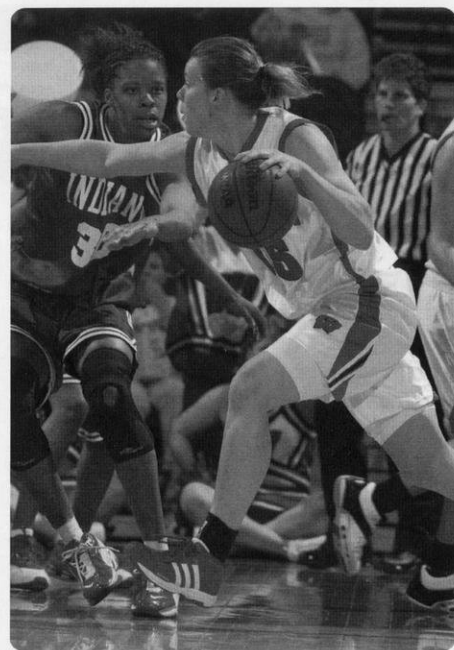
The Badgers will miss the post play of **Lesha Jones**. The 6-3 center from Detroit, Mich., averaged 23.0 points and 14.0 rebounds in leading her team to the Michigan state championship team title with a perfect 25-0 record. She had knee surgery last May.

**Akiya Alexander (Evanston, Ill.)** played for The Patterson school in North Carolina this past season averaging 15.0 points, 7.0 assists, and 5.0 rebounds.

Another Illinois recruit, **Shari' Welton (Calumet City, Ill.)**, is a strong wing player who averaged 15.0 points and nine rebounds as a senior. Alexander, Ward, Welton and Banks all played for the same AAU team this past year, Chicago Hoops Express. Teammate Jordan Wilson also played for the Express while a prepster in Naperville, Ill.

## The Schedule

The schedule features 10 teams that appeared in the NCAA tournament, six of which are Big Ten opponents. NCAA Final Four finalist Minnesota headlines a slew of nationally-ranked Big Ten teams

from a conference that ranked No. 1 in its power rankings a year ago. Minnesota (25-9) lost in the NCAA semifinals to eventual champion Connecticut.

Big Ten regular season champion Penn State (28-6) lost in the regional finals to Connecticut. Purdue (29-4), also lost in the regional semifinal to Georgia. Other Big Ten NCAA qualifiers include Iowa (1st round, 16-13); Michigan State (2nd round, 22-9); and Ohio State (2nd round, 21-10). Three Big Ten teams finished among the top 10 in the final 2004 ESPN/USA Today rankings with Minnesota fourth, Penn State sixth, and Purdue ranked ninth.

UW's non-conference schedule includes away games with NCAA qualifiers Houston (27-4), and Marquette (22-10), Middle Tennessee State (24-8) and UW-Green Bay (23-8). The Badgers will play in the Houston Classic Tournament over Thanksgiving November 26-27.

Other non-conference opponents include games with IUPUI, Southern Illinois-Carbondale, and Iowa State. UW will welcome former Wisconsin assistant coach Kate Peterson and her Cleveland State team on Thurs., Jan. 20.

The UW schedule features 16 home games including a CBS Television home game with Penn State on Sat., January 8.



# 2004-05 Badger Chat with Coach Stone

**C**oach Stone begins her second year with Wisconsin basketball. In this preseason Badger Chat, Stone reflects on last season, her current players, and her goals for 2004-05.

**How do you feel your team responded to its first season under you? What do you consider your primary accomplishment last season?**

"I was truly blessed to coach a team that bought into my philosophy from the start. Everyone was on the same page, and we worked very hard together. I am very pleased with their perseverance, and I am very pleased with their ability to follow my staff and I. They are competitors and they battled. I really, truly believe that we made great strides.

As far as our primary accomplishment, we cut down on turnovers and were in much better physical condition. Our basketball team competed on a daily

basis, and we improved. When you look at our record, it did improve. I really believe our players competed. They played hard every game. We were in every single game, at home, in particular.

The Big Ten Conference was as strong as it has ever been and we competed to the best of our abilities the entire season.

As far as our accomplishments go, I personally saw great effort, which then leads to great optimism. From the first day I walked into the locker room, they jumped in the boat and said, 'Alright, let's go. You tell us what to do. You're the captain of this ship. Let's go.' And they did that."

**What was the toughest thing you had to face last season? How did you measure up to your team goals?**

"I have never been surrounded by a group of people that wanted so badly to be successful. They did that by putting the team ahead of themselves. That makes you very, very proud as a first-year coach. We were all in this together.

One of the most difficult things to deal with last season was losing some tough games when the players' efforts were outstanding. Our team really believed in each other, and fought hard each game. So the toughest part was losing with the efforts that these players put forth for me.

I think our goals were measurable. Ideally, we have statistical goals, but in the grand scheme of things you want to win your conference and your regular season, to win a Big Ten tournament and win a national championship.

Those goals of mine have never changed. Those have been my goals since I started coaching. Are they measurable? Yes, because you can look at where we finished in the Big Ten. Can we take it to the next level? Can we keep chipping away? I think that through

our players' patience, my patience, our fans' patience, and staying focused, staying determined, a lot of good things can happen."

**What motivation have you seen the players take this spring from last year's improved record?**

"I think the players felt a sense of satisfaction through last season as well. They felt like they individually made progress. A lot of players had a pride of position, a lot of players raised their game. A good example is Jordan Wilson, who took her game from a substitution role to a mainstay. Another is Kjersten Bakke, who went from a redshirt, to a scholarship player, to Miss Intensity on our team. Stephanie Rich led the Big Ten in assists and as a shooting guard playing point guard. Ashley Josephson raised her game to a whole new level and earned a spot on the (Big Ten) foreign tour team. Ebba Gebisa has taken on some leadership.

So I think in the grand scheme of things, our players feel stronger fundamentally. They know my terminology, they know my energy level. They fed off of that the entire season. They have become great players, and with that I think we can do some wonderful things.

We have to keep striving for the top. Our support, our facilities and fans are second to none. We really look forward to making great strides again this year."

## ■ ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

Since the award was initiated in 1986, Wisconsin has garnered 71 Academic All-Big Ten honors which ranks first among Big Ten basketball teams for the most academic honorees in the history of the conference. The Badgers had seven Academic All-Big Ten honorees in 2004.

### What are the team goals this season? What are the team's strengths?

"Our team strengths will once again revolve around chemistry and team unity. Our returning players and a very talented freshmen class have worked very hard this summer to improve their individual games. We look forward to greater depth and athleticism. Youth combined with experience is exciting and something for our fans to look forward to."

### Early on, who will be the leaders on the 2004-05 team? Have you named your captains?

"Our captains are Stephanie Rich and Ebba Gebisa, both of whom I am thrilled to be able to coach for two years. I feel closer to them as a coach. I think they are wonderful, wonderful people. They are great role models and ambassadors for our program. It starts with Steph and Ebba, because those are your seniors, but they filter it right on down. They will help blend the veterans with these new kids."

### Where do you project the Big Ten's leader in assists, Stephanie Rich, will lend her talents this season?

"I really like Steph Rich as a point guard. The reason I do is because of what we have just mentioned—her leadership abilities, her court vision. Granted she can shoot the ball, and we can move her

around a little bit, but I like her running the show. If Steph was a football player, she would be the quarterback. If she was on a baseball team she would be the catcher. She is a born leader. That is where your point guard belongs. Steph will play both (guard) positions, but we'll start out the season with Stephanie Rich leading the charge up front.

She and I have grown closer as far as an understanding of what needs to happen out there. We have spent time throughout this particular year, and in the off-season, doing community service and getting to know each other better. This family network and this togetherness is going to be an integral part of our success."

### What do you think leading scorer Ashley Josephson will gain from the Big Ten tour experience?

"First let's just talk about what Ashley Josephson has gained from this past season. She is a brand new kid. She is soft-spoken, smiles big, loves the game, and loves being healthy. Right now, that's the main thing. She loves being on the court and not watching, and riding a bike because of a sore back. She is back on the court, she is mature, she wants to get better. She is learning different ways to create space for herself to shoot. She knows she has a quick release, she knows she can score. I have seen Ashley grow from a

player that got real down on herself to a player with more confidence.

The foreign tour was great for Ashley. Not only playing against foreign players, but also with, and against, some of the best in the Big Ten. Through all of that you will see much more confidence. That maturity should go to the next level. I look for Ashley to have a tremendous junior year."

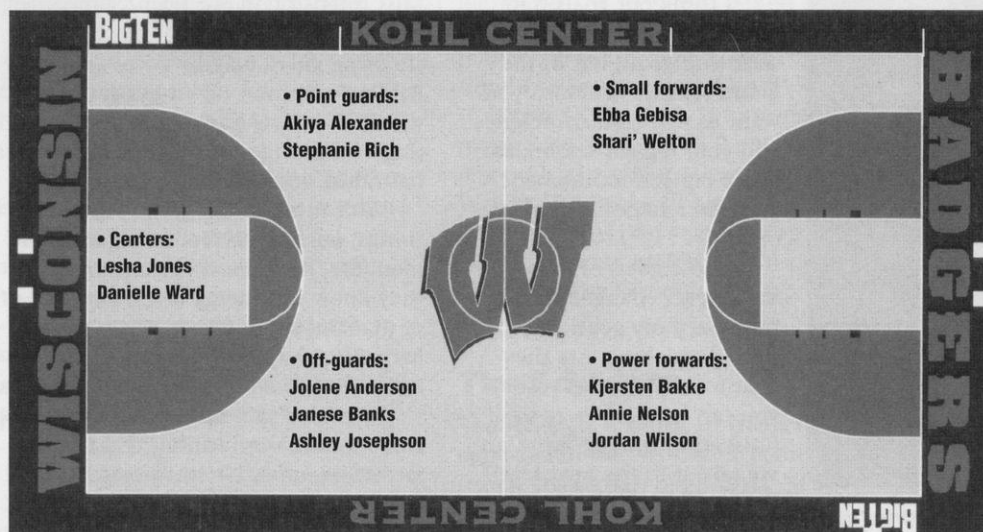
### Given Jordan Wilson's career-best season, how do you expect her to contribute this year?

"Jordan Wilson has become a very talented and powerful inside player. Jordan has a plethora of moves. She is strong. She loves contact. And, just like Ashley, has really matured with experience and her confidence is huge.

There were a lot of break-out games for her this past season, starting even in Florida. She went at it, earned a starting spot and held on to that spot. I love the way she battles. I love the way that she is not afraid of anybody. She is a small forward, but she'll play with the big ones in there. We are looking for great things out of Jordan, including leadership.

One thing that will help is she knows a lot of these new freshman coming in and so she can be a big sister to them as well. The common thread through everything is our unity.

How we blend together as a team is going to be demonstrated in how we play. We are not helter-skelter on the court, we are playing a fluid game of basketball. That is going to come from leadership. That ball goes into Jordan, we all know that thing is going up—she'll get in there and battle. When the shot goes up, you know who is going to be the first

- Centers: Lesha Jones, Danielle Ward



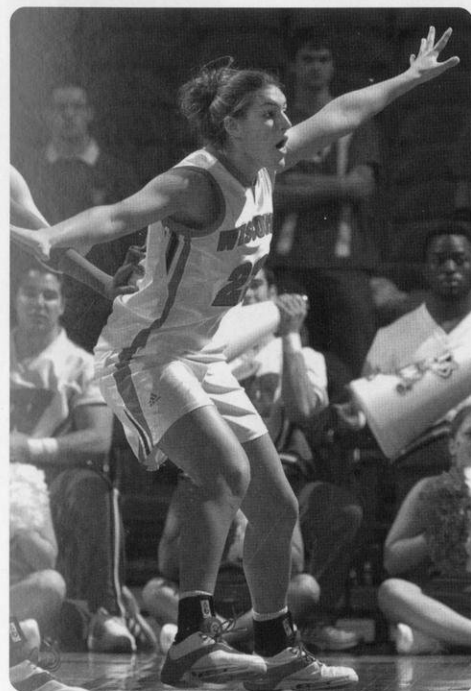
## ■ WISCONSIN'S RECORD ATTENDANCE

Wisconsin is home to all of the Big Ten Conference attendance records setting a single-game conference mark of 17,142 in 2002. The Badgers established the all-time best average with 10,455/game in 1998. UW set a league record with an average of 12,274 attending Big Ten games that same year.

person to knock somebody over to go get it. I love the fact that she has that confidence, and I love the fact that she can really help lead us next year as well."

**Half of your team is comprised of freshmen this year. What kind of different coaching demands are there with such numbers of youth and inexperience?**

"I think the whole thing is that they are going to need a shoulder to cry on and a big hug once in a while and an understanding that they don't have to take on the world by themselves. A lot of communication will be needed with their coaches, with their professors, and with their teammates. (We'll have to) work through homesickness and then work through that first basketball game when they don't score 20 points. Our freshmen will learn that they are accepted and loved for who they are, and they they are a huge part of our Badger family.

Patience is a virtue with all of them. From my standpoint as captain of the ship, I will be very disciplined from the start and have them understand that this is the way we are going to do things. There are going to be some tough times, but we will work through them together.

We certainly will miss Lesha Jones this first season and look forward to having her back at full strength next year after taking this year to rehabilitate her knee."

**Will your style of play change given the youthful makeup of your team this season?**

"Last year, with 6-7 and 6-5 inside, we really tried to isolate high-low. I would have been a fool if I didn't. We did a decent job with that. I think it would have been nice to have the same team another year. It's always sad to see kids go but as we bring new kids in, we are excited once again. I would like to go a little more up-tempo. My personality thrives up-tempo.

We will take a fundamental approach, play more up-tempo, and try to get the ball to a lot of different people. This is going to be a combination of freshmen and returning players. Defensively we will play tough, hard-nosed and aggressively. I look forward to a very intense defense. Again, a lot of it has to do with our ability to work as one on and off the court."

**Is it an advantage that so many players played for the same AAU team (five UW players played for Chicago Hoops Express)?**

"I think so. The person that hasn't is Jolene Anderson, and already they have Jolene wrapped around their arms—she is a part of this whole group. There is comfort in that. You think back to when you went to college yourself and you are standing on a big campus all by yourself. They are not alone, and they won't be alone, ever. We are here for them and they know that. We are hoping the chemistry that they have will be a great addition to something very special we have currently on the team."

**How far along are you in implementing your coaching system and philosophy at Wisconsin?**

"Like I said, from the first day I walked into the locker room, they understood my philosophy. They are getting to know me better. The first year was a great year for us. I consider our first year some of our best coaching. The part of that which makes that a statement is that the players believed in you. They knew that I was motivated, they knew that I was high energy, they knew that I assembled a staff that would help make them better players. That is why it was frustrating not to come out on the winning end on some of those games. In the short-term, you look at what I am seeing on their faces now. This new level of confidence is amazing to me. I am pleased with the progress we have made. I am really excited about the future."

Again, the Big Ten is one of the nation's powers, and I am very proud to be a member of it. There will be your pre-season favorites, like Penn State and Purdue. Also Ohio State returns a great cast. Where we'll finish I don't want to predict, but I know we will do battle with some great teams."

### What are your impressions of the Big Ten Tournament?

"I think the Big Ten Tournament's atmosphere is awesome. It is so 'national-spotlight feeling' to me. I certainly want to get to that Big Ten Tournament and stay a lot longer. The atmosphere, the environment is first class. The players, fans, teams, coaches and administrators are treated with a great deal of respect. It is a wonderful event."

### Stone Talks About:

#### UW as an Academic Institution

"Wisconsin academically speaks for itself. It is nationally recognized for its academic prowess. It is academically recognized for research, for medicine, for business, for education and much more. You name it, people know the University of Wisconsin. Our athletic program speaks for itself, but our academics speak very, very loudly as well. We have great leadership from our chancellor, and there is not

an academic discipline here at Wisconsin that would not fit a student's need."

#### Madison

"Madison is home for me. I am a local girl from nearby Oregon. You can allow Madison to be what you want it to be. If you want to be a big fish in a small pond, it would offer that to you. If you want to be a small fish in a big pond, that also is possible. A capital city brings culture to the university, brings diversity and there is always something to do here. You can go to all of the Badger functions, but there is also a lot more to the city than UW athletics.

Madisonians are special people. They have Midwestern values and are some of the most wonderful people you would ever meet. The beauty of the campus, the beauty of Madison is magnificent."

#### Administrative Support for Women's Basketball

"I am thrilled and honored to be a member of Barry Alvarez's coaching staff. He is our new athletic director (and football coach). To have an athletic director with a coaching background is really neat—someone that has walked in our shoes and understands what is important and what coaches need.

(Deputy Director) Jamie Pollard is one of the sharpest, young administrators in the country. I trust them. I respect them. I will do whatever I can for our administration. Their support for women's basketball is unbelievable.

The feeling we are family is present throughout the athletic department at the University of Wisconsin. It is something that is very unique. It exists in large part due to our administrative support and our (department) leadership."

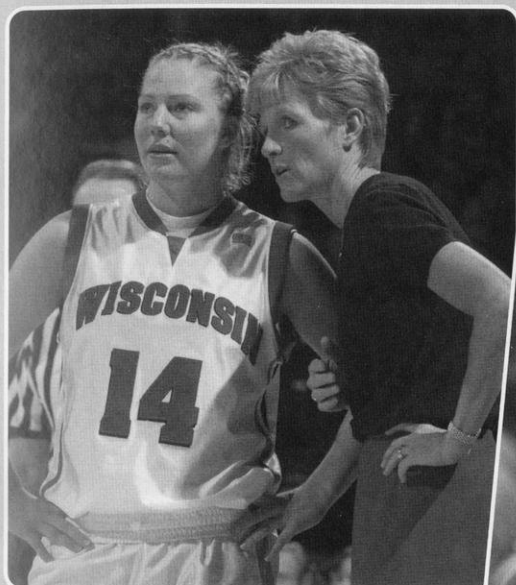
#### Her Coaching Philosophy

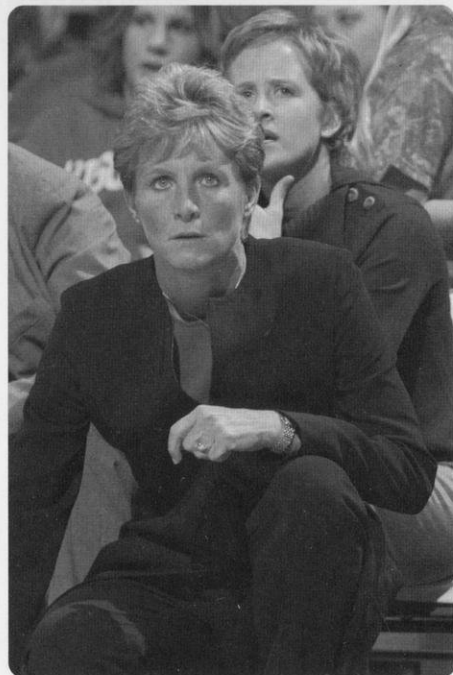
# Badger Coach Lisa Stone

**A** Wisconsin native from nearby Oregon, Lisa Stone began her first season with the Badger program in April, 2003. She came to Wisconsin from Drake University where she served as head coach three years, taking the Bulldogs to the 2002 NCAA Sweet 16.

A proven winner in four different programs, Stone began her tenure with the Badgers with an 18-year career collegiate record of 375-118 (.761) which ranked ninth in overall



winning percentage among active Division I coaches.

Stone had the first losing season of her career in 2003-04, as she faced a refurbishing project at Wisconsin. With the addition of just one recruit, she took a team that finished 7-21 in 2003, to a 10-17 record in her first year. She brings six new recruits and an insatiable energy and desire to succeed into her second season with the Badgers.

Just as important to Stone as a winning record is having student-athletes who are accomplished in the classroom. Stone's 2004 Badger team boasts seven Academic All-Big Ten honorees and her team had a cumulative grade point average of over 3.0. While at Drake, her 2001 team ranked sixth nationally, and her 2002 team ranked 15th nationally in the Women's Basketball Coaches Association's Academic Top 25.

Stone's basketball record at Drake was also successful posting a 64-27 (.703) record in three years. With a 25-8 record, her 2002 team had the best record and the highest national ranking (20th) at the school in 20 years. Drake was 23-7 in Stone's first season before bowing out in the first round of the NCAA tournament.

She was recognized for her coaching success in 2002 with an invitation to join Team USA as an assistant coach to Marsha Sharp of Texas Tech. Team USA won the gold medal at the 2002 World Championships for Young Women Qualifying Tournament in Ribeiro Preto, Brazil.

Prior to Drake, Stone built one of the top NCAA Division III programs in the nation at UW-Eau Claire. The two-time Division III national coach of the year and five-time Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WIAC) coach of the year, took a program that had only one winning season in its history, and guided 11 squads to 20-win seasons and 11 appearances in the NCAA Division III tournament. She compiled a 277-59 (.824) record in her 12 seasons, which ranks second all-

time for most wins in the league's history.

In each of Stone's last nine seasons at UW-Eau Claire, the Blugolds won at least 22 games and never lost more than six. UW-Eau Claire completed its best season in 1999-2000, winning its first 28 games before falling in the Division III NCAA Sweet 16 to the eventual national champion.

Stone began her coaching career at Cornell College (Mt. Vernon, Iowa) where she had a 34-32 record in three years as head coach from 1985-88. At 23, she was the youngest four-year college coach in the nation when she led the Rams to three consecutive Southern Division titles in the Midwest Conference.

As a player, Stone (then Lisa Anderson) earned four letters each in tennis, basketball, and track during her high school career. She led the Class A Oregon Panthers to the Wisconsin state basketball tournament in 1979 and 1980, earning first-team all-state honors as a senior and second-team recognition as a junior.

She played her collegiate ball at the University of Iowa from 1980-84, where she earned her bachelor's degree in 1984. She added a master's degree in athletic administration from Iowa in 1986. At Iowa, Stone played for one of the country's outstanding coaches in C. Vivian Stringer. She was a four-year standout at point guard, scoring 1,129 points which ranks 14th in Iowa history.

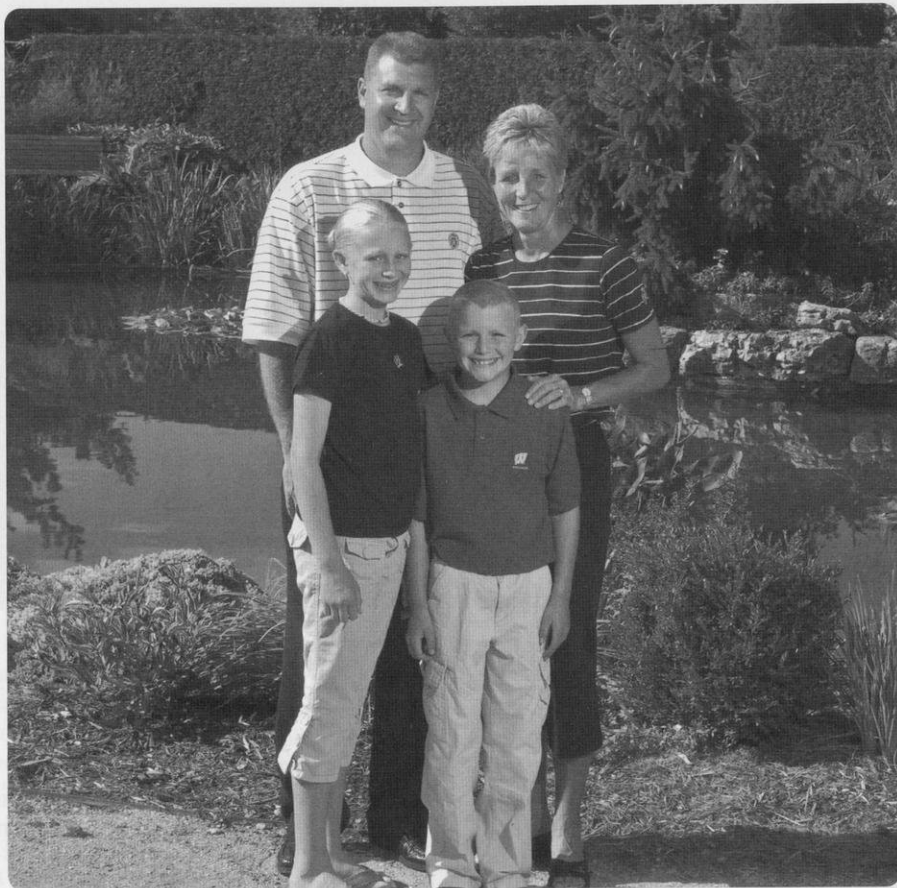

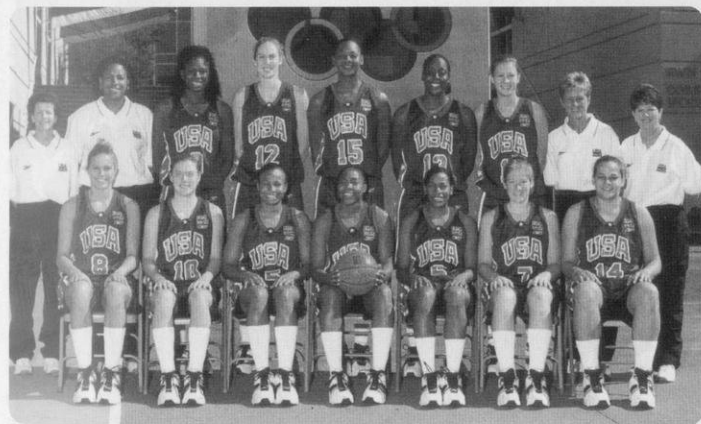

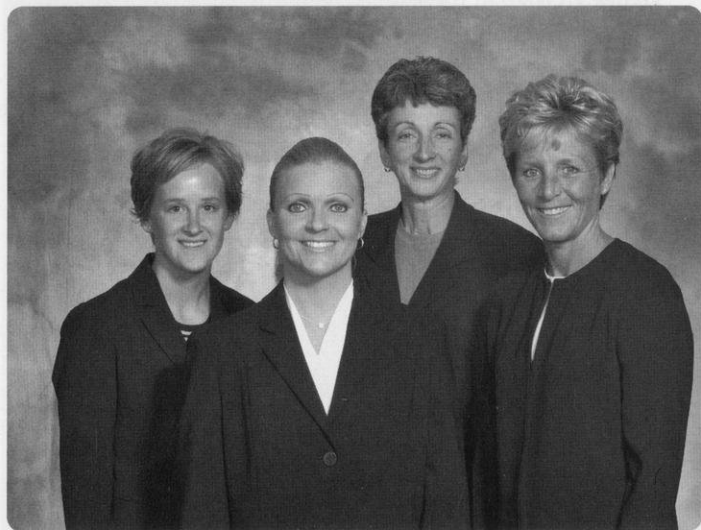

## Donna Freitag, Assistant Coach

Assistant coach Donna Freitag returned to Madison in 2003 after coaching positions at Bradley University and Drake University. A native of Oregon, Wis., and lifelong friend of head coach Lisa Stone, Freitag began her basketball coaching career at the University of Wisconsin serving as an assistant women's coach from 1986-94. She fol-

lowed Stone to Wisconsin after three years as the associate head coach at Drake University.

Freitag, a former head coach and assistant coach at Bradley University in Peoria, Ill., serves as a co-recruiting coordinator and post coach at Wisconsin. She also is instrumental in scouting opponents.

Taking over the Braves program in 1996, after two years as an assistant coach, Freitag compiled a 37-69 record during four seasons as Bradley's head coach. In her initial campaign in 1996-97, the Braves won seven consecutive games, finished fourth in the MVC and won the school's first-ever MVC tournament game by upsetting perennial power Southwest Missouri State.

Prior to her stint at Bradley, Freitag spent eight seasons (1986-94) as an assistant coach for the Badgers. While at Wisconsin, Freitag was an integral part of a rebuilding process that turned a struggling Wisconsin program into a nationally recognized team that received its first bid to the NCAA tournament in 1992.

Freitag grew up in the same neighborhood as Stone, and the two played high school and college basketball together. Both Stone and Freitag were members of Oregon's state qualifying team in 1979. Freitag earned first-team all-conference honors and was the team MVP that year.

Freitag again joined Stone for her final two seasons at the University of Iowa after earning first team all-conference and MVP honors in her first two years at UW-Platteville. At Iowa, Freitag was named the Hawkeyes' team captain and most valuable player during her senior season in 1982-83. She went on to play two seasons of professional basketball for Team Tivoli in Dublin, Ireland, from 1983-85.

## Denise Ianello, Assistant Coach

Denise Ianello returned last season to the Midwest after 11 years at the University of Arizona. The Edina, Minn., native started her coaching career at age 22 in Tucson, and became a full-time assistant coach within seven months. She was named associate head coach and recruiting coordinator in 1997, and is credited with helping elevate the UA program to that of a Pac-10

Conference and national powerhouse.

In a national poll of head coaches conducted by the *Women's Basketball Journal*, Ianello was named one of the nation's top 10 assistant coaches two consecutive years including a No. 5 ranking in 2002-03.

While at Arizona, Ianello was instrumental in recruiting All-America talent including an impressive run of five-straight, top-20 recruiting classes. In 1998, Ianello signed the fourth-ranked recruiting class in the nation. Ianello recruited and coached 12 All-Pac 10 conference players; four consensus All-Americans, including current Wildcats Dee Dee Wheeler and Shawntinice Polk and 13 professional players.

At Wisconsin, Ianello has continued to identify and evaluate top talent as a co-recruiting coordinator while also serving as the floor coach for the guards. She shares in opponent scouting duties and is the liaison with community service for the team.

A 1992 graduate of Northern Illinois, where she earned a degree in corporate communications, Ianello (then Denise Dove) was a three-year starting point guard for the Huskies. During her career, she led her team to appearances in both the NCAA tournament and the WNIT, and NIU earning national rankings as high as No. 11. With Dove leading the offense, Northern Illinois led the nation in scoring for two of her last three years averaging 94.5 points per game her final season.

A two-time all-conference player, Ianello still holds 11 records for the Huskies including all-time career assist leader (526) and the single-season assist leader (169). She was ranked ninth on the school's all-time scoring list with 1,042 points. In addition, she holds all nine NIU three-point field goal records, and is the only NIU player, male or female, to

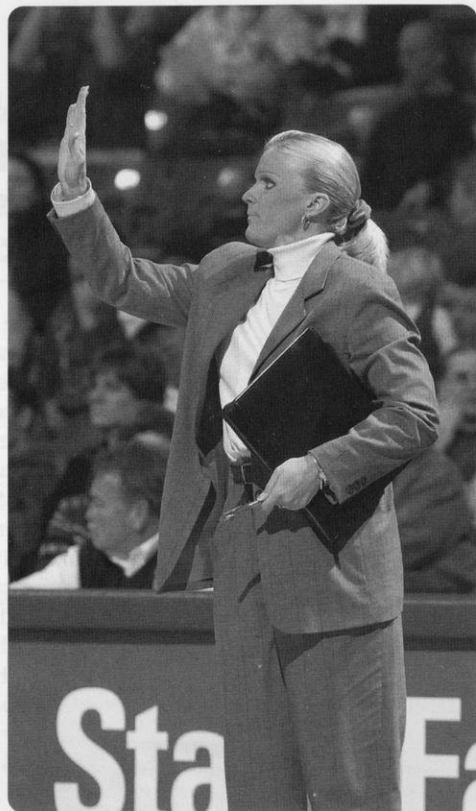
have scored over 1,000 points and have 500 assists.

Ianello came from a basketball family with her father, Steve Dove, a very successful coach at the high school and junior college levels. A former assistant coach for the University of Minnesota, her father is currently director of athletics at Edina High School in Edina, Minn. Ianello credits much of her success as a player and a coach not only to her father, but also to her mother, Sue, and her sister, Stacey, who is also a former Division I basketball player.

During her prep years, Ianello was a two-time all-state selection at Robinsdale Armstrong High School in Plymouth, Minn., as well as an honorable mention *USA Today* All-American and *Parade* Magazine All-American. In April 2001, Ianello was inducted into the Hall of Fame for the Classic Lake Conference, which is comprised of schools in the metropolitan Minneapolis area.

Ianello, whose husband Rob is the Wisconsin football team's tight ends coach and recruiting coordinator, is an avid movie goer, enjoys R&B music and spending time with her family. D.D.I.

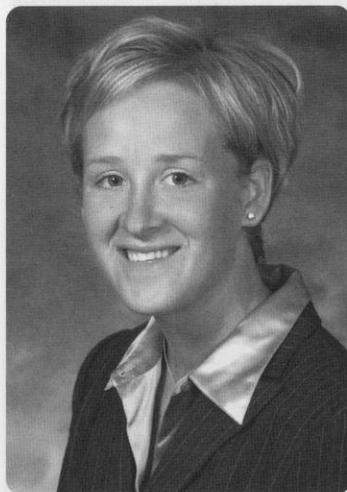

The Fond du Lac, Wis.,

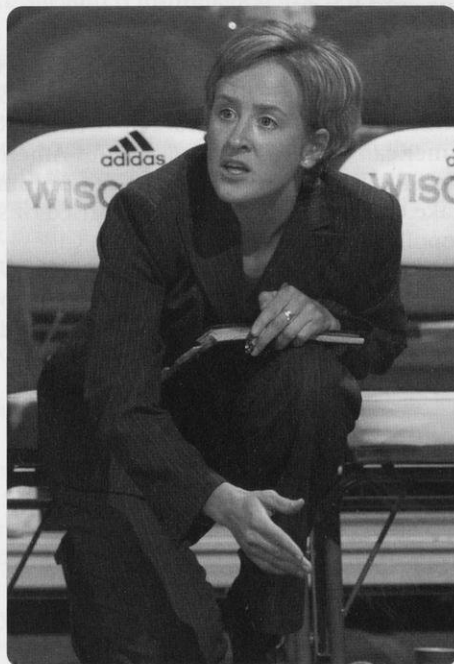
native completed her playing career ranked third in career assists with 546 for a 4.0 assists per game average. She was also fourth in steals with 220, and fifth in three-point goals with 135.

## Community Service Award

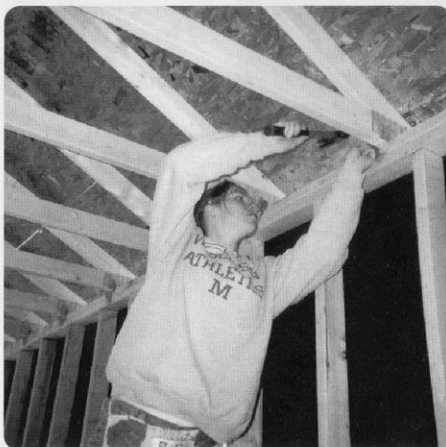

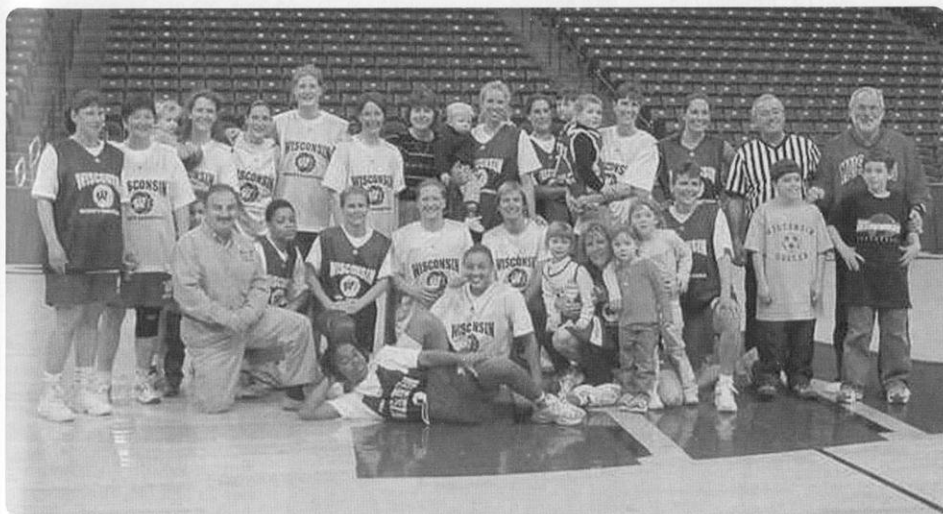


### Huff's Number 21 Is Retired

Theresa Huff, who played at Wisconsin from 1979-83, is the only woman player to have her jersey retired. Although only 5-11, the lithe center/forward became the school's all-time leading scorer and rebounder completing her career with 1,879 points and 1,201 rebounds.

Robin Threatt broke her 11-year-old scoring record with 1,901 points in 1993, and Barb Franke surpassed both Huff and Threatt completing her career with 1,994 points in 1996. But no one has ever reached Huff's incredible 1,201 rebounding mark.

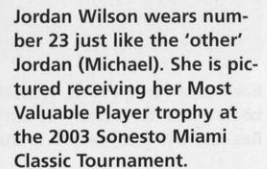
A Milwaukee native, Huff's career spanned the transition period from the AIAW to the NCAA governance. She led Wisconsin to its first post-season appearance reaching the quarterfinals of the 1982 AIAW National Championship. She was a member of the first official Big Ten Conference team in 1981-82. Huff distinguished herself as Wisconsin's first professional woman basketball player and was also the first American chosen to play in Spain in 1983-84. She was inducted into the University of Wisconsin Athletics Hall of Fame in 1998.

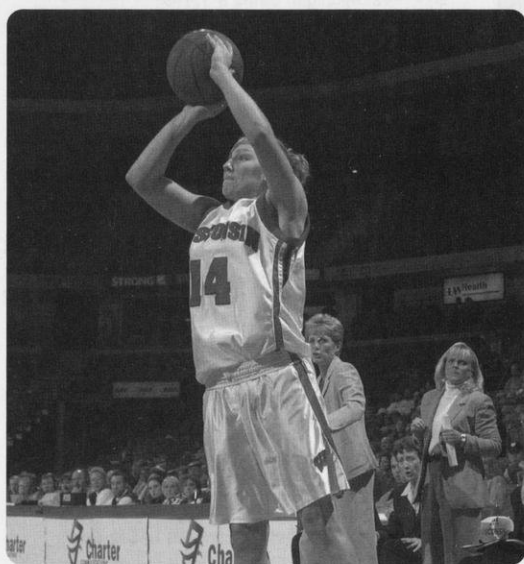

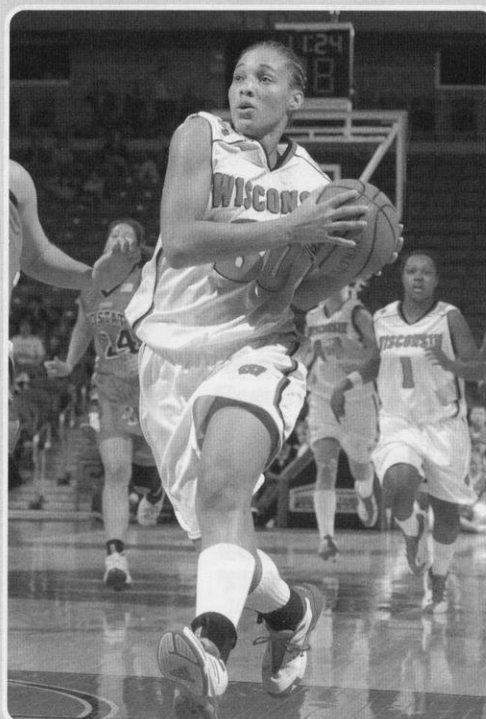

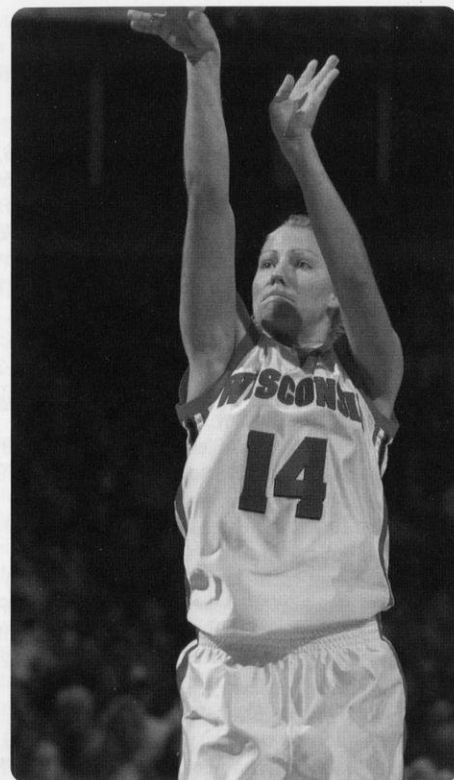

## NCAA Game Summaries

**2001-02:** The Badgers made their sixth NCAA tournament field as the No. 8 seed in the Midwest Region. UW lost to Arizona State, 73-70, in the first round at Nashville, Tenn.

**2000-01:** The 25th-ranked Badgers made their fifth NCAA tournament field as the No. 7 seed in the East Region. UW was upset in the first round by 10th-seed Missouri, 68-71.

**1997-98:** The Badger team was appointed the No. 6 seed in the West Regional taking on the 11th-seeded Virginia Tech Hokies. The Hokies upset the 23rd-ranked Badgers in the opener, 64-75.

**1995-96:** The Badger team tied the highest seed in NCAA bids at sixth in the Midwest Region. The Badgers won the first round game with a 74-60 win over the Pac-10's Oregon, and lost to the host school Vanderbilt, 94-82.

**1994-95:** The Badgers assumed the No. 10 seed in the Midwest region and won their first-ever NCAA game in a one-point, 73-72 thriller over No. 23 Kansas. The Badgers lost to No. 5 Texas Tech in the subregional final in Lubbock, Texas.

**1991-92:** The Badgers received their first NCAA bid after a 20-9 season and third-place Big Ten finish (13-5 record). Wisconsin, the sixth seed in the West Region, lost to Montana in the first round in Madison, 74-85.

**1981-82:** The Badger team qualified for the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW) national tournament losing in the quarterfinals at Texas, and finishing the season with a 21-13 record for the most wins in Badger history (until 1996). Wisconsin won the Midwest AIAW Regional tournament (MAIAW) to advance to the national championship. UW won its first game, 60-59, over Colorado to enter the Elite Eight before losing to host and No. 6 Texas, 61-73.

Women's collegiate basketball attendance has risen over the years and Wisconsin is one of the reasons, ranking among the top 15 in attendance nationally since 1995.

UW owns all the conference attendance marks including setting the single game record of 17,142 with a sellout at the Kohl Center in 2002. The Big Ten has led the nation in attendance for seven of the past 12 years.

The 1997-98 Badgers also set cumulative and conference-only games attendance marks with a record-average 12,474 in eight Big Ten games. UW set its first five-figure average with 10,455 per game also in 1998.

# Big Ten Conference Basketball

One of the premier athletic leagues in the nation, the Big Ten Conference is proud of its leadership in the arena of athletics.

Big Ten women's athletics programs have led the nation in both women's basketball and volleyball attendance. In addition, the league receives more television exposure than any conference in the nation. More than 200 Conference athletic events are televised each year on national and regional networks.

Begun in 1895, the Intercollegiate Conference of Faculty Representatives (popularly known as the Big Ten) has changed little from its original philosophy of faculty control of athletics with emphasis on the student-athlete. Comprised of 11 institutions in eight states, the conference has long set the national standard for athletics and academics.

Women's athletics programs became affiliated with the Conference officially in 1981, although unofficial conference championships had been held among the member institutions since 1972. Penn State became the 11th university to join the conference in 1991.

The Big Ten Conference began its conference basketball tournament that decides the automatic qualifier for the NCAA Championship in 1995. Purdue has won six of the last seven titles and became the Big Ten's first NCAA champion in 1999. The Boilermakers were the NCAA runners-up in 2001 and also took



part in the Final Four in 1994. Ohio State and Iowa advanced to the Final Four in 1993. Penn State was a Final Four team in 2000, while Minnesota was a national semifinalist in 2004. A Big Ten team has been to the Final Four four of the past six years.

The league title is based on the final regular season conference standings. All teams play a total of 16 games. Schools play six teams twice and four teams once.

The 2005 Big Ten Conference tournament will be held Thursday-Monday, March 3-7, at Conseco Fieldhouse in Indianapolis. The tournament is a four-day single elimination playoff with all 11 teams participating. The top five seeds (as determined by standings) receive a first-round bye. The other six teams play each other in the first round, with the winners participating in the quarterfinal round on Friday.

The conference tournament champion earns an automatic bid to the NCAA tournament. All rounds of the tournament are broadcast on Fox SportsNet or ESPN.

Wisconsin's multi-purpose athletic center opened in January of 1998. The facility provides the opportunity to host stage shows, concerts and athletic events such as the 1998 Division I NCAA Women's Volleyball Championship and the 2002 NCAA Men's Regional Basketball Championship. The UW women's basketball team sold out the Kohl Center in 2002, with 17,142 in attendance at the Minnesota game on Jan. 20 (left).

From its opening in January of 1998, the Kohl Center has become the happy home for the UW basketball and hockey programs. From lounge areas to lockers and training areas, the Kohl Center provides a competitive floor, practice and study areas for the student-athletes. The coaching offices are also located at the Kohl Center.

## Major Benefactors

The building is named for U.S. Sen. Herb Kohl (D-Wisconsin), a 1956 graduate of the UW-Madison, who donated \$25 million to the project. Kohl's gift is the single largest private donation in University history.

Former all-Big Ten basketball player Albert "Ab" Nicholas and his wife, Nancy Johnson Nicholas, pledged \$10 million toward the project. The facility's practice gymnasium is named the Nicholas-Johnson Pavilion and Plaza. Nicholas received his B.S. and M.B.A. degrees from the UW-Madison.

The Kellner family—Jack F. and his sons, Ted and Jack W. of Milwaukee gave \$2.5 million. All three Kellners received degrees from the University of Wisconsin-Madison.

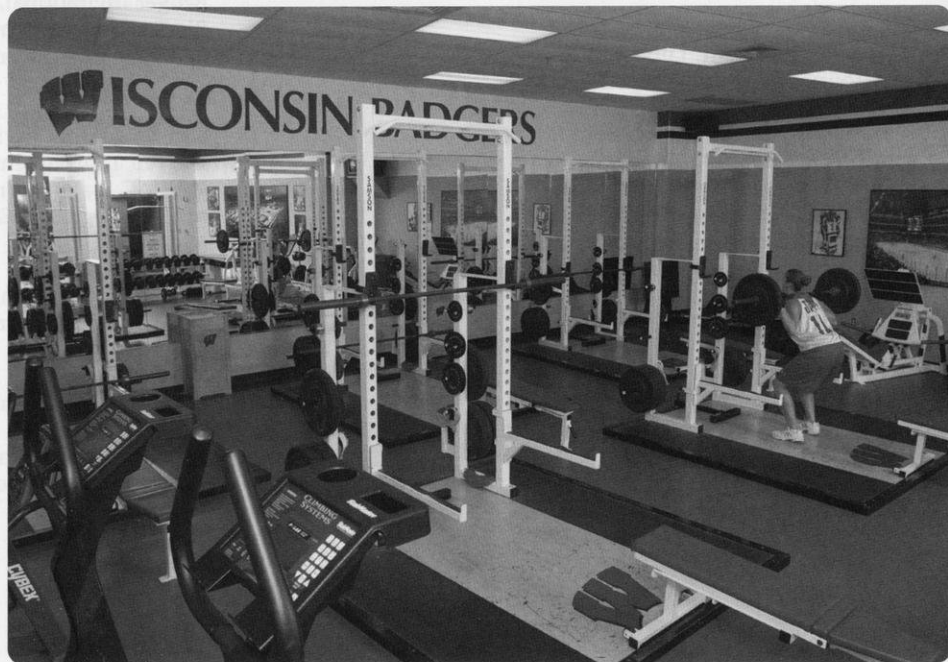
## Seating Capacity

The Kohl Center seats 17,142 for basketball. That figure includes 7,500 seats in the lower seating bowl and 4,500 in each of the two balconies. The unique design of the Kohl Center (with two overhanging balconies) guarantees that all fans will be close to the playing floor with excellent site lines. The facility seats approximately 14,000 for hockey, and between 15,000 and 17,000 for concerts.

## Practice Pavilion

The Nicholas-Johnson Pavilion houses three full-size basketball courts to be used for basketball practice sessions when the Kohl Center main floor is booked for other events.

The area is naturally lit, and has its own restrooms and loading dock. It can be set with a stage and often is utilized for pre-event functions, luncheons, and other large-group gatherings.



The newly-expanded strength and conditioning area features a full-time staff member for each Badger team that practices at the Kohl Center.





The \$76 million Kohl Center is located on campus and has become a major showcase for Madison's cultural and sporting events. Shown above is the auxiliary practice facility; on the top right is the 'living room' of the women's basketball locker area; (middle right) is the large 'w' that greets visitors to the women's locker room. ## Spacious Locker Rooms

The Kohl Center includes lockers for UW men's and women's basketball and hockey. Four other locker rooms are also available for multiple teams attending the WIAA state tournaments also held in the arena.

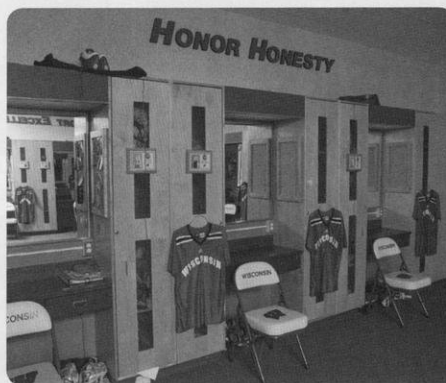
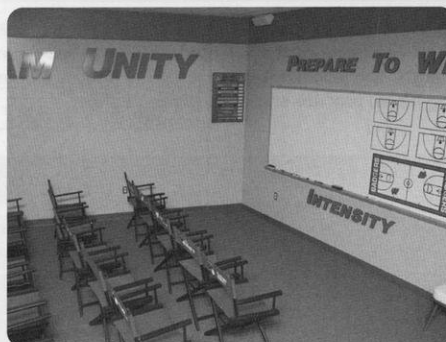
The 2,200 square-foot, state-of-the-art locker areas have been designed with the needs of student-athletes in mind including team organizational meetings, an athletes' social area, and study carrels. The athletes have a lounge area with sound system, video room, and, of course, a spacious dressing and shower area complete with multiple outlets and lighted mirrors.

## Check List of Team and Fan Amenities

- For the student-athletes: huge locker rooms that include attached lounges, video/meeting rooms, and study areas with practice facility attached.
- For the coaches: spacious offices with westward views of the campus including the Field House and Camp Randall Stadium.
- For the support areas: sports medicine, sports information, concessions/catering, and physical plant have ample and

convenient work areas. The UW ticket office is also located in the Kohl Center.

- For the fans and suites: a state-of-the-art sound system has been implemented in the Kohl Center and TV monitors are wired to the suites and above concession stands throughout the building. A new video-replay scoreboard and exciting ring beam were added in 2004.
- For the fans: extra-wide concourses (two), a number of food courts on both levels, numerous restrooms and merchandise outlets.
- Also for the fans: the cantilever design replicates the overhang effect of the Field House without the obstructions. Site lines are tremendous from every seat. At center court, you can look up at three ascending, cheering spectator areas—an awesome and intimidating sight for the opponents.

# UW's Kohl Center



The Kohl Center replaced the UW Field House (1929) as the venue for UW basketball in January of 1998. A replica of the crest on the Field House was installed on the front fascia of the Kohl Center. The 10,000-pound crest welcomes fans to the 17,142-seat facility that also serves the university and the community for special events. The Kohl Center conveniently houses all the amenities for UW basketball including coaches' offices, locker rooms, training table, study and strength training areas, practice and competitive facilities.



Situated conveniently in the center of the UW-campus, the Kohl Center sits across from the Southeast Dorms. Located at 601 West Dayton, it is easily accessible via Park Street, and is near the intersection of West Washington Avenue and Regent Street.

# Badgers Make Their World Mark



The Badger basketball family has traveled the world. Members of the UW team have taken world basketball tours as Big Ten All-Stars visiting such countries as Australia, Austria, Belgium, Denmark, England, France, Germany, Japan, Hungary, Slovakia, Sweden, Switzerland, and the Czech Republic. Team travels have included the Northern Lights Invitational in Anchorage, Alaska in 1997, and the Virgin Islands in 2001. The team also plays in tournaments around the United States and this year will travel to Houston for a Thanksgiving Tournament. Next season it's Hawaii!

Being a member of the Wisconsin women's basketball program has provided many student-athletes access to world-wide travel and competition. Players have participated in the Big Ten All-Star tours since 1992, and the Wisconsin team has the opportunity to take a foreign tour every four years. The foreign-touring Big Ten all-Star teams have traveled extensively to most of the European countries, and have even ventured to Australia and Japan.

Athletes also may be invited to participate in USA basketball tours abroad. Head Coach Lisa Stone returned from Brazil in 2002, where she served as an assistant coach to Team USA that brought home a gold medal in the World Championship for Young Women Qualifying Tournament. Former Badger Barb Franke also competed in Taiwan and Canada as a member of two different USA teams.

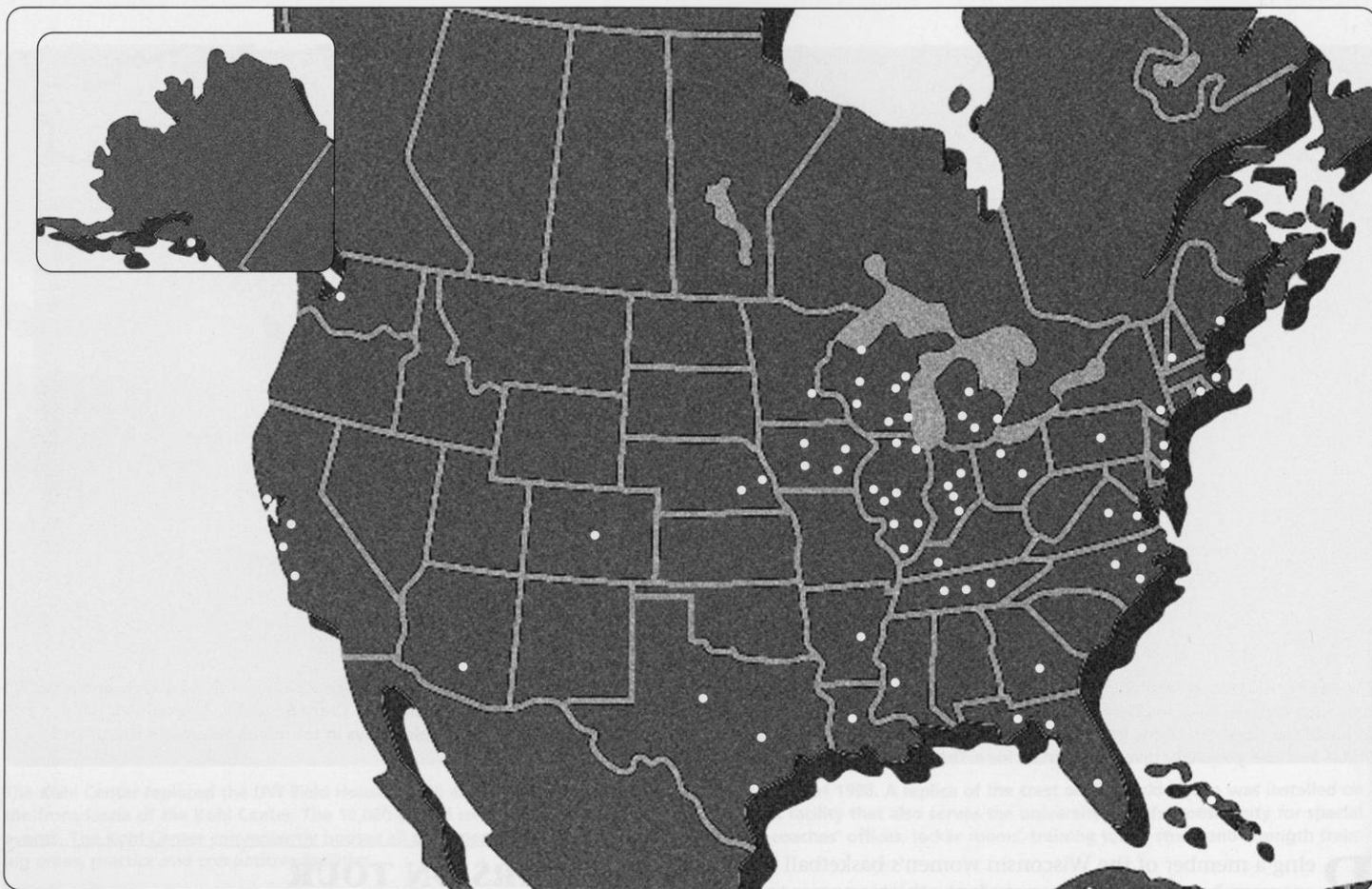
Wisconsin's foreign tours have included what most of the athletes described as the trip of a lifetime in 1999, spending 14 days seeing the sights of Australia while playing four games.

Wisconsin women's basketball took its first foreign tour in 1995 playing a four-game schedule while traveling to Paris, France, Antwerp, Belgium and London, England.

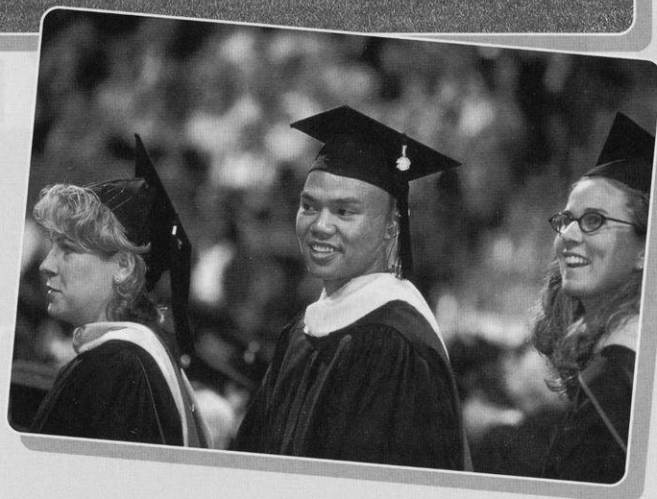

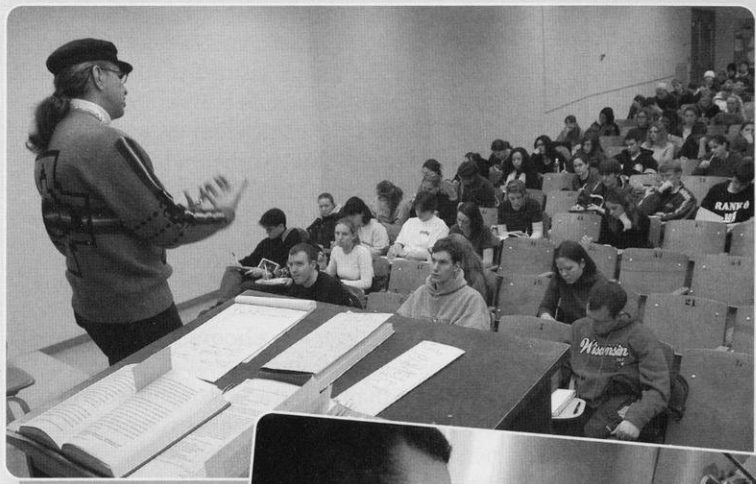

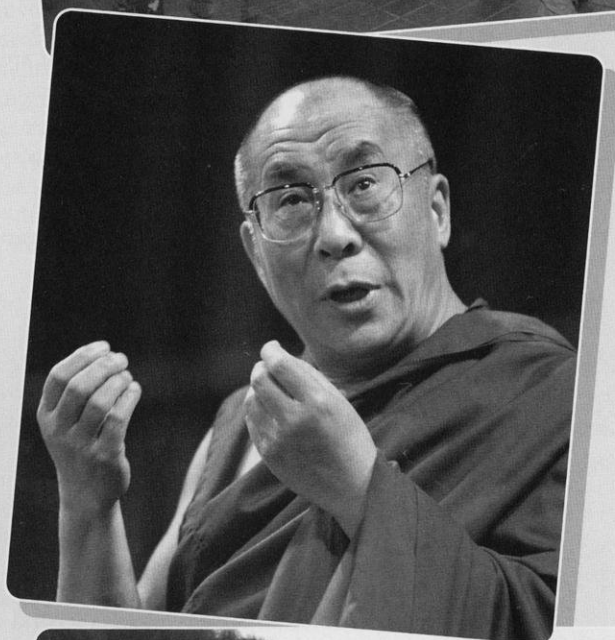

# A Beautiful Campus

**T**he University of Wisconsin campus rolls for 933 acres along the shores of Lake Mendota, encompassing wooded hills, friendly shores, and the streets of downtown Madison.

The Lakeshore Path is a pedestrian and bicycle-only trail that runs from the Union to Picnic Point, a peninsula that juts out into Lake Mendota. Along the way are numerous beaches or spots to stop and enjoy the beautiful lake views.

Spend an hour alone with your thoughts walking the trails of the UW Arboretum, a 1,262-acre nature preserve right in the middle of the city. Or visit Wisconsin's majestic State Capitol building only minutes away from campus.

And if ever you find yourself with a free afternoon, you may wish to enjoy lunch or a latte with friends at one of the many restaurants lining State Street in the heart of downtown Madison.

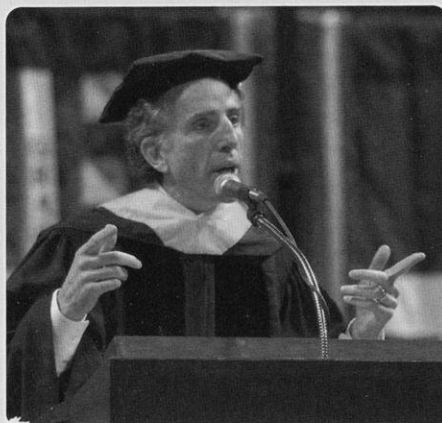

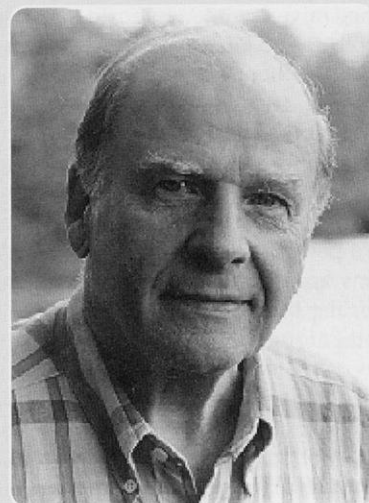

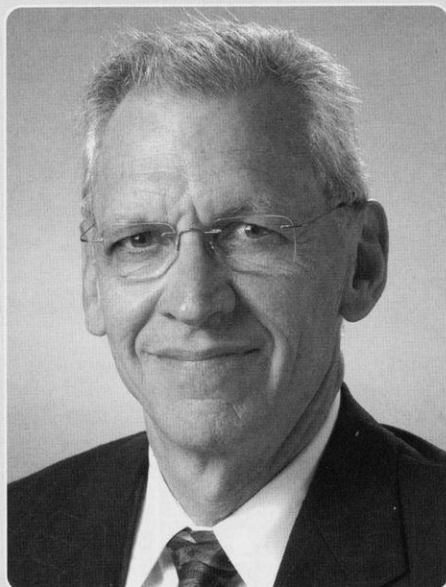

Chancellor John D. Wiley has worked to amplify the Wisconsin Idea and build on the research and teaching strengths that have made the University of Wisconsin so rich in accomplishment and tradition.

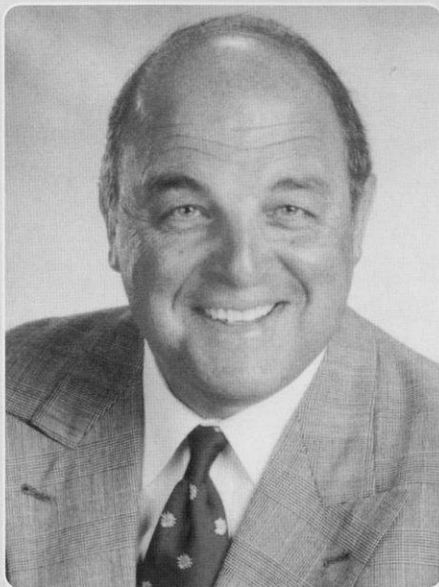
Since being named as the UW-Madison's 27th chancellor on Jan. 1, 2001, Wiley has aimed to enhance the university's role in creating a new, more viable economic future for Wisconsin while opening avenues to innovation and learning.

Wiley has presided over unprecedented growth on the west side of campus, which is being transformed into one of the nation's great health-sciences centers.

He also has mapped an east side redevelopment that will create a vibrant arts-and-humanities district to anchor the lower State Street area.

The chancellor has been a leader in efforts to expand on-campus student housing to meet demand, stem high-risk drinking and integrate athletics into the mainstream of university life. Wiley has reached out to the private sector by creating the Office of Corporate Relations to serve the increasing needs of the business community and help to build a more prosperous Wisconsin economy.

Wiley received his bachelor's degree in physics from Indiana University in 1964; attended graduate school at UW-Madison as an NSF Fellow and received master's and doctoral degrees in physics in 1965 and 1968, respectively.

Barry Alvarez**

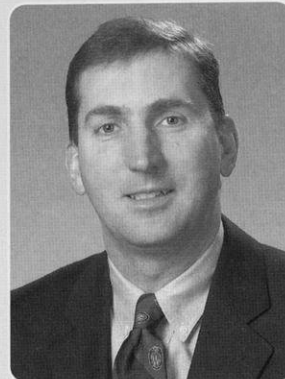
Barry Alvarez began his head football coaching duties at Wisconsin in 1990, and in April of 2004 began a dual role when he assumed the responsibility of Director of Athletics.

Alvarez has been at the forefront of the revival of the Badger athletic program during his entire tenure in Madison. He has guided Wisconsin to three Big Ten and Rose Bowl titles (including back-to-back in 1998-99) en route to becoming the winningest football coach in school history (99-67-4 record).

His 7-2 (.777) record in bowl games with the Badgers is among the best in college football history. The 1993 national coach of the year, he is a two-time (1993 and 1998) Big Ten coach of the year and was a finalist for ESPN's coach of the decade (1990s) honor.

Alvarez is a 1969 graduate of the University of Nebraska, where he played linebacker and went on to earn his master's degree. He received a Distinguished Alumnus Award from his alma mater in 2003.

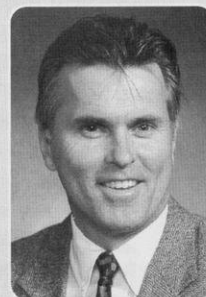

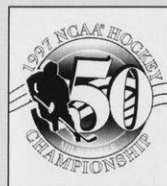
## NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS



In the last 11 years, the University of Wisconsin has hosted five NCAA championships and an NCAA men's basketball regional.



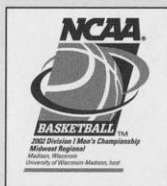
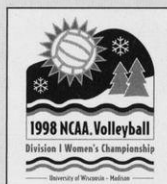

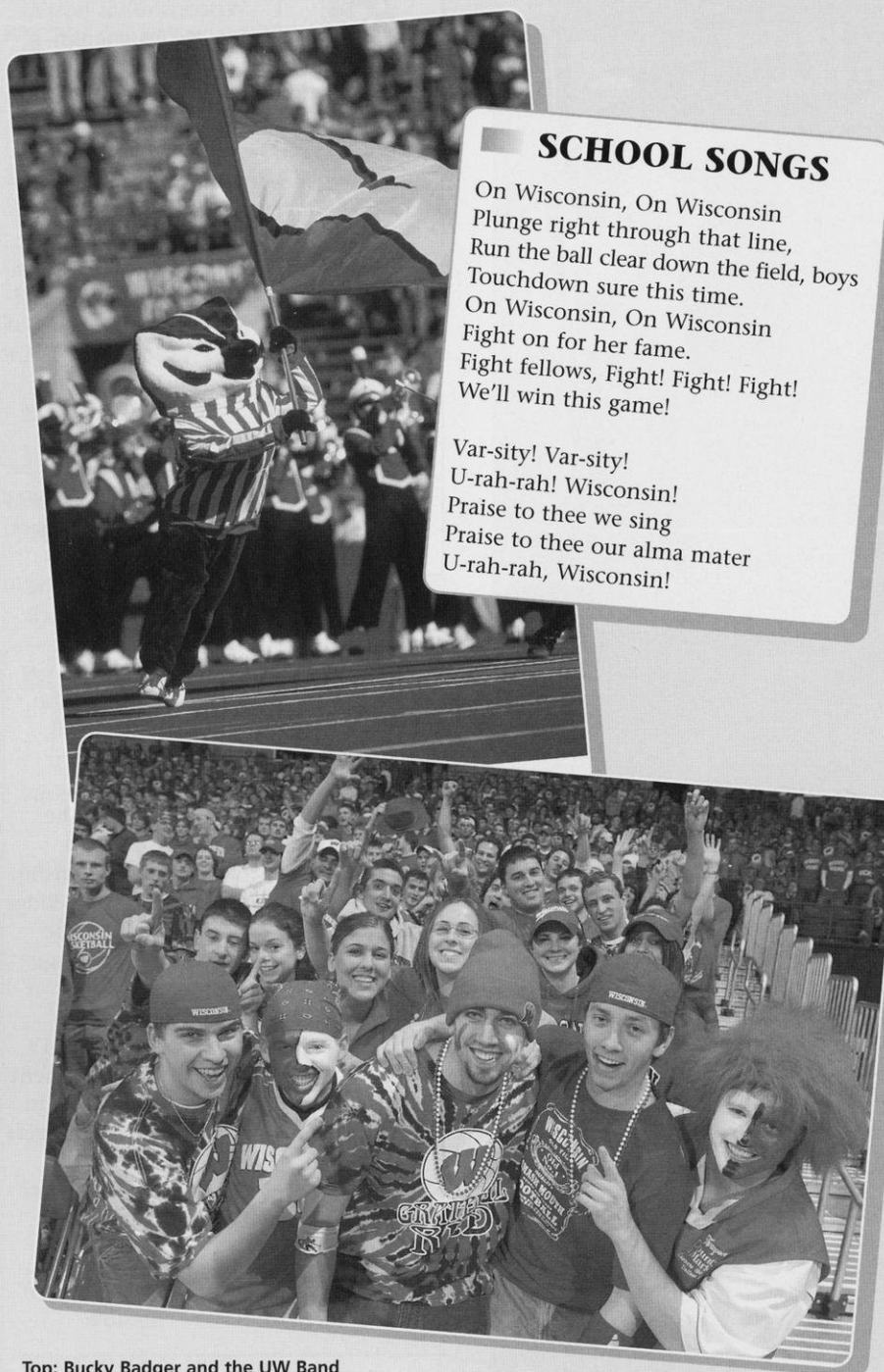


The NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament came to Wisconsin in 2002 when the Badgers played host to a regional in the Kohl Center.

# Wisconsin Traditions

## Badger Nickname

The nickname "Badgers" was borrowed from the state of Wisconsin, which was dubbed the "Badger State." The name didn't come from the animals in the region, but rather from an association with lead miners in the 1820s. Without shelter in the winter, the miners had to "live like Badgers" in tunnels burrowed into hillsides.

## Bucky Badger

Although badgers in various forms had been the University of Wisconsin mascot for decades, the version that is currently known as Bucky, sporting a cardinal and white sweater, was first drawn in 1940 by professional illustrator Art Evans.

In 1949, a student wore a badger outfit with a papier-mâché head at the homecoming game. A pep rally was held to determine the mascot's name—Buckingham U. Badger.

## Bud Song

An integral part of any Wisconsin band performance is the playing of the Bud song. The tune is a spinoff of the song "You've said it all," a jingle with words and music originally written by Steve Karen for Budweiser beer commercials. The song has become legendary at the UW because of its polka-like rhythm.

## Fifth Quarter

The Wisconsin band has become nationally famous for its post-game celebration called the Fifth Quarter. Win or lose, fans sing, dance and cheer the band as it plays traditional favorites like "On, Wisconsin" and the Bud song.

## On Wisconsin

The tune was composed in 1909 by William Purdy, with the words written by UW alumnus Carl Beck, who rewrote them in 1951. Some 2,500 schools and colleges have adopted the music and changed the words to suit their needs.

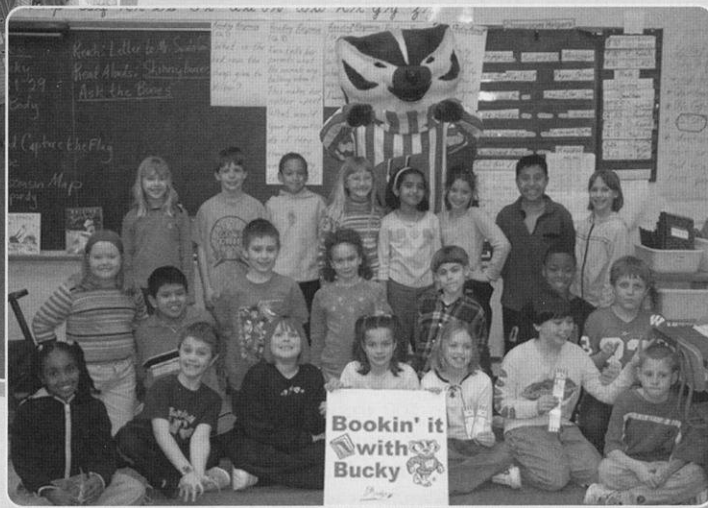

## NCAA Compliance

As a member of the Big Ten Conference, Western Collegiate Hockey Association, and the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA), the University of Wisconsin must abide by many rules and regulations. Below is general information on how these guidelines apply to prospective student-athletes and representative of athletics interests.

### Definitions

A prospective student-athlete is any student who has started classes for the ninth grade. Before the ninth grade, one becomes a prospective student-athlete if a college gives the individual (or his/her relatives or friends) any financial aid or other benefits that the college does not provide to prospective students generally.

A prospective student-athlete is recruited at a particular university when its coach approaches the prospect (or any member of the prospect's family) about enrolling and participating in athletics at that college by any one of the following three ways:

- Providing an official visit to the university's campus;
- Having an arranged, in-person, off-campus encounter with a prospect or the prospect's family; or
- Placing more than one telephone call to a prospect or any other member of his/her family.

A representative of the UW's athletics interests ("booster") is anyone who . . .

- is an alumnus of the UW
- has contributed to a Badger athletic program
- has helped arrange employment of enrolled and prospective UW student-athletes
- has been involved in any way promoting the Badger athletic program.

### The Recruiting Process

Institutional staff members have very specific recruiting guidelines that vary by sport. The major areas are: telephone calls, contacts, evaluations, campus visits, correspondence, and highlight films/videotapes.

In addition to general recruiting regulations, no booster can be involved in recruiting (e.g., no phone calls, letters, or in-person contacts).

### Eligibility

Prospects who intend to participate in Division I intercollegiate athletics must register with and be certified by the NCAA Initial Eligibility Clearinghouse. Please contact your high school counselor for more information on this process, especially regarding the requirements to be eligible.

### Extra Benefits

By NCAA definition, an extra benefit is any special arrangement by an institutional

employee or a booster to provide a student-athlete or a student-athlete's relative or friend a benefit that is not expressly authorized by NCAA legislation. This is prohibited. If the benefit is demonstrated to be generally available to ALL UW STUDENTS or their relatives or friends determined on a basis unrelated to athletic ability, it is not a violation of NCAA rules.

Extra benefits are also not permissible for prospective student-athletes. They are called offers and inducements, and include any benefit such as cash, clothing, cars, improper expenses, transportation, gifts or loans to encourage you to sign a National Letter of Intent or attend an NCAA university. UW Compliance On-Line Training Program Compliance Rules and Regs is a compliance training program available on the Internet. Student-athletes, coaches and designated athletic department staff are required to complete the program, while boosters are encouraged to participate. # Fetzer Student-Athlete Academic Center

The Fetzer Student-Athlete Academic Center has been helping Wisconsin student-athletes to achieve their academic goals since 1997.

The 15,000-square-foot, state-of-the-art facility serves the needs of all student-athletes. The center features an open area with carrels that can accommodate up to 30 students. There are eight study rooms of different shapes and sizes, including a 55-seat auditorium. A state-of-the-art computer lab, under coordinator Jim Eisenmann, is networked to allow access to email, the library system's electronic catalog and the web while the entire center is wired with voice/data jacks and power ports.

Associate Athletic Director David Harris supervises a staff of five advisors, four learning specialists and a tutor coordinator who conduct the academic services offered to the more than 700 student-athletes. The advising staff of Tom Browne, Chris Butler, Jerry Darda, Mary Weaver-Klees and Alan Zussman as well as tutorial coordinator Jill Hadfield work along with learning specialists Doug Tiedt (assistant director), Dan Ott, Maryellen Rock and Nancy Gatyas to render quality academic and personal support to student-athletes and assist coaches in providing the best possible collegiate experience. The staff, including program assistant Nancy Kreklow, has a comprehensive understanding of academics at Wisconsin, and a permanent line of communication with all university departments. Study groups, tutors and a variety of academic and career planning are available throughout the year.

Student-athletes can drop in before practice or between classes to study or meet with the advisors and learning specialists whose offices are located in the center. Sessions are offered on a one-to-one basis at a time appropriate for the student-athlete. Athletes are degree-oriented while allowing for the flexibility to explore different areas. The staff takes a personal approach to each student-athlete in determining his or her individual needs, personal or academic.

Student-athletes at Wisconsin receive recognition for outstanding academics in a number of ways on the national, conference and university level. The annual Student-Athlete Academic banquet recognizes student-athletes off the field of play.



The Fetzer Student-Athlete Academic Services Center, a state-of-the-art facility located in the lower level of the McClain Center, opened in 1997. The \$2.1 million center is one of the best in the nation and includes eight study rooms, a computer room, and a 55-seat auditorium.

# Sports Medicine

The sports medicine staff provides all University of Wisconsin student-athletes with high quality health care.

Wisconsin's Sports Medicine program features state-of-the-art facilities and the services of leading sports medicine and health care professionals.

The sports medicine staff consists of team physicians, dentists, athletic trainers, and a full-time nutritionist. The day-to-day care, prevention, and treatment of injuries to Badger athletes is supervised by a staff of 12 full-time and two graduate assistant National Athletic Trainers Association (NATA) certified and State of Wisconsin licensed athletic trainers.

Under the direction of head athletic trainer Dennis Helwig, the Sports Medicine program focuses on injury prevention. Full-time athletic trainers Karen Bloch, Beth Cranley, Greg Ehlers, Chuck Hart, Jan Helwig, Andy Hrodey, Mike Moll, Henry Perez-Guerra, Kristen Walker, Laura Walluk, and Ian Wood as well as graduate assistant trainers Holli Schaible and Nicole Gehrich utilize functional measures, measure physiological capacity and outline programs to improve flexibility.

Full-time nutritionist Jeremy Isensee provides dietary analysis and supervises training table meals to enhance the performance of the student-athletes.

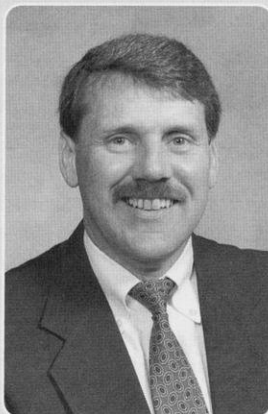
The Sports Medicine facility in the McClain Center features an extensive collection of therapeutic and rehabilitation equipment including a 50-foot, two-lane-rehabilitation pool and an on-site x-ray facility. Considered one of the nation's finest, the McClain Sports Medicine Center offers an environment conducive to expedient care and a healthy return to competition.

Should an injury occur, athletes are seen immediately by team physicians affiliated with the world-renowned UW Hospital and Clinics. Medical director Dr. Ben Graf, an orthopedic surgeon, is responsible for all services provided to student-athletes. Orthopedic care is also provided by team physician Dr. John Orwin and Dr. Lee Kaplan. General medical care is directed by the head of primary care, Dr. Greg Landry, and he is joined by Dr. David Berhardt, Dr. Tom Best and Dr. Kathleen Carr.

In addition to the headquarters in the McClain Athletic Facility, auxiliary athletic training rooms are located in Camp Randall Stadium, Natatorium, UW Field House, and the Kohl Center. All training areas are equipped with the finest therapeutic modalities and rehabilitative apparatus.

# Strength & Conditioning

The Wisconsin strength and conditioning program is a key component in all of the Badger teams' success on the playing field. The program's goal is to increase the overall performance of each student-athlete, prevent injuries and help athletes reach their potential.

Strength and conditioning coordinator John Dettmann along with assistants Brian Bott, Ben Herbert, Scott Hettenbach, Bryan Miller, Mike Potenza and Jim Snider work with the UW coaches to develop training programs to enhance each athlete's performance.

Badger athletes work on their strength programs in weight rooms in the McClain Center, Kohl Center and Camp Randall Stadium.

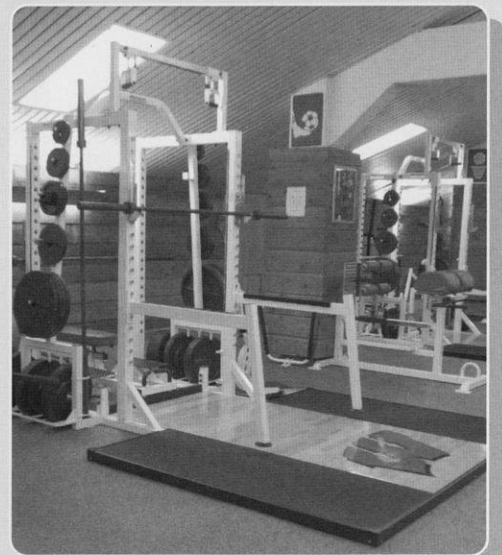
The McClain Center weight room is the largest of the facilities and features more than 45,000 pounds of free weights and more than 50 weight machines. The room has seven squat racks, eight bench press stations, eight flat-to-incline benches, six Olympic lift platforms and numerous other free weight stations.

The Kohl Center weight room is equipped with five custom-built free weight power platforms and 4,000 pounds of free weights. The room has nine pieces of cardiovascular equipment and three Vertimax jump trainers.

The Badger Den has five power stations with each station consisting of a platform for Olympic style lifting as well as a squat rack, bench press, incline bench press, pull-up station and a dip station. There are three lat-pull machines and seated row machines, a complete set of dumbbells and a complete set of plyometric boxes.

Top: Camp Randall Stadium is the home of the football Badgers and has a seating capacity of nearly 80,000. The stadium is in the midst of a \$107 million renovation that includes a new office building, video scoreboards, suites and club seating as well as other improved fan amenities.

Whatever your preference for recreation or relaxation, you'll find plenty to do in Madison and encounter a diverse group of individuals who all call this place home.



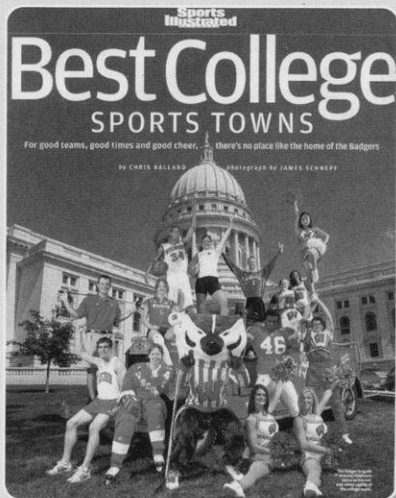
Top: The State Capitol is the center of Madison's isthmus between Lakes Mendota and Monona.
