Madison, Wisconsin

Friday, November 9, 1928, 10 A. M.

Communications were received from the absent members in explanation of their absence.

Regent Olbrich, as chairman of the finance committee, explained how the committee had prepared the budget and moved that the budget, not including requests for buildings and land, be approved as presented. The motion was seconded by Regent Schmidtmann,

Action upon the Budget, exclusive of land and buildings, which was postponed earlier in the meeting, was again brought up and upon motion of Regent Schmidtmann, seconded by Regent Faast, the budget was approved as presented. (Copy on file)

Upon motion of Regent Callahan, seconded by Regent Faast, it was VOTED, That the President of the Board be requested to attend the annual meeting of the Association of Governing Boards of State Universities and Allied Institutions, at Ames, Iowa, on November 15, 1928.

The matter of the location of the Social Science and Law Building was left to the Executive Committee. (See Nov. 10/2 8, b. 1)

Upon motion of Regent Bachman, seconded by Regent Callahan, the following recommendation of the University Faculty was adopted:

That the By-Laws of the Regents, Faculty Rules - Chapter IV, Mesection 1. 1.b/ be so amended as to increase the number of members of the athlete from seven to ten, two of the additional members to be representa-A tives of the Alumni, and one additional member a representative of the Faculty, and that the By-Law as amended read as follows:

> Subject to the authority of the faculty, the control of intercollegiate athletics shall continue to be vested in an Athletic Council, which shall remain a sub-committee of the Committee on Student Life and Interests, this Council to consist of ten members to be appointed by the President of the University, at least four of whom shall have the rank of professor; with the provision that the Business Manager of the University shall be one of the six faculty appointees, the chairman of the (faculty) Committee on Student Life and Interests another, the Alumni Association through its executive committee, as a result of securing the sentiment of the local Wisconsin Alumni Associations of the country, nominating to the President three members of the Athletic Council - whether such alumni thus nominated shall or shall not be residents of Madison being left to the Alumni Association - and one member of

which Athletic Council shall be the President of the Student Athletic Board.

The Secretary read a communication from Henry E. Smith, Secretary of the Wisconsin City Superintendent's Association, which was ordered placed on file.
