

### REVIEW OF THE 1968-69 SEASON

WISCONSIN'S SIXTH SEASON IN INTERCOLLEGIATE COMPETITION, AND LAST AS AN INDEPENDENT WAS A HIGHLY SUCCESSFUL ONE. THE BADGERS WERE 22-10-2--15-1 AGAINST OTHER INDEPENDENTS, 7-9-2 AGAINST WCHATEAMS, AND 5-5 AGAINST BIG TEN TEAMS FOR A THIRD PLACE FINISH.

BIG WINS OF THE SEASON INCLUDED A 4-3 VICTORY AND 7-7 TIE

AGAINST WCHA CHAMPION MICHIGAN TECH AT HOUGHTON; 7-5 AND 11-7 VICTORIE

OVER PREVIOUSLY UNBEATEN NORTH DAKOTA; A COME-FROM-BEHIND 5-4 VICTORY

AGAINST MICHIGAN FOR THE BADGERS' FIRST WIN AGAINST THE WOLVERINES;

A 2-1 TRIUMPH AGAINST MICHIGAN STATE FOR WISCONSIN'S FIRST WIN AT

EAST LANSING; AND A 7-3 POUNDING OVER MINNESOTA.

1 : WISCONSIN'S FINAL SERIES AT MICHIGAN DECIDED THE BIG TEN TITLE, WITH THE WOLVERINES COMING OUT ON TOP WITH 8-5 AND 2-0 WINS.

THE BADGERS PARTICIPATED IN TWO TOURNAMENTS, FINISHING SECOND
TO MICHIGAN TECH IN THE GREAT LAKES TOURNAMENT, AND TIED FOR THIRD

### ROBERT N. (LOB) JOHNSON

#### WISCONSIN HOCKEY COACH

ALTHOUGH HE IS JUST BEGINNING HIS FOURTH YEAR AS HOCKEY COACH OF THE UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN, BOB JOHNSON HAS CREATED A HOCKEY RENAISSANCE IN THE UNIVERSITY'S HOCKEY PROGRAM, AND THROUGH HIS HARD WORK AND ENTHUSIASM HE HAS SPARKED THE GROWTH OF HOCKEY AT ALL LEVELS OF COMPETITION IN THE STATE OF WISCONSIN.

IN THREE YEARS UNDER JOHNSON, THE BADGERS HAVE COMPILED 16-10 (1966-67), 21-10 (1967-68), AND 22-10-2 (1968-69) RECORDS FOR A COMBINED MARK OF 59-30-2 AND A .648 WINNING PERCENTAGE. LAST SEASON'S VICTORIES INCLUDED A WIN AND TIE (4-3, 7-7) AT MICHIGAN TECH, TWO VICTORIES AGAINST NORTH DAKOTA (7-5, 11-7), THE BADGERS' FIRST VICTORY EVER AT EAST LANSING, MICH. AGAINST MICHIGAN STATE (2-1), AND A VICTORY OVER MICHIGAN (5-4). ALL ARE MEMBERS OF THE WESTERN COLLEGIATE HOCKEY ASSOCIATION, WHICH THE BADGERS JOINED LAST MARCH.

JOHNSON IS A 38 YEAR OLD MINNESOTA NATIVE WHO HAS HAD A SUCCESSFUL ATHLETIC BACKROUND -- BOTH AS A COMPETITOR AND AS A COACH.

HE WAS AN ALL-STAR HOCKEY PLAYER AT MINNEAPOLIS CENTRAL HIGH SCHOOL AND CAPTAIN HIS SENIOR YEAR IN THE LATE 40'S. HE ALSO EXCELLED IN FOOTBALL AND BASEBALL.

HIS COLLEGIATE HOCKEY WAS PLAYED AT NORTH DAKOTA WHERE HE WAS THE LEADING SCORER IN 1950-51, AND AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA IN 1952-53 AND 1953-54.

THE GOPHERS WON THE WCHA TITLE BOTH YEARS JOHNSON PLAYED. HE ALSO WON LETTERS IN FOOTBALL AND BASEBALL AT MINNESOTA.

Johnson began his coaching career at Warroad, Minnesota High School following Army duty in Korea in the mid-1950's, and after one year, became head coach at Minneapolis Roosevelt High School where his teams won 51 of 60 conference games in six seasons through 1962-63.

PRIOR TO COMING TO WISCONSIN, JOHNSON SERVED COLORADO COLLEGE AS BOTH HOCKEY COACH AND BASEBALL COACH FOR THREE SEASONS. HIS HOCKEY TEAMS POSTED 12-14-1 (1963-64), 7-19 (1964-65), AND 10-18-2 (1965-66) RECORDS.

JOHNSON'S BASEBALL TEAMS WERE HIGHLY SUCCESSFUL AND IN BOTH 1964 AND 1965 HE WAS NAMES 'COACH OF THE YEAR' FOR THE NCAA COLLEGE DIVISION ROCKY MOUNTAIN DISTRICT. HE ADDITIONALLY ASSISTED IN FOOTBALL AND TAUGHT IN THE PHYSICAL EDUCATION CURRICULUM WITH THE RANK OF ASSISTANT PROFESSOR.

JOHNSON RECEIVED HIS BACHELOR OF SCIENCE DEGREE FROM MINNESOTA IN 1954 WITH A DOUBLE MAJOR IN PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND SOCIAL STUDIES. HE GAINED HIS MASTERS FROM MINNESOTA IN 1961 IN PHYSICAL EDUCATION.

HE IS THE AUTHOR OF TWO BOOKS, <u>COACHING HOCKEY</u> AND <u>HOCKEY</u>, THE LATTER JUST PUBLISHED THIS YEAR. HE HAS ALSO PLAYED A GUIDING HAND IN THE ORGANIZATION OF ONE OF THE FINEST HOCKEY SHOOLS IN THE NATION, HELD EACH SUMMER IN ASPEN, COLORADO.

BOB AND HIS WIFE ARE THE PARENTS OF FIVE CHILDREN.
