
### Home Economics Is a Leader Field

Each day graduates move into new and unusual careers. The training gives not only a well-rounded general education in science, art, sociology, psychology and economics, but specialized courses such as family economics, family relationships, child development, home management, nutrition, costume design, home planning, demonstration, radio work, textile testing, merchandising, clothing construction, history of costume and interiors.





Teacher: Home Economics and Education courses qualify students for a college degree and a Teacher's Certificate. Teaching youth subject matter closely related to life is a stimulating career with far reaching influence.




Research worker: Home economics combined with bacteriology and biochemistry draws many with scientific curiosity to the laboratories. World nutrition and health problems require and utilize the persistence, industry, and imagination required in the laboratory.



Nursery school teacher: Guiding groups of young children requires knowledge of physical and psychological growth processes, home and family problems, of art, music, literature, and play activities for children.



Homemaker: Career of careers! Mother and daughter, both home economists, use their social and technical knowledge first hand to provide the significant influence of the home in the life of the new generation.



Dietitian: Hospitals, business firms, schools and welfare agencies include specialists in nutrition to manage dietary departments and conduct educational programs. Demand and diversification of opportunities are increasing.



Housing specialist . . . Interior designer: The home economist integrates art studies in space, color, and texture with courses in sociology, history, and economics to develop standards and satisfactions so vital to the environment of the human being.



Merchandiser . . . buyer: Familiarity with consumer needs and standards, with the physical and chemical properties of textiles, and with construction techniques serves the home economist who enters the retailing field.




Institutional manager: Commercial, educational, and government positions are open to the home economist trained for the supervision of all aspects of food service; marketing, preparation, service, and administration.



Home Economist in Commercial Foods: A good science background, skill in food preparation, experience in food scoring and objective tests for quality, and training in food demonstration, journalism, and radio are needed in business.

Textile chemist . . . technician: Textile testing and technical service in retailing, commercial and government laboratories draw those trained in chemistry, physics, and textiles. This field is becoming increasingly important as the use of synthetic fabrics grows.



County home agent . . . 4-H Club leader: Training in home economics with electives in agricultural economics and rural sociology prepares for this field. Rural background, practical homemaking, organization and leadership experiences are desirable.
