THE UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN SYSTEM

The University of Wisconsin System is marking its seventeenth anniversary in the fall of 1988. The UW System was created in October 1971 by a law placing all of the state's public university campuses under a single Board of Regents. The UW System is composed of 13 universities and 13 two-year UW Centers, and UW-Extension which provides outreach services from offices in every county. Although only 17 years old, the UW System was one of the first statewide higher educational systems in the nation and has pioneered in developing coordinated and high quality programs and services on a statewide basis. System administrative offices are in Madison.

Universities are at Eau Claire, Green Bay, La Crosse, Madison, Milwaukee, Oshkosh, Kenosha-Racine (Parkside), Platteville, River Falls, Stevens Point, Menomonie (Stout), Superior and Whitewater. Centers are at Baraboo, Fond du Lac, Janesville, Manitowoc, Marinette, Marshfield, Menasha, Rice Lake, Richland Center, Sheboygan, Waukesha, Wausau, and West Bend.

MAX R. SPARGER, COMMISSIONER OF ATHLETICS

Max R. Sparger was named athletic commissioner of the Wisconsin State University Conference in July of 1971, succeeding Fred Jacoby.

Sparger has experienced a varied and successful career in athletics as a participant, coach, administrator and official.

A native of Wichita Falls, Texas, Sparger was a member of the UW-Stout athletic staff from 1959 to 1971, and athletic director his last two years there.

The Commissioner grew up in St. Paul Park, Minnesota, graduating from high school there in 1952. He earned his bachelor's degree in 1956 from Dubuque (Iowa) University, where he played football and wrestled during his college career.

Following graduation from college, Sparger coached high school and junior college sports in Ford Dodge, Iowa, leaving to join the Stout staff as assistant football and basketball coach in 1959. He received his master's degree in education from Macalester College, St. Paul, Minnesota, in 1961, and since then has done advanced work at the University of Minnesota.

He became head football coach in 1963, and was selected to receive an award for "Outstanding Teaching" during that year. He guided Stout to a Conference championship in 1965, after which he was named "Coach of the Year" in N.A.I.A. District 14. He gave up his football coaching duties after becoming athletic director in 1969.

Sparger was inducted into the UW-Stout "Hall of Fame" in 1980, and into the NAIA District 14 "Hall of Fame" in 1985.

After working as sports editor of the Stevens Point Daily Journal and the Daily Jefferson County Union (Fort Atkinson), Butler joined the Wisconsin State Journal as a sports writer February 1, 1953. He retired from the State Journal in 1987.

GENE CALHOUN, SUPERVISOR OF FOOTBALL OFFICIALS

Gene Calhoun, a veteran Wisconsin athletic official, became supervisor of Wisconsin State University Conference officials in 1966. He has more than 30 years experience in officiating.

Calhoun graduated from Madison East High School in 1941, served in the Army Air Corps during World War II and is a retired lieutenant colonel in the Air Force Reserves. He earned his bachelor's degree from the UW-Madison in 1947, and his law degree in 1950. He is a practicing attorney in Madison.

An official since 1947, he worked in the Big 10 for 20 years, and was referee in the 1968 and 1976 Rose Bowl games, the 1971 Cotton Bowl game, the 1974 Sugar Bowl and the 1981 Orange Bowl game.

He retired from active officiating after the Orange Bowl and assumed the duties of Supervisor of Football Officials for the Big 10 in 1982.

OTTO PULS, SUPERVISOR OF BASKETBALL OFFICIALS

Otto R. Puls is supervisor of Wisconsin State University Conference basketball officials.

Puls, a veteran high school and college official, graduated from Madison East High School and the University of Wisconsin, where he earned a B.S. degree in Pharmacy. He currently is chief pharmacist at the Central Wisconsin Center for Developmentally Disabled in Madison.

Otto played baseball at East and at UW-Madison. Following college he played professional baseball in the Baltimore Orioles farm system.

He started officiating in 1955 and has worked Big Ten football for the past 12 years. During that span he officiated six Michigan-Ohio State football games, the 1978 Tangerine Bowl, 1981 Orange Bowl and Rose Bowl games in 1977 and '82.

Blugolds Return to Kansas City

Eau Claire made its third straight appearance in the NAIA National Basketball Tournament at Kansas City in March of 1988 by defeating WSUC champion Platteville, 80-77, for the District 14 title. It marked Eau Claire's seventh appearance in the past 10 years in the NAIA tournament, 11th under coach Ken Anderson and 16th overall dating back to 1939, when the Blugolds became the first team to represent Wisconsin in the national meet.

Running back Greg Corning of River Falls received the Milwaukee Journal Trophy as the most valuable football player in the WSUC for the 1987 season. The award climaxed an outstanding four-year career for Corning, a 5-11, 225-pound senior from McFarland. He excelled every season and his four-year rushing record shows 3,006 yards in 539 carries and 41 touchdowns in conference games only. He averaged 5.6 yards per time he carried the ball.

Krueger received the WSUC Meritorious Service Award and Friday was presented a Certificate of Appreciation for their contributions and many years of dedication to conference athletics. The presentations were made by WSUC Commissioner Max Sparger.

River Falls Ace Honored

Greg Corning, one of the most explosive running backs in the WSUC, was named NAIA Division II second-team all-American following the 1987 season. The team is picked annually by the Kodak Company.

PREVIEW OF 1988 WSUC FOOTBALL SEASON

Seldom, if ever, is the Wisconsin State University Conference football race predictable and 1988's proceedings could become even more uncertain because of last season's experience. The unfortunate ineligibilities that forced Stevens Point to forfeit its conference and national championships affected everyone involved. The incident whiped away Point's title and elevated River Falls and Whitewater to WSUC co-champions. Now those two teams are put into a position of defending those co-titles with considerably less firepower than they were blessed with a year ago. Gone from the Warhawk lineup is conference rushing leader George Rainey, while River Falls no longer can count on one of the most potent one-two punches in WSUC history--running back Greg Corning and quarterback Mark Cota.

Stevens Point is operating under a new coach, former defensive coordinator John Miech, but the Pointers still can rely on All-American quarterback Kirk Baumgartner, who did a massive rewrite job on WSUC records last season. Also returning is Theo Blanco, Baumgartner's favorite target and one of the premier all-purpose backs in the conference.

Coach Bob Berezowitz is not exactly left with a barren stable at Whitewater. The Warhawks still can field an experienced quarterback in Jeff Olsen, all-conference center John Spiegelhoff and some solid defenders, including free safety Dave Haluska, an all-star performer last season.

Because of what transpired following last season, coach Mike Farley at River Falls now is working on his fifth straight WSUC title. Attaining this goal figures to be a tall order even for Farley, one of small college football's most successful practitioners. Farley's "wishbone" attack depends on strong runners and those positions are wide open this fall. He also must shore up a defense that yielded almost 37 points a game in the last four 1987 contests.

This could be the year Eau Claire makes its most serious run since the championship years of 1961 and '83. Coach Jim Lind introduced an exciting offense labeled "Air Eau Claire" and that sobriquet is self-explanatory. The Bluejays broke numerous offensive records last fall under the guidance of quarterbacks Dave Huffcutt and John Clark. Huffcutt is recuperating from knee surgery and his status is questionable. But, Clark and halfback Cary Osborn give the Bluejays enough offense to make life miserable for opponents.

La Crosse slumped somewhat last season, mainly because of a shaky defense. That side of the ball will command most attention at the outset this fall, although coach Roger Harring also must find a replacement for quarterback Todd Oberg. The offensive load probably will fall on the husky shoulders of Ted Pretasky, a proven running back who attained all-conference status the past two years.

Oshkosh fielded one of the toughest defenses in the conference last season, and the Titans figure to present a formidable unit again this year. But, coach Ron Cardo must add some pizzazz to the offense if the Titans expect to challenge for honors. Quarterback Brian Rill and running backs Mark Matzke and Dan Freeman return with experience but the attack needs diversity and some replacements to complement tackle Joe Framke and center John Dobyns in the offensive line.

Platteville coach George Chryst began a youth movement two years ago and he hopes that strategy will attain fruition this season. This becomes especially critical in light of the fact that quarterback H.T. Kinney, fullback Dave Nelson and tight end Larry Tonyan and defensive end and punter Mark Rae are missing from the Pioneer cast. Youthful vitality is the hope of the offense, while the defense appears solid enough with the likes of end Brian Forston and cornerback Kevin O'Connell anchoring that unit.

The WSUC evolved into a pass-oriented league during the past several years, thanks primarily to Stevens Point, of course, Lind at Eau Claire and Stout's Rich Lawrence, whose wide open attack shattered numerous Blue Devil offensive records last fall. Quarterback Tim Peterson and wide receivers Mark Rothwell and Scott Fredrickson are among numerous Stout offensive performers back for another campaign. The Blue Devils are intent on making waves at the top of the standings in Lawrence's third year as head coach.

Superior will operate under new coach Bill Connor, who is expected to continue a football resurgence encouraged by Gil Krueger in recent years. Connor is handicapped by the loss of key personnel, but he hopes to keep the resurgence alive with returnees such as wide receiver Dan Kelner, fullback Keith Turner and linebacker Dan Holte. The only predictable aspect of 1988 is the unpredictability of the WSUC, which guarantees an annual donnybrook before any championship is determined in November.

PROSPECTS FOR 1988

"Air Eau Claire" did more than just get off the ground in Jim Lind's coaching debut. He guided the Blugolds to a 6-4 overall record and a share of third place (5-3) in the WSUC. The question now is whether his free-wheeling attack can soar even higher this year despite the loss of 14 outstanding seniors.

Lind's multiple pro offense with emphasis on passing enabled the Blugolds to break school records for points per game (28.3), passing yards per game (276.7) and total offense per game (393.1).

Inexperience will be a problem for Lind this year but the Blugolds won't be short of talent. The 72-man roster for the final game last fall included 40 freshmen, 10 sophomores and eight juniors.

Nine of the departing seniors performed on offense, including NAIA first-team All-American guard Wil Beech and wide receiver Mike Blair, who caught 42 passes for 778 yards and seven touchdowns. Offensive line coach Tom Grossklaus will rebuild around junior tackle Dan Navin, while sophomore Pete Balistrieri becomes the nucleus of the receiving corps. Balistrieri caught 17 passes for 409 yards (24.1 per catch) and two touchdowns last season.

Another major cog on offense is sophomore halfback Cary Osborn, who set a school record by scoring 16 touchdowns as a freshman. Other keys are quarterbacks Dave Huffcutt and John Clark. Huffcutt was No. 1 until suffering a knee injury in the fifth game last fall. Clark came on after Huffcutt's injury to pass for 1,949 yards and 12 touchdowns, completing 58.3 percent of his throws. Huffcutt might be red-shirted this fall.

The Blugolds lost four defensive players, including team's most valuable player Jim Hessler, an all-conference linebacker. Veterans Karl Crump, Pat Green and Mike Lukas, though, give the linebacking stability and Lind has three solid defensive linemen in Rich Kern, Tim Golden and Chad Christianson. The secondary and end positions cause concern and lack of depth is a problem in the interior line.

PROSPECTS FOR 1988

Following a title tie in 1986, the Indians experienced an up-and-down season in '87, due mainly to a porous defense that yielded 40 or more points in four of the last five games. The most shocking was a 60-32 loss to Whitewater. That defense needs to be improved for coach Roger Harring's Indians to challenge this season.

Among graduating seniors were quarterback Todd Oberg, wide receivers Jose Alba and Gerald Last and tight end Dave Carl. These losses, of course, wipe out the Indians' strategic air arm, and sharpening this aspect of the offense could take time. Oberg averaged 203 yards a game passing in the conference. Steve Althaus, Oberg's potential replacement, lacks the experience and throwing ability of his predecessor. This area of the offense becomes a major project at the outset.

On the plus side offensively, Ted Pretasky returns at running back, where he attained all-conference honors last fall. He gained over 1,000 yards in eight conference games, averaging 136 yards per outing in the WSUC, and compiled the best rushing average per carry (6.5 yards) among conference regulars. The 6-2, 220-pound senior also finished second in conference scoring with 15 touchdowns.

Pretasky and Althaus, a good veer quarterback, will be operating behind a potentially solid offensive line that includes center Troy Nelson, guards Jason Mahairas and Steve Downey and tackles Dominic Charles and Larry Harlow. The Indians also can expect some offensive punch from Dan Bridges, the conference's leading punt returner last fall, averaging 10.3 yards each attempt.

Key losses on defense are all-conference linebacker Conrad Farner, safety Mike Gorman and cornerback Rodney Cobb. Terry Strouf, renowned more for his track and field exploits as a weight man, could come into his own this fall as a defensive tackle. End Pat Nichols and linebacker Bob Lowney form the nucleus of returnees with Strouf.

Defensively, the Indians lack experience, depth and quickness in the secondary. Punter Keith Dryden could turn out to be an important defensive weapon, if he can keep opponents bottled up consistently. Also on the plus side is placekicker Chris Schumacher, a potential threat offensively and defensively.

PROSPECTS FOR 1988

A dozen years have past since Oshkosh figured in a WSUC football championship. That 1976 outfit depended on defense to show the way, and current coach Ron Cardo could be charting a similar course for this year's Titans. Last fall's team yielded the fewest points (189) of any squad in the conference and the mainstays of that defensive unit are back.

Eight defensive starters return, including free safety Todd Schoelzel, who was credited with 117 solo tackles, while also recovering four fumbles and intercepting seven passes. He tied a National Collegiate Athletic Association Division III record by returning three of those interceptions for touchdowns, including a 100-yarder against Platteville. Also returning to the secondary are cornerbacks Dale Perkins and David Queen.

Although nose guard Bob Czarnecki is recovering from knee surgery, the defensive line is expected to remain strong. Ends John Moe and Wesley Ivery return with tackles Mike LeClair and Brian Prochniak, while Dave Scheep, the team's second-leading tackler in 1987 with 110 stops, bolsters the linebacking corps.

Cardo's veer offense averaged 212.5 yards per game rushing last year and that group has quarterback Brian Rill and running backs Mark Matzke and Dan Freeman returning. Rill accounted for 790 yards total offense and led Titan scoring with 42 points. John Stack is expected to battle Rill for the starting job. Stack enhanced his position in the 1987 finale when he started for the injured Rill and led the Titans to a stunning 21-3 upset of nationally-ranked Whitewater.

Some holes must be plugged in the offensive line with Marshall Murray, Jim Dolan and Tony Tewelis gone, along with Jim Linnabary, the team's leading receiver in '87. Tackle Joe Framke and center John Dobyns form the nucleus of Cardo's rebuilding program in the line. Tight end Greg Benish and split end Pete Greeninger head the receiving corps.

Punting again will be handled by Rill, but Cardo is looking for a placekicker to take over for graduated BenJE Veit, all-conference at his specialty last fall. The Titans are heading into the school's 94th season of football and they hope to make it a memorable one.

PROSPECTS FOR 1988

The Pioneers lost some key personnel from last year's 6-5 team, but coach George Chryst is pinning his hopes on a youth movement he began two years ago to make an impression in the won-lost column this season.

Replacing the likes of quarterback H.T. Kinney, fullback Dave Nelson, tight end Larry Tonyan and defensive end and punter Mark Rae won't be easy. But, at least this year Chryst does have some newcomers waiting in the wings to prove themselves. A strong nucleus returns and a majority of that group saw extensive playing time in 1987.

Junior Brad Taylor is the only letterman quarterback returning. Running backs will be selected from a group that includes Dave Shumway, Jerry Mentzel, Troy Burkard, Kent Christensen, Devin Cobb and Todd Peters. Leading offensive line candidates include centers Bret Badertscher and Tim Murphy, guards Jay Ferkovich, Toby Golembiewski, Dan Goodman and Mike Pascavis and tackles Chad Hempel and Scott Largent.

Chryst must bank on his defense early until the offense develops some consistency. Although replacing Rae, tackle Jeff Bardell and cornerback Brad Witt causes some concern for the coaching staff, returning defenders show promise. Anchoring this group are Brian Forston, a first team all-conference end last season, and Kevin O'Connell in the secondary.

Injuries are a nemesis for all coaches but this could be true at Platteville particularly. The Pioneers have depth problems on both sides of the football and the loss of just a couple of key players could affect the coming season adversely. The Pioneers come into '88 among second echelon teams when people talk about pre-season contenders. They're hoping to sneak up on opponents, though, much the same as they did in 1985 while compiling a 5-3 mark with little fanfare.

PROSPECTS FOR 1988

River Falls faces probably the first major rebuilding year under coach Mike Farley since 1982. The Falcons figured in their fourth straight championship last fall after Stevens Point was forced to forfeit its title. So, River Falls wound up with a 6-2 record in the conference and 7-3 overall, sharing the title with Whitewater.

The most difficult task facing Farley will be finding replacements for all-conference fullback Greg Corning, the WSUC's most valuable player, and quarterback Mark Cota, who was all-WSUC at his position as a junior. Last year those two averaged 200 yards a game rushing between them as key performers in Farley's wishbone attack. Corning also ranked second in conference kickoff returns and fourth in scoring with 14 touchdowns.

Other standouts missing from the offense are tackle Rick Lowney and center Steve Dinkel. But, the offensive line appears fairly solid, led by all-conference guard Greg Olson. Junior Jeff Saueressig is the only letterman quarterback returning, but this might be the year Ritchie Narges and Tom Baxter emerge from the shadows of Corning and Cota. Baxter was used almost exclusively as a punter.

Also likely contenders for more expansive roles in Farley's run oriented offense are Chris Krueger, Joel Marvin, Mike Miller, Tom Sebranek, Cary Sifferath, Kelly Steinmetz and Randy Stokke.

Defensive coordinator Ted Thompson must shore up that side of the football, where last season the Falcons yielded an average of 410 yards and 28 points a game in conference competition. They were nicked for almost 37 points a game in their last four outings. The defensive backfield returns three of four starters, including Phil Gribble, one of the WSUC's premier performers, so there shouldn't be too many worries there. The line needs bolstering and Thompson must find some depth, an overall team problem.

The kicking game, always a top priority in Farley's scheme of things, appears in good shape with Andy Feil handling extra points and field goals.

PROSPECTS FOR 1988

All-American quarterback Kirk Baumgartner did a major re-write job on WSUC passing records last fall while leading the Pointers to a 12-2-1 record, the WSUC title and a share of the NAIA Division II National Championship. But, Stevens Point was forced to forfeit the 12 victories and tie and those championships because of playing two ineligible athletes--wide receiver Aatron Kenney and running back Keith Majors.

The school also replaced coach D.J. LeRoy and named John Miech as his successor. Miech takes the helm after three years as defensive coordinator at his alma mater. He starts with a proven quarterback who last fall set WSUC records for most yards passing in a game (523) and a season (3,071) and most completions in a season (196).

Baumgartner returns for his junior season along with his favorite receiver, Theo Blanco, one of the premier all-purpose backs in the conference. Blanco set WSUC records for most pass receptions in a season (85) and most yards gained (1,328). He also ranked third in punt returns in the conference last season and third in scoring with 15 touchdowns.

This is not to say Miech does not have some holes in his offense this fall. Missing from the line are tackles Tim Ciriaks, Ralph Radtke and Greg Fictum and center Derek Brown.

Graduation also created some problems in the defense, where free safety and punter Dan Dantoine and end Craig Ewald, both all-conference, are missing, along with cornerback Scott Nicolai, linebacker John Bechard and tackle Bill Kolodziej, the latter also all-conference. The defensive unit, though, presents a solid nucleus, featuring two all-WSUC performers in tackle Kevin Deates and cornerback Greg Dantoine, along with Bob Bostad, a proven linebacker.

The Pointers still have the talent and experience to make a run for the championship this year but they can expect added pressure to rebuild their shattered fortunes and overcome last fall's disappointment.

PROSPECTS FOR 1988

The Blue Devils could become a serious title threat in coach Rich Lawrence's third year at the helm. He expects 35 lettermen back from last year's 6-5 team and much of the offense returns intact, including the entire line.

Among these offensive players are two receivers who gained more than 1,000 yards in receptions last fall--Mark Rothwell (1,090 on 55 catches) and Scott Fredrickson (1,185 on 70 completions). They will be on the receiving end of passes thrown by veteran quarterback Tim Peterson, who accounted for 3,052 yards in total offense last season.

While fullback Chuck Carr is a major loss on offense, defensively Lawrence is faced with replacing his entire starting linebacker corps of Tim Hudson, Jamie Walsh, Dave Behling and Matt Schwab, who have graduated. The Blue Devils do have outstanding end Mike Tweet back to shore up the front line on defense.

Lawrence also considers the Stout schedule a major problem. Along with the competitive WSUC opponents he has lined up a non-conference schedule that includes 1987 NAIA Division I playoff team Moorhead (MN) State and NCAA Division II semi-finalist University of Dayton.

The Blue Devils shattered 34 school records on their way to leading NCAA Division III teams in passing offense and finishing second in NAIA Division II total offense. So, with such potent experience returning, the offensive attack should be explosive again. Also, John Olson, the school's record-setting kicker, returns to bolster that aspect of Stout's game.

Lawrence figures his linebackers will have to grow up in a hurry for the Blue Devils to contend for conference honors. Offensively, if healthy, Stout could be lethal. But, two years of coaching experience in the WSUC taught him that playing good defense and staying healthy are the keys to success in the league. Still, it seems obvious more than ever that 1988 will enhance the WSUC reputation for balanced competition and Stout has as good a chance as any team.

PROSPECTS FOR 1988

The Yellowjackets will be playing under new coach Bill Connor, who replaced veteran Gil Krueger this year. Connor, one of two new coaches in the WSUC this season, possesses a wealth of coaching experience, including 20 years at the college level. This fall he greets 20 returning lettermen, including nine first-team offensive players and six defensive regulars from 1987.

Connor has three gaping voids to fill at the outset with the departure of nose guard Terry Senn, all-conference free safety Ray Kosey and quarterback Craig Haugo, the Jackets' most valuable offensive player last fall. Kosey was the team's defensive MVP. Heading the list of returnees are wide receiver Dan Kelner, fullback Keith Turner and linebacker Dan Holte. Kelner caught 35 passes in the conference last season, six for touchdowns, while Turner averaged 4.6 yards a carry and 77 yards a game rushing.

Superior returned to respectability last fall and a wide open style of football brought fans back to Ole Haugersrud Field in record numbers with attendance averaging over 1,500 per game. The Jackets scored more points in 1987 than at any time during the past decade and this created excitement.

Last fall the Jackets lost a 16-13 heartbreaker to Twin Ports rival UM-Duluth and that was the closest a Superior team has come to the Bulldogs in more than 25 years. This fall Superior adds a new opponent in Gustavus Adolphus, defending MIAC champion, which replaces Upper Iowa-Fayette, a team the Jackets hammered, 52-0, last season to end an 18-game on-field losing streak in front of some 3,500 fans.

Although Connor is an optimistic leader and proven recruiter, this shapes up as a rebuilding season and a year of adjustment for the Jackets. But, if they live up to the adage about a team being as good as its last game, their fortunes are looking up. The Jackets ended the 1987 season with an impressive 21-14 upset of Oshkosh on the Titan gridiron.

PROSPECTS FOR 1988

The Warhawks have been trying to crack the top of the WSUC in football since sharing the title in 1984. Then, last fall an apparent second-place tie eventually became a share of the championship when Stevens Point was forced to forfeit its title for playing two ineligible athletes during the season. So, the Warhawks' 8-2-1 overall record became the best among WSUC teams.

This year coach Bob Berezowitz, starting his fourth season at the helm, won't be able to depend on such mainstays as George Rainey, the WSUC rushing champion last fall who averaged 153 yards a game, nor tight end T.D. Weber, another all-conference performer. Also gone from the offense are starting guards Mike Johanning and Lawyer Wilson, the latter also an all-conference performer, and dependable fullback Phil Fader.

Berezowitz will have an experienced quarterback in Jeff Olsen and all-conference center John Spiegelhoff to build around, and a group of quality defensive performers with experience in all areas. All-conference free safety Dave Haluska, along with outside linebacker Jim Jaworski and end Keith Alexander are key performers on that side of the football. Probably the biggest gap in the defense was left by the departure of all-conference tackle Scott Schraml.

Despite the loss of Rainey, Weber and the rest, Berezowitz and Whitewater partisans will not spend much time lamenting their fate. The squad contains a host of quality athletes ready to take their place in the Warhawk Stadium limelight. There also are some transfer students and in-coming freshmen who offer interesting potential.

One returnee who can't be overlooked is Dave Emond, back to handle the kicking duties again after an outstanding season in 1987. Emond, a senior from Fort Knox, Ky., might add more gold to the Warhawk trophy case if he contributes like last fall when he converted 27 of 28 extra point attempts and seven of 11 field goal tries.

PREVIEW OF THE 1988-89 BASKETBALL SEASONWISCONSIN STATE UNIVERSITY CONFERENCE

Eau Claire's Ken Anderson enjoys the luxury of having all five of his starters from last season returning and this makes the Bugolds odds-on favorites in the 1988-89 basketball race, a familiar role for the school prior to 1983.

Other WSUC schools have experienced similar good fortune in the past, but few possessed the ability in those returning starters with which Anderson is blessed. So, every coach in the conference considers Eau Claire the team to beat until somebody comes up with some convincing reasons to think otherwise.

All-conference Eric Davis heads the Bugolds, who also boast the presence of Tim Blair and Craig Campbell in the backcourt, with Mike Prasher and Chris Paulson rounding out the front line with Davis. This group finished third in the conference last season behind champion Platteville and runnerup Whitewater, but the Bugolds jelled late and went on to represent Wisconsin in the NAIA Tournament at Kansas City in March.

Conversely, Platteville lost all of its title-winning starters except swingman DeAndrae Woods, who must carry the load for coach Bob Ryan until he can inject some new blood into the Pioneer lineup. Ryan finds himself starting a rebuilding program on the heels of the school's first basketball championship since 1975.

Those looking for a darkhorse might glance toward Oshkosh, where coach Jim McGrath will send out two of the most talented forwards in the conference in 6-6 Rick Kunnert and 6-5 Mark Ziebell. If McGrath finds a center to complement those two in the front line, Eau Claire could find a major challenger to its purported superiority.

La Crosse also presents some interesting potential but coach Burt McDonald would feel more comfortable if he could have brought additional recruits to the campus this year. He has talented returnees in Corey Block, Willie Arnold and Jim Rosemeyer but losses outweigh those attributes at this time.

When looking at Eau Claire, River Falls coach Rick Bowen mused, "Is anybody else even close? Are we all playing for second?" That seems a reasonable assumption when comparing form charts. At the moment Bowen would like to be fighting for the runnerup spot. He hopes his youth movement and the maturity of veteran John Kenney can carry the Falcons to the first division.

Whitewater lost standout Duane Vance and Robert Barnes from its runnerup club, but coach Dave Vander Meulen is not singing the blues. The Warhawk stable still contains some prominent thoroughbreds and his teams never drift too far out of contention. His backcourt trio of Jeff Seifriz, Ricky Spicer and Pat Miller are the envy of most coaches.

Superior is coming off its most productive season in some time and there's excitement in the Twin Ports for the lineup second-year coach Glenn Carlson has assembled this year. Sharpshooting Max Christie heads the Yellowjackets after earning all-conference honors as a sophomore. Carlson does need some inside strength to battle traditionally strong WSUC rebounders.

Stevens Point and Stout face probably the biggest rebuilding projects among WSUC teams. Coach Bob Parker, like Platteville's Ryan, lost the bulk of his punch and has instituted a youth movement that projects him playing mostly freshmen in his second year at the Pointer helm.

Stout experienced an unprecedented skid that saw the Blue Devils drop to last place in the conference (1-15) and finish 8-18 overall. Compounding the problem is the fact that coach Dwain Mintz lost his two best players, Mark Stevens and Dave Sandstrom. He, like Parker, starts practically from scratch and figures to lean heavily on newcomers.

Rival coaches point to Eau Claire as the favorite but such comments often include some smoke-blowing. No coach in the WSUC is ready to concede the championship trophy to the Bugolds. The road remains long and treacherous.

PROSPECTS FOR 1988-89

Guard Corey Block leads returning lettermen from a team that finished a strong fourth and compiled an overall 18-10 record for the Indians last season. Block, an all-conference performer as a junior, averaged 11.3 points and 4.8 assists a game in the conference.

But, coach Burt McDonald must operate without three starters from a year ago--Bob Zenz, Dave Dodge and Paul Everson. Zenz and Dodge led the Indians in scoring with averages of 17.1 and 13.5 points, respectively, in the conference. Everson contributed almost 10 points and five rebounds a game, and McDonald might have trouble picking up this slack among returnees.

Ticketed for starting assignments along with Block are 6-4 guard Willie Arnold, who averaged 11.1 points and 7.3 rebounds as a junior last season, and 6-5 forward Jim Rosemeyer who contributed 10.5 points and 6.1 rebounds playing 12 games during the second semester.

Although McDonald figures the Indians are two key players away from a strong challenging role, enrollment restrictions at La Crosse hampered recruiting. Still, good outside shooting and experience are favorable factors, while lack of size and quickness, especially in the middle, figure to plague the Indians in a tough WSUC race.

PROSPECTS FOR 1988-89

The Titans possess the ingredients of a bona fide contender if coach Jim McGrath can develop a competent center. The preseason project at this time revolves around 6-8 sophomore Brad Skogman and 6-6 senior Arnie Enz. The rest of the cast appears capable of making a run for the top after last season's 14-13 finish.

Kingpins in Oshkosh's chase for its first WSUC championship since 1978 are 6-6 Rick Kunnert and 6-5 Mark Ziebell, who provide McGrath with two of the best forwards in the conference. This pair finished fourth and fifth in WSUC scoring last season, with Kunnert averaging 19.3 points a game and Ziebell 18.9. Kunnert also grabbed an average of 8.1 rebounds and Ziebell 6.4.

The Titans also feature two experienced guards in 6-1 senior Ellis Turrentine and 5-11 junior Robert Strayhorn. Experience and scoring ability give the Titans a head start but McGrath figures he must find that capable center in order to challenge the likes of Eau Claire. McGrath also hopes to improve his team defensively and establish a stronger half-court offense. The Titans scored 82.2 points a game last season, but they also allowed exactly the same number.

PROSPECTS FOR 1988-89

Coach Bo Ryan finds himself pretty much in the same position today as he was four years ago while assuming the helm of Pioneer basketball fortunes. He's in the midst of a rebuilding project following last season's WSUC championship, the school's first basketball title since 1975.

The Pioneers enjoyed a banner season in 1987-88 with their 14-2 conference record and 24-5 overall mark, but Ryan lost seven of the top players from that unit, including forward Steve Showalter, who averaged 21.3 points a game and was named the conference's most valuable player. Also gone are Rock Ripley, Randy Kazin, Joe Theisen, Scott Plondke and Brian Kahl.

Replacing the team's top three rebounders--Showalter, Ripley and Plondke--as well as four-year play-making guard Kazin are the major problems to be solved. Swingman DeAndre Woods is the lone returning starter. He was second in team scoring to Showalter with a 15-point average and hit the last second basket at Whitewater that gave the Pioneers their undisputed championship. Andy Banasik saw considerable playing time, so he and Woods form the nucleus of the rebuilding program.

Ryan figures defending a championship is always tougher than winning it and the task appears doubly difficult because of this year's losses. Still, a winning attitude acquired over the past four years should ease the way. Also, when Ryan started four years ago the Pioneers were coming off a 6-20 season, not defending a title.

Coach Rick Bowen is starting the third year of a program he hopes will return River Falls to basketball respectability and eventually develop a consistent contender at a school that hasn't won a WSUC basketball title since 1950.

The youthful Falcons, who learned the hard way while compiling records of 5-11 in the conference and 11-15 overall, expect last season's experience to help noticeably during the coming campaign. They lost only senior captain Neil Yost, so basically the bulk of the team returns.

Heading the list of returnees are guard Adrian Bowdry, who led the Falcons with 14.1 points a game last season, and 6-7 John Kinney, a senior Bowen believes is destined for all-conference recognition this season. Also key to River Falls hopes are sophomore guards Dean Cook and Rick Montreal, both of whom performed better than anyone could expect as freshmen last season. Cook averaged 13.8 points a game and Montreal almost 10.

Kinney is a strong rebounder who must assume a leadership role in 1988-89. Cook gives Bowen an excellent outside shooter and junior Eric Miller provides the Falcons with a heady performer at point guard. Lack of height and depth remain problems that have plagued River Falls basketball for too many generations.

Bob Parker starts his second year as Stevens Point coach with a lineup that graduation stripped of its punch. The Pointers slumped to sixth place last season after figuring in six straight WSUC championships under coaches Dick Bennett and Jay Eck. Bennett now directs fortunes at UW-Green Bay and Eck at Toledo University.

Gone from last year's group are all-conference Todd Christianson, team scoring leader John Holmes, 7-foot center Craig Wessel and 6-4 forward Darian Brown. PROSPECTS FOR 1988-89

Stout's basketball fortunes took a horrendous nosedive last season, following a solid third-place finish in the WSUC the previous year. The Blue Devils couldn't seem to find the key that would mesh the material at hand. The collapse that included 14 straight losses at the end of the season left the Blue Devils at 1-15 in the conference and 8-18 overall.

Complicating matters this year is the fact that the two best players from that group, 6-7 Mark Stevens and 6-6 Dave Sandstrom, are gone. Stevens averaged 14.6 points a game in the conference and Sandstrom 10.3. Heading the list of six returning lettermen is 6-6 Boyd Witt, who contributed 7.3 points and 6.7 rebounds a game as a sophomore.

The Warhawks will try to rebound from a near-miss season when a last second shot by Platteville's DeAndrae Woods probably deprived them of the WSUC championship. The stage was set in that final game at Whitewater and it became increasingly evident the last team with the ball was going to win. Platteville triggered the final shot.

Duplicating the 22-6 overall record could be difficult for veteran coach Dave Vander Meulen, who is without two key performers from that team--guard Duane Vance and center Robert Barnes, both all-conference. Vance led conference scoring with a 22-point average and Barnes won the rebounding title with 12.3 caroms a game. Also gone from that group are Joe Bocker, a high percentage shooter, and Kevin Marks.

The backcourt still looks in capable hands with the return of sharpshooting Jeff Seifriz, quick Ricky Spicer and 5-11 Pat Miller. All three can hit the outside shot. Miller sank 56 of 107 3-point attempts last season and Seifriz 61 of 133. Vander Meulen expects to get some immediate help from three transfers--6-5 Elbert Gordon, 6-3 Luke Beinfang and 6-2 Eric Owens.

The Warhawks still possess plenty of quickness and outside shooting, but lack of inside strength presents a problem with Barnes gone. Barry Schaffner, a 6-6 letterman, could help solve the lack of inside strength, but he is recovering from his second major knee operation and this remains a concern at the outset.

Mike Neumann finished third in the NCAA Division III discus and improved his own school record with a toss of 170 feet 2 inches. Steve Sharp, running his last collegiate track event, earned his first all-American honor by placing seventh in the 10,000-meter run with a time of 31:32.75.

Terry Strouf and Keith Dryden sparked La Crosse to the NCAA Division III outdoor track and field championship at Northfield, MN., in 1988. Strouf won the discus and shot put and finished second in the hammer throw. Dryden won the high jump with a career best of 6-11 3/4. Strouf's discus toss of 175-9 is a La Crosse record and his 62-7 3/4 shot put was his personal best.

The Indians won with 54 points. Jim Batchelor finished second in the 3,000-meter steeplechase, Troy Nelson third in the shot put, Chris Hall sixth in the 5,000 and Darin Shepardson seventh in the steeplechase. Lincoln College was second with 47 points.

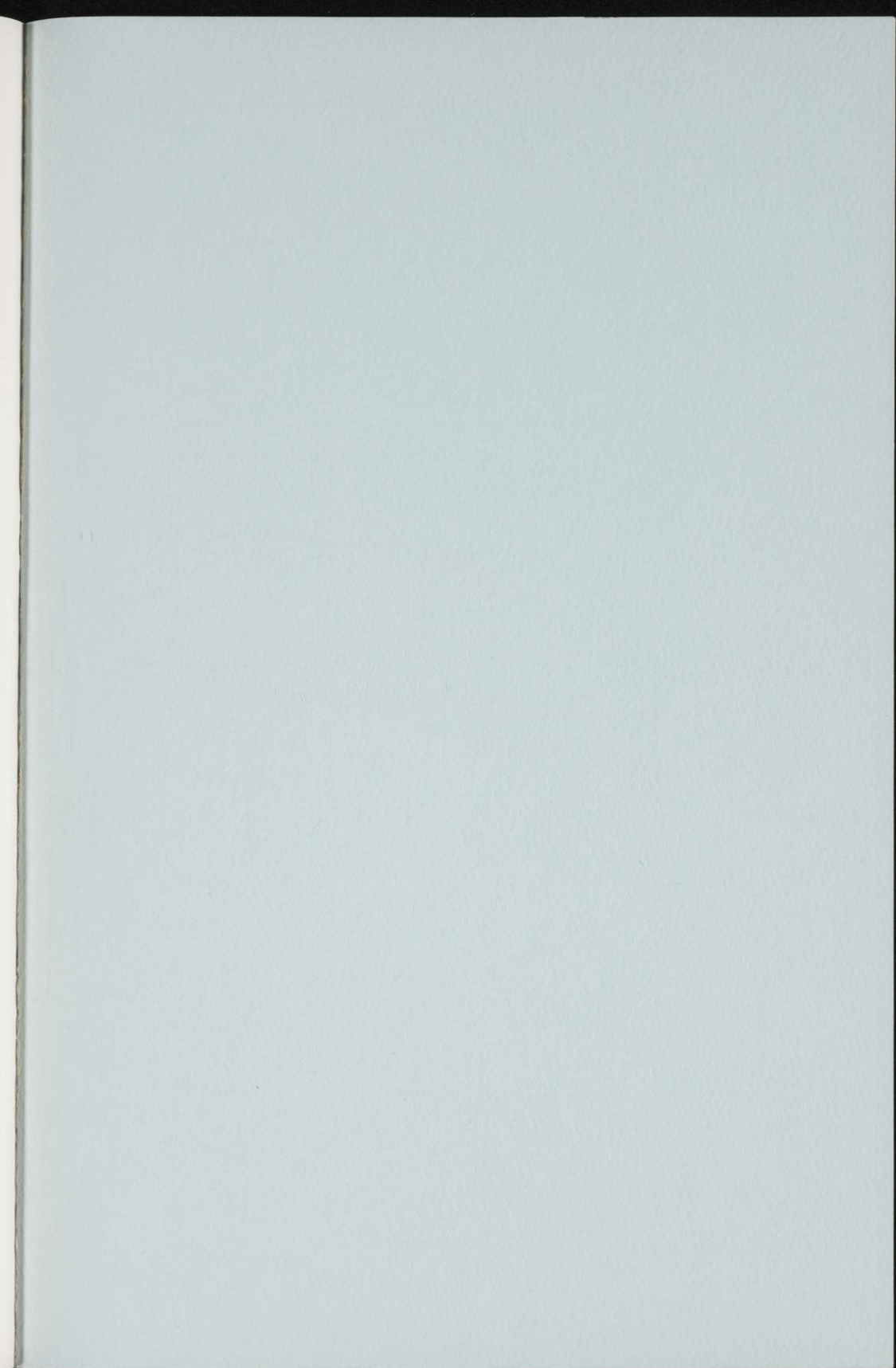
