THE UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN SYSTEM

The University of Wisconsin System is marking its sixteenth anniversary in the fall of 1987. The UW System was created in October 1971 by a law placing all of the state's public university campuses under a single Board of Regents. The UW System is composed of 13 universities and 13 two-year UW Centers, and UW-Extension which provides outreach services from offices in every county. Although only sixteen years old, the UW System was one of the first statewide higher educational systems in the nation and has pioneered in developing coordinated and high quality programs and services on a statewide basis. System administrative offices are in Madison.

Universities are at Eau Claire, Green Bay, La Crosse, Madison, Milwaukee, Oshkosh, Kenosha-Racine (Parkside), Platteville, River Falls, Stevens Point, Menomonie (Stout), Superior and Whitewater. Centers are at Baraboo, Fond du Lac, Janesville, Manitowoc, Marinette, Marshfield, Menasha, Rice Lake, Richland Center, Sheboygan, Waukesha, Wausau, and West Bend.

MAX R. SPARGER, COMMISSIONER OF ATHLETICS

Max R. Sparger was named athletic commissioner of the Wisconsin State University Conference in July of 1971, succeeding Fred Jacoby.

Sparger has experienced a varied and successful career in athletics as a participant, coach, administrator and official.

A native of Wichita Falls, Texas, Sparger was a member of the UW-Stout athletic staff from 1959 to 1971, and athletic director his last two years there.

The Commissioner grew up in St. Paul Park, Minnesota, graduating from high school there in 1952. He earned his bachelor's degree in 1956 from Dubuque (Iowa) University, where he played football and wrestled during his college career.

Following graduation from college, Sparger coached high school and junior college sports in Ford Dodge, Iowa, leaving to join the Stout staff as assistant football and basketball coach in 1959. He received his master's degree in education from Macalester College, St. Paul, Minnesota, in 1961, and since then has done advanced work at the University of Minnesota.

He became head football coach in 1963, and was selected to receive an award for "Outstanding Teaching" during that year. He guided Stout to a Conference championship in 1965, after which he was named "Coach of the Year" in N.A.I.A. District 14. He gave up his football coaching duties after becoming athletic director in 1969.

Sparger was inducted into the UW-Stout "Hall of Fame" in 1980, and into the NAIA District 14 "Hall of Fame" in 1985.

TOM BUTLER, SPORTS INFORMATION DIRECTOR

Tom Butler joined the WSUC staff part-time May 1, 1967, to assist the Commissioner with the dissemination of sports information. The Madison native graduated from East High School in 1942.

Following three years in the Navy during World War II, he received a B.A. degree in journalism from the UW-Madison in January of 1950. After working as sports editor of the Stevens Point Daily Journal and the Daily Jefferson County Union (Fort Atkinson), Butler joined the Wisconsin State Journal as a sports writer February 1, 1953. He has been there since.

GENE CALHOUN, SUPERVISOR OF FOOTBALL OFFICIALS

Gene Calhoun, a veteran Wisconsin athletic official, became supervisor of Wisconsin State University Conference officials in 1966. He has more than 30 years experience in officiating.

Calhoun graduated from Madison East High School in 1941, served in the Army Air Corps during World War II and is a retired lieutenant colonel in the Air Force Reserves. He earned his bachelor's degree from the UW-Madison in 1947, and his law degree in 1950. He is a practicing attorney in Madison.

An official since 1947, he worked in the Big 10 for 20 years, and was referee in the 1968 and 1976 Rose Bowl games, the 1971 Cotton Bowl game, the 1974 Sugar Bowl and the 1981 Orange Bowl game.

He retired from active officiating after the Orange Bowl and assumed the duties of Supervisor of Football Officials for the Big 10 in 1982.

OTTO PULS, SUPERVISOR OF BASKETBALL OFFICIALS

Otto R. Puls is supervisor of Wisconsin State University Conference basketball officials.

Puls, a veteran high school and college official, graduated from Madison East High School and the University of Wisconsin, where he earned a B.S. degree in Pharmacy. He currently is chief pharmacist at the Central Wisconsin Center for Developmentally Disabled in Madison.

Otto played baseball at East and at UW-Madison. Following college he played professional baseball in the Baltimore Orioles farm system.

He started officiating in 1955 and has worked Big Ten football for the past 12 years. During that span he officiated six Michigan-Ohio State football games, the 1978 Tangerine Bowl, 1981 Orange Bowl and Rose Bowl games in 1977 and '82.

Link Walker Retires

Link Walker, the winningest football coach in Eau Claire history, retired after the 1986 season. Walker, 60, coached the Blugolds 19 years and compiled an overall record of 104-85-3.

Walker directed the Blugolds to WSUC championships in 1981 and '83 and four of his teams won eight or more games. His 1981 squad was the last unbeaten, untied conference champion. He will remain on the Eau Claire faculty.

Hintz Football MVP

Mike Hintz, a senior defensive back from Platteville, was named the WSUC's "most valuable football player" in 1986. The award is presented annually by the Milwaukee Journal. Hintz, a two-time all-conference defensive back from Waukesha (South), intercepted nine passes, broke up 15 more, recovered two fumbles and was credited with 63 tackles.

PREVIEW OF 1987 WSUC FOOTBALL SEASON

Three teams shared the WSUC football championship in 1986, so it won't come as any surprise if something similar happens this fall.

Tight races and stiff competition are the rule rather than the exception in the WSUC. Two teams tied for the '84 title and the 1980 season ended with four teams deadlocked at the top of the standings.

Last year La Crosse, River Falls and Stevens Point all finished with 7-1 conference records. The Pointers lost in the opening round of the NCAA Division III playoffs, but the Indians advanced to the semi-finals of the NAIA Division II tourney before being eliminated.

Tradition and talent again figure to put La Crosse right back into the thick of this year's title chase. The same can be said of River Falls, which has figured in three straight WSUC championships, while Stevens Point has a program built on a solid foundation over the past several years by D.J. LeRoy.

La Crosse coach Roger Harring expects another big year out of Ted Pretasky, a 205-pound fullback who led the conference in rushing with 1,139 yards and a 6.3-yard average per carry last fall. Harring must rebuild his offensive line and fill some gaps in the defense, but he has some eager reserves from last year waiting in the wings.

River Falls is aiming for its fourth straight championship and coach Mike Farley has the luxury of starting two 1,000-yard rushers in his offensive backfield. Quarterback Mark Cota and fullback Greg Corning each accomplished that feat last year and both made the all-conference team. The Falcons also have their linebackers and secondary intact to start this year's campaign.

LeRoy lost some key performers at Stevens Point but he shouldn't have to worry about the quarterback spot, where sophomore Kirk Baumgartner returns. All Baumgartner did as a freshman was compile the conference's second best passing and total offense statistics. He also threw for a conference-high 11 touchdowns. The Pointers also start with a strong defensive nucleus.

Whitewater, which finished fourth last fall behind the tri-champions, expects to challenge but will be hampered at the outset by inexperience at quarterback with Lance Leopold gone. Running back George Rainey returns but coach Bob Berezowitz must fill some gaping holes on both sides of the ball to become competitive.

Eau Claire's Jim Lind is the only new coach in the WSUC this season and he brings a wide open attack that Blugold partisans already have labeled "Air Eau Claire." Bob Gelhaus returns at quarterback, but newcomers could play prominent roles in Lind's first season.

Platteville got out of the blocks slowly last fall and that prevented the Pioneers from having the kind of season coach George Chryst expected. Veteran quarterback H.T. Kinney and some experienced players in the defense should make the Pioneers competitive from the start this fall.

Stout's Rich Lawrence found the WSUC anything but an easy mark in his first year as Blue Devil coach in 1986 but he's ready to tackle his second season with enthusiasm. He starts with two quality running backs in Chuck Carr and Kyle Gunderson and some newcomers he hopes can make the Blue Devils contenders.

Oshkosh's Ron Cardo is another coach trying to build a winning tradition in a program that hasn't experienced a championship season in 15 years. Youth predominated in his first three years at the helm and now in his fourth season he hopes to have enough experience to fashion some victories in close games that have been going the other way.

Superior coach Gil Krueger, like Cardo, is trying to find that winning combination. He could have one of the most dangerous passing combinations in the conference with quarterback Craig Haugo and wide receiver Dan Kelner, but depth again poses a problem.

PROSPECTS FOR 1987

Jim Lind brings a new dimension to Blugold football this season. He espouses a wide open multiple-pro offense that is bound to cause problems for opposing pass defenses. Already folks around the Blugold campus are calling Lind's passing attack "Air Eau Claire."

Although Lind brings a new philosophy to the Blugold offense, a pro style with emphasis on passing, he does not exclude the running game. His UM-Morris team last season rushed for more than 200 yards a game, while averaging 220 through the air. Every one of former coach Link Walker's 19 Eau Claire teams rushed for more yards than they gained passing.

Lind acquired his taste for passing while working as a graduate assistant for LaVell Edwards at Brigham Young University. Lind's 1986 Morris squad ranked No. 3 in the NAIA in scoring offense, and two of his four Morris teams led the Northern Intercollegiate Conference in total offense. Bob Gelhaus, who averaged 107 yards passing in eight WSUC games last fall, probably will get the first crack at the quarterback spot over junior Keith Rohde.

Among the missing from the Blugolds this year are linebacker John Kuhn, an all-conference performer and Eau Claire's 1986 most valuable player, and all-WSUC defensive lineman Kevin Fitzgerald. Leading returnees are Wil Beech, Paul Van Camp and Joel Betsinger in the offensive line and defensive starters Mike Yakesh, Jerry Annis and Fritz Leinfelder.

Lind is developing a new offensive and defensive system and feels his coaches have recruited "an excellent freshman class both in size and speed." The new coach has helped direct teams to five conference championships in 10 years at the college level and looks to continue that success with the Blugolds.

PROSPECTS FOR 1987

Coach Roger Harring has some problems to solve, but the Indians possess all the ingredients to challenge for the WSUC championship again. They shared the title with River Falls and Stevens Point last fall in a wide open race that is expected to be duplicated in 1987.

Graduation left some huge gaps, particularly in the offensive line, where center Pat Mohr and guard Tim Scheibe are missing. Both were all-conference players. Phil Ertl, the defensive line anchor, and running back Matt Pekarske also are gone. Pekarske had punt returns of 80, 78 and 60 yards for touchdowns in 1986.

Missing from the defensive secondary is all-conference Jerry Sydorowicz along with Eric Guth and linebacker Cirt Tesch. The offensive line was depleted further by the departure of Al Weidner, Joe Daniels and Lee Wardall. Harring also must find a replacement for kicker Joe Mirasola.

The Indians made it to the semifinals of the NAIA Division II playoffs before losing to Baker (Kan.), 16-14, and one of the principal reasons for their success was running back Ted Pretasky. The 205-pound fullback led the conference in rushing with 1,139 yards and a 6.3 average per carry last fall. He will be a pivotal part of the offense again along with quarterback Todd Oberg and tight end Dave Carl.

The offensive line must be rebuilt but some quality players remain, including guard Dave Newberry and 6-foot-6, 270-pound tackle Dominic Charles. Harring incorporates the I-formation and the veer into his offense and it's obvious the Indians possess the experience, depth, tradition and size to repeat their 1986 success.

PROSPECTS FOR 1987

Coach Ron Cardo still is trying to fit the pieces together for the Titans as he starts his fourth year at the helm. The Titans haven't been able to slug it out with the contenders yet, but at least this season Cardo starts with more experienced players. He has 17 starters among 36 returning lettermen, including 10 from the defense.

There are some big shoes to fill, however. Among the missing is Rob Frahm, the school's second all-time leading rusher who ran for 1,178 yards and scored ten touchdowns in 1986. Also gone are quarterback Jeff Peterson and split end John LaFleur, an all-conference performer a year ago.

Senior quarterback Ken Maly is the only returning lettermen familiar with running Cardo's veer offense. A plus in this area, though, is running back Mark Matzke, a junior who gained 530 yards a year ago. It will be tough for them to match the performances of Peterson and Frahm, so Cardo might have to find additional tools in his offense.

Senior guard Marsh Murray anchors the offensive line, which boasts good size and experience. Jim Linnabary could pick up the slack for LaFleur at split end. He finished second in receptions among the Titans last fall with 16, just one behind LaFleur. Matzke could do the job at running back, but Frahm also was such a threat as a return specialist.

The defensive backfield includes Todd Schoelzel, who led the Titans last season with 54 solo tackles, 26 assists and five passes broken up, along with Bob Whiteman with a team-leading five interceptions. Cardo also will depend heavily on linebacker John Schmidt, who had five tackles for losses in 1986.

The Titans must jell early again this fall because their first conference game is with La Crosse, one of the defending tri-champions, on the third Saturday of the season.

PROSPECTS FOR 1987

The Pioneers need a fast start this year, something that didn't happen in 1986 and which plagued them all the way. After winning two non-conference games, they dropped four straight in the WSUC. They won four of their last five games of the season but it was too late to make an impact in the standings.

Coach George Chryst feels his team could be a darkhorse this year if they avoid injuries and get off to a good start. The Pioneers return with defensive experience, a good kicking game and coaching continuity for the first time in eight years. Leading defensive returnees are tackle Jeff Bardell and end Mark Rae, who also was the all-conference WSUC punter last fall.

Chryst has some gaping holes to fill on both sides of the football. Among the missing are all-American defensive back Mike Hintz, defensive end Mike Runde, offensive center John Mamerow and all-conference wide receiver Jim Scherkenbach.

Veteran quarterback H.T. Kinney returns to direct Chryst's wing-T offensive. Also back are outstanding tight end Larry Tonyan, and all-conference tackle Tom Peplinski. Todd Peters, a transfer running back from South Dakota State, should bolster the offense.

Seven defensive starters and five from the offense are among the 37 returning lettermen. Chryst believes Peplinski and defensive back Todd Rice, both fifth-year seniors, "could makes us better than we expected."

The Pioneers finished with a 6-5 record last fall but their slow start in the conference left them 3-5 in the standings. The toughest losses were a 14-9 decision to Oshkosh and a 15-10 setback against Stevens Point, one of the tri-champions. Chryst's Pioneers need more size and speed to reverse that this fall.

PROSPECTS FOR 1987

A 28-8 loss to Stevens Point in the final game last season prevented the Falcons from winning an undisputed championship. As a result they were forced to share the WSUC crown with the Pointers and La Crosse. The Falcons figure to challenge for the title again and coach Mike Farley expects even more competition than he experienced in 1986.

The biggest plus centers around all-conference performers Mark Cota at quarterback and Greg Corning at fullback. Both gained more than 1,000 yards last season running out of Farley's wishbone attack, Cota 1,279 (a record for a NCAA Division III quarterback) and Corning 1,051. Corning scored 11 touchdowns in the conference and Cota 10.

Farley is not home free, however, because two key ingredients from last year's offense will be missing. They are all-conference offensive linemen Jim Benick and Jim Kuchta. Also gone are tackle Brian Flatt and center Sheldon Swensen. Guard Greg Olson and tight end Gene Ahlborn return to bolster the offense.

Linebackers and starters in the secondary return intact, but Farley must find replacements for all-conference nose guard Kent Gray, tackle Bruce Rivard and end Mark Reuter. The kicking game appears strong with Tom Baxter punting and Andy Feil booting field goals and conversions.

Last fall River Falls became the first WSUC team to figure in three straight football championships since Platteville in 1968-70. The Falcons will try to make it four in a row this year, something never before accomplished at River Falls. La Crosse had a record run of six straight from 1949-54.

PROSPECTS FOR 1987

The Pointers lost their first three games last year and then fashioned a comeback that earned them a share of the WSUC championship. Coach D.J. LeRoy expected as much. He scheduled tough non-conference foes purposely. After losing to La Crosse, 20-14, the Pointers won eight straight games before bowing in the NCAA Division III playoffs.

But LeRoy must begin this year without starting running backs Mike Christman and Kevin Knuese, wide receiver Dave Steavpack and all-conference placekicker Kim Drake. Also missing are outstanding defensive linemen Bill Flynn and Ric Perona and linebacker Tom Finco.

Prospects become more optimistic when LeRoy lines up his offense with sophomore Kirk Baumgartner at quarterback. Baumgartner as a freshman finished second in the conference in passing and total offense. He averaged 177 yards a game through the air and passed for a conference high 11 touchdowns.

LeRoy has 37 lettermen returning, 19 from the offense and 18 defenders. The defensive nucleus is headed by all-conference linebacker Steve Day and cornerback Greg Dantoin. Also back on defense are end Craig Ewald, lineman Bill Kolodziej and cornerback Scott Nicolai.

Another strength for the Pointers is that LeRoy's staff returns intact and adds to the continuity. One possible detriment is the schedule, which includes only four home games. Included in the taxing travel schedule are games at Portland State, Northwest Missouri State and St. Ambrose. The Pointers also must play at La Crosse and wind up the season at Platteville.

PROSPECTS FOR 1987

Rich Lawrence's inaugural season is behind him and the Blue Devils should present a more settled appearance in 1987. He is no longer the new kid on the block. Players have completed a full season under his command and the system is in place.

Stout finished seventh in the conference last year and struggled to a 2-8-1 overall record. Lawrence lost some key players from that squad, including all-conference defensive back Scott Romenesko, an outstanding athlete who won the WSUC decathlon title in the spring.

Also gone are defensive tackle Brandt Olsen, wide receiver Ron Wise and offensive tackle Eric Austvold. On the plus side, though, are returnees Chuck Carr and Kyle Gunderson, two quality running backs; wide receiver Scott Fredrickson, who also contributes as a return specialist; and linebacker Mike Tweet.

Lawrence is looking for newcomers who can contribute right away because the Blue Devils has some voids to fill and a lack of depth. Among transfer students he hopes can help are running back Anthony Fisher and linebacker Tim Cotten of West Texas State and tight end Mark Wisroth of Black Hills State. Fisher and Cotten are former Oklahoma all-staters and Wisroth received similar recognition in Wyoming.

The coach feels better about starting his second season because he has more players with college football experience this year. He has 17 of last fall's 22 starters on offense and defense back.

Although the Blue Devils lack overall size and depth particularly in the line offensively and defensively, Stout coaches expect their team to contend. Traditionally balance throughout the WSUC makes any team a threat. Coaches feel if circumstances are right, the Blue Devils can contend.

PROSPECTS FOR 1987

Coach Gil Krueger and the Yellowjackets went into last season with high hopes because of the presence of quarterback Craig Haugo, who seemed to be the key ingredient in Superior's resurgence. Their hopes were dashed early, however, when Haugo injured a knee in the preseason game at Thunder Bay and was sidelined for the year.

Haugo is back for the '87 season healthy and, hopefully, capable of producing the kind of numbers he did in 1985, his first year with the Yellowjackets. He will be backed by Scott Tiedens, who handled the quarterback chores last fall.

Superior never could get untracked without Haugo last season and wound up with a 1-9 record. The one victory was a forfeit when UM-Duluth used an ineligible player in the opening game. There is a feeling in Superior now, though, that Krueger could field his best team in his fourth season at the helm.

Hugo and defensive back Ray Kosey, the team's co-captains, are the catalysts, but some promising newcomers could swing the pendulum for Krueger. They include fullback Keith Turner, offensive guard Paul McLeod, strong safety Brian Buol, linebacker Lane Johnson and defensive backs Jim Carlson and Rocky Erickson.

Linebacking still is thin, but the rookies, who played most of the way a year ago, are veterans now and the experience should help. Also, the addition of Johnson is a plus, as is the return this year of Doug Lindsey to that position.

One of the principal offensive weapons could be wide receiver Dan Kelner, who enjoyed a spectacular spring as the WSUC sprint champion. He caught 18 passes and scored five touchdowns in conference competition last fall and should be an inviting target for a healthy Haugo.

PROSPECTS FOR 1987

Just when things were starting to look up for the Warhawks, record-setting quarterback Lance Leipold ran out of eligibility. Last year he led the conference in passing and total offense, averaging 193 yards a game through the air. He also threw for nine touchdowns.

This year coach Bob Berezowitz, a record-setting passer himself during his undergraduate days at Whitewater, starts out with only junior Jeff Olsen having any appreciable experience at that position. On top of that, the leading Warhawk receiver from a year ago, M.R. Miller is gone, too. He caught 37 passes in 1986, just one behind the conference leader.

On the credit side of the ledger, though, returnees include running back George Rainey, who averaged more than 100 yards a game rushing last season, and tight end Terence Weber, who caught 34 passes in the WSUC last fall. Rainey and Weber were all-conference selections.

All-conference linebacker Tom Spatholz is gone, but down lineman Scott Schraml and defensive back David Haluska anchor an experience group on that side of the scrimmage line.

The Warhawks did not do as well against the eventual tri-champions last year as Berezowitz had hoped. This season he looks for his team to be more competitive with the contenders. In order to do this he needs more team size and speed and to develop depth.

Berezowitz is trying to get the Warhawks back to where they either win or challenge for the title every year. They figured in 11 championships over the past 27 years and tied for the crown as recently as 1984.

This year he figures the first three games against Ferris State, Findlay (0.) and Stevens Point hold the key. This stretch should give the Warhawks an indication of how competitive they can be without an experienced quarterback.

PREVIEW OF THE 1987-88 BASKETBALL SEASON

WISCONSIN STATE UNIVERSITY CONFERENCE

"Top to bottom strength" has become a cliché when describing the Wisconsin State University Conference basketball situation but that was never more evident than during the 1986-87 season. There is no other way to describe co-champions at 13-3, a 9-7 third place team, 7-9 for fourth and five teams deadlocked at 6-10 in a nine-team league.

The race could be even tighter this season with many of the all-conference stars gone. Co-champions Eau Claire and Stevens Point have lost most of the key performers who propelled them to the top of the conference last season. Each will be without its two all-conference players.

Among the missing are Stevens Point's Tim Naegeli, the WSUC's most valuable player, and Eau Claire's Chuckie Graves, the league's third leading scorer. Third-place Stout will be without its top scorer, Tom Gomolak, while fourth-place Oshkosh lost Gordy Skagestad, the conference scoring champion.

Everybody can point to a critical loss in the program -- Eric Chudzik at La Crosse, Tim Hopfensperger at Platteville, Paul Denny and Steve Justice at River Falls, Rich Bourget at Superior and Mark Duckworth at Whitewater. So, the field is wide open for newcomers to start a new era in the conference.

Stevens Point, which figured in the last six conference championships, not only lost Naegeli, but coach Jay Eck, who took the head job at Toledo University in April. Bob Parker from Valley City (N.D.) takes the helm at Point with only four lettermen returning and a questionable recruiting class because of his late arrival.

Eau Claire vaulted back into the title picture after an absence of five years and coach Ken Anderson was voted coach of the year by his peers for a remarkable job during the 1986-87 season. But, he faces a rebuilding chore of his own, although probably not as monumental as Parker at Point.

Stout might have trouble repeating its third-place finish in 1988, but coach Dwain Mintz is renowned for his surprises and this situation is made to order for his talents.

Oshkosh lost a real "horse" when Skagestad departed, so coach Jim McGrath must develop some scoring and rebounding in his current squad or find a newcomer or two to fill that void.

Platteville and Whitewater are two of the most fortunate teams as far as returning talent goes. Pioneer coach Bo Ryan has his first recruiting class of seniors and the group includes all-conference forward Steve Showalter. Showalter, 6-10 Scott Plondke and 6-7 Rock Ripley could give Ryan one of the best front lines in the Conference.

Whitewater coach Dave Vander Meulen has the conference's best rebounder in 6-8 Robert Barnes as well as guard Duane Vance, who can score and dish out assists with the best in the conference. If the Warhawks can find the right combination and win the kind of close games they lost last season, they should be contenders.

La Crosse and River Falls experienced frustrating seasons in 1986-87, but coach Burt McDonald finished on a high note because his Indians came on strong in the second half, while coach Rick Bowen's Falcons lost their last nine in a row.

McDonald hopes the Indians can pick up where they left off and he will be counting on guards Bob Zenz, Paul Everson and Corey Block to led the way now that they experienced the thrill of victory. They found out all about the agony of defeat early.

Bowen must deal with the latter as he brings his Falcons into preseason practice October 15. He lost 70 percent of his scoring punch, so newcomers must carry the load. His team is so inexperienced it's impossible for him to speculate about the season.

Superior faces an even more tenuous situation. The Yellowjackets face the season with a new coach and without three of the mainstays from last season -- all-conference Rich Bourget as well as Kerry Loberg, and Charles Oates.

Nobody has dared to come out with a flat prediction about this coming race. There are too many new players and intangibles. People use "top to bottom strength," "balance" and "on any given night" clichés when discussing prospects. Five teams tied for last in 1986-87. Maybe five will share the title next March.

PROSPECTS FOR 1987-88

Veteran coach Ken Anderson heads into a rebuilding years as do most WSUC teams this season. Gone from the Blugolds are all-conference performers Chuckie Graves and Mike Blair, plus defensive standout John Bowen and Bruce Jonason.

Anderson has some quality players returning, headed by 6-7 center Eric Davis, who averaged 8.4 points and 6.3 rebounds a game in the conference last season. Also returning are lettermen guards Scott Anderson and Craig Campbell along with 6-7 Tim Blumentritt, 6-8 Jeff Coenen and 6-5 Chris Paulson, all of whom lettered at forward.

It might be difficult for the Blugolds to repeat as co-champions and make it back to the NAIA tournament in Kansas City next March, but Anderson has a great track record that includes 20 or more victories in 11 of the last 12 years, six trips to Kansas City in the last nine seasons and 12 WSUC crowns in the past 18 campaigns.

Although Anderson might have to depend on more newcomers than usual, that is the case throughout the WSUC. He does expect a strong rebounding team. Among in-coming freshmen is 6-4 guard Kevin Larson of Fennimore, who should fit in well with Anderson's system.

PROSPECTS FOR 1987-88

The Indians won seven of their last 11 games in 1987, including a 68-64 decision over Stout in the NAIA District 14 playoffs. It was a remarkable finish, considering coach Burt McDonald's squad managed only five victories in the first 16 games.

La Crosse's turnaround caused a wild scramble in the final WSUC standings with five teams tied for fifth place, or last, whichever way one looks at it. Even in the district playoffs the Indians took co-champion Stevens Point to the limit before bowing, 67-62, on the Pointers' home floor.

McDonald would like to see his squad play at something close to the last one-third of the 1986-87 season, but that might be difficult without center Eric Chudzik. He was the backbone last season, shooting at a .514 clip from the field while averaging 16.3 points and 6.2 rebounds a game.

The Indians do start with experience in the backcourt, featuring Bob Zenz, Paul Everson and Corey Block. Zens averaged 15.1 points a game, Block 10.4 and Everson 8.8. Zenz also made 30 of 59 shots from three-point range.

PROSPECTS FOR 1987-88

PROSPECTS FOR 1987-88

The Falcons experienced an exhilarating first two-thirds of last season and a disastrous final one-third. Now second-year coach Rick Bowen will try to rectify that unusual collapse. What looked like a contending season finished with a disappointing 13-14 record.

River Falls won its first six games, 10 of the first 13 and 13 of the first 18 before losing the last nine in a row, including a 74-62 decision to co-champion Stevens Point in the NAIA District 14 playoffs. Early in the season the Falcons whipped the Pointers by 10 points.

To say this is a rebuilding year for Bowen would be a classic understatement. He lost four starters, including co-most valuable players Paul Denny and Steve Justice, and 70 percent of his scoring punch from last season.

The Falcons could get a big lift from two transfer students, 6-9 John Wolf from UW-Milwaukee and 6-5 Todd Johnson from UW-Eau Claire.

PROSPECTS FOR 1987-88

Bob Parker begins his first season as coach of the Pointers, following a successful tenure at Valley City State in North Dakota. He succeeds Jay Eck, who left in April to become head coach at Toledo University.

Eck is a tough act to follow. He coached the Pointers to an undisputed championship in 1986 and a co-title last season as well as a 45-13 overall record in two years. Eck followed Dick Bennett, who won four straight WSUC crowns himself before departing to UW-Green Bay.

Parker comes into a somewhat more difficult situation because four starters are gone, including Tim Naegeli, the WSUC player of the year last season. Naegeli finished second in conference scoring with a 20.5 average. Also gone is guard Craig Hawley with his 13.9 scoring average and conference-high 6.3 assists a game. Naegeli and Hawley were all-conference selections.

Leading returnee is 6-2 guard Todd Christianson, who averaged 13.1 points a game last season. Recruiting suffered because of Parker's late arrival and the new coach received further bad news when sophomore Tim Blair, from whom much was expected, said he was transferring to UW-Eau Claire.

PROSPECTS FOR 1987-88

The Blue Devils finished a strong third in the conference last season and made the NAIA playoffs with their 18-8 overall record. However, coach Dwain Mintz lost five players from that squad, all of whom started at one time or another, including all-conference Brian Ellingson and center Tom Gomolak, the team's scoring leader.

Stout's stable is not empty, though. Mintz still can count on a quality front line with 6-6 Dave Sandstrom, 6-7 Mark Stevens and 6-6 John Auer. Also back is 6-foot guard Luther Forrest, who averaged 13 points a game in the conference and should provide a steady influence to an inexperienced lineup.

The Yellowjackets have been striving to find the right combination to contend for many years and the struggle continues this season. Superior, which hasn't won a conference basketball championship since before Pearl Harbor, still was looking for a coach when this book went to press in June. Coach Chris Ritchey resigned after last season.

Three of their best players also will be missing when the new coach convenes the first practice Oct. 15, including all-conference Rich Bourget, who averaged 17.1 points and 6.3 rebounds a game last season. Also missing are Charles Oates with his 16-point average and seven rebounds a game, and steady guard Kerry Loberg.

This could be the year of the Warhawks with so many of last season's top players departing from the WSUC. Nine of the 11 players picked on last season's all-conference team were seniors, so the WSUC is in a state of transition.
