DANE COUNTY MEMORIAL COLISEUM

WISCONSIN PLAYS ALL OF ITS HOME GAMES AT THE BEAUTIFUL AND SPACIOUS DANE COUNTY MEMORIAL COLISEUM. THE COLISEUM'S 7,883 FIXED SEATS NOT ONLY GIVE WISCONSIN THE LARGEST FACILITY IN THE BIG TEN AND WCHA, BUT ALSO THE MOST COMFORTABLE AS THE SEATS ARE UPHOLSTERED, SELF-RISING THEATRE TYPE. THE COLISEUM ICE SURFACE IS 85 FEET BY 200 FEET.

WISCONSIN ATTENDANCE

WISCONSIN LED THE NATION IN TOTAL ATTENDANCE AS 109,940 FANS WATCHED THE BADGERS IN 16 HOME GAMES DURING THE 1970-71 SEASON.

WISCONSIN ALSO LED THE NATION IN AVERAGE ATTENDANCE LAST YEAR FOR THE SECOND CONSECUTIVE SEASON WITH 6,871 PER GAME. FOR WCHA GAMES THE AVERAGE ATTENDANCE WAS EVEN HIGHER AS AN AVERAGE OF 7,326 FANS ATTENDED EACH GAME. ON THREE OCCASIONS THE BADGERS PLAYED BEFORE STANDING ROOM ONLY CROWDS OF 8,234 WHILE THOUSANDS OF OTHER FANS WERE TURNED AWAY AT THE GATE. THE SEASON TOTAL, AVERAGE TOTAL AND SINGLE GAME TOTAL WERE ALL-TIME WISCONSIN SCHOOL RECORDS.

IN 34 TOTAL GAMES, HOME AND AWAY IN 1970-71 THE WISCONSIN BADGERS PLAYED IN FRONT OF 174,917 FANS.

REVIEW OF THE 1970-71 HOCKEY SEASON

WHEN THE 1969-70 HOCKEY SEASON CAME TO A CLOSE, THE QUESTION MOST ASKED WISCONSIN COACH BOB JOHNSON WAS, "WHAT DO YOU DO FOR AN ENCORE", OR "HOW DO YOU FOLLOW AN ACT LIKE THAT?" THE BADGERS IN THEIR FIRST YEAR IN THE WESTERN COLLEGIATE HOCKEY ASSOCIATION FINISHED IN FOURTH PLACE, LED THE NATION IN AVERAGE ATTENDANCE, WON TWO PLAYOFF GAMES IN DENVER AND FINISHED THIRD IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT.

WHILE THE BADGERS DIDN'T MAKE IT TO THE NCAA TOURNAMENT THEY DID ACCOMPLISH MANY FIRSTS IN WISCONSIN HOCKEY DURING THE 1970-71 SEASON AND THE STATISTICS PROVIDED THE ANSWERS TO THE QUESTIONS ABOUT HOW THEY WOULD FOLLOW THE HIGHLY SUCCESSFUL 1969-70 SEASON.

FOR 1970-71 THE WISCONSIN BADGERS FINISHED WITH TWENTY OR MORE WINS FOR THE FOURTH CONSECUTIVE YEAR (20-13-1) AND ACCOMPLISHED THEIR HIGHEST FINISH IN THEIR TWO YEAR WCHA HISTORY AS THEY TOOK THIRD PLACE WITH A 13-9 RECORD. THEY SET SCHOOL RECORDS FOR THE MOST GOALS IN A WCHA SEASON 102, MOST ASSISTS IN A WCHA SEASON 130, AND MOST TOTAL POINTS IN A WCHA SEASON 232, TO BECOME THE HIGHEST SCORING TEAM IN WISCONSIN HOCKEY HISTORY. THEIR 12-1 WIN OVER NORTH DAKOTA ESTABLISHED THE SCHOOL RECORD FOR MOST GOALS IN ONE WCHA GAME AND THEIR FINAL RECORD OF 13-9 SET THE SCHOOL RECORD FOR HIGHEST WINNING PERCENTAGE IN WCHA COMPETITION .591.

RECEIVING OUTSTANDING SUPPORT FROM WISCONSIN FANS, THE BADGERS LED THE NATION IN TOTAL ATTENDANCE, 109,940 IN 16 HOME GAMES AND FOR THE SECOND CONSECUTIVE YEAR LED THE NATION IN AVERAGE ATTENDANCE WITH 6,871. THREE TIMES THE RECORD STANDING-ROOM-ONLY CROWD FIGURE OF 8,234 WAS REACHED WITH THOUSANDS OF OTHER FANS TURNED AWAY AT THE GATES. FOR WCHA GAMES WISCONSIN AVERAGED 7,326 WHICH IN THE 7,916 SEAT DANE COUNTY COLISEUM IS 92.5% OF CAPACITY.

THE BADGERS STARTED OUT ON A DISMAL NOTE LOSING THEIR FIRST TWO GAMES TO MICHIGAN TECH IN WCHA COMPETITION. THEY THEN DEFEATED SUPERIOR STATE UNIVERSITY AND SWEEP TWO HOME GAMES WITH BROWN. THEY THEN SPLIT SERIES AT DENVER, AT HOME AGAINST MINNESOTA-DULUTH AND AT MICHIGAN. THEY LOST AND TIED A GAME AGAINST IMPROVED NOTRE DAME THEN WENT ON TO SUCCESSFULLY DEFEND THEIR TITLE IN THE ST. LOUIS TOURNAMENT AND TO TAKE THE CHAMPIONSHIP AT THE RPI TOURNAMENT. DURING THE SECOND HALF OF THE SEASON THEY SWEEP TWO GAME SERIES WITH COLORADO COLLEGE, MICHIGAN, MINNESOTA AND NORTH DAKOTA.

THREE GOALIES SHARED NET-MINDING DUTIES FOR WISCONSIN IN 1970-71 WITH FRESHMAN JIM MAKEY STARTING OUT THE SEASON. HE WAS INJURED AT NOTRE DAME AND LOST HIS STARTING JOB TO SENIOR JOHN ANDERSON. ANDERSON WAS DECLARED SCHOLASTICALLY INELIGIBLE AT THE MIDWAY POINT AND WAS REPLACED BY ANOTHER SENIOR GARY ENGBERG WHO FINISHED OUT THE SEASON. NONE OF THESE GOALIES HAD HAD ANY WCHA EXPERIENCE PRIOR TO THIS SEASON AND YET TURNED IN OUTSTANDING PERFORMANCES.

WISCONSIN ALSO LOST LEADING SCORER MURRAY HEATLEY AT MID-SEASON AS HE COMPLETED HIS EIGHT SEMESTERS OF PLAY. IN VIEW OF THE LOSS OF THE NUMBER ONE GOALTENDER, ANDERSON, AND THE NUMBER ONE SCORER, HEATLEY, 1970-71 WAS INDEED AN OUTSTANDING SEASON. COACH JOHNSON GOT HIS 100TH VICTORY AT WISCONSIN IN A 3-2 OVERTIME WIN OVER MINNESOTA.

A DISAPPOINTING 4-3 PLAYOFF LOSS TO MINNESOTA, A TEAM WISCONSIN HAD BEATEN THREE TIMES PREVIOUSLY DURING THE YEAR, ENDED THE 1970-71 SEASON.

ROBERT N. (BOB) JOHNSON
WISCONSIN HOCKEY COACH

IN THE FIVE YEARS BOB JOHNSON HAS BEEN HEAD HOCKEY COACH AT WISCONSIN THE BADGER HOCKEY PROGRAM HAS GROWN BEYOND ANYONE'S WILDEST DREAMS. DURING COACH JOHNSON'S TENURE THE BADGERS HAVE WON OVER 100 GAMES, NEVER HAD A LOSING SEASON, HAVE WON TWENTY OR MORE GAMES FOR THE PAST FOUR YEARS AND LED THE NATION IN AVERAGE ATTENDANCE THE PAST TWO YEARS AND TOPPED THE NATION IN TOTAL ATTENDANCE THIS PAST SEASON.

AFTER THREE YEARS AS AN "INDEPENDENT" IN COLLEGE HOCKEY, JOHNSON'S BADGERS JOINED THE TOUGH WESTERN COLLEGIATE HOCKEY ASSOCIATION (WCHA). THEIR FIRST YEAR IN THE WCHA 1969-70, THE BADGERS SURPRISED THE HOCKEY WORLD BY FINISHING FOURTH (ALL OTHER FIRST YEAR TEAMS FINISHED LAST) AND TOOK THIRD PLACE IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT AT LAKE PLACID, N.Y. IN THE 1970-71 SEASON WISCONSIN PLACED EVEN HIGHER IN THE FINAL WCHA STANDINGS BY TAKING THIRD PLACE. IN THEIR FIRST YEAR IN THE WCHA THE BADGERS DREW 86,465 IN 13 HOME GAMES, AN AVERAGE OF 6,651. LAST SEASON WAS EVEN GREATER AS 109,940 FANS ATTENDED 16 HOME GAMES AN AVERAGE OF 6,871.

JOHNSON, 40, IS A NATIVE OF MINNEAPOLIS, WAS AN ALL-STAR HOCKEY PLAYER AT MINNEAPOLIS CENTRAL HIGH SCHOOL AND CAPTAIN IN HIS SENIOR YEAR. HE ALSO EXCELLED IN FOOTBALL AND BASEBALL.

HE PLAYED COLLEGIATE HOCKEY AT NORTH DAKOTA IN 1950-51, AND AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA IN 1952-53 AND 1953-54. THE GOPHERS WON THE WCHA TITLE BOTH YEARS JOHNSON PLAYED. HE ALSO WON LETTERS IN FOOTBALL AND BASEBALL AT MINNESOTA.

FOLLOWING ARMY DUTY IN KOREA AND A SHORT FLING IN MINOR LEAGUE BASEBALL WITH THE CHICAGO WHITE SOX ORGANIZATION, JOHNSON TURNED TO COACHING AND BEGAN HIS CAREER AT WARROAD, MINNESOTA HIGH SCHOOL IN 1956. A YEAR LATER, HE BECAME HEAD COACH AT MINNEAPOLIS ROOSEVELT HIGH SCHOOL WHERE HIS HOCKEY TEAMS WON 51 OF 60 CONFERENCE GAMES IN SIX SEASONS THROUGH 1962-63.

JOHNSON LEFT MINNEAPOLIS IN 1963 TO SERVE COLORADO COLLEGE AS BOTH HOCKEY AND BASEBALL COACH FOR THREE SEASONS. HIS HOCKEY TEAMS POSTED A COMBINED 29-51-3 RECORD. HIS BASEBALL TEAMS WERE HIGHLY SUCCESSFUL AND IN BOTH 1964 AND 1965 HE WAS NAMED "COACH OF THE YEAR" FOR THE NCAA COLLEGE DIVISION ROCKY MOUNTAIN DISTRICT. HE ALSO ASSISTED IN FOOTBALL AND TAUGHT IN THE PHYSICAL EDUCATION CURRICULUM WITH THE RANK OF ASSISTANT PROFESSOR.

JOHNSON RECEIVED HIS BACHELOR OF SCIENCE DEGREE FROM MINNESOTA IN 1954 WITH A DOUBLE MAJOR IN PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND SOCIAL STUDIES. HE GAINED HIS MASTERS IN 1961 AND HIS PH.D IN 1963 BOTH FROM MINNESOTA IN PHYSICAL EDUCATION. HE IS CURRENTLY A FULL PROFESSOR OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION AT WISCONSIN.

HE IS THE AUTHOR OF TWO BOOKS, COACHING HIGH SCHOOL HOCKEY AND ICE HOCKEY, THE LATTER PUBLISHED IN 1968. HIS UNBOUNDED ENTHUSIASM FOR THE GAME OF HOCKEY AND HIS GREGARIOUS PERSONALITY HAVE HELPED WIN FANS FOR WISCONSIN HOCKEY FROM THROUGHOUT THE STATE.

BOB AND HIS WIFE MARTHA, ARE THE PARENTS OF FIVE CHILDREN.

BILL ROTHWELL WAS NAMED ASSISTANT WISCONSIN HOCKEY COACH ON MAY 21, 1971, REPLACING FORMER ASSISTANT JEFF SAUER WHO ACCEPTED THE JOB OF HEAD HOCKEY COACH AT COLORADO COLLEGE.

ROTHWELL, 33, WAS ASSISTANT HOCKEY COACH AT OHIO STATE UNIVERSITY FOR THREE YEARS PRIOR TO ACCEPTING THE WISCONSIN JOB. HE HAS A VARIED HOCKEY BACKGROUND WHICH INCLUDED FOUR YEARS OF COMPETITION AT THE UNIVERSITY OF NEW HAMPSHIRE, 1964-68, EIGHT YEARS OF PLAY IN AMATEUR HOCKEY LEAGUES IN NEW ENGLAND, CANADA AND THE MID-WEST, TWO YEARS OF COMPETITION WITH THE U.S. ARMY HOCKEY TEAM IN EUROPE AND FOUR YEARS OF HIGH SCHOOL HOCKEY IN NEW HAMPSHIRE.

AN ACCOMPLISHED TENNIS PLAYER, ROTHWELL PLAYED FOR THE FIRST U.S. ARMY TEAM IN 1956 AND FOR THE UNIVERSITY OF NEW HAMPSHIRE TENNIS TEAM, 1965-68 SERVING AS CAPTAIN IN 1968. HE ALSO SERVED AS TENNIS PROFESSIONAL AT RYE BEACH, NEW HAMPSHIRE COUNTRY CLUB FROM 1964-71 AND WAS ASSISTANT TENNIS COACH AT OHIO STATE UNIVERSITY DURING THE 1971 SEASON. ROTHWELL ALSO PLAYED BASEBALL FOR THE U.S. ARMY 82ND AIRBORNE DIVISIONAL TEAM IN 1957 AND 58 AND SOCCER AT THE UNIVERSITY OF NEW HAMPSHIRE 1965-68.

ROTHWELL RECEIVED A BACHELOR OF SCIENCE DEGREE IN PHYSICAL EDUCATION FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF NEW HAMPSHIRE IN 1968, A MASTER OF ARTS DEGREE FROM OHIO STATE UNIVERSITY IN 1969 AND A DOCTORATE DEGREE FROM OHIO STATE IN 1971.

GOALTENDING -- POSITION IS "UP FOR GRABS." THE ONLY VETERANS RETURNING ARE SOPHOMORES JIM MAKEY AND DOUG SPITZIG BOTH OF WHOM SAW LIMITED VARSITY ACTION LAST SEASON. IN ADDITION TWO FRESHMEN, DICK PERKINS AND DOUG MCFADDEN ENTER THE PICTURE AND WILL FIGHT FOR STARTING BERTHS. MAKEY WAS A REGULAR DURING A PORTION OF LAST YEAR AND IN SPITE OF RELATIVE NEWCOMERS THE POSITION SEEMS STRONGER AND WISCONSIN WILL ENJOY MORE GOALTENDING DEPTH THAN WAS AVAILABLE LAST SEASON. MADISON SOPHOMORE LOREN SEAGRAVES LENDS ADDED DEPTH.

DEFENSE -- THE LOSS OF STARTING DEFENSEMEN, ALL-AMERICAN JOHN JAGGER AND DAN GILCHRIST LEAVE A QUESTIONMARK ON DEFENSE. REGULARS, SENIOR CO-CAPTAIN JEFF ROTSCH AND BRIAN ERICKSON, LAST YEARS MOST IMPROVED PLAYER RETURN TO GIVE US A GOOD START. AL FOLK, UTILITY WING AND DEFENSEMAN AND LAST YEARS TOP JUNIOR VARSITY DEFENSEMAN DAVE ARUNDEL SEEM LIKELY TO MOVE INTO REGULAR BERTHS. ADD TO THEM TWO OUTSTANDING FRESHMEN, TOM MACHOWSKI AND BOB LUNDEEN, WHO ARE SURE TO SEE A LOT OF ACTION, AND ERNIE BLACKBURN AND WISCONSIN HAS THE NEEDED DEPTH AT THIS IMPORTANT POSITION. DEFENSE, HOWEVER, STILL REMAINS A BIG QUESTIONMARK FOR THE 1971-72 SEASON.

CENTER -- WE MUST REPLACE MOST VALUABLE PLAYER AND LEADING SCORER JIM BOYD, BUT WE HAVE TWO FINE CENTERS RETURNING IN LLOYD BENTLEY AND GARY WINCHESTER. PAT LANNAN, A REGULAR RIGHT WING, WILL BE TRIED AT CENTER ALONG WITH TOP JUNIOR VARSITY SCORER BOB SHAUGHNESSY. MINNESOTA ALL-STATE DEAN TALAFOUS AND TOM CHUCKEL GIVE WISCONSIN MORE DEPTH AT THIS KEY POSITION. TALAFOUS, A PLAYER WITH OUTSTANDING CREDENTIALS COULD BE A STARTER.

LEFT WING -- THE STRONGEST POSITION ON THE TEAM. FOUR REGULARS RETURN INCLUDING CO-CAPTAIN JIM YOUNG, TIM DOOL, PHIL UIHLEIN AND STAN HINKLEY. YOUNG AND DOOL ARE TWO YEAR REGULARS, WHILE UIHLEIN GAINED VALUABLE EXPERIENCE LAST SEASON AND HINKLEY FOUGHT HIS WAY TO A VARSITY BERTH. FRESHMAN DON DEPREZ WILL BATTLE THE REGULARS FOR A VARSITY SPOT ALONG WITH TOM KUKLINSKI.

RIGHT WING -- WISCONSIN'S LEADING WCHA GOAL SCORER, NORM CHERREY, RETURNS ALONG WITH ANOTHER JUNIOR JIM JOHNSTON. SENIOR GARY KUKLINSKI WHO GAINED VALUABLE EXPERIENCE LAST SEASON WILL BATTLE FOR A REGULAR SPOT ALONG WITH BILLY REAY, JR., DOUG KELSO AND CHRIS WRIGHT.

GENERAL OUTLOOK -- WCHA LOOKS STRONG AGAIN THIS YEAR AND IT MAY BE DIFFICULT TO IMPROVE ON LAST YEARS THIRD PLACE FINISH.
