The Business Manager reported that as a result of the telephone investigation a new three-year contract with the Wisconsin Telephone Company has been prepared. It was VOTED, That the Business Manager be authorized to sign the contract in behalf of the Regents.

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At a meeting of the Executive Committee of the Regents February 20, 1935, the insurance of the University elevators was ordered placed with the Royal Indemnity Company, New York, for a three-year term, beginning February 2, 1935, at a net premium cost of \$1640.94. It has developed that the Royal Indemnity Company is unable to carry the insurance at this rate. It is therefore

VOTED, That the insurance be placed with the Employers Mutual of Wausau, Wisconsin, for a three-year term at an estimated net premium cost of \$1678.11, with the understanding that the Employers Mutual will guarantee the Regents against any possibility of an assess-

ment.

Regents Callahan and Mead voted "Aye"; Regent Ullsperger "No".

The Secretary presented a communication from J. H. Coe, Treasurer of the Haresfoot Club, together with a resolution adopted at a joint meeting of the Haresfoot Club and the Executive Committee of the Haresfoot Club, requesting the withdrawal of \$2500 from the trust agreement in order that current bills may be paid, reducing the amount of the trust from \$7500 to \$5000. It was

VOTED, That the Regents concur in the withdrawal from the trust as provided in the resolution. (Copies of the trust agreement and the resolution are on file.)
