



ADD-6 GAME BY GAME REVIEW OF 1970-71 OFISCONSIN HOCKEY SEASON 2--OOA REVIEW OF THE 1970-71 HOCKEY SEASON

WHEN THE 1969-70 HOCKEY SEASON CAME TO A CLOSE, THE QUESTION MOST ASKED WISCONSIN COACH BOB JOHNSON WAS, "WHAT DO YOU DO FOR AN ENCORE", OR "HOW DO YOU FOLLOW AN ACT LIKE THAT?" THE BADGERS IN THEIR FIRST YEAR IN THE WESTERN COLLEGIATE HOCKEY ASSOCIATION FINISHED IN FOURTH PLACE, LED THE NATION IN AVERAGE ATTENDANCE, WON TWO PLAYOFF GAMES IN DENVER AND FINISHED THIRD IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT.

WHILE THE BADGERS DIDN'T MAKE IT TO THE NCAA TOURNAMENT THEY DID ACCOMPLISH MANY FIRSTS IN WISCONSIN HOCKEY DURING THE 1970-71 SEASON AND THE STATISTICS PROVIDED THE ANSWERS TO THE QUESTIONS ABOUT HOW THEY WOULD FOLLOW THE HIGHLY SUCCESSFUL 1969-70 SEASON.

ENRICKSON 2.0 LANNAN 4. WSU-Superior 0 00 1. -FOR 1970-71 THE WISCONSIN BADGERS FINISHED WITH TWENTY OR MORE WINS FOR THE FOURTH CONSECUTIVE YEAR (20-13-1) AND ACCOMPLISHED THEIR HIGHEST FINISH IN THEIR TWO YEAR WCHA HISTORY AS THEY TOOK THIRD PLACE WITH A 13-9 RECORD. THEY SET SCHOOL RECORDS FOR THE MOST GOALS IN A WCHA SEASON 102, MOST ASSISTS IN A WCHA SEASON 130, AND MOST TOTAL POINTS IN A WCHA SEASON 232, TO BECOME THE HIGHEST SCORING TEAM IN WISCONSIN HOCKEY HISTORY. THEIR 12-1 WIN OVER NORTH DAKOTA ESTABLISH-ED THE SCHOOL RECORD FOR MOST GOALS IN ONE WCHA GAME AND THEIR FINAL RECORD OF 13-9 SET THE SCHOOL RECORD FOR HIGHEST WINNING PERCENTAGE IN GAME 5. Nov. 127 ATIMADISON OD SIW 18 GOALS: DOOL YOUNG 2, CHERREY

RECEIVING OUTSTANDING SUPPORT FROM WISCONSIN FANS, THE BADGERS LED THE NATIONS IN TOTAL ATTENDANCE, 109,940 IN 16 HOME GAMES AND FOR THE SECOND CONSECUTIVE YEAR LED THE NATION IN AVERAGE ATTENDANCE WITH 6,871. THREE TIMES THE RECORD STANDING-ROOM-ONLY CROWD FIGURE OF 8,234 WAS REACHED WITH THOUSANDS OF OTHER FANS TURNED AWAY AT THE GATES. FOR WCHA GAMES WISCONSIN AVERAGED 7,326 WHICH IN THE 7,916 SEAT DANE COUNTY COLISEUM IS 92.5% OF CAPACITY.

THREE GOALIES SHARED NET-MINDING DUTLES FOR WISCONSIN IN 1970-71 WITH FRESHMAN JIM MAKEY STARTING OUT THE SEASON. HE WAS INJURED AT Notre Dame and Lost HIS STARTING JOB TO SENIOR JOHN ANDERSON. ANDER-SON WAS DECLARED SCHOLASTICALLY INELIGIBLE AT THE MIDWAY POINT AND WAS REPLACED BY ANOTHER SENIOR GARY ENGBERG WHO FINISHED OUT THE SEASON. NONE OF THESE GOALIES HAD HAD ANY WCHA EXPERIENCE PRIOR TO THIS SEASON AND YET TURNED IN OUTSTANDING PERFORMANCES. OF ST

9: MAKEY (W) 42 BAGNELL WISCONSIN ALSO LOST LEADING SCORER MURRAY HEATLEY AT MID-SEASON AS HE COMPLETED HIS EIGHT SEMESTERS OF PLAY.
