




The Badger coaching staff uses a computer to analyze team and individual performances.






The Badger women's team incorporates weight training as a regular part of the basketball conditioning program.

The Big Ten Conference ranked second in the nation in attendance last season averaging 1.657 per game. The Southwest Conference, led by Texas, was first with an average of 1.838. Wisconsin's attendance at nearly 1000 per game, ranked 37th of 220 Division I schools in the country.



# Head Coach



### Mary Murphy


Mary Murphy begins her third year as head Badger coach with high hopes and expectations for her young team. Now with her second recruiting class in town, Murphy believes her enthusiasm and hard-work will begin reaping benefits.

Murphy's first recruiting class included five freshmen players, four of whom became starters by the conclusion of 1988. With just one senior on the squad, the youthful Badgers finished the season at 4–24, but gained valuable playing experience that will soon put the Badger program in the upper division of the Big Ten.

The 1988 Badger team was recognized for its individual talents when senior Lisa Bonnell (Merrill, WI), was named second team All—Big Ten, and Kay Fredrickson (Durand, WI), was picked the 1988 Big Ten Freshman of the Year. Despite the record, the Badger fans still turned out in numbers with attendance figures averaging close to 1000 per game.

Murphy brought impressive competitive, academic and coaching credentials to Wisconsin when appointed head coach in 1986. As the former assistant women's basketball coach at Notre Dame for six years, Mary gained experience in all levels of coaching.

As a competitor, she captained the Northwestern University basketball team that won the Big Ten Conference titles in 1979 and 1980. The 1980 Wildcat team also won the Midwest Association of Intercollegiate




Sports for Women Regional Tournament and was defeated in the quarter-finals of the AIAW National Championship.

The Chicago native was named the Chicago area "Player of the Decade," 1970–80, and she was a Kodak All-American regional winner and Wade Trophy finalist her senior

year. She was a four-year starter at guard for the Wildcats.

Murphy graduated in public administration and public policy from Northwestern in 1980, and added a master's degree in business administration from Notre Dame in 1982.

# Assistant Coaches



Michael Peckham

Mike Peckham, a former assistant coach at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, enters his third year with Wisconsin women's basketball as chief recruiting coordinator. An assistant at North Carolina from 1980–86, Mike aided the Tar Heels to four NCAA tournament appearances. Mike serves as the head recruiter, travel and schedule coordinator, in addition to his oncourt coaching duties. He has worked at many summer basketball camps, and is the Co-Director of the Mary Murphy Basketball Camps. Mike is a 1982 graduate of North Carolina in recreation administration.



Donna Freitag

Donna Freitag, a native of Oregon, Wisconsin, returned to Wisconsin in 1986 as second assistant. Freitag earned most valuable player honors at the University of Wisconsin–Platteville for two years before transferring to the University of Iowa. At Iowa, she was named team MVP and captain during the 1982–83 season. Freitag also won the All-Around Athlete award in 1983 and was named to the All-Tournament team at the Sun Dial Classic.

Freitag, a 1983 graduate of Iowa in physical education and health, has also worked at numerous basketball camps and has coached at the high school level. She played in Ireland with the women's semi-professional basketball league for two years prior to her appointment at Wisconsin.



Yulonda Wimbish

Part-time assistant **Yulonda Wimbish** joins the Wisconsin staff after playing four years at top-ranked University of Texas at Austin. As a senior, Wimbish had her best season for Texas, averaging 15.7 points per game to lead the Longhorns. Wimbish was named Southwest Conference Player of the Year in 1988. She started for the U.S. National Team which competed in the Pre-Olympic Invitational Tournament in Seoul, South Korea in 1986. Wimbish, a 1988 graduate of the University of Texas in Public Relations, ranks eighth in scoring at Texas with 1485 career points.

# 1988-89 Preview

### Coach Murphy's Remarks

You are entering your third year at Wisconsin. How do you evaluate the status of your program at this juncture?

This is my third year of coaching, but only the second recruiting class we have brought in. I think whenever one is rebuilding a program, you can expect a lot of turnover in personnel and some unexpected situations. But you learn from your mistakes, and you work to improve the conditions that cause those setbacks.

We are in a better position this year than any other since I've been here. We have better athletes and better students, and more depth at certain positions. We're young still, but these athletes identify with the style of basketball I want to play. They're hard-working, they're enthusiastic, and they're the type of ball players we need to turn the program around here at Wisconsin.

### What are some of the areas you feel needed to be improved after last year's 4–24 performance?

Our performance last season helped us focus on what we needed to do better. Our inadequacies were very obvious. We basically need improvement in three areas: First, our guard play was inconsistent. We need leaders that can hit the

open player and make better decisions on the floor. Second, our field goal shooting was horrendous. You can't win ball games shooting 35 percent (Wisconsin hit 36 percent or less in 14 of 28 games). And finally, we need to improve our post defense. That area has hurt us the past two years. You can't win ball games unless you can shut down the opponent's inside game.


## How have you addressed the areas requiring improvement?

The personnel we have brought in along with our returnees are better capable of handling the level of play in the Big Ten. Our newcomers will have an immediate and profound effect on the team. They have the desire to excel, and they are people who accept a challenge. All five freshmen will see extensive action, and they will all be starters at one time or another. They have that level of ability already.

#### Evaluate the newcomers.

There will be a dramatic improvement in our guard play. **Amy Bauer** (Durand, WI) is a proven player who can hit the open person, is a gifted ballhandler, and makes good decisions in the open court. She collected over 1500 points and 500 assists in her career, so with her shooting ability, she will prove to be an offensive threat as well.





Robin Threatt (Cedar Rapids, IA) is a versatile athlete (offered scholarships in volleyball, basketball, softball and track). With five state sprint titles, her speed will be a real asset. At off-guard, she averaged 27 points last year and hit nearly 60 percent of her shots. I expect the Bauer-Threatt tandem will not only produce more points off the break, but will provide a lot of relief for the inside players with their outside shooting abilities.

Another guard, **Mynette Clark** (Racine, WI) will provide a great deal of creative entertainment for the fans, as well as contribute to our depth at the guard spot. She "shaked and baked" her way to a 17.5 average last season, and added 7.6 rebounds

We'll have more height this season than we've ever had in 6-3 junior college transfer, Janetta Johnson (Ann Arbor, MI), and with 6-2 Jennifer Scotten (Victoria, British Columbia, Canada). Janetta is known as the "block master." She averaged six blocks per game her sophomore JC season, and will be an intimidating force inside. She doesn't like people in her paint, or shooting over her. Jennifer doesn't miss many shots inside. She hit 65 percent from the floor while averaging 23 points and 18 rebounds last year. Our post defense should improve dramatically as these two have the ability to shutdown inside play as well as to help out and recover. They'll also be key individuals in rebounding, which should provide more break-away opportunities.

Our depth at the three spot is greatly improved with the addition of 6–1 **Heather Bostrom** (Rochester, MI), and a walk-on, 6–2 **Michele Kozelka** (Prairie du Chien, WI). Heather is an all-around great player with great speed. She had double figure averages in both points and rebounds, as well as adding three assists, six steals and six blocks per game. Michele is a power forward who contributed 20 points and 10 rebounds her senior year.

### Let's talk about the returnees led by 1988 Big Ten Freshman of the Year, Kay Fredrickson.

Kay Fredrickson (Durand, WI) certainly won the respect of the Big Ten coaches last season with her transition to college ball. She started 25 of 28 games last year, and was third on the team in scoring (8.9 points per game). [Kim] played in 27 games last season and successfully made the transition to facing the basket after playing the post in high school. Both were teammates of Amy Bauer on Durand's two-time state championship basketball squads. I think they'll have a natural communication (with Bauer) on the court, and Amy's presence will allow Kay to play the two and three spots, rather than sometimes fill in at point.


Amy will get some immediate playing experience with the first semester absence of **Gina Edmonds** (West Nyack, NY). Gina, who is ineligible for the first half of the season, was the most experienced returning point guard having played in 25 games last year (started 10). It was a blow to lose Gina, especially with senior guards **Verdell Hale** and **Karen O'Malley** not returning due to medical reasons.

**Lisa Lawrence** (Milwaukee, WI) will continue to improve her play this season after her introduction to college ball in 26 games last year. She will play both the three and four spot for us, and will lend herself well to our breaking style of play.

Our only returning senior will be Shelly Rucinski (Dousman, WI). DeLinda Hastie will not be returning for personal reasons. Others not returning to school are sophomores Julie Garske and Kathy Kamrath. Walk-ons Nikki Boucher, Jane Runzheimer, and Dee Dee Oestreicher will not rejoin the team. Shelly is the captain of the team this year, the first time I have ever named one, and we'll count on her for her leadership role as well as helping us with her perimeter shooting and 'zone busting' abilities.

Lisa Bonnell (Merrill, WI) graduated after averaging 19.6 points per game last year and ranking second in all-time scoring at Wisconsin. How much of a loss is that for this team, and how will you replace that kind of point production?

Lisa was our offense last year. She could play inside, shoot the outside jumper, and was our pri-



mary three-point goal shooter. She was also a very dedicated and hard-working athlete. I don't think we will try to replace her with one person, but rather with several of our talented newcomers. We now have the ability to spread the offense, and that will make us a more successful team. We'll naturally miss her, and we wish her well in her professional basketball career this year in Germany.

# What style of play do you anticipate the combination of newcomers and returnees will best be able to execute?

I would hope we would evolve into a running type of team. That was my goal when we first came here, and I believe we certainly have the talent on this team. We'll have the ability at the post position to get the rebound, and we'll have the ball in people's hands who not only have the speed, but can make the right decisions.

You used the three point shot more than any school in the Big Ten last season (60 of 225 attempts for .267 percent). How much will you employ the extra point play this year?


We'll continue to use it as an offensive weapon, and we'll probably be more effective this year because we'll have more people that can accurately shoot from 19 feet. We have five people who are fairly accurate from that distance, and we'll use it to take some pressure off of our inside players.

# How do you size up the Big Ten Conference race and Wisconsin's hope for a better-thancellar finish this year?

I would hope we'd move up this year. I certainly don't think I0th place was made for Wisconsin. We'll have to stay healthy and play to our abilities. We're not deep at certain positions that we'd be able to recover from a serious injury.

lowa, I believe, is a clear favorite to repeat as Conference champion. They may miss Michele Edwards, but have plenty of talent to cover. Ohio State, Michigan State, and Purdue also have strong returning teams, and it could be Michigan's year as well, with a mature class of juniors and the return of Lorea Feldman.

Big Ten Conference.

The University of Wisconsin is a Division I member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association. The NCAA, which established women's championships in 1981-82, conducts 33 women's championships in 15

In addition to its national affiliation, the University of Wisconsin-Madison benefits from the interest and media exposure associated with the Big Ten Conference. As a Big Ten school, Wisconsin athletes compete in conference championships in basketball, cross country, golf, gymnastics, swimming and diving, tennis, indoor and outdoor track and field, and volleyball. The basketball and volleyball teams compete in roundrobin conference action, both at home and away. The other Big Ten sport seasons culminate in a Big Ten Championship event.

Other Big Ten institutions include Illinois (Champaign, Ill.), Indiana (Bloomington, Ind.), Iowa (Iowa City, Iowa), Michigan (Ann Arbor, Mich.), Michigan State (East Lansing, Mich.), Minnesota (Minneapolis, Minn.), Northwestern (Evanston, Ill.), Ohio State (Columbus, Ohio), and Purdue (West Lafayette. Ind.).

The Big Ten Conference is considered one of the premier athletic conferences in the nation. From Indiana's 1987 NCAA basketball championship title to Iowa's NCAA field hockey championships, the Big Ten schools have been well represented in national competition.

Begun in 1895, the "Intercollegiate Con-

ference of Faculty Representatives" (popularly known as the Big Ten) has changed little from its original philosophy of faculty control of athletics, and emphasis on the student-athlete.

Women's athletics programs became affiliated with the Conference officially in 1981, although unofficial championships had been held among the member institutions since 1972.

Included among the services the Conference provides are:

- ☐ Determines champions in 10 sports for men and 10 sports for women
- ☐ Publishes an annual "Records Book" with historical data. Pre-season sports outlooks are also published and distributed, and media guides are provided for football, basketball and volleyball.
- ☐ Collects, compiles, and distributes official statistics weekly during the sports
- ☐ Negotiates for television exposure on behalf of the membership
- ☐ Provides education on rules governing college athletics, including those covering eligibility, financial aid, practice and competition, and recruiting
- ☐ Provides awards and recognition for Big Ten male and female athletes by selection as player of the week, athlete of the month, All-Big Ten academic and athletic. Conference Medal of Honor, and Athlete of the Year.

## Sports Facilities

Athletes at the University of Wisconsin benefit from some of the finest sports facilities found anywhere in the country. From practice and competitive areas to athletic and weight training, Wisconsin offers modern and well-equipped facilities for its women athletes.

The basketball and volleyball teams practice and compete in the Wisconsin Fieldhouse, which seats 12,204. The Fieldhouse features four remodeled locker rooms and a modern athletic training area. Other recent additions include a new lighting system and new sound system.

The Wisconsin tennis teams have a competitive advantage in their ability to play year-round at one of the best college facilities in the United States. Ranked in 1984 by the USTA as the number one indoor tennis facility in the country, Nielsen Tennis Stadium seats 1500 spectators and is valued at over eight million dollars. It features 18 tennis courts (12 indoor and six outdoor), five squash courts, and one squash doubles court.

The stadium, located close to the lakeshore dormitories, is named for Arthur C. Nielsen, founder of the Nielsen television rating system. Nielsen captained the Wisconsin men's tennis team from 1916 to 1918 while a student in electrical engineering.

Wisconsin's track teams benefit from practicing and competing during the indoor season in the Camp Randall Memorial Sports Center. Located next to Camp Randall Football Stadium, the "Shell" contains a 220-yard Mondo rubber track, throwing and jumping areas in the infield, and a seating capacity of 2500.

During the outdoor season, Wisconsin track and cross country athletes have the opportunity to use one of the finest tracks in the Midwest. The newly renovated 400-meter, Mondo rubber outdoor track is located on the west side of campus. The Dan McClimon Memorial Track, dedicated in honor of the former Wisconsin head men's track and cross country coach, was the site of the 1986 Men's and Women's Big Ten Outdoor Track Championships. Planning and fund-raising are underway for the next phase of construction: the addition of permanent spectator seating with press box and locker room facilities.

The swimming and diving team has the luxury of having two pools where they practice and compete—the Natatorium adjacent

to Unit II, and the new Unit III facility, or SERF. The "Nat" contains an eight-lane, 25-yard racing pool equipped with a fully automatic Colorado Timing System and digital readout score board. The 50'x40' separate diving well is fitted with three one-meter and two three-meter Dura (Maxi) Flex boards. The recently completed Unit III facility features an indoor long course pool with movable bulkheads that more than double the program's training space.

The Wisconsin men's and women's gymnastics teams train and compete in the renovated Armory located on central campus along Lake Mendota. Better known on campus as the Red Gym, the facility provides over 15,000 square feet of training space and spectator seating. Gymnasts are pro-

vided plenty of working space and equipment, including a large foam training pit, 10 balance beams, four sets of uneven parallel bars, and ample floor exercise practice space.

Outdoor facilities at Wisconsin include soccer fields adjacent to Camp Randall Stadium. The crew boat house, situated on Lake Mendota, provides the Badger crews with a modern facility, including an indoor rowing tank for year-round practice. Construction was just completed on an additional shell storage area, and other construction plans include a second indoor rowing tank and additional locker room space.


Our teams also have access to several other facilities on campus. The soon-to-be-

completed McClain Athletic Facility will offer an indoor practice facility for soccer as well as lockers for both track and soccer teams. The Natatorium and SERF feature numerous multi-purpose gyms, weight rooms, running tracks, and other athletic facilities for practice and competition.


Other facilities that are an integral part of the athletic program are the coeducational weight training and sports medicine rooms in Camp Randall Stadium. The modern weight training area features Nautilus equipment, free weights, and stereo music in a spacious, fully carpeted room in Camp Randall. Two full-time weight training instructors monitor and advise all Wisconsin student-athletes.

The care, prevention and treatment of injuries to all Wisconsin athletes is supervised by a six-person staff of N.A.T.A.-certified athletic trainers. They are supported by a staff of 25 student trainers and two certified graduate assistants as they care for the nearly 900 men and women athletes at Wisconsin.

The staff utilizes training rooms in the Stadium, Armory, Coliseum, Natatorium, and UW Fieldhouse. All training areas are equipped with the finest therapeutic modalities and rehabilitative apparatus. Other medical specialists assigned to intercollegiate athletics also assist in the diagnosis and treatment of the athletes.

Two pools are available to the UW men's and women's swimming and diving teams. Competitions are held in both the Natatorium, shown, and the SERF pools.

Both Wisconsin men's and women's teams won the event completing a "double-triple" crown sweep which saw the Badger teams win the cross country, indoor and outdoor track titles in the same year.


Photographers: Photographers may work from any side of the floor, or end of the court.

# Madison: All-American City



Nestled in a chain of four sparkling lakes, the dominant feature on the Madison skyline is the majestic capitol building, whose 200-foot illuminated white dome is visible for miles both day and night.

Madison is a clean, vibrant city whose chief businesses are education and government. Located just three driving hours from Chicago, one-and-one-half hours from Milwaukee, and five hours from Minneapolis, Madison is consistently rated as one of the most attractive places to live in the country. In 1978, Madison proudly accepted the designation of All-American City given by the national Municipal League.

The Madison campus is located just one mile from the state capitol on a series of hills overlooking scenic Lake Mendota, the largest of the chain of lakes.

The campus covers over 900 acres—most within two blocks of Lake Mendota. Many of the residence halls have the lake in their backyard, and there are numerous bathing beaches along the Mendota shoreline. In addition, the UW Arboretum, a nature study and hiking area, offers another 1,224 acres to the campus community. Also located near the campus is Picnic Point, a 129-acre, park-like peninsula which extends into Lake Mendota and is used for nature study and recreation. Jogging paths and bike trails extend along the entire campus shoreline of Lake Mendota.
