THE UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN SYSTEM

The University of Wisconsin System is marking its fifteenth anniversary in the fall of 1986. The UW System was created in October 1971 by a law placing all of the state's public university campuses under a single Board of Regents. The UW System is composed of 13 universities and 13 two-year UW Centers, and UW-Extension which provides outreach services from offices in every county. Although only fifteen years old, the UW System was one of the first statewide higher educational systems in the nation and has pioneered in developing coordinated and high quality programs and services on a statewide basis. System administrative offices are in Madison.

Universities are at Eau Claire, Green Bay, La Crosse, Madison, Milwaukee, Oshkosh, Kenosha-Racine (Parkside), Platteville, River Falls, Stevens Point, Menomonie (Stout), Superior and Whitewater. Centers are at Baraboo, Fond du Lac, Janesville, Manitowoc, Marinette, Marshfield, Menasha, Rice Lake, Richland Center, Sheboygan, Waukesha, Wausau, and West Bend.

MAX R. SPARGER, COMMISSIONER OF ATHLETICS

Max R. Sparger was named athletic commissioner of the Wisconsin State University Conference in July of 1971, succeeding Fred Jacoby.

Sparger has experienced a varied and successful career in athletics as a participant, coach, administrator and official.

A native of Wichita Falls, Texas, Sparger was a member of the UW-Stout athletic staff from 1959 to 1971, and athletic director his last two years there.

The Commissioner grew up in St. Paul Park, Minnesota, graduating from high school there in 1952. He earned his bachelor's degree in 1956 from Dubuque (Iowa) University, where he played football and wrestled during his college career.

Following graduation from college, Sparger coached high school and junior college sports in Ford Dodge, Iowa, leaving to join the Stout staff as assistant football and basketball coach in 1959. He received his master's degree in education from Macalester College, St. Paul, Minnesota, in 1961, and since then has done advance work at the University of Minnesota.

He became head football coach in 1963, and was selected to receive an award for "Outstanding Teaching" during that year. He guided Stout to a Conference championship in 1965, after which he was named "Coach of the Year" in N.A.I.A. District 14. He gave up his football coaching duties after becoming athletic director in 1969.

Sparger was inducted into the UW-Stout "Hall of Fame" in 1980, and into the NAIA District 14 "Hall of Fame" in 1985.

TOM BUTLER, SPORTS INFORMATION DIRECTOR

Tom Butler joined the WSUC staff part-time May 1, 1967, to assist the Commissioner with the dissemination of sports information. The Madison native graduated from East High School in 1942.

Following three years in the Navy during World War II, he received a B.A. degree in journalism from the UW-Madison in January of 1950. After working as sports editor of the Stevens Point Daily Journal and the Daily Jefferson County Union (Fort Atkinson), Butler joined the Wisconsin State Journal as a sports writer February 1, 1953. He has been there since.

GENE CALHOUN, SUPERVISOR OF FOOTBALL OFFICIALS

Gene Calhoun, a veteran Wisconsin athletic official, became supervisor of Wisconsin State University Conference officials in 1966. He has more than 30 years experience in officiating.

Calhoun graduated from Madison East High School in 1941, served in the Army Air Corps during World War II and is a retired lieutenant colonel in the Air Force Reserves. He earned his bachelor's degree from the UW-Madison in 1947, and his law degree in 1950. He is a practicing attorney in Madison.

An official since 1947, he worked in the Big 10 for 20 years, and was referee in the 1968 and 1976 Rose Bowl games, the 1971 Cotton Bowl game, the 1974 Sugar Bowl and the 1981 Orange Bowl game.

He retired from active officiating after the Orange Bowl and assumed the duties of Supervisor of Football Officials for the Big 10 in 1982.

OTTO PULS, SUPERVISOR OF BASKETBALL OFFICIALS

Otto R. Puls is supervisor of Wisconsin State University Conference basketball officials. Gene Calhoun will continue as supervisor of football officials.

Puls, a veteran high school and college official, graduated from Madison East High School and the University of Wisconsin, where he earned a B.S. degree in Pharmacy. He currently is chief pharmacist at the Central Wisconsin Center for Developmentally Disabled in Madison.

Otto played baseball at East and at UW-Madison. Following college he played professional baseball in the Baltimore Orioles farm system.

He started officiating in 1955 and has worked Big Ten football for the past 12 years. During that span he officiated six Michigan-Ohio State football games, the 1978 Tangerine Bowl, 1981 Orange Bowl and Rose Bowl games in 1977 and '82.

OSHKOSH LINEMAN HONORED

Defensive lineman Scott Rucynski of Oshkosh was named to the NAIA Division II second All-American team in 1986. Rucynski became only the third player in Oshkosh history to receive NAIA All-American recognition. Defensive linemen Len Kurzynske and Jay Hautala were chosen in 1978.

ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

Platteville's Mike Hintz and Mark Rae were named to the College Sports Information Director's of American Academic All-American first team in 1985. Hintz, a junior defensive back from Waukesha (South), is a mechanical engineering major and Rae, a sophomore punter from Marshfield (Columbus) is pursuing an electrical engineering degree.

PREVIEW OF 1986 WSUC FOOTBALL SEASON

The 1985 football scenario in the Wisconsin State University Conference aptly describes what uncertainty prognosticators might expect while trying to predict 1986. La Crosse won the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics Division II national championships and yet finished second in the WSUC last fall.

River Falls won the conference with a 6-1-1 record and beat the Indians along the way, 34-21. La Crosse also was tied by Stevens Point and Oshkosh. River Falls missed an unbeaten season by falling to the Pointers, 23-19, in the season finale. The Falcons also were tied by Eau Claire, 6-all.

So, nothing really has changed much in the WSUC and don't expect anything but the unexpected this season. One unusual aspect last season was that eight of the nine conference teams were involved in at least one tie game. Only Platteville played to a decision in all 10 of its outings.

If there's such a thing as a favorite this year it would have to be River Falls, if only because the Falcons are defending champions. But, there is more to that conclusion. Coach Mike Farley has 52 lettermen returning, including tackle Jim Benick, guard Jim Kuchta and running back Greg Corning from the offense.

Farley doesn't have quarterback Clark Luessman this year, but sophomore Mark Cota and Ritchie Narges are capable of dividing that assignment and Corning figures to provide an impressive threat running from the Falcons' potent wishbone attack.

La Crosse could have the best shot at dethroning River Falls from the WSUC. The Indians hit their peak in the playoffs and finished the season with 11 victories. But, Coach Roger Harring must find replacements for all-American guard Tom Newberry and running back Dan Lowney, the WSUC's No. 2 rusher. The defense is strong and sophomore Steve Althaus, who sparked the surge to the national championships, could be the quarterback of the future.

Eau Claire still features a formidable defense and that's where it all starts in the eyes of coaches. Coach Link Walker is bound to miss WSUC rushing leader Lee Weigel, so he must find a replacement or two to shore up the Blugold offense.

Stevens Point would be a likely threat to challenge the Falcons, but Coach D.J. LeRoy is going to be starting his first year without quarterback Dave Geissler, who played so brilliantly the past four seasons. Talented running back Mike Christman returns, but finding a dependable replacement for Geissler looks like an awesome assignment.

Stout hopes to surge back to football prominence under new Coach James Richard Lawrence, who will scrap the veer offense and operate out of the Pro-I. The Blue Devils need confidence, and Lawrence, a former University of Wyoming coach, hopes to instill that with some early success.

Platteville might shake up the favorites with a strong junior class returning with confidence and optimism. Seven 1985 starters from each side of the ball return as Coach George Chryst plots strategy. His Pioneers split in 10 games last fall after a slow start. They must shake the bad taste left from a season-ending 24-7 loss to Eau Claire.

Bob Berezowitz starts his second year at the Whitewater helm and is bolstered by the presence of veteran quarterback Lance Leipold, who finished second in WSUC passing efficiency last fall. Berezowitz also has some critical holes to fill before getting his Warhawks back into contention.

Superior Coach Gil Krueger finds himself in a similar situation with quarterback Craig Haugo back for his senior year but some top performers from last year gone. Krueger must fill serious voids in his defense.

A lapse in the middle of last season prevented Oshkosh from finishing as the surprise team in the WSUC. Following a 62-6 shellacking from Stevens Point, Coach Ron Cardo's Titans rebounded and found respectability. Cardo now is searching for consistency.

PROSPECTS FOR 1986

Although their 5-4-1 record last year was the Blugolds' worst over the past five seasons, they still have been the most successful WSUC team over that span. The key for Coach Link Walker is to regain the formula that enabled the Blugolds to win undisputed conference championships in 1981 and '83.

Walker, beginning his 37th year in coaching and 19 as head man at Eau Claire, starts the season with 37 returning lettermen, including his entire defensive unit. Among them are defensive tackles Kevin Fitzgerald and Randy Duxbury, linebackers Jerry Annis and John Kuhn, end Paul Sinclair and noseguard Joe Kempen. The Blugolds had the second best defense in the WSUC last fall, yielding an average of only 144 yards rushing and 107 yards passing a game.

Developing a consistent offense remains a high priority. Replacing two-time NAIA All-American running back Lee Weigel, tight end Darryl Goehring and center Todd Reinhardt is a formidable assignment. Weigel was the WSUC rushing leader with 974 yards and Reinhardt the all-conference center.

There's good size and experience in the offensive line, headed by 6-4, 270-pound Jeff Day. Bob Gelhaus returns at quarterback after gaining some valuable experience last fall as a sophomore. Weigel averaged more than 30 carries a game last season, so Walker is looking for someone to pick up the slack.

Blugold defenders intercepted 25 passes last fall, the second highest total in school history, while also holding opponents to 2,727 total yards, the best effort since 1977. But, the offensive total of 2,682 yards was the lowest total since 1975 and only the second time since then a Walker team has not gained at least 3,000 yards in a season.

PROSPECTS FOR 1986

How can the Indians duplicate the 1985 season? That's probably what Coach Roger Harring is asking as La Crosse prepares for the coming campaign. The Indians whipped Carroll College, Northwestern (Iowa) and Pacific Lutheran last fall on the way to the NAIA Division II national championship.

Harring and his team are not without incentives. The Indians finished second to River Falls in the WSUC last season and still won a national title. They failed to beat three conference opponents. Harring has some hugh gaps to fill if the Indians expect to come close to last year's success.

First, All-American guard Tom Newberry and running back Dan Lowney, the No. 2 rusher in the WSUC, are gone from the offense. Defensively the Indans will be without end Jay Wolowicz, linebacker Dale Gottschalk and cornerback Pat Bushman, three all-conference performers. Gottschalk also earned All-American honors.

The defense still should be strong. Senior tackle Phil Ertl, another all-conference choice, and senior linebacker Cirt Tesch anchor that unit. La Crosse allowed only 103 yards a game rushing last fall and led the WSUC in total defense. That's the tradition the Indians will ride into the 1986 season.

The squad is rich in quarterbacks with senior Mark Capstran, junior Todd Oberg and sophomore Steve Althaus returning. All started at one time or another last year and Althaus came on strong in the playoffs. Junior Ted Pretasky and senior Matt Pekarske get the first crack at replacing Lowney. Harring also must retool the offensive line and that's a project with Newberry gone.

PROSPECTS FOR 1986

Coach Ron Cardo's Titans compiled a 3-7 record his first year at the helm in 1984 and last season improved to 4-5-1. This season he and his Titans are confident they can move up another couple notches. Cardo's club showed signs last year of making a serious run in the WSUC. The Titans beat Eau Claire, 23-13; tied second place La Crosse, 14-all, and lost by just three points to champion River Falls.

But, Oshkosh also was smothered by Stevens Point, 62-6, and bowed by 22-21 in the season finale to Whitewater. So, one of Cardo's priority items going into preseason practice is establishing some kind of consistency. This the Titans should develop during the normal course of maturity.

They were the youngest team in the WSUC last year and even now Cardo's roster consists of only five seniors among 40 lettermen. He also has 19 juniors and 16 sophomores who won monograms last fall as freshmen.

Among those returning are the four most productive offensive players on last year's roster, including quarterbacks Jeff Peterson and Ken Maly. Peterson passed for 475 yards last season and Maly 225. They will battle for the starting job.

Rob Frahm, a second team all-conference running back, rushed for 733 yards in 10 games and he was followed closely by Mark Matzke, who gained 565 yards rushing. Jim Linnabary and John LaFleur, the team's leading pass receivers, also return along with some promising offensive linemen.

All-conference defensive linemen Scott Rucynski has graduated but the two top linebackers, Ed Fryman and John Schmidt, along with defensive backs Steve Finco and David Queen and defensive tackle Mike LeClair return.

PROSPECTS FOR 1986

A strong junior class returns for its senior season and Coach George Chryst is blessed with experience at most positions for the first time in several years. He expects 44 lettermen to report for fall practice, including seven starters from each of the offensive and defensive units.

Among returnees are split end Jamie Scherkenbach and defensive back Mike Hintz, both first team all-conference performers last season. Also back are quarterback H.T. Kinney, center John Mamerow, punter Mark Rae and defensive tackle Dave Rooyakkers, all of whom made the second all-conference team in 1985.

That doesn't mean there aren't some serious voids Chryst must fill. Gone is all-conference offensive tackle Paul Gruner, along with halfback Gary Pronchinski, kicking specialist Scott Sindelar and linebacker Bill Weichmann, end Tom Hunsader and cornerback Steve Lindauer from the defense.

Kyle Cherry, a transfer from UW-Eau Claire, is expected to vie for placekicking chores. Tight end Larry Tonyan, a junior from McHenry, Ill., and sophomore defensive tackle Jeff Pardell of Platteville were the Pioneers' most improved players last fall and Chryst hopes their progress continues in 1986.

Lack of size in the line and overall speed are concerns, but the Pioneers acquired a winning attitude while rolling up a 5-3 conference record last season, good for fourth in the league. Kinney will be a key. He passed for 1,276 yards and seven touchdowns in '85.

PROSPECTS FOR 1986

The Falcons are shooting for their third straight WSUC championship and Coach Mike Farley has 52 lettermen returning who figure to make a strong run at it. Not a single River Falls player made the all-conference offensive first team last fall but the Falcons produced the best rushing statistics and the second best total offense in the league.

Anchoring the offense will be tackle Jim Benick, guard Jim Kuchta and running back Greg Corning, all of whom made the second all-conference team a year ago. Corning ranked third in conference rushing with 703 yards in eight games and second in scoring with 10 touchdowns.

Farley will have a difficult time filling voids created by the loss of all-conference defensive performers Steve Frantl at linebacker, Mike Annis at end and Ellis Wangelin in the secondary. The latter also was a return specialist. Tackle Bruce Rivard and nose guard Kent Gray will anchor the defensive line.

Sophomore Mark Cota probably will get the first call at quarterback with Clark Luessman gone. Ritchie Narges again is expected to divide his time between quarterback and halfback in Farley's run oriented wishbone offense.

The defensive secondary features three returning starters in strong safety Jay Stuttgen, free safety Phil Gribble and right corner David Praschak. Rod Stengl probably will take Wangelin's spot at the other corner. Tim Fellenz returns with good credentials as a placekicker.

PROSPECTS FOR 1986

The Pointers will be starting their first football season in four years without quarterback Dave Geissler, the conference's most valuable player last fall. He also led the WSUC in passing four times and total offense three of the last four years. There's no denying replacing him is Coach D.J. LeRoy's top priority.

But, the Pointers also lost tight end Guy Otte, guard Mark Reitveld and wide receiver Jim Lindholm, three more all-conference players from the offense, so LeRoy's job is magnified. End Dennis Lane and linebacker Mike Reuteman are gone from the defense, so a rebuilding project is necessary for the Pointers to come close to last year's 8-2-1 record.

On the plus side, running back Mike Christman and wide receiver Dave Steavpack return. Christman, a speedster, led the WSUC with 55 pass receptions last fall and gained 529 yards rushing with 5.5 yards per carry. Kevin Knuese also returns to help in the ball-carrying department.

Senior Todd Emslie and junior Dan Dantoin are quarterback possibilities. Linebacker Tom Finco, free safety Rich Smigaj and cornerback Greg Dantoin give the Pointers some continuity on defense. Recruiting this year is important because LeRoy doesn't feel he has the personnel currently to replace all his losses.

Compounding the problem is the fact that Stevens Point might be facing its toughest schedule in history. The Pointers start the season on the road against non-conference opponents South Dakota State and Dayton. When they return home, La Crosse and non-conference foe Northwest Missouri will be waiting on successive Saturdays.

PROSPECTS FOR 1986

The Blue Devils start 1986 with a new coach, a new direction and a new confidence. James Richard Lawrence replaced Bob Kamish. Lawrence came to Stout from the University of Wyoming, where he was administrative assistant to the head football coach, recruiting coordinator and coach of outside linebackers.

Lawrence's main job will be to rejuvenate a program that slumped to a 7-25-1 record during the last three seasons. He plans to scrap the veer offense and operate out of a Pro-I. Bob Lindberg is the only returning quarterback with experience, but everybody starts from scratch under a new coach.

Offensive inconsistency plagued the Blue Devils for three years. Last season they finished seventh in conference rushing and last in passing and total offense. Defensively they were considerably more competitive, finishing sixth in rushing defense, third against the pass and fourth in total defense.

Running back Chuck Carr and guard Rich Rupp lead offensive returnees. Carr gained 435 yards rushing in eight conference games last season. Defensive tackle Brandt Olsen and cornerback Scott Romenesko lead veterans on that side of the ball.

Lawrence concedes it's too early for him to evaluate strengths and weaknesses of his club. He's still not that familiar with personnel. "We are still very early in the development stages," he said. "We have almost doubled the number of athletes from those who finished last season. They are enthusiastic and ready for the football season to start."

PROSPECTS FOR 1986

The Yellowjackets made modest strides last season with a 2-8-1 record, but it marked their best showing in 13 years and the Superior campus bristles with optimism as veteran Coach Krueger starts his third year at the helm. He continues the rebuilding project wih 38 lettermen, including eight offensive starters and six from the defense.

One of the principal reasons for optimism is the return of quarterback Craig Haugo for his senior year. He passed for 141 yards a game last season and was one of only two conference quarterbacks to complete more than 100 passes during 1985. He was the "new kid on the block" working with a young team last year. This season he should be more at ease.

Haugo faces a couple of drawbacks, though. Superior's leading rusher, Fred McClellan, and top pass receiver, Jon Marquardt, are gone, so Krueger must find replacements for those key positions. Tight end Andy Johnson, though, returns and he caught 23 passes in 1985.

The big job defensively will be replacing linebackers Phil Eiting and Chuck Janovick. Eiting made the all-conference first team last fall and Janovick was honorable mention. Terry Senn, at 6 feet and 260 pounds, will more than hold his own at nose guard in his junior season.

Senior guard Greg Conner is a fixture in the offensive line, and Krueger expects to get help in the running department from talented Keith Turner, a 5-11, 215-pound transfer from Vermilion Community College.

PROSPECTS FOR 1986

The pressures of a first-year coach are behind Bob Berezowitz and he heads into his second season at the helm of the Warhawks with more confidence and resolve. He has experienced first hand the additional burdens of head coaching as compared with the duties of an offensive coordinator. Also, his squad knows what to expect from him and should be more at ease.

Last season was a tough one for the Warhawks, who slumped to 3-4-1 in the conference and 3-7-1 overall. The highlight was a 28-24 victory over Stevens Point following four winless games at the outset. They also won two of their last three games and hope to build on that with a fast start in '86.

One of the most stabalizing aspects at the start will be the presence of veteran quarterback Lance Leipold, who finished second in passing efficiency among conference signal-callers last fall. He passed for almost 160 yards a game and will be backed this season by a stable of strong running backs, including George Rainey, Jim Jaworski and Phil Fader.

Linebacking appears to be strong with a corps that includes veterans Joe Westen and Bill Wickman. A priority item early is building a competent secondary to recplace last year's threesome of all-conference standout Tim McNeill, Chris Heller and Bill Schulte. Berezowitz also must find replacements in several key areas of both offensive and defensive lines.

The secondary and line stability are items Berezowitz hopes to straighten out during opening games against non-conference opponents Dubuque University and Ferris State. Besides McNeill, critical voids are apparent with the loss of offensive tackle Stuart Rindy, tight end Jon Giese, wide receiver Todd Kuehn and Joel Gmack, the WSUC's leading punter last fall and one of the top placekickers.

Eau Claire advanced with a 63-45 opening round victory over Cabrini of Pennsylvania. The Blugolds finished with a 24-7 record. They averaged 64.4 points offensively for 31 games and 55.1 defensively.

His 161 victories and .719 winning percentage both top the Warhawk list.

When Eau Claire defeated Platteville, 67-54 in 1986, it marked the 500th career victory for veteran Blugold coach Ken Anderson. He has guided the Blugolds to 11 WSUC championships since 1970.

PREVIEW OF THE 1986-87 BASKETBALL SEASON WISCONSIN STATE UNIVERSITY CONFERENCE

Long-time observers of Wisconsin State University Conference basketball have learned never to venture too far out on a limb when predicting what to expect from year to year. The conference usually possesses exceptional balance that creates intense interest.

The tendency this year is to say Stevens Point, Whitewater and Eau Claire again because that's the order in which they finished last season. But, all three clubs have lost key players, while teams like Stout, Platteville and River Falls have enough veterans returning to put the heat on traditional powers.

It's particularly interesting to consider last season's events before getting serious about the coming campaign. Whitewater was highly ranked in NCAA Division III ratings all season and had the league's most valuable player in Dwayne Johnson. Yet, the Warhawks finished second to Stevens Point.

The Pointers won their fifth straight title but lost to Eau Claire at home, 47-46, in the NAIA District 14 playoffs. That sent the Blugolds to the National Tournament in Kansas City. Point had beaten Eau Claire twice previously during the regular season, including a 61-38 decision just a few weeks prior to the district meet.

Eau Claire went farther than any conference team in post-season play and yet lost five times in the WSUC, twice to Stevens Point and once each to River Falls, Whitewater and Stout. It was that kind of year.

The consensus of opinion among WSUC coaches is that Eau Claire, Stevens Point and Whitewater will battle for the title again, while Platteville and Stout have a chance of making it a five-team race. Chuckie Graves makes the Blugolds potent again and Coach Ken Anderson has added some talented newcomers.

Coach Dave Vander Meulen faces a formidable rebuilding job at Whitewater, but the Warhawks expect people like Robert Barnes and Duane Vance to respond to the challenge. The Warhawks are only a couple years removed from a national championship with hopes still high for a repeat.

Stevens Point Coach Jay Eck is under the gun to continue a dynasty that has produced five consecutive championships. He has the returning talent to get the job done, but not without a struggle. The presence of 6-7 Tim Naegeli and guard Craig Hawley should help put the Pointers in another challenging position.

Coach Bo Ryan has his program in place at Platteville and the Pioneers could be ready to make their move even though they are still young. Steve Showalter, Rock Ripley and Randy Kazin could lead the charge.

Platteville ranks as a prime darkhorse candidate along with Stout, where Coach Dwain Mintz developed a tenacious outfit last year with a penchant for upsets. This might be the year the Blue Devils recapture the spirit of '75, when they last won a title. Ironically, they shared the crown that year with Platteville.

River Falls is an unknown quantity with the only new coach in the conference. Former UW-Madison assistant Rick Bowen replaced Stan Jack in June and the Indiana graduate is eager to run his own show. With returnees like Paul Denny and Greg Martin, Bowen could create some waves this season.

La Crosse, Oshkosh and Superior appear to have the toughest road back. Each has the potential to cause any opponent problems on a given night, but finding consistency remains a stumbling block for Coaches Burt McDonald, Jim McGrath and Chris Ritchey.

PROSPECTS FOR 1986-87

The Blugolds have experienced an unaccustomed drought under veteran Coach Ken Anderson. They now have gone four seasons without a WSUC championship, the longest dry spell in Anderson's tenure at Eau Claire. He won or shared 11 titles in his 18 seasons and advanced to the NAIA National Tournament in Kansas City nine times.

Eau Claire had the ingredients to go all the way last season, especially on defense, where the Blugolds ranked No. 1 in the NAIA. They also forced more turnovers than any other Eau Claire team since those records have been kept. Stevens Point and Whitewater proved to be just a little tougher, but that could all change.

All-Conference Chuckie Graves returns along with his backcourt runningmate Mike Blair. But, Anderson must find a replacement for all-conference forward Brian Krueger, the team's most valuable player last year. There doesn't seem to be that kind of power on the bench, but newcomers might help.

Jeff Coenen, a 6-8 prospect who averaged 24 points and 10 rebounds for DePere, has a good shot at playing early. Also, Bill Moore, a 6-5 swingman who averaged 25.6 points and 13 rebounds for his high school team in Hamtramck, Mich., might be Anderson's most valuable recruit.

Coach Burt McDonald lost his three most productive players from last season, including 6-8 Paul Kuske, who averaged 16.4 points a game. Also gone are Lee Stahl with his 15.7 average and guard Bruce Conner, who averaged 9.2 points and 5.1 assists a game last season.

The leading returnee is guard Eric Chudzik, who averaged 7.2 points. So, McDonald faces a massive rebuilding job. He hopes to get some center help from senior Dave Bartz and sophomore Tom Gray. Both are 6-8 lettermen.

The Indians struggled most of last season, finishing seventh in the WSUC with a 5-11 record and 11-15 overall. They had the worst field goal percentage in the conference, .451, and were sixth in free throw shooting. Kuske made them respectable with his rebounding but somebody has to pick up that slack.

McDonald figures the conference will be tougher this season than even in recent years. His squad will be quicker than a year ago, but lacks experience, of course. Newcomers who are expected to provide some help are 6 4-1/2 forward Andy Mueller of Green Bay (East), 6-3 guard Scott Johnson and 5-11 guard John Veith, both of Madison (LaFollette).

The Titans finished a disappointing eighth (3-13) in the conference last season and 8-18 overall. Coach Jim McGrath's Titans scored more points than any team in the WSUC, but they also yielded more points than any of their opponents. This must be rectified for Oshkosh to regain its former basketball stature.

Rick Bowen, former assistant to Steve Yoder for four years at the UW-Madison, became Falcons head coach in June when Stan Jack resigned to enter private business. Bowen, an Indiana University graduate who also assisted Yoder at Ball State and has head coaching experience in high schools, tackles his new job with enthusiasm.

The Falcons need some players, but Bowen does start with the advantage of having two all-conference performers, 6-0 guard Greg Martin and 6-9 center Paul Denny, as the nucleus. Denny has an excellent touch around the basket and can control a game from there. Martin shoots well from outside and will be a threat from the new three-point range. Steve Justice will man the other guard spot and 6-8 Dennis Amy should help inside.

Mark Stevens, a 6-7, 220-pound junior leads returnees. He and Stephan were principal reasons why Stout averaged 37 rebounds a game and finished ninth in the NAIA in that department. Another veteran who should help the Blue Devils challenge this season is 6-4 guard Brian Ellingson, who led the conference with 6.9 assists a game last season.

Among newcomers, redshirt Cedric Howleit, could help immediately. The 6-5 forward averaged 19.2 points and 8.5 rebounds at Collins High School in Chicago and "has very good potential to be a factor," says Mintz.

Attendance jumped at the end of last season when the Blue Devils won four of their last five games, including a 47-44 decision over Eau Claire. Mintz needs an outside shooter, but the feeling in Menomonie is this team could mount Stout's first serious challenge in several years.

PROSPECTS FOR 1986-87

If Coach Chris Ritchey could find that one key player in the front line, the Yellowjackets might challenge for the first division for the first time in years. Superior played respectable enough most of the time last season but lacked the one dominating guy who could put an opponent away.

Ritchey does have a competent group of returnees, including 6-4 guard Jerome Jackson, who finished eighth in conference scoring with a 14.9 average. Then, 6-5 forward Charles Oates averaged 10.7 points with 6-5 guard Rich Bourget at 9.6.

The Yellowjackets need a big guy to bang the boards. Their top man last season, Dino Wesley with 6.8 rebounds a game, will not be back. Superior finished eighth in rebounding last year with only 24.8 a game. Ironically, champion Stevens Point finished ninth.

But, the Pointers didn't miss many shots and that's why they had so few rebounding chances. The same can't be said for the Yellowjackets, who shot only .469 from the floor. Ritchey has high hopes, though, his team can improve with help from Dean Buckner, a 6-6 junior college transfer, and a few other "big" men who have shown interest in Superior.

PROSPECTS FOR 1986-87

Coach Dave Vander Meulen appears to be facing the most prodigious rebuilding job among WSUC mentors this season. You can't lose Dwayne Johnson, Gary Ruch, Duane Byrd, Pete Friedrichs and Derrick Johnson and think otherwise. Dwayne Johnson was the most dominating player in the WSUC last season and his loss alone will cause the veteran coach some sleepless nights.

Still, other conference coaches will not initiate a "tag day" on Vander Meulen's behalf. He is not exactly coaching in a depressed area, especially with people like 6-8 Robert Barnes, 6-2 Duane Vance and 5-9 Mark Duckworth returning. Vance averaged 11.6 points and shot .550 from the floor last season, while Barnes contributed 9.7 points and 7.8 rebounds each time out.

The Warhawks also have a strong winning tradition. They finished second last season at 13-3, only a game behind champion Stevens Point, and were 24-4 overall. Eventually they wound up third in the NCAA Division III Midwest Regional Tournament.

This is the year 6-5 Joe Bocker, 6-7 Randy Maerz, 6-5 Barry Schaffner and 6-8 Kevin Steussi might blossom. Also, Vander Meulen has a strong track record recruiting and he could have some surprise newcomers. Among his early commitments was 6-3 Craig Coulthart from Whitewater High School.

LA CROSSE SETS POINT RECORD

La Crosse coasted to its eighth straight Wisconsin State University Conference indoor track championship in 1986 with a record-shattering 230 points.

Stevens Point finished second with 103 points and was followed by Stout 74. Oshkosh 58, Whitewater 54, Eau Claire 42, Platteville 24, River Falls 4, and Superior 0.

Double winners were Earl Novotney of La Crosse in the 300 and 440-yard dashes and Stevens Point's Arnie Schraeder in the mile and two-mile runs.

La Crosse's Eric Keller accounted for the only record when he won the pentathlon with 3,169 points. It eclipsed the 3,075 points teammate Mike Meeteer scored a year ago. Meeteer did not compete last week because of an injury.
