A new era in women's basketball began last season as Mary Murphy took the helm of the Wisconsin program. Murphy, who inherited a 4-24 team of nine returnees and six walkons, more than doubled the number of wins in the Big Ten and regular season, finishing 9-19 on the year and 5-13 in the Big Ten, tying for eighth place. Her enthusiasm and her team's hard-working style coupled in producing record-breaking attendance figures with Wisconsin averaging over 1000 per game.

Murphy has impressive competitive, academic and coaching credentials. As the former assistant women's basketball coach at Notre Dame for six years, Mary gained experience in all levels of coaching.


As a competitor, she captained the Northwestern University basketball team that won the Big Ten Conference titles in 1979 and 1980. The 1980 Wildcat team also won the Midwest Association of Intercollegiate Sports for Women Regional Tournament and was defeated in the guarter-finals of the AIAW National Championship.

The Chicago native was named the Chicago area "Player of the Decade," 1970–80, and she was a Kodak All-American regional winner and Wade Trophy finalist her senior year. She was a four-year starter at guard for the Wildcats.

Murphy graduated in public administration and public policy from Northwestern in 1980, and added a master's degree in business administration from Notre Dame in 1982.

Assistant Coaches

Mike Peckham, a former assistant coach at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, enters his second year with Wisconsin women's basketball. An assistant at North Carolina from 1980–86, Mike aided the Tar Heels to four NCAA tournament appearances. Mike served as the head recruiter, travel and schedule coordinator, in addition to his on-court coaching duties. He has worked in several summer basketball camps and has attended coaching seminars and clinics. Mike is a 1982 graduate of North Carolina in recreation administration.

Donna Freitag, a native of Oregon, Wisconsin, returned to Wisconsin last year as second assistant. Freitag earned most valuable player honors at the University of Wisconsin–Platteville for two years before transferring to the University of Iowa. At Iowa, she was named team MVP and captain during the 1982–83 season. Freitag also won the All-Around Athlete award in 1983 and was named to the All-Tournament team at the Sun Dial Classic.


Freitag, a 1983 graduate of lowa in physical education and health, has also worked at numerous basketball camps and has coached at the high school level. She played in Ireland with the women's semi-professional basketball league for two years prior to her appointment at Wisconsin.

Graduate assistant **Michelle Fischer** played for UW–Madison from 1983–87. A captain of last year's team, the Flint, Michigan, native had her best season as a Badger, starting 25 games and averaging five points and rebounds. She was the leading rebounder in five games, and had career highs of 15 points and 11 rebounds. She completed her career in a tie for 10th in blocks with 35, 25 of which she collected her senior year. Michelle is a 1987 communication arts graduate of UW–Madison.



1987–88 Badger Women's Basketball Preview

Rebuilding.



It's a term many coaches use to describe the process of going from the bottom of the heap to becoming a top contender. And it's a term quite applicable to the 1987–88 Wisconsin Women's Basketball year.

Second year head coach Mary Murphy has just completed her first recruiting season. Wisconsin, despite having only nine returnees and six walk-ons last year, moved from tenth place to a tie for eighth place in the Big Ten Conference standings. Although Murphy will need three walk-ons to complete this year's roster, she knows her team will baffle a few opponents, and perpetuate the enthusiasm to win established by Murphy and her coaching staff a year ago.

"These have been times for change at Wisconsin," Murphy said of her first season. "We took a team which was 4–24, and more than doubled our wins overall and in the Big Ten. Moreover, we developed an enthusiasm for Wisconsin basketball as evidenced by both our attendance last year and our very successful recruiting season."

The 1986–87 team combined for a 9–19 overall record, and was 4–14 in the Big Ten Conference. Wisconsin also ranked third in conference attendance behind league cochampions Ohio State and Iowa, averaging over 1000 per game.

Murphy's 1987 recruiting class includes four quality in-state players. Freshmen twins **Kim and Kay Fredrickson** led their Durand High School team to back-to-back Class B State Championship titles and contributed to a winning streak of 52 consecutive games dating back to a 1985 loss suffered as sophomores in the state tourney semi-final. The 5–10 guard/forwards both averaged double figures of 18 and 16 points throughout high school, and both averaged nine rebounds per game and hit career field goal percentages of over .500.

Freshman **Kathy Kamrath** of Hartland will be the Badger's tallest player. A 6–1 forward, Kamrath was a member of Arrowhead's 1987 Class A State Championship team. She averaged 12 points, nine rebounds and three blocks her senior year.

Also joining the Badger program is 5–11 freshman forward **Lisa Lawrence** of Milwaukee's Rufus King High School. Lawrence has "untapped potential" according to Murphy. She averaged 14 points, 11 rebounds and three assists as a senior.

In addition, Notre Dame transfer **Julie Garske** of Amherst, Wisconsin, will be eligible to play for the Badgers in January. Selected as Wisconsin's 1986 "Miss Basketball," Garske, 5–11, averaged 24 points and 12 rebounds as a senior All-State player from Amherst High School. She was an all-



conference pick each of her four prep seasons, and was the only Wisconsin player named to the Converse All-America team her senior year. Garske played in just nine games for the Fighting Irish averaging 6.3 points and 2.9 rebounds. She will have one-and-one-half years of eligibility at Wisconsin.

Murphy's final recruit is **Gina Edmonds**, a 5–6 point guard from West Nyak, New York. A versatile athlete, Edmonds served as team captain of her high school soccer, basketball and softball teams, earning Most Valuable Female Athlete of her high school class three consecutive years. She helped her Clarkstown High School team to a 23–1 record and quarter-final finish in the New York State large school basketball tournament last year. A deft ball handler, Edmonds averaged eight assists and four steals, while adding 10 points and four rebounds per game her senior season.

Badger returnees include 1987 Big Ten Honorable Mention **Lisa Bonnell** of Merrill, Wisconsin. The 5–11 senior averaged 17 points and 7.5 rebounds last season, which ranked her sixth in scoring and seventh in rebounding among Big Ten players. With one season remaining, Bonnell appears destined to become one of the top career statistical leaders in Wisconsin women's basketball history. She currently ranks sixth in scoring with 933 points, and seventh in rebounding with 540.

"Lisa was the bright spot of our offense last year," Murphy related. "She averaged 17 points and seven rebounds, despite often being double and even triple-teamed by our opponents. She really deserves recognition as one of the top five players in the Midwest.

"She's not Hollywood, Murphy continued. "She's a blue collar, get-down-in-the-trenches-and-get-the-job-done type of player. But then she can come outside and hit the three-pointer, which is pretty glamorous. Her leadership and her work ethic are what we're building our team around right now."

Three other starters also return in junior guards Karen O'Malley (Madison, Wisconsin) and Verdell Hale (Queens, New York), and senior forward DeLinda Hastie (Washington, D.C.). Hastie was Wisconsin's only other double figure scorer, averaging 10.7 points and 7.0 rebounds per game. Hale averaged 4.4 assists and two steals per game while flitting in and out of double figure scoring, completing the season with a 9.7 average. O'Malley proved herself to be a steady player, particularly at the free throw line, where she hit nearly 80 percent of her attempts. She was the fourth leading scorer for the Badgers, averaging 9.2 points and 3.4 assists.



Part-time starter **Shelly Rucinski** (Dousman, Wisconsin), who established herself last season from walk-on to scholarship player, also returns. The 5–8 junior guard started seven games for the Badgers and played in all 28. Another junior guard **Nikki Boucher** (Oregon, Wisconsin) will also lend support for another season. Boucher was the 1987 Athletic Board Scholar for women's basketball.

Additional players include freshmen Jane Runzheimer (Plymouth, Minnesota) and Dee Oestreicher of Madison West High School.

Graduation losses include forward Michelle Fischer (Flint, Michigan), who went from player to Murphy's graduate assistant this season, and guards Lynne Fitzgerald (Boscobel, Wisconsin) and Helen Stoffel (Racine, Wisconsin). Also gone from the 1986–87 season are seniors Vicki Prince (Flint, Michigan) and Kelly Leinfelder (Edina, Minnesota). Both

decided to concentrate on their studies. Walk-ons Margaret Drexler (Appleton, Wisconsin), and Julia Delaney (Stratford, Wisconsin) also will not return.

In addition, centers **Cammy Hudson**, 6–4, (Aurora, Illinois) and 6–3 **Inga Young** (Alexandria, Virginia) completed their eligibility. Young played in all 28 games, averaging four points and rebounds, and two blocks per game. Even with the tallest player in the Badger ranks now only 6–1, Murphy does not consider the lack of height necessarily a liability.

"We're obviously going to be one of the shorter teams, but we're going to turn that into a positive," Murphy said. "We'll be playing an up-tempo game and adding a lot of full-court pressure. Our lack of height could be a problem in a slow-down, half-court game, but we're going to try and control the tempo and pressure the perimeter people."

"I don't think our lack of height will even hurt our rebounding too much," Murphy added. "This is where the three-point play will help neutralize any height disadvantage. The distance of the shot, combined with the smaller, lighter ball, will produce longer rebounds that our guards can scramble for. We're going to call that our shoot and scramble offense."

Murphy was smiling when she indicated the Badgers will use a "shoot and scamble" offense because she knows several players can hit from that three-point range. "Lisa (Bonnell) proved she can be a threat from a distance last season," Murphy said. "And when Julie Garske joins us second semester, she will be an offensive force out there. We'll really have to see who has the range since we've not concentrated on that part of the game before."

The 1987–88 Wisconsin team will continue to follow Murphy's blueprint, engineered toward success. And if anything can be said of Murphy's one year legacy, the team will be competitive, give 100 percent, and surprise a few opponents.

"We lost by nearly 40 points a couple of times last season," Murphy said remembering contests with NCAA quarter-finalists lowa and Ohio State. "I predict we will close that margin substantially this year, and even if it's a loss, I'll count that as improvement. Realistically, that's how good the competition is, and that's how far we have yet to go."


Rebuilding. Murphy established a reputation last season for being extremely honest. Perhaps, for once, a coach is describing her sports program accurately.

Wisconsin Sports Facilities



Weight training is an integral part of the UW athletic program. Weights are available in the varsity weight room (above) as well as in the Shell, and at the SERF. The SERF also features numerous multipurpose gyms, a suspended running track and Olympic size pool.

Athletes at the University of Wisconsin benefit from some of the finest sports facilities found anywhere in the country. From practice and competitive areas to athletic and weight training, Wisconsin offers modern and well-equipped facilities for its women athletes.

The basketball and volleyball teams practice and compete in the Wisconsin Fieldhouse, which seats 12,204. The Fieldhouse features four remodeled locker rooms and a modern athletic training area. Other recent additions include a new lighting system and new sound system.

The Wisconsin tennis teams have a competitive advantage in their ability to play year-round at one of the best college facilities in the United States. Ranked by the USTA as the number one tennis facility in the country, the \$2 million Nielsen Tennis Stadium seats 1,500 spectators. It features 18 tennis courts (12 indoor and six outdoor), five squash courts, and one squash doubles court.

The stadium, located close to the lakeshore dormitories, is named for Arthur C. Nielsen, founder of the Nielsen television rating system. Nielsen captained the Wisconsin men's tennis team from 1916–18 while a student in electrical engineering.

Wisconsin's track teams benefit from practicing and competing during the indoor season in the Camp Randall Memorial Sports Center. Located next to Camp Randall Football Stadium, the "Shell" contains a 220-yard Mondo rubber track, throwing and jumping areas in the infield, and a seating capacity of 2,500.



The UW Fieldhouse is the home of the men's and women's basketball, and the women's volleyball teams. Located adjacent to camp Randall Stadium, the Fieldhouse seats over 12,000 people for athletic events.

During the outdoor season, Wisconsin track and cross country athletes have the opportunity to utilize one of the finest tracks in the Midwest. The newly renovated 400-meter, Mondo-rubber outdoor track is located on the west side of campus. The Dan McClimon Memorial Track, dedicated in honor of the former Wisconsin head men's track and cross country coach, was the site of the 1986 Men's and Women's Big Ten Outdoor Track Championships. Planning and fund-raising are underway for the next phase of construction: the addition of permanent spectator seating with press box and locker room facilities.

The swimming and diving team has the luxury of having two pools in which to practice and compete—the Natatorium adjacent to Unit II, and the new Unit III facility or SERF. The "Nat" contains an eight-lane, 25-yard racing pool equipped with a fully automatic Colorado Timing System and digital readout score board. The 50' × 40' separate diving well is fitted with three onemeter and two three-meter Dura (Maxi) Flex boards. The recently completed Unit III facility features an indoor long course pool with movable bulkheads that more than double the program's training space.

The Wisconsin men's and women's gymnastics teams train and compete in the renovated Armory located on central campus along Lake Mendota. Better known on campus as the Red Gym, the facility provides over 15,000 square feet of training space and specatator seating. Gymnasts are provided plenty of working space and equipment, including a large foam training pit, 10 balance beams, four sets of uneven




Indoor track facilities are located in the Camp Randall Memorial Sports Center adjacent to Camp Randall Football Stadium.

parellel bars, and ample floor exercise practice space.


Outdoor facilities at Wisconsin include soccer fields adjacent to Camp Randall Stadium. The crew boat house, situated on Lake Mendota, provides the Badger crews with a modern facility, including an indoor rowing tank for year-round practice. Construction was just completed on an additional shell storage area, and other construction plans include a second indoor rowing tank, and additional locker room space.

Our teams also have access to several other facilities on campus. The Natatorium and SERF feature numerous multi-purpose

gyms, weight rooms, running tracks, and other athletic facilities for practice and competition.

Other facilities that are an integral part of the athletic program are the coeducational weight training and sports medicine rooms in Camp Randall Stadium. The modern weight training area features Nautilus equipment, free weights, and stereo music in a spacious, fully carpeted room in Camp Randall. Two full-time weight training instructors monitor and advise all Wisconsin student-athletes.

The care, prevention and treatment of injuries to all Wisconsin athletes is supervised by a six-person staff of N.A.T.A. certi-

fied athletic trainers. They are supported by a staff of 25 student trainers and two certified graduate assistants as they care for the nearly 900 men and women athletes at Wisconsin.

The staff utilizes training rooms in the Stadium, Armory, Coliseum, Natatorium, and UW Fieldhouse. All training areas are equipped with the finest therapeutic modalities and rehabilitative apparatus. Other medical specialists assigned to intercollegiate athletics also assist in the diagnosis and treatment of the athletes.

Athletic Conference and Competition







The University of Wisconsin is a Division I member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association. The NCAA, which established women's championships in 1981–82, conducts 33 women's championships in 15 sports.

In addition to its national affiliation, the University of Wisconsin—Madison benefits from the interest and media exposure associated with the Big Ten Conference. As a Big Ten school, Wisconsin athletes compete in conference championships in basketball, cross country, golf, gymnastics, swimming and diving, tennis, indoor and outdoor track and field, and volleyball. The basketball and volleyball teams compete in roundrobin conference action, both at home and away. The other Big Ten sport seasons culminate in a Big Ten Championship event.

Other Big Ten institutions include Illinois (Champaign, III.), Indiana (Bloomington, Ind.), Iowa (Iowa City, Iowa), Michigan (Ann Arbor, Mich.), Michigan State (East Lansing, Mich.), Minnesota (Minneapolis, Minn.), Northwestern (Evanston, III.), Ohio State (Columbus, Ohio), and Purdue (West Lafayette, Ind.).

The Big Ten Conference is considered one of the premier athletic conferences in the nation. From Indiana's 1987 NCAA basketball championship title to Iowa's NCAA field hockey championship, the Big Ten schools have been well represented in national competition.


Begun in 1895, the "Intercollegiate Conference of Faculty Representatives" (popu-

larly known as the Big Ten) has changed little from its original philosophy of faculty control of athletics, and emphasis on the *student*-athlete.

Women's athletics programs became affiliated with the Conference officially in 1981, although unofficial championships had been held among the member institutions since 1972.

Included among the services the Conference provides are:

- + Determines champions in 10 sports for men and 10 sports for women
- Publishes an annual "Records Book" with historical data. Pre-season sports outlooks are also published and distributed, and media guides are provided for football, basketball and volleyball.
- + Collects, compiles and distributes official statistics weekly during the sports seasons
- + Negotiates for television exposure on behalf of the membership
- Provides education on rules governing college athletics, including those covering eligibility, financial aid, practice and competition, and recruiting
- + Provides awards and recognition for Big Ten male and female athletes by selection as player of the week, athlete of the month, All–Big Ten academic and athletic, Conference Medal of Honor, and Athlete of the Year.

Photographers: Photographers may work from any side of the floor, or end of the court.


Media Services: The Wisconsin sports information staff will provide game programs, pregame notes, half-time and final game statistics, and game play-by-play.

Nestled in a chain of four sparkling lakes, the dominant feature on the Madison skyline is the majestic capitol building, whose 200-foot illuminated white dome is visible for miles both day and night.

UW-Madison has ranked among the top ten universities in the United States in every scholarly reputational study since 1910.

Madison is a clean, vibrant city whose chief businesses are education and government. Located just three driving hours from Chicago, one-and-one-half hours from Milwaukee, and five hours from Minneapolis, Madison is consistently rated as one of the most attractive places to live in the country. In 1978, Madison proudly accepted the designation of All-American City given by the national Municipal League.

The Madison campus is located just one mile from the state capitol on a series of hills overlooking scenic Lake Mendota, the largest of the chain of lakes.

The campus covers over 900 acres—most within two blocks of Lake Mendota. Many of the residence halls have the lake in their backyard, and there are numerous bathing beaches along the Mendota shoreline. In addition, the UW Arboretum, a nature study and hiking area, offers another 1,224 acres to the campus community. Also located near the campus is Picnic Point, a 129-acre, park-like peninsula which extends into Lake Mendota and is used for nature study and recreation. Jogging paths and bike trails extend along the entire campus shoreline of Lake Mendota.
