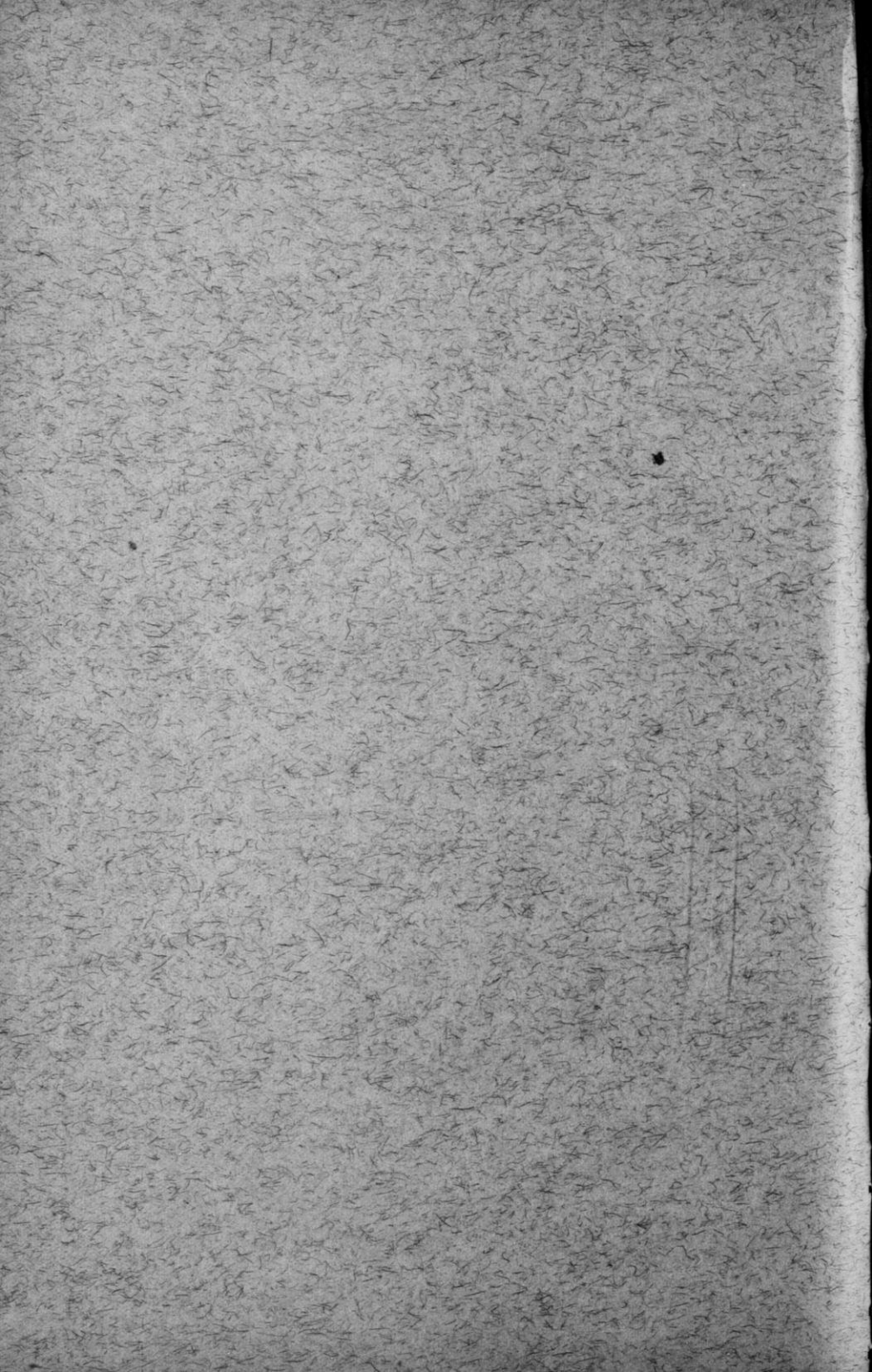

HONORABLE JOHN J. BLAINE,
Governor of Wisconsin.

Sir:—We have the honor to submit in compliance with law, our biennial report of the transactions of this department, for the two years ending June 30, 1926.

The policy of withholding state lands from sale, adopted in 1913, has been continued to the present. An exception was made in a case where the lands were needed for a storage reservoir at the headwaters of the Flambeau River. About 1040 acres of swamp and overflowed lands in Iron County were offered for sale on December 18, 1925, after having been reappraised and advertised pursuant to law. The timber was sold for \$8,348.00, and the right to overflow these lands was sold for \$8,690.24.

This grant was subject to reservations provided for in Paragraph 6, Section 1, of said Chapter 452 of the laws of Wisconsin for the year 1911.

Account of this sale with others will be found in Exhibit G-2, herewith. Other sales were only such as directed by legislature, to perfect titles and establish titles and escheated lands.

Section 24.39, Wisconsin Statutes, created by Chapter 454, Laws of Wisconsin for 1917, empowers the Commissioners to lease parcels of the public lands and to sell timber thereon that has been damaged by fire or wind. Under that section a few leases have been made for hay and pasture meadows.

4 REPORT OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE PUBLIC LANDS

In accordance with Chapter 345, Laws of Wisconsin of 1925, there have been prepared approximately 2650 patents relating to the Fox and Wisconsin River Improvement Company's grant, thereby clearing the title on these lands so affected.

On April 18, 1925, the Commissioners of Public Lands being advised that the last United States Land Office in the state of Wisconsin was abolished, made application to the Interior Department, General Land Office, Washington, D. C., for such records which the government has duplicates. Such transfer was authorized by Bill H. R. 10859, 69th Congress, 1st Session, introduced on March 30, 1926, and passed on May 18, 1926.

It will, therefore, be necessary that the legislature at the coming session of 1927, enact a law to provide for receiving and accepting such transcripts, documents, records, field notes, maps, plats and other papers as are directed by Sections 1 and 2, of said Act, to be turned over by the Federal Government to the state of Wisconsin, and that provision be made for the receiving and safe-keeping of these as public records, and for allowing free access to the same by the authorities of the United States.

Exhibits A to I and Appendix 1 to 4 inclusive, herewith, are intended to show in sufficient detail, the transactions of the department for the biennial term.
