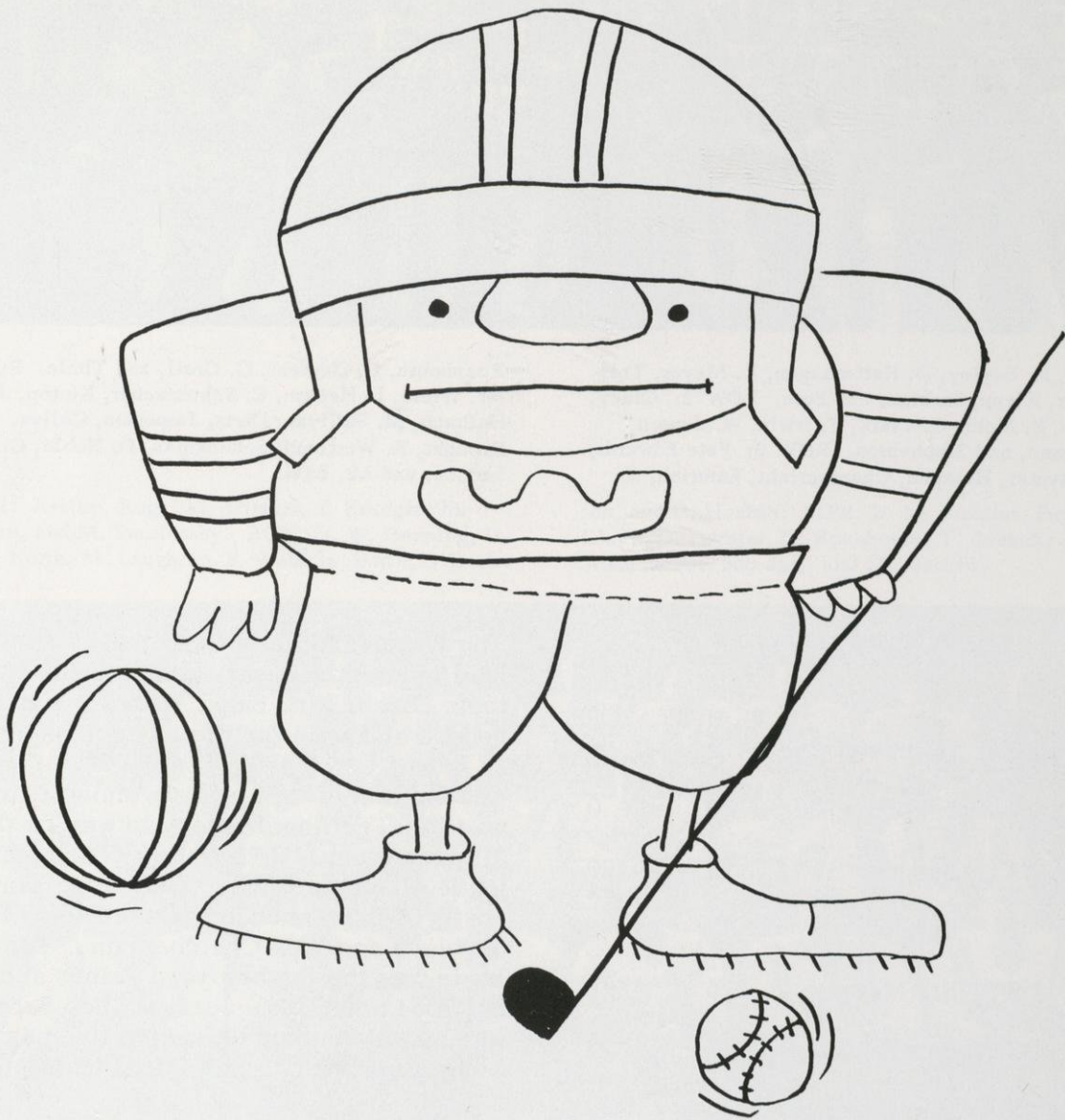
Skits were presented by all four classes, the drama club, the chorus, and the women of the faculty during the pep assembly.
